Winter Wool Words

- Choose a word from our list of examples or come up with your own. Trace its letters onto the dull side of freezer paper.
- Cut the letter template out.
- Press the shiny side of the letter to <u>2 layers of woolfelt.</u>
- Sew around the template's edges.
- Peel off the template. (These can be used repeatedly)
- Cut the letter out with pinking shears OUTSIDE THE STITCHING. Be very careful
 on inside angles. If you find you've cut through the stitching, just stitch over it
 again and backstitch across the cut area. If you've used thread that matches your
 wool, it won't show.
- Make a slit in the back of the letter with pointy scissors or a seam ripper that is
 just big enough to easily stuff the letter. Stuff the letter (I like to use hemostats to
 do this!) and whip stitch the opening shut. I found it easier with some large or
 curvy letters, to cut two stuffing holes
- Embroider the letters if you'd like. Some can be eyeballed. Some can be printed or traced onto "stick on water soluble" sheets , stuck on the letter, stitched through, and dissolved in water. Let it dry thoroughly.
- Hang with clothespins or sew to ribbon or cording. You can also thread your ribbon or cording through a HUGE eyed sharp needle and just sew through the letters with it.
- Have fun!

You can easily fit 4 letters on a 5" strip of Woolfelt. Sometimes 5 if using narrow letters.
