Those in Jesus Christ-

Early on in my ministry, one of my fellow pastors told the story about a conversation that he had with a young parishioner of his who had returned from college. At the dinner table, she all of a sudden asked why he had never told her directly that intimacy before marriage was sinful. The pastor was floored. Having covered all the 10 Commandments in confirmation, he was sure he had in a way. But he had never said it plainly.

And so in the same vein I want to say something I am not sure everyone knows because maybe we don't say it a lot very plainly. Here it is: Christians are only to marry Christians. I say this now in particular because this thought did not come to my mind in relation to any person or relationship I know. I just happened to be studying for a Bible Study and came across the account of Samson telling his parents to go arrange for a marriage to a Philistine gal that pleased his eye. You could and should look up the story in Judges 14.

His parents responded by asking if there was really no one among all the women of Israel that he could wed instead of going and marrying someone among the uncircumcised Philistines. The point of course was not that the actual act of physical circumcision alone was so important. This was not an ethnic bias against the Philistines. It was simply that they knew that Samson should be looking among his tribe to find a bride. Why? Because Samson should marry one who was a believer in the one true God.

That is why Christians are only to marry Christians as well. It is not because unbelievers are unattractive to the eyes or lacking skills and abilities or even that they are not capable of being a good spouse in many ways. But the Christian is only to bind themselves in life tightly to those who share their faith.

2 Corinthians 6:14 tells God's people to not yoke themselves together with unbelievers. Being married is indeed one of the most profound ways in which one yokes themselves together to another. In fact, I once saw a wedding involving a woman of Philippine origin where, following a tradition in her country, they actually put a yoke made of rope around the husband and the wife's neck during the ceremony to make this point.

Therefore, if you are single and you are dating someone or are interested in someone that is not a Christian, you should stop now before you get more attached. If you have children, you should be instructing them in this truth either preemptively before they start dating or right away when they mention their interest in someone that does not share our faith. You should do this because it is right to be sure. But you should also do it because a godly spouse is a great gift you should try to help your child receive.

I know there are some of you that are thinking, "But pastor I know a situation in which someone married a non-Christian and it turned out fine. In fact, that person became a Christian." Well, we are told that God also used Samson's marriage for good, in this case to punish the pagan Philistines that had oppressed his people for 40 years, but that does not mean that Samson's marriage itself was good. God uses even our mistakes for his good. But that does not free us to test him by continuing in disobedience or by thinking lightly of the gifts he wants to give.

If Jesus is your life, then you will only want to share your life with one for whom Jesus is also their life. And so, if you didn't ever hear it said that plainly, let me say it now. Christians are only to marry Christians.

- Blessed are they who gossip, for they cause strife and divisions that please me.
- Blessed are they who are easily offended, for they soon get angry and quit.
- Blessed are they who do not give their offerings to carry on God's work, for they are my best helpers.
- Blessed is he who professes to love God but hates his brother and sister, for he shall be with me forever.
- Blessed are the troublemakers, for they shall be called the children of the devil.
- Blessed is he who has no time to pray, for he will be easy prey.

## WHY I BRING MY CHILDREN TO CHURCH

**I bring my children to church, even though at times they do not want to come.** I also feed my children good nutritious meals regularly even though at times they are too busy playing and do not want to eat ( or do not want what I cooked). Is not the **spiritual food** offered them in worship and Sunday school just as necessary for their spiritual health, growth, and development as food I feed them is necessary for their physical health, growth, and development?

**I bring my children to church, even though at times they do not want to come.** I also make my children wash their hands, or take a bath, even though at times they say their hands are clean enough, and do not need to be washed again. Is not the **spiritual cleaning** they receive from their Savior's words of forgiveness, love and acceptance, spoken in worship and Sunday school even more important than the cleaning they get from a bar of soap?

**I bring my children to church, even though at times they do not want to come.** I also take my children to family get-togethers even though at times they do not want to go because they think it is too boring, or they have to dress up, or be relatively quiet and well-behaved. Is it not equally important for them to be present when **God's family** (of which we are a part) gets together? Don't they need to know the love, acceptance, and support of God's family?

**I bring my children to church, even though at times they do not want to come.** I also take my children to the doctor even though they do not think they feel sick enough to warrant such a visit (or even if it is inconvenient for me to get them there – I have to alter my schedule, leave work early, or postpone something I would like to do). The **healing touch**, the words of love and acceptance from their Savior, the Great Physician is just as necessary as the healing touch and medicines of their medical doctor.

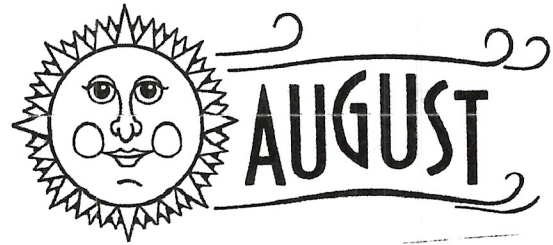

QUARTERLY VOTERS' Meeting  
Sunday, July 19, 2020 – 3:00 pm**

Chairman Tim Koski called the meeting to order at 3:07 pm. Pastor Hoppe opened with prayer.

The minutes of the January 19, 2020 Annual Voters' Assembly Meeting were approved as read.  
The Treasurer's report was presented by Dennis Korpi which was accepted.

**Council Action:** Council actions since the previous Voters' Assembly Meeting were read.

**Pastor's Report:**

- The Sunday morning radio program on WCMP has been paid for once per month by Peace and once per month by St. Paul's. Pastor Hoppe preaches twice per month. The cost to Peace is \$85 per month. It was decided to continue this ministry for another year and review it next year at this time, on motion by Don Weiss, second by LeRoy Thurn and carried
- If there are additional uses for the new video equipment purchased by the church, please let Pastor know.
- The District Convocation is now planned for Sunday, November 1<sup>st</sup>.
- VBS is planned for one day (August 3<sup>rd</sup>) and will be held outside this year.
- The Voters' Assembly welcomes Gene and Sharon Mosbek as new members to Peace.
- The church is now on SCI Cable.

**The Elders:**

- The Voters' Assembly adopted the new "Policy to Guard Children and Others Against Sexual and/or Other Abuse," at the request of the insurance company. Motion by LeRoy Thurn, second by Ron Osladil and carried.
- Dwight Hahn resigned as an Elder and Ron Osladil has agreed to take the remainder of Dwight's term. Motion by Bill Tvedt, second by Dick Alleman and carried.

**Trustees:**

- The landscaping around the church needs attention. The Voters will take this up in the future.
- Three maple trees along the East property line are split and need to be removed before they blow down. Motion by Ron Osladil, second by LeRoy Thurn and carried to authorize the removal of the trees, stump grinding and all cleanup for \$1,900.
- Work around the church entrance, various repairs of sections of the parking lot, sealing and re-striping of the parking lot were all authorized by the Voters for approximately \$15,000. Motion by LeRoy Thurn, second by Ron Osladil and carried. Contractors will be contacted to offer suggestions to help alleviate the water seepage problem at the parsonage.
- Repairs were made to the A/C in the narthex.

**Board of Education:** A new Sunday School Superintendent is needed in the fall.

**Old Business:** There was discussion regarding how to help the Elders with all of the extra administrative tasks imposed by the government. The Constitution is not explicit about whose responsibility these tasks are, so many have just fallen to the Elders. Sub-groups from the Voters' Assembly or Council members can help relieve some of the burden. The Elders will be asking individuals in the future.

**No New Business:**

Meeting adjourned at 4:43 pm. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
