People Waiting for the King,

It is the go-to passage for wedding ceremonies: First Corinthians Chapter 13. It tells us about what love is and what it does. It tells us what it is not and what it does not do. It is patient and kind. It rejoices in the truth and perseveres. It is not proud or rude. It keeps no record of wrongs nor is it easily angered. But at the end of this exposition on what love is we get this summary, "And now these three abide: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love."

This year we are going to take this passage and apply it not to love and marriage but to the season of Advent. In our midweek services, we will look at how faith, hope, and love are great themes to think about during the Advent season. I will suggest that faith teaches us to look upward, hope forward, and love outward. Each of these things is central to what we should be doing in this season leading up to Christmas. As we hear promises of a Messiah to come both in Bethlehem and on the Last Day, we look upward trusting the One who makes the promises. We look forward hoping for the things He has assured us will come. And understanding God's love is made manifest in the coming of this One, we look outward to shower such sacrificial love on those around us.

While hopefully you are in the word and prayer daily, Advent services provide an opportunity to gather in the middle of the week with your church family to stop and restore your focus. Even though some of the busyness of this season may be reduced this year, there will be other things added to the schedule to try to figure out how to do something when not everyone agrees on what can be done. There will be sadness about loved ones not present with us due to the current situation or the fact that they have gone to rest with Jesus. There will be for some melancholy, as there is every year at this time due to a perceived lack of the things they always dreamed would be present in these special times. Whatever the case with you, whatever it is that might capture your attention whether positive or negative, consider coming together for these times with your church family. If your schedule does not allow you to come at the time things are scheduled, watch online later to give yourself a chance to stop and restore your focus on the things your church family will be focused on. Focus on the God who promises who is deserving of our trust. Focus on the things He has promised which are where we place our hopes. And focus ultimately on His love which He has shown us by sending us the Child of Bethlehem.

On the final week of those midweek services, we plan to have our children involved in reminding us of the love of God through songs and readings as well.
