<u>MARCH FOR LIFE</u> <u>At the State Capitol – Wednesday, Jan. 22^d</u>

The last few years, our church has had a delegation travel to the State Capitol on January 22nd for the annual March for Life campaign. This year the 22nd is on a Wednesday and is the 47th annual commemoration of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton, the infamous 1973 Supreme Court decisions that overturned every pro-life law across the nation and imposed abortion on demand, throughout all nine months of pregnancy. More than 650,000 unborn babies have been killed by abortion in Minnesota since then! More than 60 million killed nationwide since 1973. The march begins at NOON on the Capitol grounds with a short program at 12:30 pm. If you are interested in going, please talk to Ed Barnick, or LuAnn Alleman. Rides will leave from the church at 10:00 or so and we usually park in the Bethesda Hospital parking lot which is only 2 blocks from the capitol - easy access!

According to recently fired Planned Parenthood president, Dr. Leana Wen, she explained in a departure memo, "Planned Parenthood's leadership has determined that the priority of PP moving forward is to double down on abortion rights advocacy."

The Minutes of the November 2019 Council Meeting were approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was approved as presented by Dennis Korpi.

Pastor's report:

- Pastor will be on vacation from December 26-January 3. The Elders will lead the service on Sunday, Dec. 29th with Scripture readings and hymns.

- The Circuit Convocation date has been set for June 28, 2020 at Peace. There will be a joint service for all Circuit congregations at 11:00 am. More information to follow.

- Pastor Langhorst and Pastor Hoppe have set the dates for joint Bible studies of Peace, St. Paul's, Trinity-Sandstone, and Immanuel-Giese. The dates for these Bible studies are January 26th @ Trinity in Sandstone; February 2nd @ Peace; February 9th @ Immanuel in Giese; February 16th at St. Paul's, Bruno. The Bible studies will start at 12:30 pm, go for approximately 1¹/₂ hours, and then there will be a light snack provided by the hosting church. There will be a study of each of the 4 Gospels, one each week.

- There will be no Sunday school on Sunday's December 22nd and 29th.

- The Annual Voters' Assembly meeting will be Sunday, January 19, 2020.

Trustees report: The ditch between the school and the church has been dug out to help water drainage away from the area West of the church. The church's property has been surveyed. The trees along the East property line are on church property.

New Business: The Nominating Committee for 2020 church officers and boards is to be made up of the Vice-Chairman, Pastor, the Elders & Trustees whose terms are not up for election. The following positions are up for election in 2020: Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, one Elder, and two Trustees (one 1-year term, one 2-year term.

WHOSE FAULT IS IT??


