Children of God,

A lot of people have said that they wonder how it is that Jaimee and I take care of the needs and concerns of seven children. I wish I could tell you that we have some perfect system created that always works and makes everything easy. I cannot tell you that. It can be rather overwhelming at times.

Anyone charged by God with watching over other people's wellbeing can be overwhelmed with the responsibility. It does not only happen with parents and children.

Many Lutherans have been very hesitant to use the term father for pastors because of Jesus' own words in Matthew 23:9, "Call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven." But Martin Luther himself talked often about how the role of the pastors is a fatherly one in many ways. In the Large Catechism, he says, "the name spiritual father belongs only to those who govern and guide us by the Word of God."

Just like fathers in the home are to watch over their children. Pastors are given to watch over the people in their congregations. The book of Hebrews in talking about spiritual leaders says, "Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you." Yes, pastors, are to watch over the souls of those entrusted to their care.


But how is one pastor supposed to truly watch over the amount of people in each congregation or collection of congregations. I wish I could tell you again that I have some perfect system that I created that always works and makes everything easy. But I cannot tell you that. The church throughout at least recent history has employed elders in congregations to help the pastor do this work of spiritual care. But even with their help, the task can seem quite overwhelming.

I have not created a perfect system to deal with this as I mentioned, but the elders and I at Peace have created a simple way in which we are going to try to do this work better.

So beginning this month at Peace, we are going to begin to just simply work through our membership rolls in alphabetical order. We are going to take 10 households as they are listed in the annual report and make them our particular focus for that month. We are going to be thinking about you, praying for you, and trying to provide you good care for your souls. At Bruno, we are going to begin doing something very similar in our monthly fourth Sunday meetings of church officers.

That means that in March at Peace we will be focusing on the first 10 family units listed in our membership list. Will be praying for the Allemans, the Alms, the Baluts, the Barnicks and the Beckers. In Bruno, we will start alphabetically as well. We will be mentioning these people in the prayers of the Church during the month. We may reach out to you in one way or another. If you have particular concerns that you always mean to mention but never have, reach out to us during this time also! Each month in the newsletter we will note those we are praying for that month.

March is MINNESOTA FOOD SHARE month. Minnesota Food Share was founded in 1982 as a faith-based response to local hunger. During March, Minnesota corporations and individuals will match a percentage of the food and dollars received.

Across East Central Minnesota, over 8% of our neighbors do not have enough money to buy food for their families. Many of them report going hungry or skipping meals to ensure food goes to their children. Half of the individuals who visit Family Pathways are under 18 or over 65 years of age.

**IN RESPONSE to this need, Peace church will be having a "noisy change" collection on Sundays March 15 & 22. Please save your loose change each week and bring it to church when you come on these Sunday mornings in March, and we will pass around a container to gather the change. This would also be a good project for our young children. Have your child/children save their pennies, nickels and dimes so they can participate as well and feel they can help in some small way. Remind them (and yourself) of the blessings you receive from our Lord each day.

ON MARCH 20, 21 & 22 we will have "PACK THE PEW" days. We would like to encourage our members to bring a grocery bag (or 2) of non-perishables to church and PACK THE PEW in the narthex. You can bring your filled bags to church during that weekend, or when you come to church on Sunday the 22nd.

Food shelves need all types of non-perishable food, including paper products, personal and hygiene products, and cleaning products.

Think about giving larger cash donations - the food shelf can convert cash into more food than you can. Food and cash raised will be taken to our local Family Pathways Food Shelf in Sandstone which currently serves about 300 families each month, including adults, children and seniors. We hope all of our members will participate in this local mission project!
