Children of God,

In our bible classes during the week we have been working our way through the Gospel of Matthew. And we just finished going through Matthew 6. It includes many teachings but is known first and foremost because it is where we find one of the records of Jesus teaching the disciples the Lord's Prayer.

While in class we got to delve into that prayer at greater depth, here I want to just focus our thoughts on a few things we spoke about there. In particular, I want to focus our thoughts on what the Small Catechism calls the introduction to the Lord's Prayer. We think for a few minutes on the words, "Our Father who art in Heaven."

Did you know that in the Old Testament, though God often alludes to the fact that the children of Israel were in fact His spiritual children, they were not taught to call upon Him as Father in their prayers? In this way, Jesus introduced something new. And He did so with purpose.

He wanted us to understand that God wishes for us to know that He is our Father. He wishes for us to think of Him as a Father. He wishes for us to view ourselves as His children.

Luther writes in the Small Catechism, "With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father."

Yes, God is not just the Almighty Creator. He is not even just our Almighty Creator. He is our Father. We are His children. Truly. Not of course by nature like Jesus but by adoption. He has chosen us in the waters of Baptism when we were made His family by being connected to Jesus' atoning death and victorious resurrection.

And so when we pray, we do so like a young child going to their father. We go with boldness that our Father will hear us. We go with the confidence that He wants to help us. We go expecting to find His help, knowing that He like a good father will provide just what we need.

And want more good news? Your Father is in heaven with all power and authority to help you. And He begs you to come to Him with all your petitions. How often can you have someone who loves you with a relentless love and has the power to do all things who just begs you to bring your requests to Him?

If that doesn't drive you to prayer, what would. So pray then like this, "Our Father who art in Heaven.?"

Election of officers: Jenny Alleman has agreed to be a candidate for President and Jan Hahn for Secretary. Bernice Bergseth agreed to fill the remaining year of Jan's term as Vice-President. There being no other nominations, a white ballot was cast.

The LWML Zone Fall Workshop will be held Wednesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> in Isle with registration beginning at 8:30 am. Rides will leave the church at 7:45 am.

Joint Council Meeting @ Peace  
October 9, 2019 - 7:00 pm**

**Present were:** Roland Henkel, Dwight Hahn, LeRoy Thurn, John Pitts, Bill Tvedt, Don Weiss, Ed Barnick, Brad Jensen and Pastor Hoppe.

Peace Chairman Tim Koski called the meeting to order. Pastor Hoppe opened with prayer.

### **Pastor's report:**

- Confirmation classes are off to a good start with seven students @ Peace, and two students @ St. Paul's.
  - Young Family Group still getting together and meeting every month with steady attendance.
  - VBS numbers were up this year.
  - Pastor has a week left of vacation and has plans to use it.
  - Youth coordinator organized a confirmation retreat in September that went well with 8-10 participants. The future goal is every other month to have an activity.

**Old Business:** The frequency of the Joint Council Meetings was discussed. Everyone was in agreement the meetings were needed. A short discussion on the pros and cons of a once-a-year meeting was discussed. In the end, it was decided there was more benefit to both congregations to continue holding a Joint Council Meeting twice a year rotating between the two congregations.

**Motion by Dwight Hahn, seconded by LeRoy Thurn and carried to approve the schedule.**

Pastor's annual salary was discussed. There is a new application that once demographic information about the congregation is loaded will give rough guidance on pay and benefit scales for the area the church is located. This is a new program that will require a little more investigating to make the most of the information provided. Looking at rough data and 17 years of service, a motion was made by John Pitts to propose to the Voters an increase in Pastor's salary to \$51,000 plus benefits with Peace responsible for 75% and St. Paul's responsible for 25% of the cost. Second by Bill Tyedt and carried.

It was proposed to bring to the Peace Voters a plan to pay for the cleaning of the storm drain that travels from the tennis courts across the school grounds to Peace's property. If approved, this would be done this fall and the estimated cost would be \$2,000.

Meeting adjourned. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING  
Sunday, October 20, 2019 – 2:00 pm**

President Tim Koski called the meeting to order at 2:05 pm. Pastor opened with prayer.

**Voter Roll Call:** LuAnn Alleman, Ed Barnick, Bernice Bergseth, Quinton Finley, Marge Haefner, Dwight Hahn, Glen Hemphill, Roland Henkel, Pastor Hoppe, Dennis Korpi, Tim Koski, Royce Larson, Rich Mensing, Ron Osladil, John Pitts, Elaine Steeg, Bill Tvedt, Don Weiss.

Motion by Don Weiss, second by Rich Mensing & carried to accept the Minutes of the July 21, 2019 Quarterly Voters' Meeting. Minutes from July amended to read, "Women of Peace requested permission to buy from their funds a small chest freezer for the kitchen."

Dennis Korpi distributed the **Treasurer's report**. Motion by Rich Mensing, second by Bill Tvedt and carried to accept the report as presented.

There was no regular Peace Council meeting in July or September.

**Pastor's report:**

- Pastor will be starting an adult instruction class on Monday, October 21<sup>st</sup>.
- Bible Studies are on Tuesday afternoon and evenings at this time.
- There are a total of eight in Confirmation between Peace and St. Paul's.
- Items purchased with Memorial Funds will be dedicated soon.
- The Circuit Youth Worker, LeAnne Gregoire, had a Confirmation Retreat recently and intends to hold a youth activity every other month in the future.

**Elders**

- The Pastor's 2020 salary has been reviewed and the Joint Council recommends approval of \$51,000 annual salary, plus use of the parsonage, and other allowances. Motion by Dwight Hahn, second by Quinton Finley and approved. The fair market value for rent of the parsonage plus utilities, has been set at \$1,250/month, or \$15,000 annually. St. Paul's will pay 25% of the expenses and peace will pay 75%.
- The inactive member list was distributed and discussed. Six names of members "attending other non-LCMS churches" were removed from the rolls on motion by Don Weiss, seconded by Bill Tvedt and carried. All other names of those who the Elders were "unable to contact", or were "contacted and understand that due to their lack of participation they will be removed from the rolls," were removed from the rolls on motion by Don Weiss, seconded by Roland Henkel and carried.

**Trustees:**

- In order to maintain the church property without encroaching on adjacent property owners, the church property will be surveyed, and existing markers found or established. The estimated cost is \$800. Motion by Ron Osladil, seconded by Don Weiss and carried to proceed with this.
- Water drainage to the West of the parking lot continues to be a problem. The ditch is on school property, but is the county's ditch. Peace has been given the OK to clean the ditch at Peace's expense. Motion by Roland Henkel, seconded by Dwight Hahn and carried to give permission to clean the ditch at an estimated expense of \$2,000 - \$2,500.
- There is a bump at the end of the handicap ramp in front of the church, and the front steps do not have proper rises. Bill Tvedt continues to work with contractors regarding this situation.

**Board of Education:** The Sunday School has seen large fluctuations in attendance – 10-28 per Sunday.

**Old Business:**

- The Security Committee has purchased cameras for monitoring the church entrance. Currently the front entrance is monitored in Pastor's and LuAnn's office.
- WiFi coverage in the church will be switched to SCI if the contract with Frontier has reached its end. Motion by Tim Koski, second by Roland Henkel to proceed with this change.
- Keyless door operators will be investigated since the panic door operators will not work with residential type doors.
- The chest freezer has been purchased for the kitchen by the *Women of Peace*.

**NO New Business**

Meeting adjourned at 3:12 pm. Pastor led all in the Lord's Prayer.
