Greetings in Christ,

I apologize in advance to those who may have heard some of this before in Bible study or in a different setting but several people have asked me about the conference that I presented at in Kansas and what I was asked to teach there.

A pastor friend of mine named Dan Galchutt and I have for some time now been producing resources for people to use in their home for daily devotions and for training up their children to live out the Christian life throughout their days. We were asked by the Kansas District to summarize some of the things we have learned and wanted to teach. They ended up asking us to present at their conference of Lutheran educators with the idea that they would record our sessions and distribute them on a DVD to the Kansas congregations.

We had three one hour sessions to present material. And so, we divided up the material we wanted to share into talking about why, how, and to what end families should make teaching the faith in the home a priority in their lives.

In answering the question of why one should make this a priority, we gave two main reasons. First, the fact is that all of us are receiving insane amounts of information every day through what we see and hear and watch. Most of that information is not helpful in regards to the living out of our faith. Therefore, even more than ever before, we need to make sure that we are engaging with God's word and connecting with Jesus our Savior daily. Secondly, the prime task of this daily gathering around God's Word in the Scriptures is not given to pastors but to the head of the household. Therefore, rather than trying to create more church programs, we encouraged trying to help those heads of the household to do this work that is their responsibility.

In answering the question of how one should do this work, we suggested that the family should read the Word together, pray together, memorize the Word and other texts of the Christian faith like the Creeds and the Lord's Prayer together, and sing hymns together. We presented our resource called a Simple Approach to Daily Devotions which you can find printed out on green paper at either of our churches.

Finally, in answering the question of to what end we should do this work, we rejoiced in God's wisdom that those who are trained up in the way that they should go in regards to the faith will not depart from it when they are old. We also rejoiced that not only would children benefit from this practice but that everyone in the household would as well. Even the church at large would benefit. Marriages would be stronger, sibling relationships would be less troubled, and the church would be filled with good laypeople and church workers who know the Word and love the Lord's salvation.

I hope this brief summary encourages you to take time to consider how you are living out the Christian life at home and to consider engaging in a time each day where you gather those in your house around the Word. A service of Christian burial for Larry was held here at Peace on Wednesday, October 3rd.



Wednesday, October 10, 2018 – 7 pm**

Attendance: Pastor Hoppe; from Peace: Dennis Korpi, Dwight Hahn, John Pitts, Ron Osladil, Don Weiss, Tim Koski, Ron Volk, Ed Barnick, LeRoy Thurn, Royce Larson. NO Council Members from St. Paul's were in attendance.

Chairman Tim Koski called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. Pastor Hoppe led the group in prayer.

Motion made by Ron Osladil, second by LeRoy Thurn and carried to approve the minutes of the April 2018 Joint Council meeting as read. Motion by LeRoy Thurn, second by Don Weiss and carried to approve the minutes of the September Regular Council Meeting.

The Treasurer's report was accepted as presented by Dennis Korpi.

Pastor's report:

- Next week Pastor Hoppe will go to Kansas to a conference where he will present the material being used for the Young Adults Group. He will be back by Thursday.
- The parsonage has switched internet service for faster uploading capability.
- Nothing definite on the feedback timing of the requested Constitution changes from the District has been received.
- Pastor mentioned an upcoming Baptism and Adult Confirmation.
- Sunday School Superintendents, Mary Nelson & Kate Alm, have requested reimbursement for registration and mileage to the Institute of Creation Research training session at Lutheran Island Camp. Motion by Don Weiss, second by Dwight Hahn and approved.
- The Circuit Youth Worker is now supervised by the Pastor and one lay person from each supporting congregation. Hinckley has now joined in supporting the Youth Worker, making five congregations, each with two members on the supervising committee.
- Pastor Vogt from Moose Lake/Barnum, was elected to attend the Synodical Convention in 2019. A lay person, and an alternate were also elected from the MN North District.

The Elders continue to review the inactive member situation.

Trustees – Kneeling pads and their installation will be discussed at the Voters' Assembly Meeting.

The Youth Group is continuing to raise money for attending a conference in Wisconsin next year instead of the National Convention.

Old Business: The road work at the cemetery will go forward. The total cost has been reduced to \$5,500. The Catholic Church is asking if Peace would participate in the expenses. They are asking for \$2,500 from Peace. This will be decided by the Voters.

New Business: The schedule for upcoming services will be reviewed with the Council at St. Paul's and then discussed with Peace in the next few weeks.

Motion by Don Weiss, second by Bill Tvedt & carried to accept the Minutes of the July 15, 2018 Quarterly Voters' Meeting.

Dennis Korpi distributed the Treasurer's report. Motion by Bill Tvedt, second by Rich Mensing and carried to accept the report as presented.

Pastor's report:

- The Circuit Worker, LeAnn Gregoire, has organized two activities with the youth. There was a Confirmation student retreat and a Bible Study with bowling for grades 7-12. The five churches supporting her have agreed to fund her through 2019.

The Council will then consider the suggestions and maintain a list for those interested in specific projects.

New Business:

- Motion by Rich Mensing, second by Elaine Steeg to give the MN No. District \$11,000 for Mission Commitment in 2019.
- The road that the Catholic Church intends to add in the cemetery will cost \$5,500. Motion by Don Weiss, second by Dennis Korpi and carried to contribute \$2,500 to the project since it will benefit Peace Cemetery as well.
- Kneeling pads will be placed at the Communion rails on both sides. The center gates will remain.
- The MN No. District is sending a semi load of potatoes to Southern Texas through Orphan Grain Train at a cost of \$3,500. The Voters voted to donate \$100 to the cost of the shipping.

Meeting adjourned at 3:10 pm. Pastor led all in the Lord's Prayer.
