# ODE TO A PIPEWRENCH


When winter comes with snow and ice, The plumber throws away his vise; Picks up a book and kisses his mate, Hops on a bus, and heads for N.A.I.T.

# ELECTRONICS CLUB NEWS




# PAINTERS AND DECORATORS 2 nd year
