

Shown here is a scaled replica of the New NAITSA Credit Card which will all but eliminate tool chits for next year.

The new credit card will be used n the McNally Library, Drafting Stores, the Physical Education tores, and for NAITSA functions. This card will also be used for obtaining a yearbook, voting on elections and referendums, as well as serve as an identification card to activities to be held at NAIT.

Some of the Instructions printed on the back side of the credit card

- 1. This card MUST be carried by students at ALL TIMES.

- 3. The student whose name appears on this card will be held personally liable for all items and obligations incurred by its
- 4. Students must present this card for a yearbook.
- Students must report a change of address to the MAIN OF-FICE - IMMEDIATELY.
- 6. A charge of \$5.00 will be levied against any student who destroys or looses this card, as a new card shall have to be printed and issued.
- It is hoped that this card will begin a new regime at NAIT 2. The loss, damaging, or finding where a student's signature is all of this card must be reported that is needed for borrowing items.

The object of the Toastmaster's Club is to help you gain confidence in yourself and to show you how to use gestures properly. It also shows you how to conduct a meeting in the proper manner. Upon joining Toastmasters, each person is presented with a set of manuals plus a monthly bulletin put out by Toastmasters International. You are also eligible to be asked to any of the other Toastmaster's Clubs in Edmonton as a guest speaker. The aim of Toastmasters is punctuality. Each meeting, which occurs every Wednesday, starts at exactly 5:45 p.m. and ends at exactly 7:30 p.m., give or take a few seconds!

You also get a chance to express your own opinions. About once every three weeks you will be required to give a prepared talk which should last five minutes. The topic is given to you the week before its presentation. At each meeting, table talks are given. These are impromptu speeches which need last only about one and half minutes. If you wish to have further information about NAIT's Toastmaster's Club, any one of the executive would be more than happy to supply you with it.
