

Mr. Victor Harms, vice-principal academic, was Awards Day chairman. After the Invocation, given by the Revered N.W. Dreger, Mr. Harms introduced the platform party and the donors' representatives. Mr. W.A.B. Saunders gave his report. He mentioned that a total of \$21,065 had been donated for the 6th annual Awards Day. This money was unsolicited, which goes to show the esteem with which the donor firms and groups hold NAIT. Mr. Saunders said that much credit is due to the wives, husbands or parents of the winners, for the work they have done to help the students.

Mr. Lorne Thompson, head of Business and Vocational Education, introduced the speaker, Mr. J.P. Mitchell, the Director of Technical and Vocational Training in the Departm ent of Education, who spoke in the place of the Hon. R. C. Clark who was not able to attend due to urgent business. Mr. Thompson told the audience that Mr. Mitchell had been the first President of NAIT, during its building stage of two years.

Mr. Mitchell's address was on technical institutes in Canada. He pointed out that his remarks were his own opinions, not official policy or views. The institutes found

in Europe are highly specialized engineering colleges: the two bestknown in the U.S.--Cal Tech and MIT--follow the European plan. The Canadian Institutes of Technology are unique. They offer an alternative to the high school gradwates who find that their high school diploma does not do too much for them, but who do not wish to attend university. People come to NAIT, which offers many different technological courses, because it fits their needs. The students at NAIT are not rejects from other institutions.

It was found that a very large percentage of full-time students had their high school diploma. Of these, an impressive number had their senior matriculation and university entrance. Most of the students lacking a high school diploma had 95 credits.

The main problem facing technological institutes, and their graduates, is the lack of awareness, among employers and the public, of what a diploma in technology represents. It is hoped that this problem will be solved within the next ten years. By that time, the public should have a better idea of the training and work necessary to gain such a diploma.



The following is a Ryersonian Editorial I would like to pass on to you as food for thought.

By looking through the papers these days one gets the idea that something akin to a global, constant earthquake is occuring.

On universities around the world students occupy building and police battle them in attempts to remove them. In the United States violence, both political and criminal, is growing. There is more crime committed in New York city than in Britain.

In England unions make demands for higher wages and the Labor government attempts to stop them. In London, the postal workers staged a 24-hour strike, the bank workers walked out and students at the London School of Economics occupied the buildings and held strikes.

In New York the public school system is periodically closed down as a result of the demands for community control by minority groups. San Francisco State College has been kept open with only 15 to 20 per cent attendance by an armed body of police.

In Canada, black students and white supporters occupied part of Sir George William University charging racism. Cops were called into Simon Fraser University and University of New Brunswickat Moncton. Our Indian population is demanding more rights. The cost of living index continues upward.

In Vietnam the world's mightiest military machine has been bogged down by guerillas. In Paris it took months for the shape of the peace talk table to be decided. (One psychiatrist says that a round or oval table encouraged flexibility).

In Italy workers are staging strikes to get higher wages and better working conditions. Students are demanding better facilities.

Six thousand police stormed the University of Tokyo to get students out of the buildings. It took days to dislodge the students who had held the building for a year and fought back.

It has been a year since the Tet offensive inVietnam which swept away American claims of a military victory and was a factor in forcing the resignation of Johnson.

It has been less than a year since the workers and students of France almost toppled De Gaulle. The French government fears a repetition of those May-June days.

The world is seething. A war is continuing in Nigeria. Another one might break out in the Middle East. The world is arming itself at high costs to the people. There are enough nuclear weapons to kill everyone on this plant several times over.

Plans are made to send men to the moon while people starve. Jumbo jets will fly over the world's slums.

To many the world is a bleak, frightful place to live in now. And the future does not seem to hold any forseeable improvements.

The feelings of depression and the desire to escape is strong among many. These desires are reflected in our music, our culture, and in the increasing use of drugs.

But the world has gone through similar situations and survived. Many individuals see basic ills in society and wish to correct them. They meet strong opposition from the establishment yet continue in their attempts. The present era is a revolutionary one A revolutionary ones similar to those eras in Europe in the late 18th century, also of 1948 and post World War 1.


Many governments cannot meet the demands made on them by their people. Unrest is spreading. The world situation is unstable because national and local situations are unstable.

This may sound pessimistic, but it's reality. This is not to say that there is nothing right with the world. Science and medicine are advancing. But individuals must arrive at an understanding of what is happening. Once they do that they should go out and act.

Don't sit around complaining, correct the situation. Don't wish for something better, attempt to implement something better.

HOW TO CREATE A LOVLIER YOU

Make-up sipplies: Towel and head band Alcohol Sterilizer Cleansing tissues Powder

Spatula Cleansing cream Astringent

Paste Rouge for lips and cheeks Powder base

Cream rouge (or blushers)

Eyebrow pencil

Mascara Eyeshadow

Cotton

Lipstick applicator Method:

1) Put head band on. 2) Apply cleansing cream.

3) Remove cream with cleansing tissue or towel.

4) Apply a stringent, moisten cotton with astringent and go over face and neck with upward motion until all cream is removed.

5) Apply foundation cream or lotion and apply sparingly to nose and chin where pores are large. 6) Apply powder.

a) Choose shade to match natural coloring of skin

b) Apply sparingly and blend evenly with upward and outward strokes. c) Avoid leaving a line of demarcation at hairline or under chin. *Cream rouge is applied before the face is powdered, whereas dry rouge is applied after the face has been powdered.

7) Apply rouge (blusher)

a) study face to determine proper application

b) remove small quantity of rouge from container

c) put rouge on cheek area

d) avoid a distinct line where rouge (blusher) application stops

8) Apply lipstick

a) study shape of mouth and determine proper lip-rouge application. Shape of lips may be changed.

b) apply lip rouge with lipstick applicator. Outline upper lip, then lower lip, starting at corners and working toward center and then fill in outlines.

c) blot excess rouge with tissue. 9) Apply eye shadow

a) select shade to match eyes or to complement them.


b) apply on upper lid only and blend up and out to meet brow line. *Try something different, white eye shadow instead of col-


10) shake powder on sterile cotton and dust lightly on face and neck. 11) apply eyebrow pencil

a) brush brows lightly, then use short strokes of eyebrow pencil and follow natural contour of brow. Brush brows again to smooth the pencil line.

12) Apply selected shade of mas-

a) apply mascara by brushing back and forth from roots to the tips.





HAIR STYLES


1. CASUAL

Set hair as shown in the diagram using jumbo rollers throughout. When hair is dry, brush well until all roller ridges are removed. Part hair low on one side, then brush smoothly down, turning the ends under all around into a page

Set is on jumbo rollers throughout. When hair is dry, brush well to loose set, then brush hair down and back over ears from the low side part, secure at back to form the large curls with rattail comb, back brushing lightly, spray to hold curls in place.
