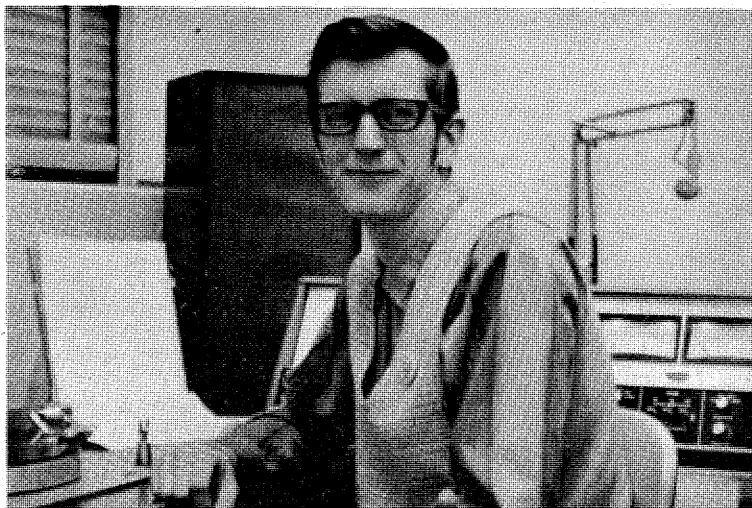

GLENN TRACY RESIGNS FROM CHNR

Glenn J. Tracy has resigned from his position as director of CHNR (NAIT Radio). He felt, among other things, that he should devote more time to his school work.

Glenn started working for CHNR in 1967 as an announcer and assistant to the chief engineer. In 1968 he was elected as chief engineer and he filled this position for the full year. At this time he was largely responsible for the acquisition of the new control room (E-129B). In May, 1969, he was elected assistant director of NAIT Radio, and it wasn't until late August when the director, Roy Smith, resigned to take over Advertising duties, that Glenn assumed full responsibilities as director.

In April 1969, Glenn went before council and asked for a budget of \$10,000 in order to supply NAIT Radio with professional radio equipment. The budget was passed

and Glenn spent the summer of 1969 laying out the proper wiring of the control room.

I talked with Glenn to find out his feelings as it now stands. Reporter: "Do you feel that CHNR has now reached professional

standing?" Glenn: "It's very hard to improve the sound as there's too much bass in it right now. As for announcers, there are some good ones and some bad, but you have to realize that for most this is their first year as announcers.

They are greatly improving though." Reporter: "How do you feel about the newly formed News Department?" Glenn: "I think it's great and I know a lot of people listen to the news." Reporter: "What suggestions would you make to improve CHNR?" Glenn: "Many people here at NAIT feel that CHNR is a separate entity of its own. It's owned by the students and run by the students for the students. It would be crazy for them not to co-operate with RTA as they can complement each other. But many people seem to feel that RTA are the only people who are allowed on the air. I would like to straighten out this fallacy. There are people in other technologies around this institute who could do as well if not better than those

in RTA, and all that is required of them is to come down here to get some training. A good example of that is Andy Michaelson from CJCA, who started out with NAIT Radio. He was in Distributive at the time." Reporter: "Will you still be associated with CHNR in any way?" Glenn: "I plan on doing the occasional radio show and I will act in an advisory capacity on the executive." Reporter: "Who is now assuming the responsibilities of director?" Glenn: "Jack Lambert, who was previously Promotions Director. I think he will do a real great job!"

The NUGGET would like to take this opportunity to wish Glenn the best of luck in all his future endeavors.

ON BIRTH CONTROL

In Canada a book which sells over 5,000 copies is a best seller. By this standard a "Birth Control Handbook" being circulated by Canadian students is an all-time best seller. The Handbook, now in its fourth printing, is, however, not for sale, although probably 80-100,000 copies are in circulation. It has been published by the student bodies of about 30 Universities and colleges, several technical institutes, the CUS, and several hospitals and Family Planning Associations, not to mention 4 Women's Liberation Groups. It has been distributed free of charge to those bodies. An introduction to the 40 page pamphlet states that: "Conception control necessarily carries liberating potential for women...A woman may safely engage in pleasurable sexual relations without automatically submitting to the humiliating protective-dependent relationship with a man which is ordinarily imposed...She is not compelled to enter sexual relations or adopt a particular life style in order to maintain a certain standard of living."

"For all women birth control is a personal decision which will affect the nature of society. This publication attempts to provide the information necessary in making that very important decision."

And in making this information available, the pamphlet fulfills its goal entirely adequately. The only inadequacies are those in the fields of science which are responsible for advancing knowledge of the field. Particularly disappointing to the author is the fact that there is so very little work being done on methods of conception control for males. The methods which have been developed are entirely inadequate. The pamphlet does an excellent job in discussing them, in spite of that fact. Its tone is

straightforward; none of the embarrassed tone of the traditional "father-son" or "mother-daughter" talks. None of the technical jargon of the other books which are available. Indeed, it was written by students and scrutinized by numerous medical specialists for technical accuracy. Anatomy, male and female; hormones and the menstrual cycle; conception. This is the first time I can remember picking up a book with these ominous headings, and being able to understand what is being said. Oral contraceptives; how they work, what they cost, side effects; for the first time, I have finished reading articles on these questions and come away with a clear picture of the dangers involved, presented in a factual way, without distortion to one side or another. There are dangers, and they are stated factually and coolly, in their proper perspective. For example, deaths per 100,000 women from pulmonary cerebral thromboembolism is only .2, among non-pill users, while among pill users it is 1.5. However, in contrast, death rate by abortion is 5.6 per 100,000 pregnancies. And the statistics cover all other aspects of the pill.

Condoms, I.U.D.'s, Diaphragms, and spermicidal contraceptives discussed in turn, as is the rhythm method proposed in Pope Paul's Encyclical "Humanae Vitae". It, too, is explained in practical, down-to-earth terms. Frequency of the use of the various methods, and their effectiveness are rated. Sterilization, and abortion occupy the second and third last chapters. The latter chapter ends up with the grim tone "BUTCHER ABORTIONS ARE

DEADLY - ONLY DOCTORS OR OTHER SPECIALLY TRAINED PERSONNEL CAN SAFELY USE ONE OF THE 4 METHODS OF ABORTION - ALL OTHER METH-

ODS CAN CAUSE DEATH BUT RARELY INDUCE ABORTION."

Finally, a glossary explains all terminology, although the best single thing about this pamphlet is that its use of technical terms is an absolute minimum. A Bibliography refers interested persons to more extensive documentation on the questions taken up by this excellent pamphlet.

In an age such as the present, when North Americans consume up to 40% of the world's available natural resources and when 2 out of 3 people are undernourished, the question of birth control must concern all of us. Although very often the problem of undernourishment is a problem not of production, but of rationalization of distribution through improved social organization, we must realize that we cannot continue to consume our natural resources at the present rate, and waste at our present rate, and hope to keep this planet inhabitable. This pamphlet does an excellent job in confronting the problems of "conspicuous consumption and waste" and in informing its readers of one aspect of the problem, and one solution. The problem is one to be confronted by every living human being. As human beings (biologically at least) our students' association should bulk purchase this pamphlet, which sells for \$35. per thousand, and make it available to its entire membership. It is available from the McGill Students Society, 3480 McTavish St., Montreal.

Today, a controversy is raging across our continent, should we or should we not legalize marijuana? Some people say there are no side effects, others claim there are. Some people claim marijuana to be less harmful than alcohol. I agree that a BB gun is less harmful than a .357 Magnum. I agree that there may not be any side-effects from smoking the occasional stick of pot. But, there is another side effect that not too many people recognize. Through the association that is a part of marijuana smoking, other more harmful addicting substances will be available. Not every pot-smoker will use these more harmful drugs even though they are available. But a good percentage of the pot smokers will want to try at least once, some of these more harmful drugs.

No matter how a person looks at this social problem ethically, morally, physically or spiritually, it is wrong for any person to not learn to stand on their own inner resources. After a time, any person smoking pot, knows he will get a relief from various tight situations, all he had to do is light up. This does not solve their problem, in the long run it will add to their original situation.

Marijuana is not harmful? Eighteen milligrams are toxic. There are no side effects, kidney malfunction is a direct result of over indulgence in pot. Not all pot smokers go on to using hard drugs, 87% of all heroin-addicts who went through Lexington, Kentucky began their addictive lives, by first smoking marijuana. You

say that none of this is significant to this generation, you say 'I can control my usage'. I said the very same thing in 1946, and lived the next twenty-one years as a criminal drug-addict. Not everyone is addiction-prone, but to those people who are, their lives can become Hell on earth.

Is it worth finding out?

VANCOUVER'S "SPRING" A BAND FOR ALL SEASONS

The Jefferson Airplane's recent Vancouver appearance marked a highlight for Vancouver's music fans who follow that city's fast moving music scene. The Airplane played for two hours, left the stage and returned to play a half hour encore. Although this is the usual length of an Airplane concert it is still remarkable considering many lesser known and unestablished groups sometimes play for less than an hour. The Airplane is like that. Along with playing such a long show, the group tries to play a free concert for every paid one.

After the show, the Airplane showed up at the Parlour, a new late night Vancouver night club. The club is owned and operated by Dave Graham who was formerly road manager for Papa Bear's. Jango, an Edmonton group, was playing at the club during that particular night. The jazz-blues orientated group, consists of Hans Stammer and Wayne Kozak (formerly with the Privilege), Tom Doran (Tommy Banks), Gay Delorme (Toronto's Crazy Horse) and an organist and pianist who have also

worked around Edmonton. Although Jango had only been together about two weeks ago when I saw them, they were very impressive. Jango will probably be Vancouver's top group within two months.

The following day I had a chance to interview Jorma Kaukonen, the Jefferson Airplane's lead guitarist, who was very enthusiastic about Jango and in particular Hans Stammer, the group's vocalist.

Another band I made a point of seeing were SPRING who were playing at the Bistro that weekend. I have seen the group numerous times during the last nine months and they continually impress me. "Cat" the group's new drummer (formerly with Papa Bear's) has added a lot to the group. "Cat" plays a very solid beat, where "Spring's" former drummer had a tendency to play around it. They are one of Canada's most talented groups and should have a single release during November. "Spring" is managed by an agency called "Grandmothers", operated by Jim Allan, who was also responsible for arranging The Poppy Family's recent concert here.

A double album will be released within the next few weeks featuring Vancouver top bands. It will be called "Benefit" with all the proceeds going to Cool-Aid. The \$6.95 album features two songs each by the Collector's, Spring, Mother Tucker's Yellow Duck, Seeds of Time, Black Snake, Papa Bear's (R.I.P.) and one other Vancouver band.

Locally, the recent Black Snake, Seeds of Time, etc. show at the Kinsman Fieldhouse was very successful. The two Vancouver bands along with Stoney Plane came across best musically. A lot of good shows have taken place in the Fieldhouse lately but all have been hampered with poor acoustics and seating.

Black Snake is becoming one of Edmonton's biggest attractions consistently drawing large crowds. This is largely due to the groups talented and tasteful guitarist Patie MacDonall. Seeds of Time, also of Vancouver, were the most entertaining group on the show. They performed a number of comical skits and delighted the audience with some country and western material.

RECORD REVIEWS

The Youngbloods - R.C.A. Victor (LSP - 3724)

Actually, this is the first album released by the Youngbloods (over two years ago) but has recently started selling again because their single "Get Together" is included on it. Of the groups' three albums, this is probably their worst, but considering the high calibre of their last two, this does not mean that it is a bad album.

Ever since this album was recorded, the Youngbloods have enjoyed a reputation as being one of the most "together" groups in the states. The album contains no disappointments but the exceptional songs include "Grissely Bear" (the groups first single release), "Get Together" and "Foolin' Around (The Waltz)".

"Get Together", has a beautiful history behind it. It received a lot of airplay and was one of the theme songs for San Francisco's summer of love in 1967.

New Years Eve 1967, found the Youngbloods playing Vancouver's old Retinal Circus. At exactly midnight instead of playing "Old Lang Syne" or something similar, the group played "Get Together". I cannot think of another song that would be equally appropriate for the occasion.

A serious movement is now afoot in the United States to make "Get Together" the new American national anthem. Although it probably wouldn't happen, it's a beautiful thought.

If you like down to earth music with an honest bluegrass flavour, you should own at least one Youngbloods album.

MARTHA VALEX - FIENDS & ANGELS* SIRE (SES 97008)

Few female singers have achieved a great deal of success since the groups took over the music industry. Fewer still have made it singing blues. With her debut album, Martha Valez has proven that she has the talent and the blues feeling to rate with Janis Joplin, Tracy Nelson (Mother Earth) and Julie Driscoll.

"Fiends & Angels" is a truly

fine album. The studio musicians (especially the lead guitarist) are some of the best I've heard. Unfortunately, no credit is given to them on the liner notes. Recorded in England, the sound reproduction is excellent while Martha Valez's songs are superb.

Although it is basically a blues album, it touches R & B in spots. My favourites on the album are "A Fool For You" and old Ray Charles song and "Drive Me Daddy". During both of these songs, she generates the same type of excitement as Janis Joplin.

The Guess Who - Canned Wheat - R.C.A. Victor (LSP-4157)

The first thing you notice about this album is the catchy title and the beautiful layout. The album itself shows the Guess Who's versatility in handling almost all kinds of musical styles. They come across as an amazingly tight group while Burton Cummings emerges as one of the really good singers in rock music.

"Undone", the Guess Who's latest single is one of the best releases of the year. It is included on the album along with two other previously released singles, "Laughing" and "Of A Dropping Pin". Randy Bachman's guitar and Burton Cummings short flute bridge establish a beautiful jazz background to "Undone".

When the Guess Who were in town during the summer, Ihor Todoruk (editor & publisher of Poppin') and I spoke with Randy Bachman for about two hours. He was very enthusiastic about a song they had just recorded called "Key". The twelve minute song is included on the album and is indeed very impressive. "Key" is a biblical song featuring a drum solo by Garry Peterson that is really superb. "Canned Wheat" finishes on a weird note with a verbal thing called "Fzir Warning".

Gordon MacCalder is a 2nd year Distributive Technology student in the sales option. He is Distributive's Treasurer and likes money!! (Any way he can get it!)

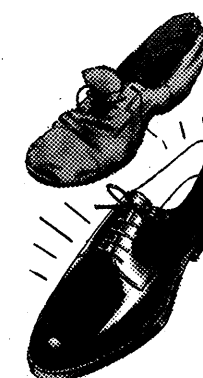
Val Lynn is a 1st year student in Social Services. Val is interested in Police work and we think she will be some cop!!

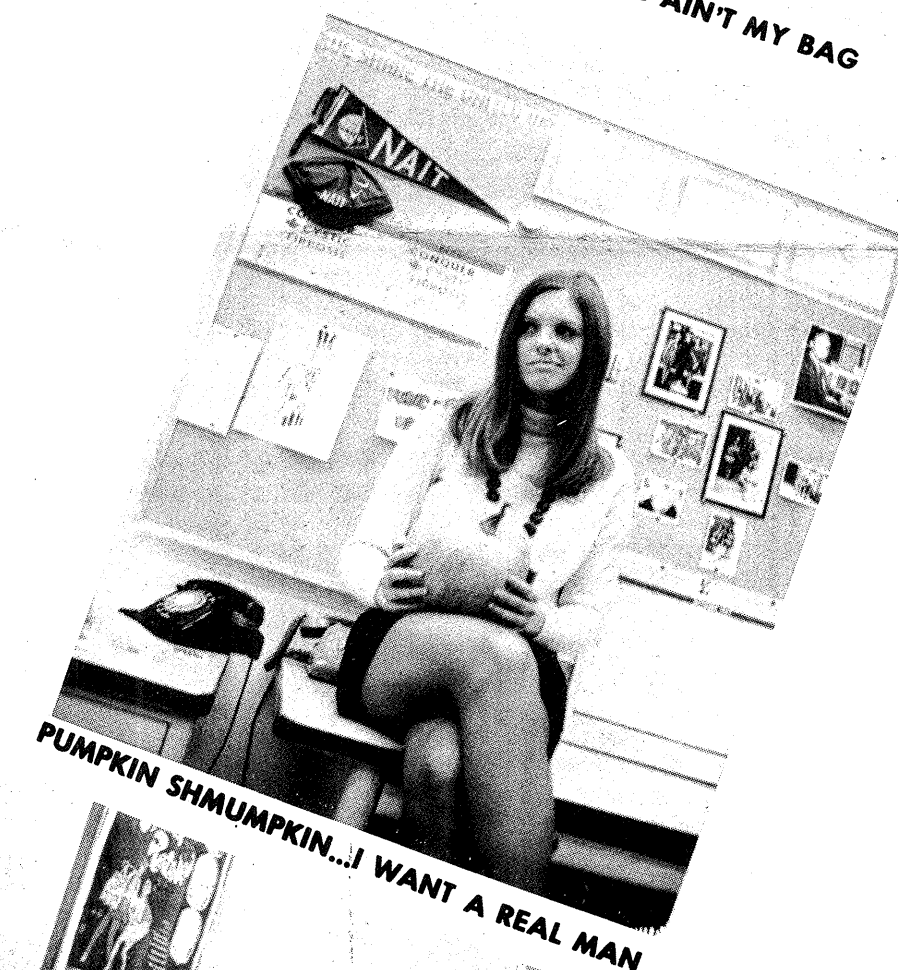

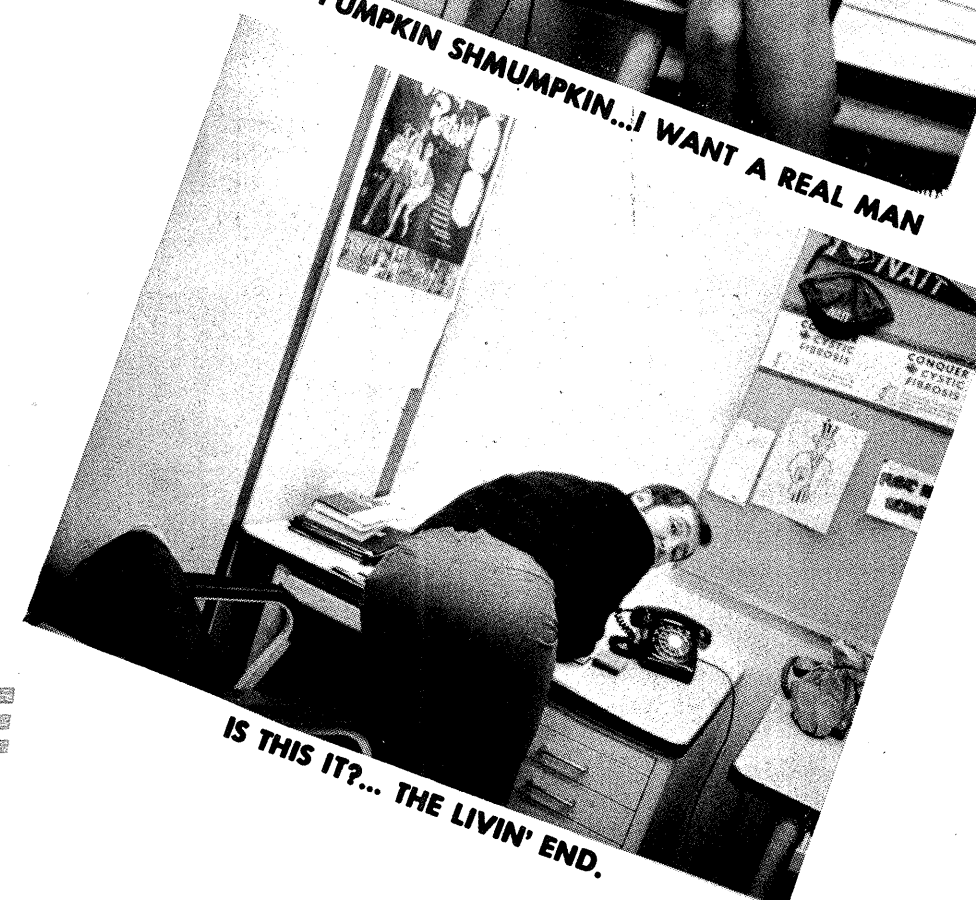

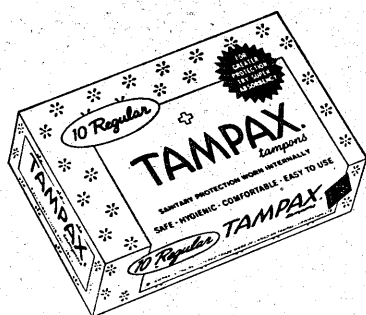

DISTRIBUTIVE CLUB NEWS

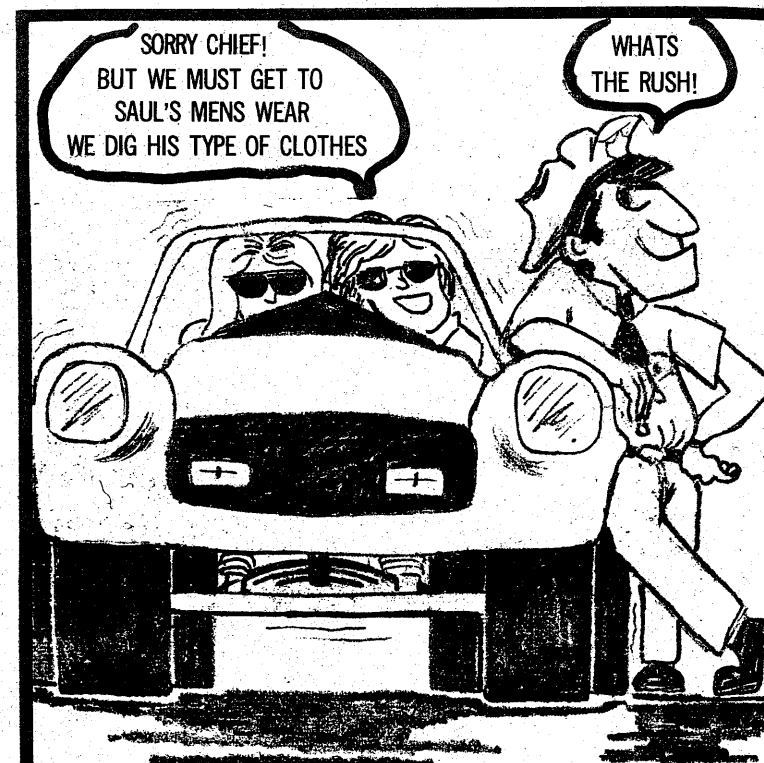
The Distributive Club is holding its fourth bash of the year on October 31. This event will be held at the home of the Great Pumpkin, Highlands Hall.

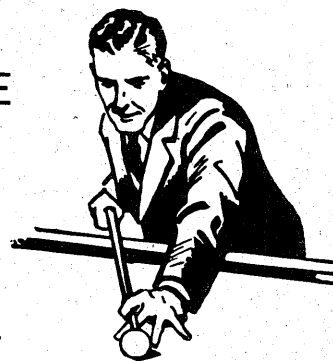

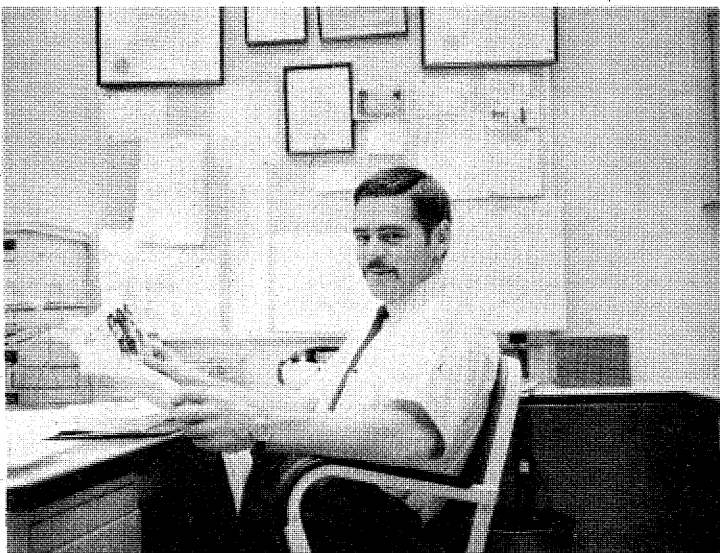

Our first subject is Mr. R.G. Meadus, Director of Student Services.

We will welcome suggestions from the students for subjects for future issues. The person must be working to aid student activities. This will include people who are working to organize intramural sports, or the sparkplug on your technology club. The new feature has been set up as the result of a letter to the Editor. We do listen, but if you say nothing, we can't hear you.



MR. MEADUS, DIRECTOR OF STUDENT SERVICES

Mr. Meadus, as Director of Student Services, is responsible to the administration for all student services. These encompass the library, counselling and health services, physical education, the registrar's department, and the student activity program.

Mr. Meadus said that his general purpose--for the student activity program--is to aid the student in carrying out co-curricular activities to meet their desires and needs. His first task upon coming to NAIT involved the setting up of a student government.

This was done by student committees and Mr. Meadus. A constitution was gradually worked out over the winter, and the first elections held in the spring of 1963.

An important part of student-involvement plans was the formation of technology clubs. Two objectives in getting students working together were hoped for: social organization; and professional organization in the form of films, speakers, and events to add to classroom instruction. The clubs are doing quite well in the social sphere, but not too well on the professional end. The only group to provide professional stimulation is the IEEE, which is restricted to electrical and electronics-type technologies.

Mr. Meadus sees a couple of developments as pleasing ones. These are the involvement of students in policy-making bodies; the General Faculty Council, and the Principal's Advisory Committee. At the time NAITSA was formed, no one had any ideas of the future student participation in the affairs of NAIT.

There is one thing about which Mr. Meadus feels strongly. This is the lack of community identity at NAIT. The administration, students, and staff must develop a feeling of community. After all, this is the place where we spend a large portion of our waking hours. On this, he said, "The students are as much to blame as is the staff for lack of community spirit". He pointed out that the students are clamoring for, and receiving a greater voice in running the institute, but do not show

any interest in letting the staff venture suggestions in student activities. If we want to get along better, we will have to co-operate.

One area of co-operation the proposed building program will give, and something Mr. Meadus wants to see, is the inclusion of all services in a Community Center Building. This would include Students' Union offices, without being a Students' Union Building. It would include a Staff Dining Room and Lounge, without being a Faculty Club. It would simply be the Community Center, for those who teach and learn here, for the citizens of NAIT.

During the course of the interview, I remarked that one of the reasons for the progress of student government and voice in policy must be the help of the principal Mr. Saunders. Mr. Meadus emphasized that most of the student activities have been made possible because of Mr. Saunders' complete help and co-operation; too often he does not get the recognition he deserves.

I asked Mr. Meadus if he enjoyed his work. He had no hesitation in saying, "It's the best in the world".

The students of NAIT have a good friend in Mr. Meadus.

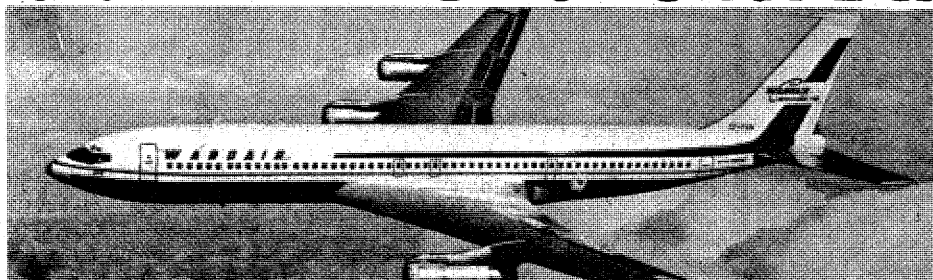
