N.A.I.T.'s Ookpiks...What have you got to lose by trying out?

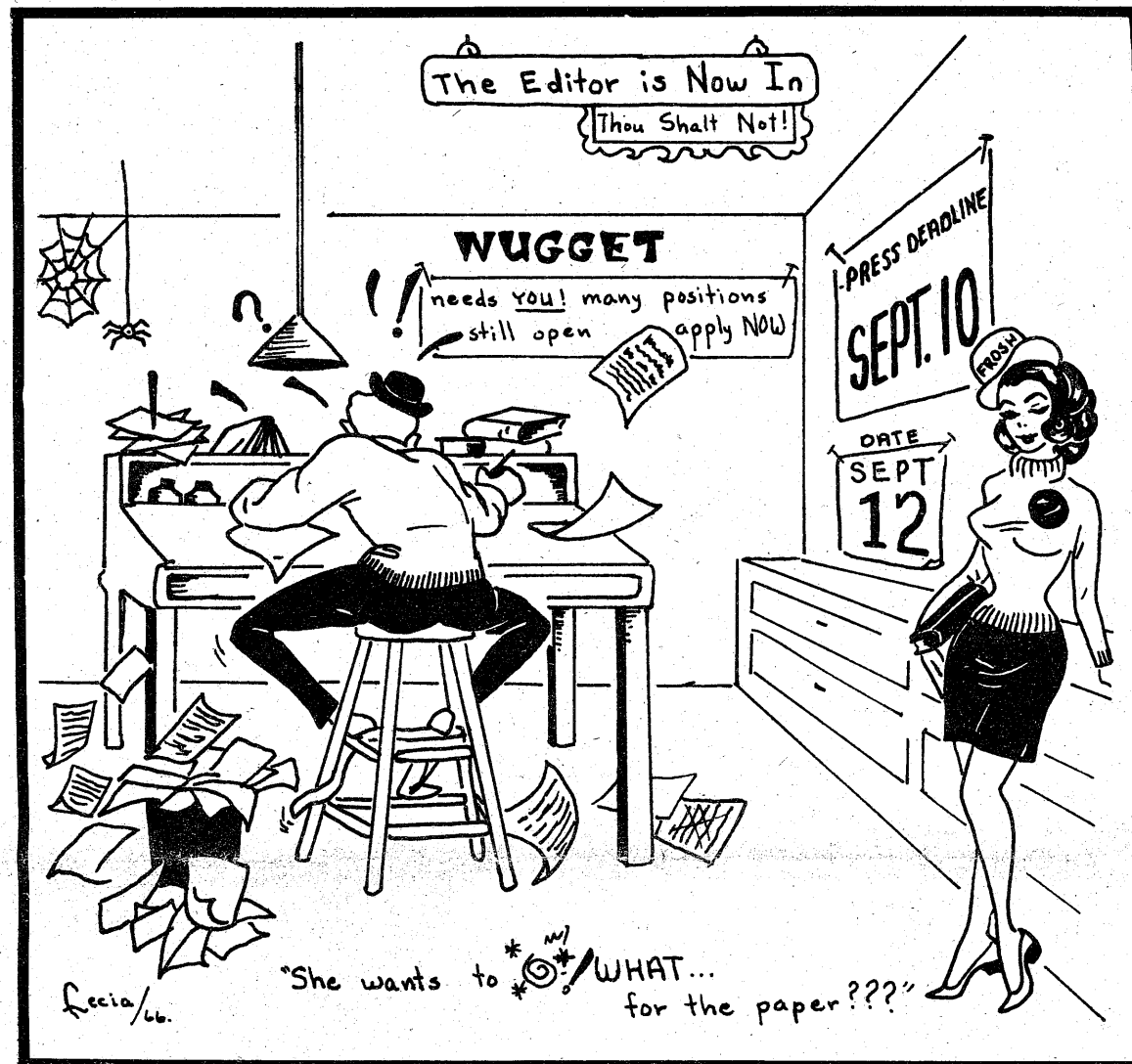

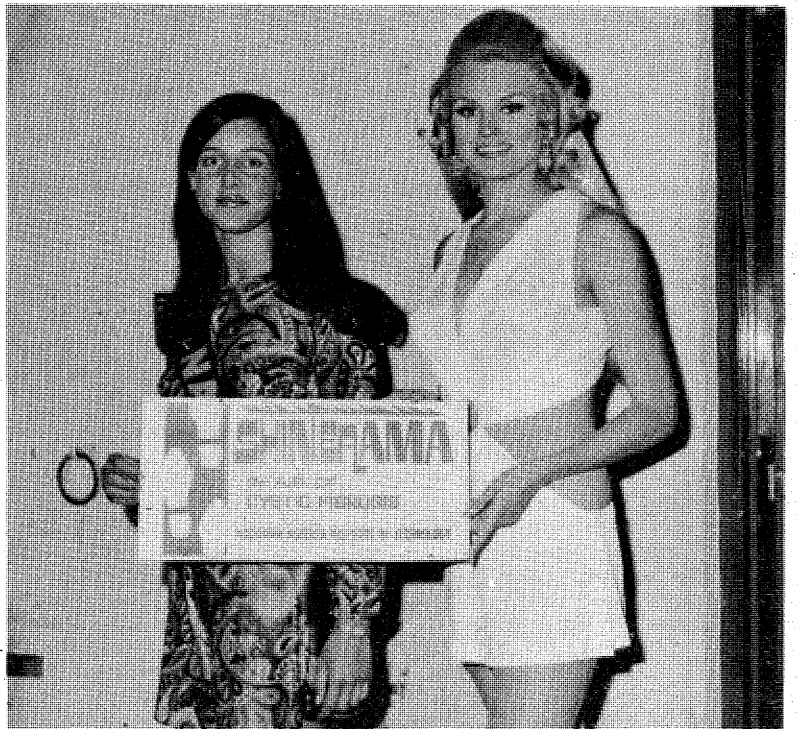
The women have their own athletic events set up for the coming year as well as mixed competitions

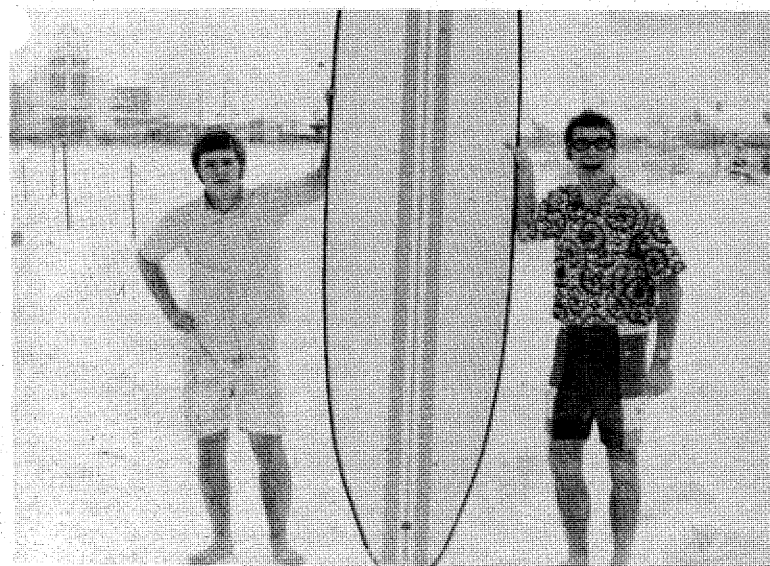

Athletic Display

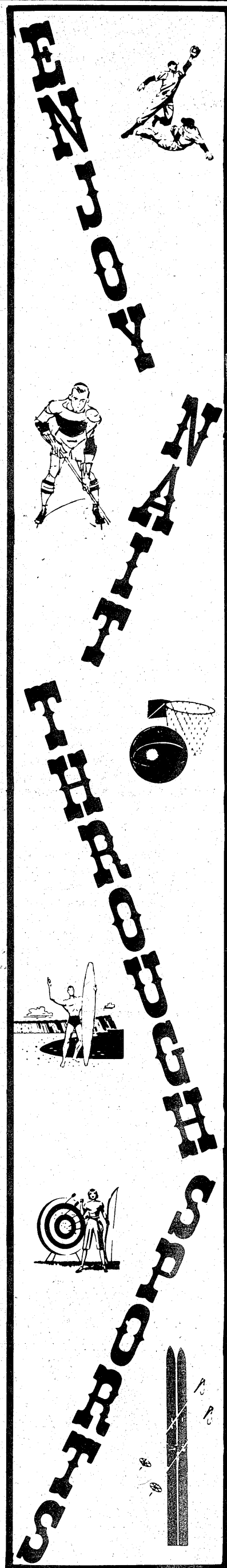

On NAIT Housing

Housing is definitely one HELL of a big problem. As far as I can see the majority of people in this vicinity are completely ignorant of their rights as tenants. They (landlords) seem to think because they own the house they own the life of the student who rents a room. Landlords think they have the right to walk in whenever they please and snoop or make wild, filthy accusations based on their ignorant, filthy minds. An eviction notice is something they think they can deliver whenever they are so inspired - Canadian law says eviction notice can't be given except in cases where rent isn't paid or where there is willful damage of property and even then one full month must be given from the date the rent is paid. Besides, once you rent a place it is completely yours and the landlord doesn't even have the right to a key - it is your home.

And these people literally leach on the students situation wherein he needs a residence near N.A.I.T. so they can charge exorbitant rates for rat-holes and get it because of the students need for housing.

If the student has any housing problems he now has a friend and a legal leg to stand on in Mr. Terry LeFevre of Canadian Renters and Leaseholders. For a nominal fee they will give legal aid and make you aware of all your legal rights. I had an ignorant landlord who because of personality conflicts wouldn't return my damage deposit so I took him to court with Canadian Renters and Leaseholders paying the bill, and won my case and my money.

My work of warning to the student looking for housing is BEWARE keep the relationship between you and your landlord entirely impersonal and financial. Also be aware that as a tenant you have definite rights.

COUNSELLING CORNER

To acquaint you with the services provided by the Student Counselling Services, the following information is presented for your perusal:

WHO MAY USE THESE SERVICES?

All NAIT students, prospective students and parents are invited to

make use of the free services available at the Counselling Office.

SERVICES AVAILABLE

Student Counselling Services are available to assist students to obtain maximum benefit from their studies at N.A.I.T. and to develop their potentialities to the fullest extent. In order to accomplish this purpose, the following services are provided to students and prospective students.

1. Educational Counselling - assistance with selection of programs, choice of options where applicable, study skills and academic difficulties.

2. Personal Counselling - students with personal concerns such as worry, restlessness, inability to concentrate or pre-occupation with personal problems which interfere with their academic or social interests should seek counsellor assistance.

3. Vocational Counselling - students may wish to explore their vocational interests, aptitudes, abilities and vocational opportunities with the assistance of a counsellor.

4. Financial Counselling - information regarding scholarships, grants and loans is available.

5. Testing - the purpose of the testing program is to enable the counselling staff to assist students in self-appraisal of their interests and aptitudes. These tests are administered to all ACCEPTED first year students on a scheduled group basis. Other tests may be administered on an individual basis when considered useful by the student and counsellor.

6. Occupational - Educational Information reference materials on occupations, universities, technical institutes and colleges are available for student use.

7. Group Counselling - group sessions may be scheduled during the year.

CONFIDENTIALITY

All communication between student and counsellor is held in the strictest confidence. Only with the written consent of the student will confidential information be released.

LOCATION

There are five counsellors on staff. They are located in the Tower Building on the main floor in room T112.

APPOINTMENTS

Appointments may be made personally or by telephone 318 (black) or 158 (grey) internally or 479-8471 extension 318 externally.

CHAPLAINCY SERVICES

A team of voluntary chaplains present denominational and inter-faith programs and are available to assist students in religious and personal problem areas. This is not a duplication of the efforts of the Student Counselling Services, but rather an important supplement. Appointments with a chaplain may be made through the counselling office.
