

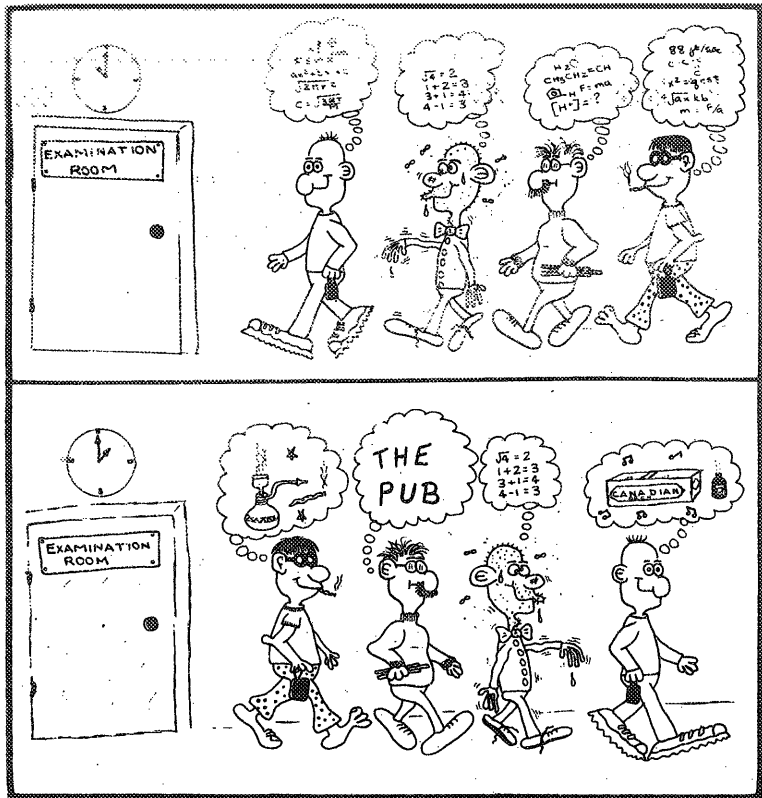

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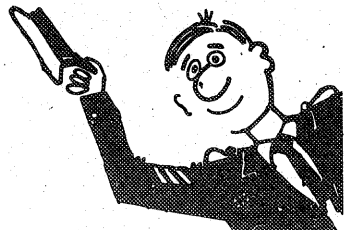

For those who will return for another term, we welcome them and hope they will help new arrivals.

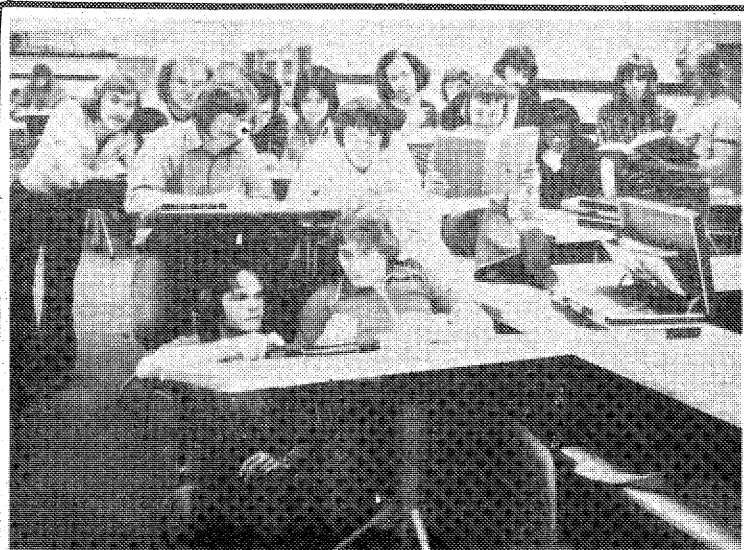
Parking was difficult this year but was kept under very good control. It was not easy, at times, and the amount of fines handed out were very necessary to keep control.

Communication thru body language

In recent years researchers have discovered that people communicate with one another, through body language as well, rather than exclusively through verbal transmittance.

For the most part, one is hardly aware of body language as such, and assumes it to be haphazard and incidental.

The non-verbal manifestations express very effectively and very often the emotional side of the message. Psychologist Albert Mehrabian has postulated this formula: total impact of a message 7% verbal, 38% vocal, (this implies the tone of voice, and not what is said but the way it is said), and 55% facial. Observing facial expressions, and voice are very important in determining what the individual wants to communicate. Eye behavior is another potent ingredient in body language. In normal conversation, the duration of each eye contact is only approximately

a second before one or both parties look away.

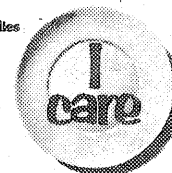
Staring for example is considered inappropriate behavior in North America, however in Israel it is very customary for natives to stare and look people up and down on the street. Israelis, apparently think nothing of staring at others' on the street.

Experts in the study of body language are not yet ready to interpret a precise vocabulary of gestures; what they do attempt, is to search for patterns of body language throughout the entire observation, rather than look for isolated meaningful gestures.

Uncles at Large

Helpful hints for hitch-hikers

Maturity, stability and a willingness to spend time; these are a few of the traits of an UNCLE AT LARGE. Are they also characteristic of you? If so, you'll gain greatly by becoming an UNCLE.

UNCLES AT LARGE is a group of men helping fulfill the needs of kids. UNCLES provide adult male friendship and guidance to fatherless boys.

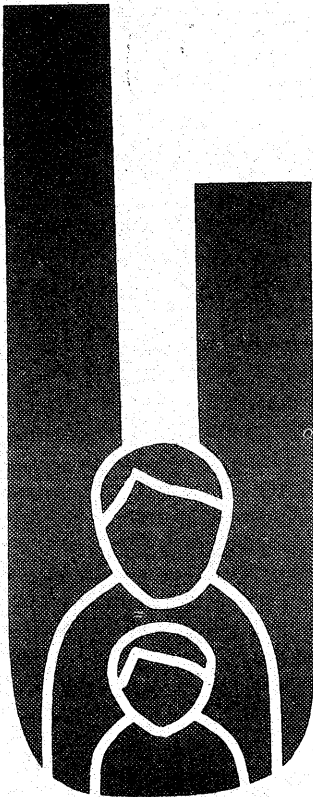
What does the program mean to those involved - the boy, the man, their families? How do uncles and nephews get together, and what do they do once matched?

Partly, UNCLES AT LARGE is activity oriented. The type of action depends on each individual man-boy match. Uncles and boys are matched for similar personalities and interests, whatever you, as an UNCLE, would like to do will have enthusiastic support from your nephew. You might like camping. You and your nephew will be involved in summer camping trips, winter camping trips or whatever you both prefer. Are you a sports fan? You and your friend can talk about and go to sports events. Thinking of buying a new car?

Take your nephew along - if he is young, say 6 years old, he'll think the whole idea is neat; if he's older his approach will be different but his attitude the same. Who knows, you may be shopping for his car. Is carpentry your bag? Do you think

you'd be embarrassed if caught playing with a model train? Have you been kite flying recently? With a nephew to do these things with they can be more fun.

Okay, being on UNCLE can



be fun, but even more importantly it can be fulfilling. You will be able to give a boy a viewpoint on life that his mother can't possibly explain; a man's viewpoint. You will have to give your time with no guarantee of return. But with Uncles AT LARGE the old cliché about giving and receiving has a great deal of meaning. From a young boy, a complete stranger, you gain a friend, one who looks up to you and needs you and accepts you for who you are.

You also gain from other UNCLES. The men in the program vary in age from 20 to 60, they come from all types of occupations and have different

backgrounds and interests. You and your nephew can do things between just the two of you, or you can get together with other UNCLES in group events.

If you need help with your match, other UNCLES very often have already experienced your problem and can help you sort things out.

That is what UNCLES is all about. How did it start? UNCLES AT LARGE was organized in 1967 in order to fill a need.

In that year a group of women approached the Family Service Association of Edmonton to see if they could find help for their single parent families. They had heard of "Big Brothers" and wanted something similar for their families. Family Services recognized that a great deal of good could be done in this area, therefore they canvassed Edmonton service clubs to find a sponsor and a source of potential UNCLES. The Canadian Progress Clubs of Edmonton agreed to fill both roles - initially all UNCLES came from the CP clubs.

As the need for UNCLES increased the Progress Clubs found it impossible to fill the demand from among their ranks. CPC decided to retain control and funding of U at L but to recruit UNCLES from the entire Edmonton population. The program has grown from under ten matches in 1968 to over two hundred UNCLES paired with three hundred boys. Some of the original ten matches are still going strong.

Because of the growth of the program, the Canadian Progress Clubs through their Joint Planning Committee, decided in 1974 to incorporate UNCLES AT LARGE. This process is now nearly completed, with an Alberta Uncles at Large Society made up of an Edmonton and a Calgary branch.

Until the fall of 1974 the Family Service Association of Edmonton provided professional counselling and handled the day to day administration of UNCLES AT LARGE. Because of the size of the program at this time UNCLES decided to open their own office complete with staff. The office is located at 10036 Jasper Avenue, #220. If you are interested in UNCLES AT LARGE, or just want to know more about it, feel free to drop into the office and talk to the people there. TRANSCENDENTAL MEDITATION

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8:00 pm

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It's that time of year again folks, when the student population of the world make the big decision. Do we stay in town, cut our hair, get an office job 9 to 5 and be miserable earning money, or do we cast off the shackles of society, throw on the shackles of our backpacks, and hitchhike off into the sunrise as full fledged, freedom loving, longhaired weirdo, hippy freaks? The choice is yours, boys and girls, but for those of you who are opting for the open road this year for the first time, this is just a set of experience proven lifesavers that you may consider taking along with you.

One very important note is that you can make your pack at least five pounds heavier than you had planned to, possibly ten pounds heavier or more. The reason for this is that you will not be carrying your pack very much. While you are riding the pack is in the back seat or trunk. In the city, it can be locked safely in most hostels. When you are hitching, you'll be sitting on it at the side of the road. It is not really advisable to walk between rides. You may be miles from the nearest town or village (unless you are somehow positive the distance is short), the long walk with a heavy pack will tire you out, and the amount of ground you could cover in hours can be made up in minutes once you get a ride. Don't panic if you find that you haven't had a ride in several hours. It's not unusual, and you just have to wait it out.

An average male in poor physical condition can carry 50-60 lbs fairly comfortably, although this precludes long walks with the pack at any time. You may think that clothes are the heaviest thing to carry because they take up so much room in the pack. This is far from true. Clothes are bulky if packed wrongly, but never really heavy. Definitely take along that third pair of pants, you may wind up sleeping in them. What else to carry in and out of the pack? These are several things which you should take. The first is a good, strong, plastic fly for your tent. No matter how good or expensive your nylon hiking tent is, it will breathe water, and you'll wind up damp, if not wet. Besides keeping you dry in anything short of a monsoon, the fly also acts as an insulator, keeping the heat in your tent. If you think that unimportant, summer nights can get awfully cold, and the Rockies (Banff, Lake Louise, Jasper, . . .) usually have snow by mid August. A light weight, but very warm ski jacket is mandatory if you expect to be gone until September. Another good idea is a flannelet 'slip' or envelope which will fit inside your sleeping bag, reducing its effective temperature to about 20 degrees F. Your poncho will also act as a ground sheet. Even if you don't have a tent your fly can be hung from four trees, and will keep pretty dry.

How the hell does all that crap fit in the pack? It does not. Your sleeping bag, envelope fly, poncho, ski jacket and jean

jacket will all fit outside your pack. They can be very easily attached to the tower part of the pack's rail with two good strong shot cards. These are inexpensive, and valuable. Take a spare. They act as tent guys in a pinch.

The most important article of clothing to take is your shoes. Choose them carefully and try not to scrimp on costs, if you develop blisters on your feet you're in real trouble. Buy them several weeks before you leave, and break them in slowly. Remember, the rest of your clothes just won't wait as much as you think if you're sensible.

Utensils and camping equipment are next. They are also heavy, and should be chosen with care also. A good scout knife is the most essential. It will dig a trench, replace a spike, cut a steak (or another camper) and scare the Christ out of any would be thief. Whether you want the Bowie type knife, or the Swiss Army style (with 4,862 different gadgets on it), your knife is a friend when nobody else is. A can opener is a good idea, but you can use your hatchet instead. We'll discuss food later. The hatchet is necessary, not all that heavy, easy to pack, and how the hell else are you going to split wood? Light should be provided by a waterproof flashlight. It weighs a ton, but you need it.

As for a cooking utensils, the can opener is alright. You can buy special sets of 'camp cutlery' but anything you can rip off your old lady is cool. Not necessary, but beautiful, is a small coffee pot. Your mess kit really doesn't have anything in it to boil water in. Speaking of water, your canteen better check out good. The road gets hot and dry. When it's raining and a fire is impossible, a small, collapsible Sterno stove and some cans of fuel will make the difference between hot and cold meals. The stove and fuel together weigh about 9 oz. Your matches, of course, are waterproof. All of the things mentioned above should be available at a very reasonable cost at any of the surplus stores around the city.

After equipment and clothes, we come to food. Don't trust the 'special' dehydrated camp foods you'll see. They are expensive, and they taste bad. Three things to carry with you in your pack at all times. A jar of peanut butter. This is the only 'heavy' food you should really carry. You can eat it plain anytime (with bread if you're lucky). It is nourishing, high protein, filling and the one food to always carry. Two other really handy foods to carry are instant soup mix, and instant oatmeal. Both come in envelopes that are very very easy to pack. They are filling and nourishing, and in case of emergency, (you ran out of peanut butter), they can be eaten dry. They don't taste too good dry, but it'll keep you alive.

One thing to carry as a last

this session was designed to teach children tennis however Eileen in addition lured their moms and dads to join the fun

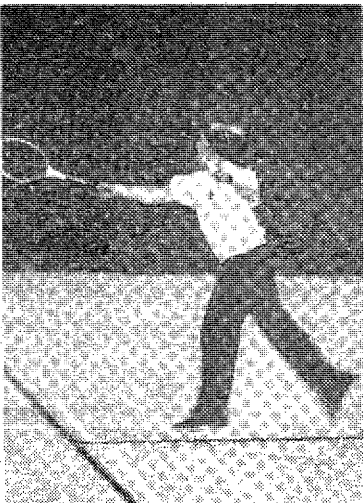
on the courts with their children.
