

# NAITSA EXECUTIVE

It was decided on Monday at a NAITSA EXECUTIVE meeting to drop the amendment asking for the creation of the new position of External Vice-President and at the same time Bill Nowrie agreed to support the amendment asking for a \$5.00 increase in Student Fees for athletics. The Executive also announced the resignation of Activities Chairman Lorie Lupol, for personal reasons.

The executive agreed to drop the External V.P. amendment after considerable debate. It was concluded that there were more suitable alternatives than the creation of another exec member.

At the same time the Publications Chairman, Bill Nowrie, agreed to support the 2nd amendment calling for an increase in the student fee by \$5.00, which would supplement the Athletics budget. This was finally agreed to after the remaining executive members gave their support to the proposal of re-evaluating the possibility of asking for a further increase of \$5.00 in the spring to supplement the other budgets of the Students Association.

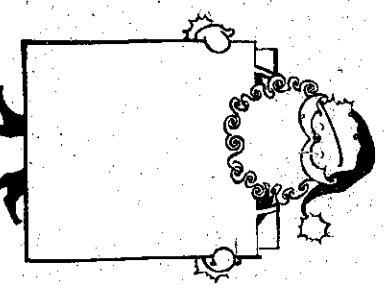

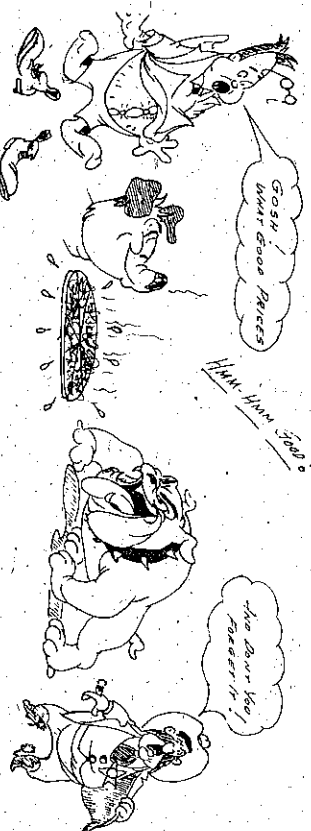

21. It's time to leave - forget the pizza can't get laid at a restaurant. However back seat of a car is another story. If you can eat out and get laid.

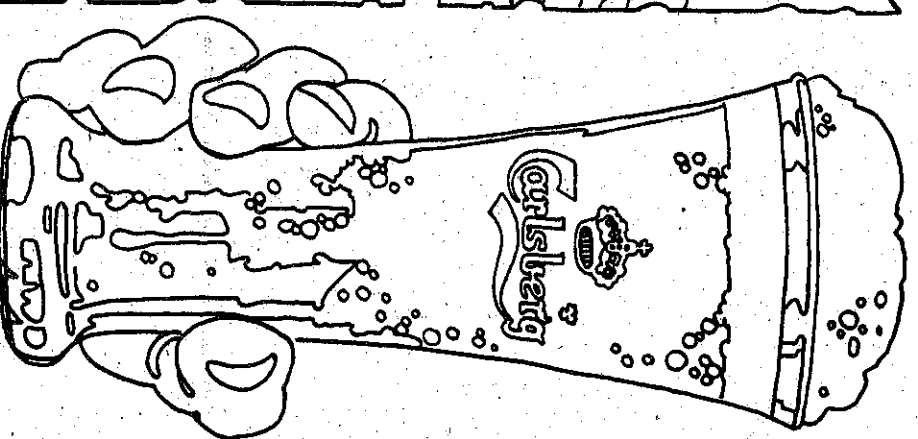
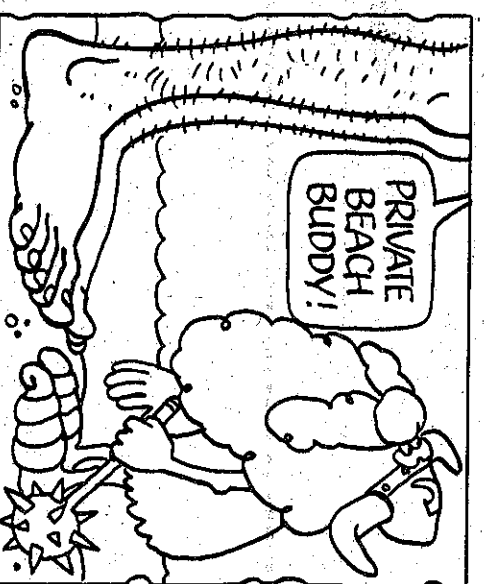
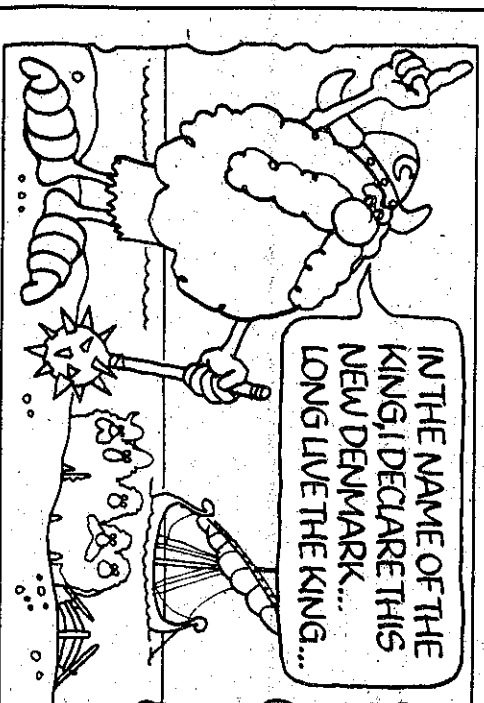
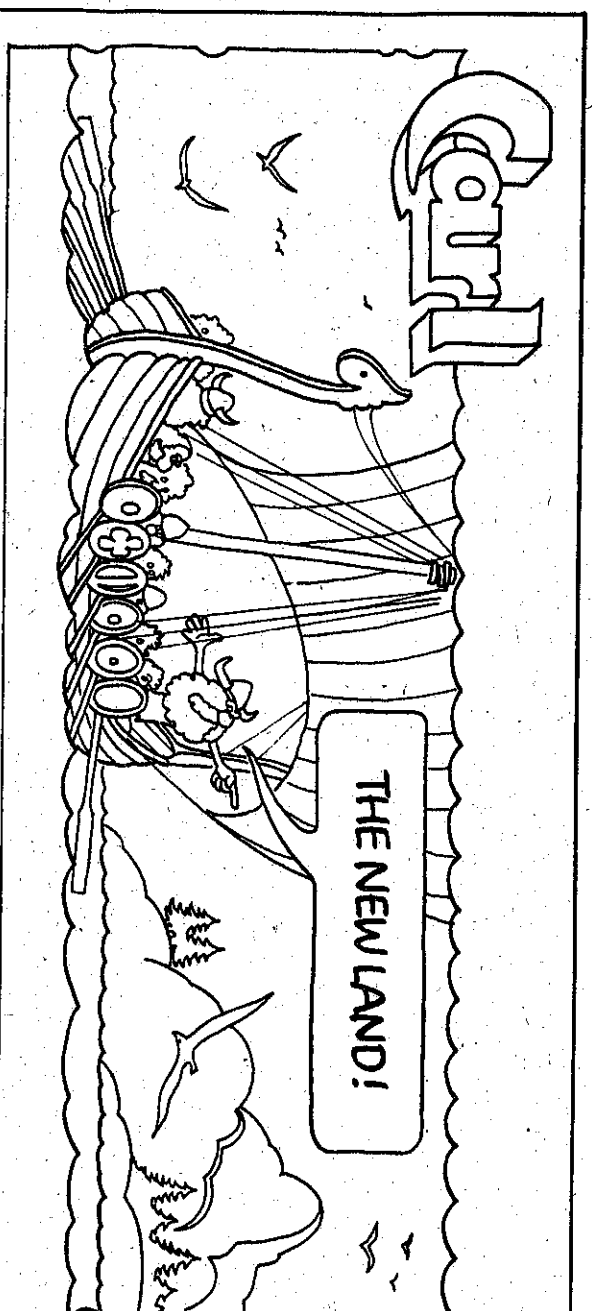
22. Now you've just started your car and you're ready to leave. Tell her you can't go the windows have unfogged and the engine warm.

d) Student Housing: Computer's felt the proposed changes in the rent review were not applicable to students because they are in the lower income bracket. A heated discussion followed and Dave explained that the letter that appears in the position paper was a draft only, and the copy that was revised and actually sent out is in Dave's office, available to anyone interested in seeing it.

**New Business**

a) Christmas Cabaret: There will be a limit of two (2) tickets per person for the Christmas Cabaret to avoid outsider trouble and to allow the majority of NAIT students an opportunity to have first crack at tickets. The limit for this cabaret, which will be held in the large cafeteria, is 650 bodies. The Santa's Anonymous Raffle draw will take place at the cabaret.

From now on, more adequate ID will be required to get into the Naitisa cabarets, as per the ALCB rules. Acceptable ID will include an ALCB card (available at vendors); a birth certificate PLUS two other pieces of ID (eg. credit cards, drivers license); a drivers license PLUS two other pieces of ID.

b) Queen Week: Deadline for candidates nominations will be Friday, December 19, 1975. There is a \$50 allowance given to each sponsoring tech to buy their candidate a gown for the Queen Ball and to purchase an appropriate banner. More details in the Nugget.

c) Nugget Machinery and ratification of CUP contract: "The Great Nugget Machinery Scandal" was briefly explained. Pros and cons as to whether or not we should follow the action to court were tossed around. We have been offered an out-of-court settlement by Nabel leasing of \$1,800 for a debt of \$2,600. It was felt that we should set a precedent for Singer, to who we still owe \$10,000.

CUP Contract: We have been offered a five year term lease with Canadian University Press (CUP) at a cost of \$1,000 which has in past given us \$2200 to \$3200/year in income revenue from Youthstream advertising.

MOTION 3: Move to stay with CUP for five (5) more years.

d) Adult Education Act: Computers brought Councils attention to "A Draft for Discussion" involving "Dissolution of Student's Association". Computers felt we leave ourselves open to being dissolved, but Dave explained that the buildings are government owned; Lloyd pointed out that the government cannot be the dissolution at will but only by the recommendation of the Student's Executive, and subsequent approval by Representative Council.

e) B.A.S. The question posed by B.A.S. as to whether or not evening cabarets will be a definite plan was answered in affirmative and it was brought up that these evening cabarets will only be once (possibly twice) a month.

This Wednesday at 1:00 pm the NAIT Student Association will be asking you to vote in favour of the proposed changes:

a) The adoption of the Activities Committee, it is presently in effect, it just needs ratification by the student body. It is useful in that it gives a good cross section of student and staff in planning up coming events and activities.

b) The increase in student fees of \$5.00 which will go towards Athletics. The increase is necessitated by the rapid increase in costs of equipment, and travel. If a fee increase was not asked for a degrading of calibre in terms of equipment, and amount of participation would have to offset costs.

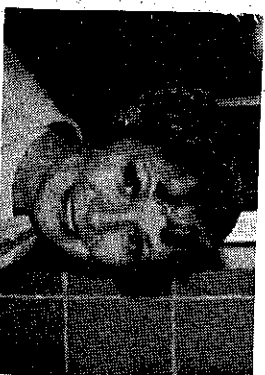

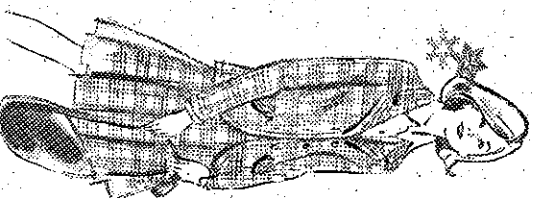

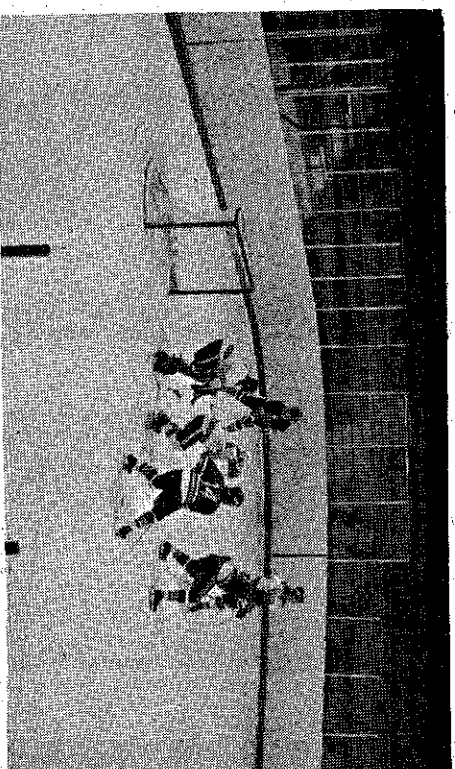
## TEAM MEETING SPARKS CONFIDENCE NEW STREAK STARTED Michael Nethery

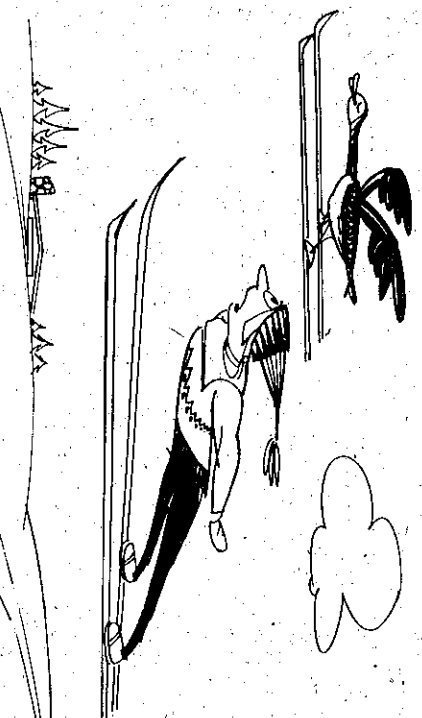

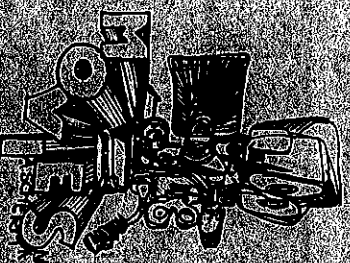

PINK FLOYD - Wish You Were Here

The legacy that is Pink Floyd, is now permanently re-installed in my mind with the release of their latest record, "Wish You Were Here." The album is very well recorded, constituting a lasting blend of electronic heavy metal and acoustic rock. The eerie sound that has been Pink Floyd's trademark in the past is apparent in this album, but somewhat less agreeable than "Dark Side of the Moon."

The name of this album seems to be a dreamlike glimpse of the higher echelons in the music business. Every song bears little resemblance to any other cut on the album, but the transition between tunes is barely noticeable. The overall effect is pleasing, making the album sound like one continuous work rather than the standard collection of singles common to most new albums.

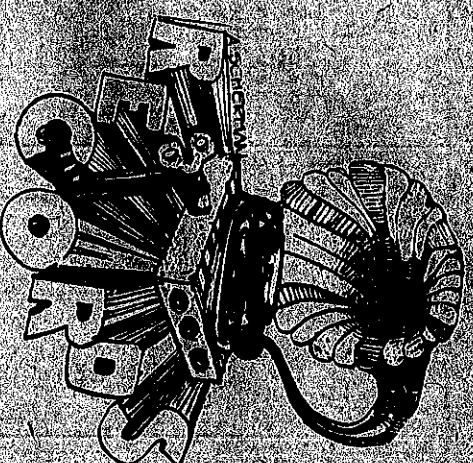
Something that might turn the average listener away from "Wish You Were Here" is the heavily synthesized first song, "Astronomy." On "You Crazy Diamond," becomes reminiscent of

Yvonne Ginn's, a prime example of early Pink Floyd era. Following "Shine On," is a song entitled "Welcome To The Machine." The opening consists of the sounds of several unidentified machines gradually forming a steady rhythm for Pink Floyd to build on.

The lyrics in "Shine On" and "Welcome To The Machine" tend to be more rhythmical than inspirational. That is not the case with "Have A Little Boy." These lyrics tell the story of capitalism in the modern music business. The opening dialogue is between a record executive and the manager of the band. His ignorance of the musical product is evident and Roger Waters, the group lyricist, plays on this throughout the record. Rogers seems to be telling us about the unorthodox bureaucracy of the industry.

Pink Floyd has always been known for having unique album jackets. "Wish You Were Here" is no exception. Don't let the blue plastic fool you. The photography on the jacket as well as the sleeve emphasize what the group mentioned earlier. The pictures don't directly relate to the music, but they do stimulate the senses and even cause some people to reassess what they think is real. Something Pink Floyd has been doing all along.

"Wish You Were Here" is a must for every Pink Floyd fan, and a refreshing addition to any middle of the road collection.

SWEDEN'S NEW CURIOUS ON CAPITALISM  
Oslo (ENS-CUP) - - - Sweden's ruling political party, the Social Democrats, proposed legislation in early October that would virtually abolish the private ownership of major industries.

The government's Labor Minister spelled out a plan that would replace private ownership, or work management partnership in which the workers would have the upper hand.

The proposal will go before the Swedish Parliament in January and is expected to become law by 1977, despite strong opposition from industry leaders.



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
