



Referendum Vote

Two-thirds Successful

On Wednesday, Jan. 19 nearly 400 students filed into the main gymnasium to listen to Rod Osborne and his council explain why an increase in student fees for both athletics and the student association fund was needed.

After a brief 15 minute period which was made up of a short speech and then question answer period the students were then asked to vote on the three proposals.

Here are the final results: 1. Request for \$5 increase in athletic fee assessment (\$10 -\$15), Yes - 306, No - 75, 80.3 per cent in favor.

2. Request for \$5 increase in the Student Association assessment (\$20 - \$25), Yes -270, No 107, 71.6 per cent in favor

3. Request to delete section

20 of constitution and add the structure of present committee, Yes - 315, No - 47, 84.7 per cent in favor.

Since a 75 per cent majority is necessary to change any part of the constitution the request to increase the athletic fees and to add to the structure of the present committee were passed but the increase in student fees were denied.

Because of the heavy turnout of athletes the first proposal to increase the athletic fees was nearly guaranteed before the vote even took place and so it passed easily.

The second proposal to increase student fees was rejected although if another 3.4 per cent of the voters had voted yes it would have went

across as well. Probably the problem here is that there are not 75 per cent of the NAIT students convinced that council, any student council (not just this years) are spending the funds allocated to them in right areas.

So for next year NAIT students can expect to be paying \$35 with \$20 allocated to student association fees and \$15 towards athletics. I just hope that if an increase is asked for by council next year that it passes as inflation is readily eating up our student association budget and therefore fewer cabarets and other functions will have to be planned for next year.



Dear Mr. Editor:

This letter concerns your statements in last weeks editorial --re: parkade plug-

I do not know what technology you are in but it's a cinch to see it's not electrically oriented. Your knowledge of your car's block heater is nil. Turning the block-heater off and on is not harmful to it. The very electricians who installed the new 1/2 hour off - 1/2 hour on system park their cars either in the parkade or in the other parking lots that are on the system. I ask you, are they worried about the premature failure of their cars block heater? You bet they aren't because there is no such thing.

You also state that this is

hard on the whole city power system every time the power is turned back on. This is rubbish. A rock thrown into a lake would have greater consequences.

I think \$4 a month is a very good price to pay just for parking in the parkade, let alone with plug-ins. Where would those 2,000 automobiles be parked if it were not for the parkade?? So as you can see, parking space is at a premium at NAIT and \$4 a month is a very good price.

I have not seen one car being boosted in the parkade because it has failed to start due to the block heater being off for 1/2 hour. So what is the bitch??

Personally, I think the idea is very good. It was not very expensive to install, is easy to maintain and only consumes 1/2 the normal daily parkade power output. Take a look one day in the parkade when the temperature is above freezing and notice how many cars are plugged in. The percentage would be at least 50 per cent. This is an extravagent waste of power and Alberta's resources. Those 50 per cent of the people have adopted the attitude of "I paid for it, I'm going to get my monies worth." This is the main reason I think it's a good idea.

You also say that this system is saving NAIT a few pennies. This is not true. This system is saving a whole lot of pennies. Unfortunately I do not have facts to back this statement up. If you would like to verify this, the electrical foreman, Jerry Yelle would be glad to fill you in on the details.

Action has been taken to reduce power consumption in the class rooms. Last spring a timing system was installed hoods. A timer will turn the circuits on in the morning before classes and off after classes. This was done because students and staff leave them running all night and this is more wasted power. It was estimated power saved would pay for the installation in two years.

Also in the spring there was a plan to reduce the class room lighting in the Tower Building, by taking one ballast out of every fixture in the classrooms. Whether this plan has been successfully accomplished or not I do not know, but this is something you could check up on, since you are so interested in conserving power.

It doesn't matter how many times you remind students and staff to turn off lights behind them, you can still find many fully lit classrooms at any time of the day. As a result, little stick-ons have to be made and stuck on every

> My final argument concerns your full-time afternoon plug-ins. This is not a good plan at all. When you thought of this idea, did you consider people attending classes in the morning only

> and people who have to leave suddenly because of illness or emergency? When they arrive at the car park their ears are frozen stiff because there was no power all morning. Your system only accommodates the majority of the people but the 1/2 hour on, 1/2 hour off system, accommodates 100 per cent of the people satisfactorily.


Red Deer **Blasts NAIT**

Heli It's Only Rock 'N' Roll

Michel Pagliaro is not the type who talks who about aesthetics. He plays music-hard. C'est tout, simplement. People do talk about Pag. . . the voice reminiscent of Little Richard; the Rick Nelson stance; a touch of Neil Diamond, a McCartney melodic twist.

Among music critics, Pagiliaro's superstardom is a foregone conclusion. Pas encore, "Quebec's best kept secret," they are incredulous that he has eluded the intemotional spotlight this long.

Pagliaro is the only Canadian with gold disques - 10 maintenant - in both English et en Français. He personifies the conjunction of primitive American rock-raw and nasty-with the stylized in-tensity of "Les Quebecois." Surtout, there is the British predominance of guitar.

Rock'n'Roll staples comme Dizzy Miss Lizzy, Pagliaro transfigures with the fever of his stuccato French. His heady, J'entends Frapper has been ranked with the classics, Johnnie B. Goode and Jumping Jack Flash. Critic Greg Shaw asserts that Pag is probably, "the first to do anything original to the French language." Some Sing (Some Dance), Loving You Ain't Easy, and Give Us One More Chance, have created a mushrooming Pagliaro cult.

Pag has been the idol of French Canada since he began his solo career with producer manager George Lagois ten years ago. Toujours, c'est la meme chose, when Pagliaro steps on stage with his back-up group Rockers," 'Les dimonium breaks loose. As a crossover artist, he has been successful in both A, and FM formats. He keeps getting better. Reviewing his first Engligh LP on Columbia, Pagliaro I, Bill Mann, of the Montreal Gazette, stated flatly. "This is the most impressive work I have ever heard by any Canadian rock or pop artist."

NAIT Doubles SAIT

Summary and highlights: Saturday, Jan. 15.

Strong penalty killing helped the OOKS defeat the visiting SAIT Trojans 6-3 Saturday afternoon at the NAIT Arena. The teams were tied at one after 20 minutes, but in the second period the OOKS opened up a 3-1, lead only to have SAIT score 2 goals, thirty-one seconds apart, with less than two minutes to play. In the third period, the OOKS controlled the play and notched 3

unanswered goals.
The OOKS managed to control the play for the most part, but it was their penaltykill units that played ex-ceptionally well when the team was at a numerical disadvantage.

Bob Cruthers lead the OOKS attack with 3 goals, and now has a total of 9 goals and 5 assists in 5 games since the Christmas break.

For the second game in a row, the NAIT OOKPIKS hockey team only went through the motions. Generally, the players lacked desire and second effort.


