FOUND TO BE UNINTERESTING, NON TOPICAL AND UNINVITING

Last Monday evening the administration of NAIT congregated at camp HE-HO-HA for their annual NAIT spring workshop.

This event was scheduled to take place at 6:30 P.M. in the main recreation building on site.

The agenda was to cover areas spanning from objectives (past, present, and future), historical development, present status, priority activities and issues all related to NAIT.

This annual spring workshop is conducted for the purpose of analyzing past endevours, evaluating these and then to suggest new replacements if needed.

Monday evening seemed as though replacement for these endevours was unneeded, for in the past years NAIT student representatives had been courtiously extended an invitation to this gathering. This was not the case last evening. No student representative either from your own NAITSA council and/or one of the many NAIT societies had been invited.

The reason for this is not exactly known even to president Carter who himself commented on their absence.

How can one report on an event who was not invited, you ask?

Taking it upon himself to organize and motivate a few other students, Greg Lesiuk (NAITSA President) constructed the fram work to attend this workshop at camp HE-HO-HA and represent those students not invited!

The persons responsible for attendance and representation of NAIT student body were Greg Lesiuk, Kevin Fergusson (president of B.A.S) Rick Stewart (newly appointed President of NAITSA), Francols.....(president B.S.S.) and myself, Dale Henderson (eidtor of NAIT Nugget). On arriving, the meeting seemed a little slow going (no one can say for sure but it may have been a little slow starting), due to the lack of enthusiasm evident in the audience. Among the speakers of this meeting were president G.W. Carter; F. Williamson (academic Vice-President); W. Zahary (Director of Continuing Education); G. Meadus (Director of Student Services); and J.O. Starritt. (Administrative Vice-President).

We arrived late and were unable to hear president carters address, but did listen to the other speakers.

Mr. Williamson discussed the importance of improving development, transferability of students and priorities in operating NAIT as an institute.

Mr. Williamson discussed the importance of improving instuctural "effectiveness" which he emphasized through out. He found and suggested that some of our instuctors are slipping in their capabilities and could use a little refresher course.

Mr. Williamson pointed out the fact that 30 percent of the NAIT students had previously attended other post-secondary schools. He was concerning this with the issue of transferability of students from other institutes. Mr. Williamson also stated that there is 15 to 20 new programs which NAIT is presently investigating. Though Mr. Williamson pointed out priorities in operating NAIT those being organization, recruit tarining spectrum; and what students are doing after they leave NAIT. He failed to mention admission standards which at this time were currently being considered.

These standards are not of a selective type of admission but instead on a first come first serve basis.

W. Zahary did not get the motivated response needed at this time from the executive council and program heads. Zahary merely showed the arrangment of positions and changes taking place in his area of work.

The item of most significance stated by Zahary was that of the adoption of "commercial Chinese cooking" in the school? Zahary descrived his report as just being a "small bit." It was actually a small bit which could have been avoided.

Gary Meadus brought a relief to the workshop with refreshing suggestions and proposals such as a dormitory for the commuters. (surely we have commters coming to NAIT but what about all the out of towners? Don't these people need facilities?)

Gary went on to comment on the role of student services and items which we should start to concern ourselves with, some of these being the anonomys student, student emotional problems and areas to increase better development through instructor and student.

The surprise of the evening as president Carter announced, was ourselves.

Greg brought to light some main issues which students are concerned about and some of which the adminsitration should be considering about.

These issues were that of admission, decentralization and implications involved.

Admissions was a popular topic with our group for not only was it touched on by Greg, but kevin and Francois rammed the point home.

Admissions was a concern to Francois being in Biological Sciences






Is work the answer for you this summer?

Most of us look forward to working during the summer months. But with the limited number of openings it takes more than luck to land a desired position; it takes ingunuity and hard work. The serach for work, be it a summer/part-time position or a future career, is an eight hour a day proposition. Following are some do's and don'ts you might consider during your search:

- 1. Do be persistent. Those who give up won't work this summer. you have to find work, work won't find you.
- 2. Do start early. If you wait until June you'll be cutting down on your choices.
- 3. Do spend eight hours daily looking for a job (except for a ½ hour lunch break). Remember that a job takes eight hours a day of effort
- 4. do have a good breakfast before you start. You'll need the energy if you are to remian alert.
- 5. Don't limit your possibilities. Walk up and down every street where businesses are located and apply EVERYWHERE, whether or not it's the position you want.
- 6. Do read the want ads daily and apply for ALL the positions which specify your skills, or those that say no experience is necessary.
- 7. Do visit manpower and other placement agencies -- they have a varied listing of positions aching to be filled.
- 8. Do go for as many interviews as possible. If you don't get the position, at least you'll learn how to conduct yourself in this type of situation. And the interviewer may remember you when another position becomes available.
- 9. Do dress in clean, well fitting clothes. This doe not mean expensive, it means efficient. Employers believe that the clothes make the person. A sloppy dresser is identified as lazy and sloppy on the job.
- 10. Do learn to write a resume (ask a friend, instructor, read a book on the subject). Once written, send your resume to every personnel office, where you might be interested in working. Follow this with a phone call about a week later.
- 11. Do be flexible. The position you find may not be the most desirable one but it may lead to a better position later.
- 12. Do think satisfaction. Sure pay is important but sometimes a lower paying position may be more satisfactory than a higher paying proposition. And the experience might help in your future career.
- 13. Don't ignore free lancing. You may have a skill which others require. So, research your potential customers, price your services or products against similar ones and advertise what you have to offer. The plus here is in the choosing of your own hours. And it's feasable, I spent a year cutting through red tape simply because I speak English and my customers didn't so they needed an interpreter.

Finally remember: If you believe you can do it and you are willing to put forth the effort, you'll make it come true. It's a self-fulfilling prophecy.




# PLAYER'S CHOICE
