## LAND USE

Agricultural land is Alberta's most precious natural resource and, apart from our people, our most precious heritage. It is basic to this province's economy and, indeed, to our way of life.

Unfortunately, it seems to me the provincial government does not fully appreciate the importance of farm land. There is no overall provincial land use policy; at best there is a piecemeal approach to land use and in many respects there is no provincial policy at all.

As a result of this drift on the part of the provincial government, good agricultural land is being lost to urban sprawl, industrial expansion, flooding of land as dams are constructed, and so on. This is a major reason why I was particularly incensed by the decision to proceed with construction of a dam at Site 6 on the Red Deer River--a decision which will flood several thousand acres of good farm land and endanger thousands more acres through seepage. When one considers that an alternate site was available which would not have flooded any farm land, the decision on Site 6 seems especially unnecessary and foolish.

With those considerations in mind I recently introduced a private member's bill in the Legislature to establish a land use policy for the province.

A prime objective of the legislation would be to preserve agricultural land for farm use.

The legislation would establish a five-member Land Commission to carry out the provisions of the Act. In addition to preservation of farm land, the Commission would encourage family farms, preserve green belt land around urban areas, preserve land bank land for urban and industrial development, preserve park land, and assist local governments in preparing land reserve plans.

Bill 251, the Land Commission Act, is patterned on legislation introduced by the Barrett government in British Columbia. Al-

though this legislation in B.C. was criticized when it was introduced, it has not been repealed by the new government and in fact now is widely recognized as a wise and far-sighted policy.

The Chinese delegation was confirmed today and as expected includes some of the top gymnasts in the People's Republic of China.

The average age for the men's team is 20 years old while the women are all 15 years of age including Ma Wan-shu who is the

current National champion in the Floor Exercise Competition and Vault Competition and is ranked #2 overall in her country.

Meet organizers received a pleasant surprise when it was learned that Alan Reddon a 15 year old high school student at McNally Composite High in Edmonton has been asked to compete in the competition on an exhibition basis by the Canadian Men's National Coach, Keith Russell.

Reddon just recently competed in the Western Canadian Championships and is rated as one of Canada's 'futures' in gymnastics. He will also take part in the National finals May 20th and 21st to be held in Ottawa.

The meet will take on further local flavor in the form of demonstrations by the U. of A.'s Bounders Gym Club and the Edmonton Modern Rhythmic Gymnastics Club.

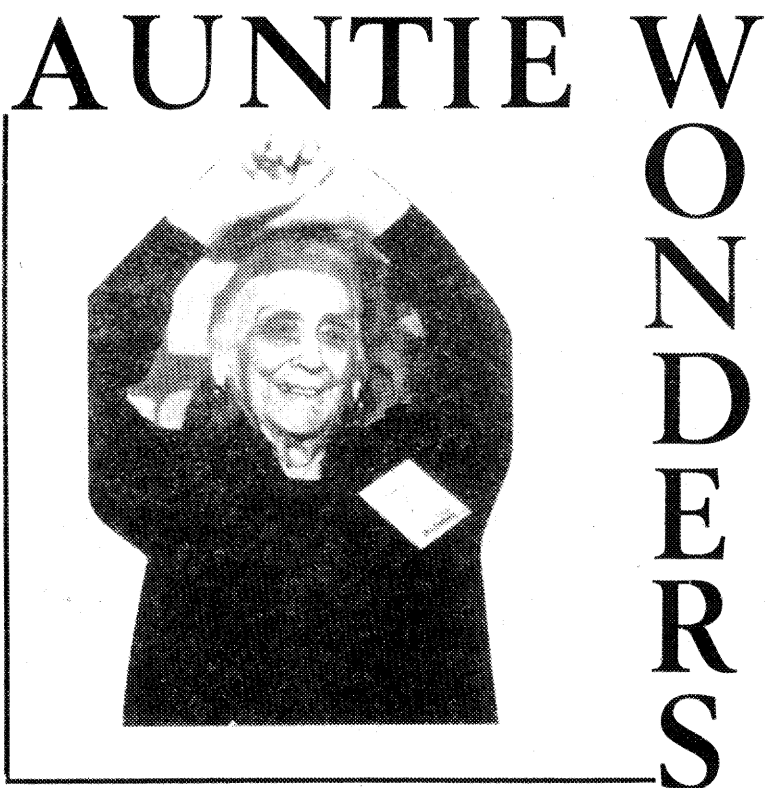
I thank the quartet for the superb concert and hope that these progressive artists continue to raise the musical awareness of this conservative cow-town.

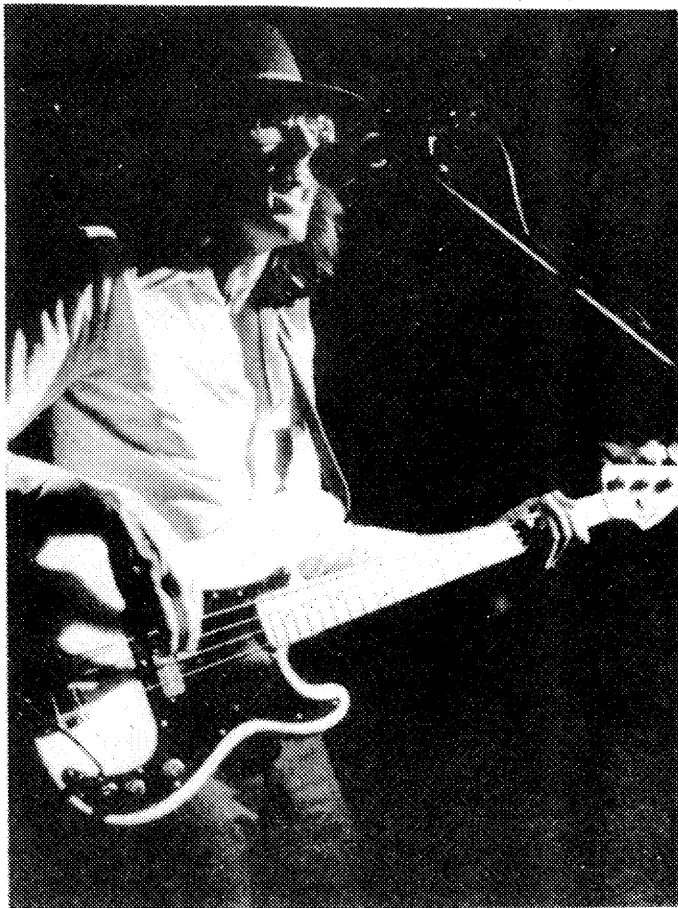

Pick a hot summer's day, preferably at the lake, and give one of these a try.

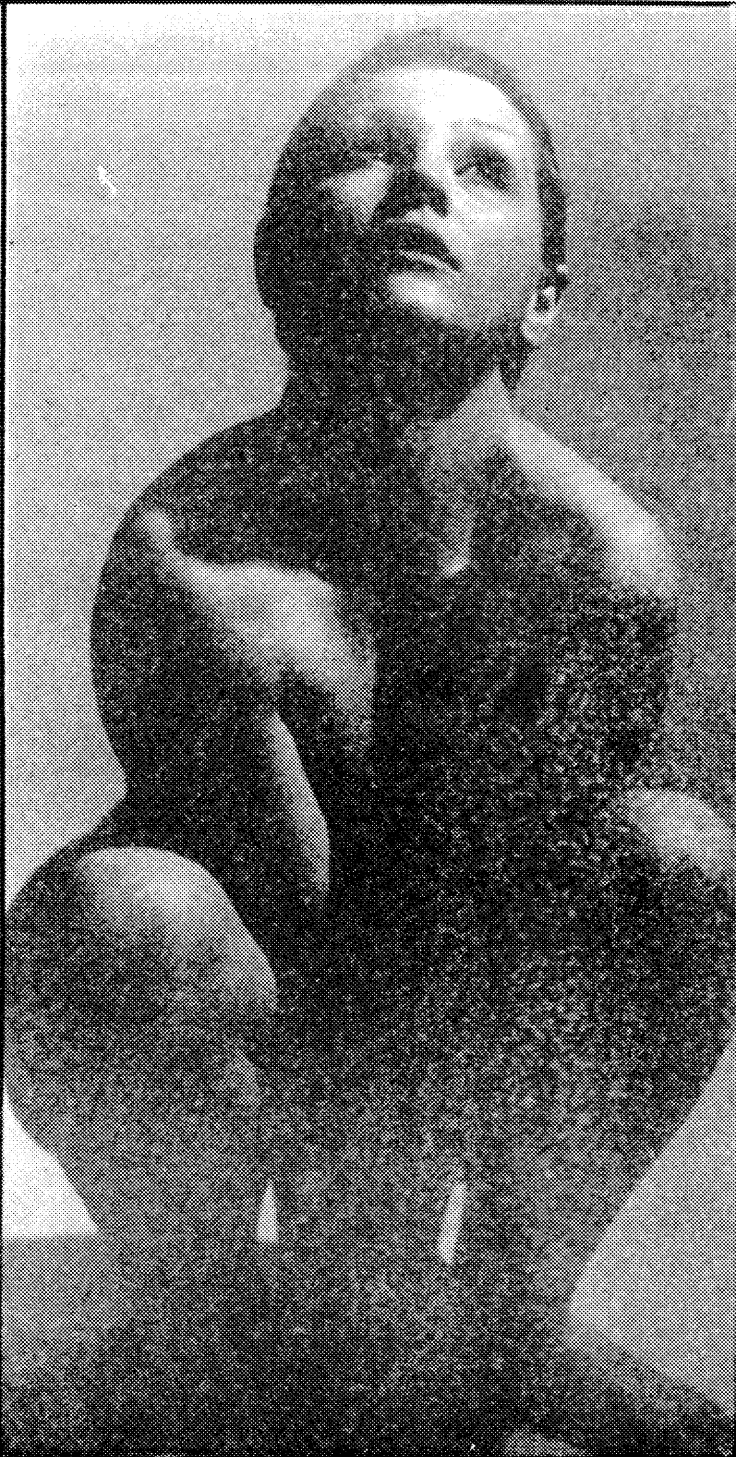
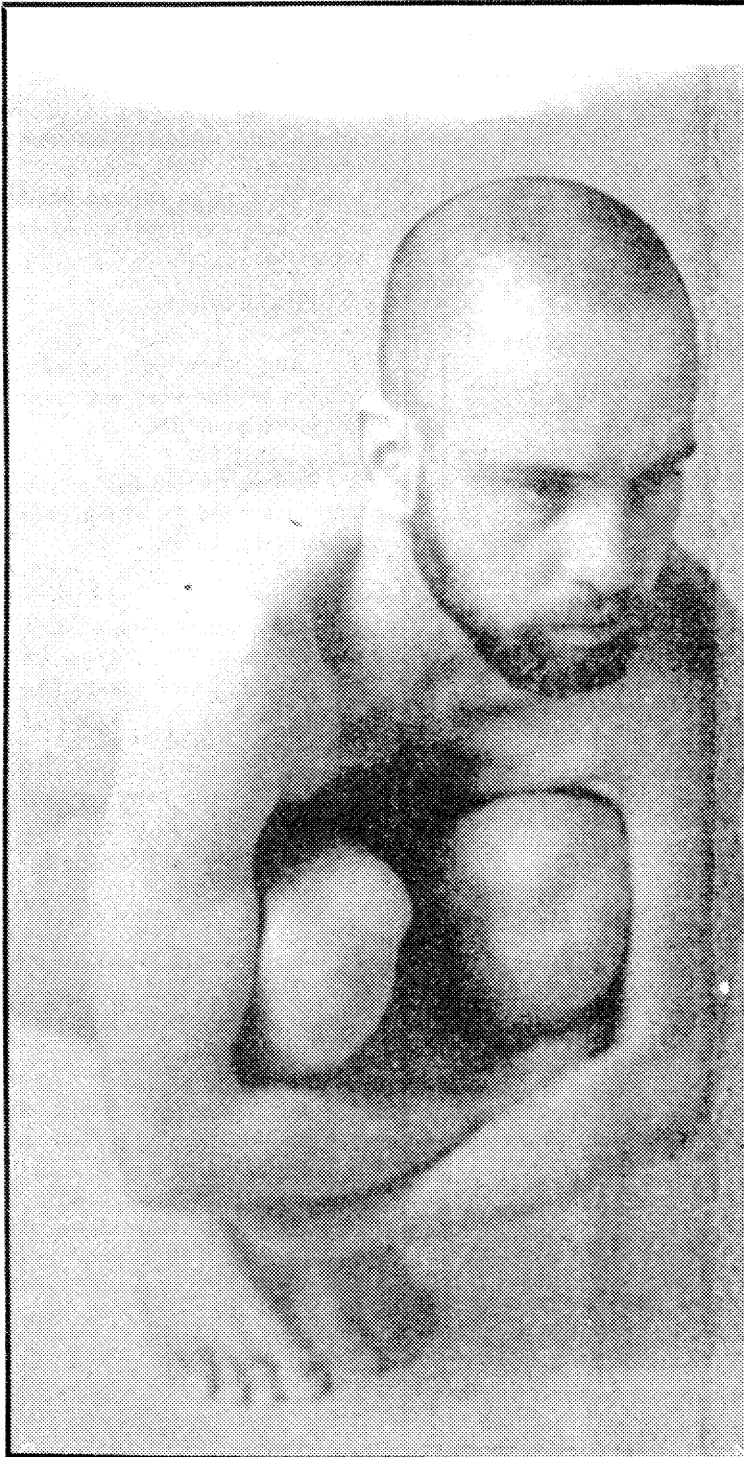

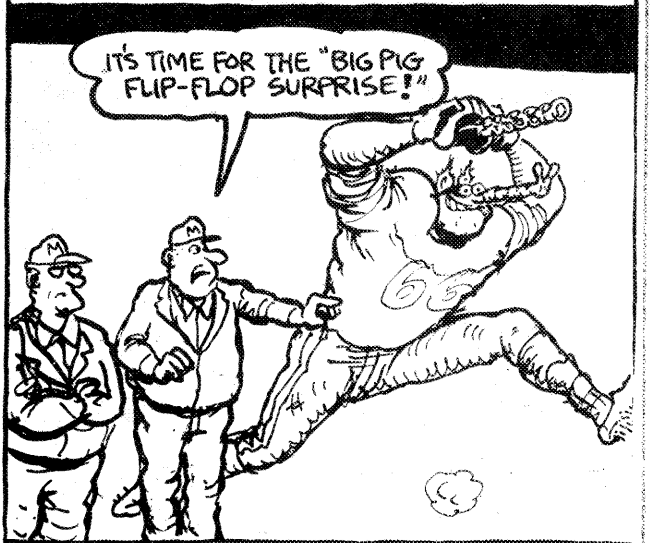

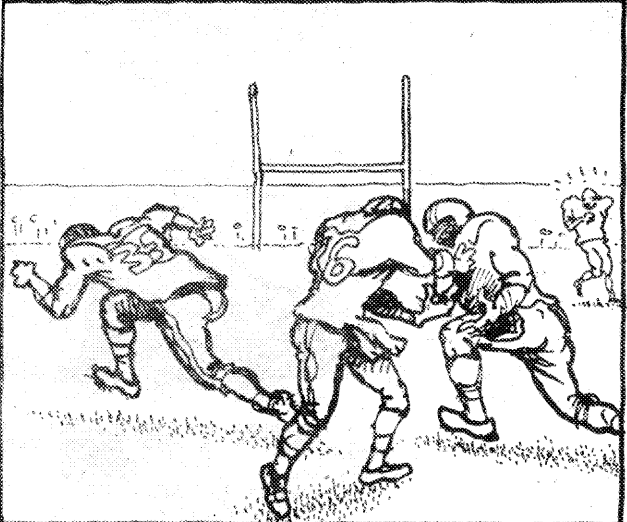
