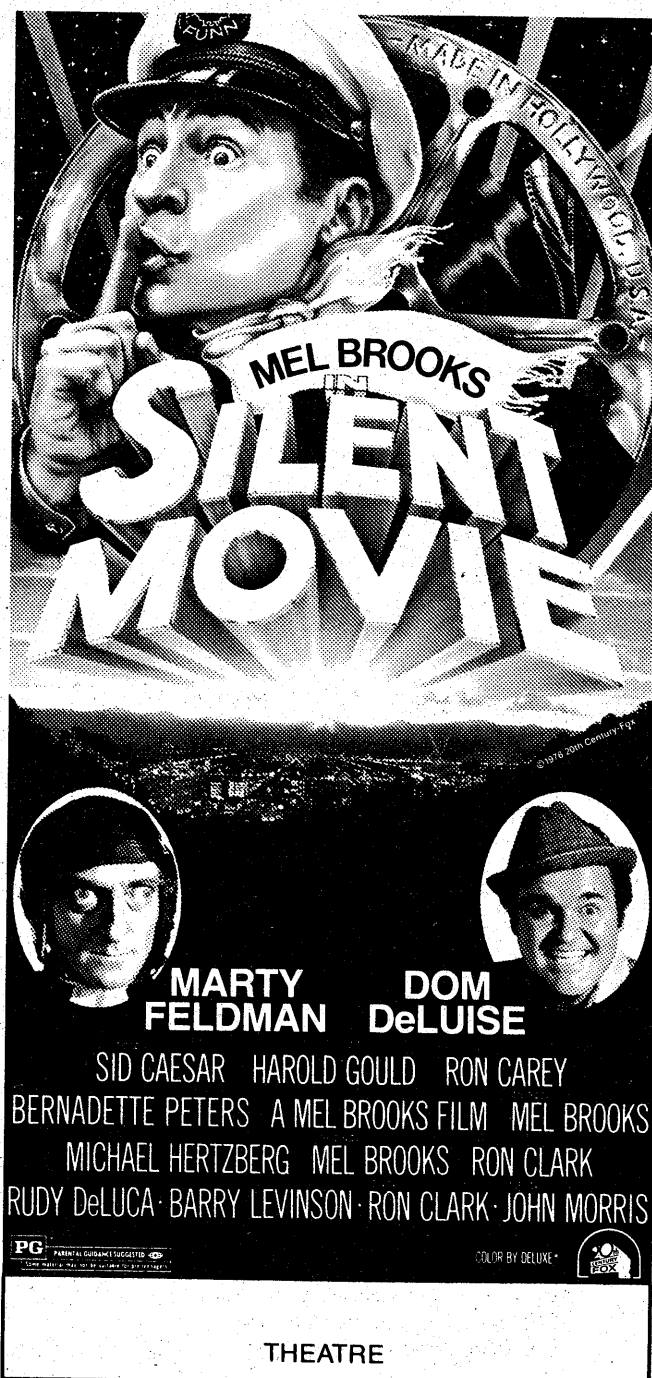
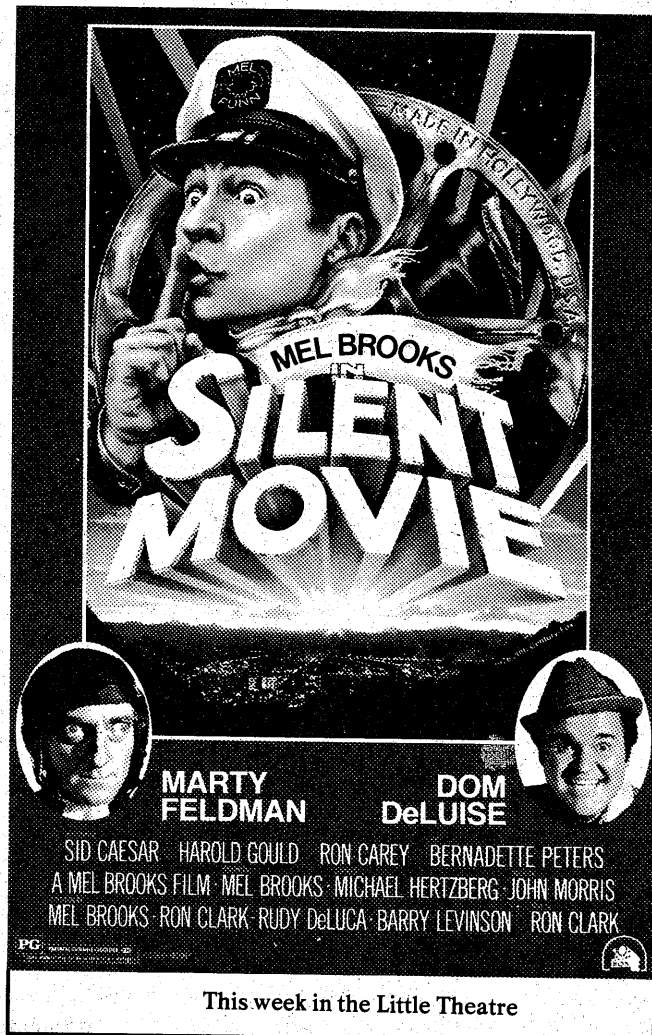

INCREASES

An increase in provincial support for new school building construction was announced today by Education Minister Julian Koziak.

The new schedule, which applies to all school jurisdictions in the province, will increase funding by about 5% in permanent construction and 10% in core school portables. Rural jurisdictions more than 40 km from the cities of Edmonton, Calgary, Grande Prairie, Medicine Hat, Lethbridge or Red Deer will also receive a 36% increase in distance allowances.

Distance allowances are based on the straight line distance between the construction site and the nearest city centre. Fort McMurray, for example, would receive, in addition to basic construction support, a distance allowance of \$7.00/sq. ft., an increase of \$2.00/sq. ft.

The increase covers school building tenders or other schemes of construction approved by the Minister during the period July 1 1978, to December 31, 1978. There was no increase during the first 6 months of 1978.

GAS SELLOUT

The fall session of the Alberta Legislature opened October 11 with a lengthy and defensive speech by Premier Lougheed. There were almost no new initiatives announced in the speech, although there were a number of aspects to the speech which I found disturbing.

For one thing, there was little mention of agriculture and a general complacency about the overall agricultural situation.

There continues to be an overwhelming emphasis on the oil and gas industry at the expense of

agriculture. In speaking about diversification of the economy, the Premier now talks about oil sands and heavy oil development as "diversification".

It is becoming increasingly clear that the vast bulk of the Heritage Trust Fund will be funnelled into large energy-related projects which will be carried out in conjunction with the multinational oil companies. In short, there will be no real diversification of the economy, and areas such as forestry and agricultural processing will continue to play second - fiddle to the oil and gas industry.

There was another aspect to the Premier's speech which I found particularly disturbing. That is his determination to export increasing quantities of natural gas to the United States.

It is clear to me the Premier is bowing to pressure from the petroleum industry to sell off our natural gas. It is my view that we should not make any more deals to sell off natural gas to the U. S., since natural gas is a depleting resource which is absolutely vital to Alberta, in view of our cold climate and our need to diversify the economy. Our obligation is to heat the homes of Albertans and

other Canadians, not to run the air conditioners of Californians.

Gas exports to the U. S. may fatten the coffers of the petroleum industry today, but a future generation of Albertans may well ask why we did not keep the gas in reserve for our own vital use.

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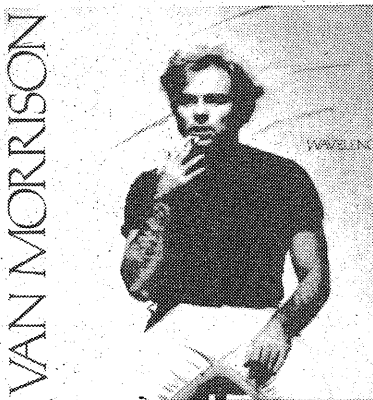

Garth Hudson adds the feeling of gondolas when joining Van in the song Venice U. S. A. with accordion.

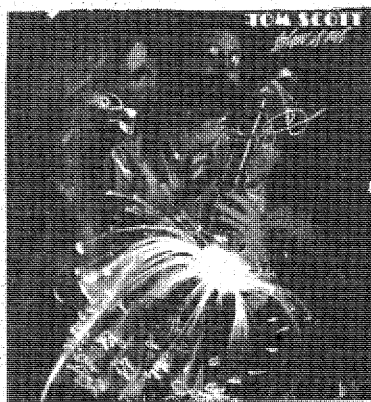
The talent is fantastic on this album! "Wave Length" carries a radio wave tune in the background thanks to Peter Bardens who plays keyboards throughout.

Since Tom Scott came out of the woodwork he has pleased musician and listener alike.

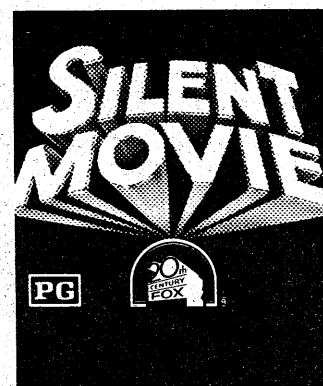
As long as Tom Scott can hold and play brass, millions will continue being satisfied.

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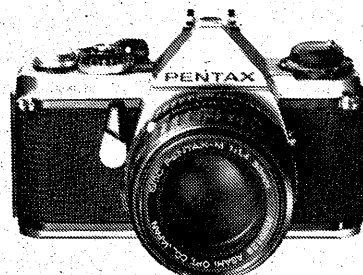
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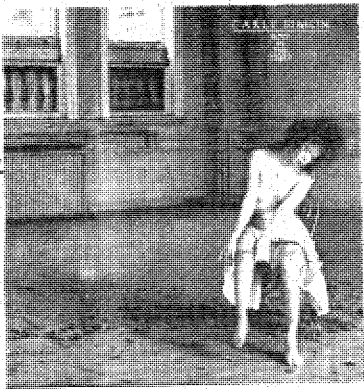

MEDITERRANEAN SUNSET

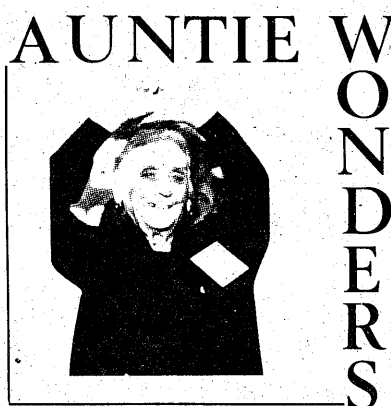
