

LIMITS TO GROWTH

Alberta Liberal Leader, Nick Taylor, today called on the provincial government to develop a "limits to growth" policy.

"Alberta's growth is not determined by the amount of gas or oilfields to be developed, nor by the space we have for settlement, it is determined by the amount of water we have -- potable drinking water, water for irrigation and water for industrial use".

Mr. Taylor says he fears the province may turn into another California resulting in the same problems for Alberta as face rain-dependent California. Drought, useless dams, over - crowded cities, and farmland going under to asphalt have a terrible iffect on our future. 'Drought itself is made worse by the numbers of people drawing on limited water supply'.

of the five Rocky Mountain States which have completed water management and growth studies and are now setting limits to population growth in each river basin".

Mr. Taylor says such studies in Alberta should tell the government how large the province can grow, how much water it has left for power and industry, and how much agriculture its water supply can support.

I couldn't believe the "enthusiasm" of the crowd. You guys were terrific. There's no doubt that when it comes time to party, NAIT students do it best. Oh,


congratulations table number one, your audience participation program turned out to be a real table cruncher. Hope you all have hands left to write wild this week.



The man whom Time magazine labeled as rock's new superstar after the release of "Born to Run" two years ago has done it again. "Darkness on the Edge of

Town" is an exceptional album.

Springsteen's New Jersey "blue collar" roots have spawned ideas for some great songs heresongs about working in factories during the day; about trying to forget a mundane existence at night by racing the streets; about going home to a woman; about waiting for the chance to run away from it all. Perhaps his most powerful song is "Adam Raised a Cain" - it is reputed to be about Bruce's own painful childhood relationship with his father.

There is less emphasis on Clarence Clemon's saxophone (he was pictured on the cover of "Born to Run" with Bruce) and more on Springsteen's guitar this time around - a good trend, since



olive.

* The addition of vermouth is a personal thing. Some enjoy their Martini's dry where 1/3 oz is sufficient. Extra dry may mean from 1/4 oz to none at all. In place of an olive a twist of lemon and one or more pearl onions can be added. Having done so you've got a Gibson.

Another similar type of drink elite is the:

ROB ROY

1½ oz scotch 3/4 oz sweet vermouth. Cinzano) Stir with ice & strain into a Martini glass.

And finally a real taste tester, the

MANHATTEN

11/4 oz Rye 2 oz sweet vermouth 3 - 4 drops of bitters This can be served on ice or straight in a martini glass. Garnish with a cherry.

NAIT WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM HAS NEW COACH



Lubrication

And thanks to modern chemistry, several new nonreactive lubricants have been developed so that prophylactics are available in either non-lubricated or lubricated forms. The lubricated form is generally regarded as providing improved sensitivity, as is, incidentally, the NuForm' Sensi-Shape. For your added convenience, all prophylactics are pre-rolled and ready-to-use.

Some Helpful Hints

The effectiveness of a prophylactic, whether for birth control or to help prevent venereal disease, is dependent in large


measure upon the way in which it is used and disposed of. Here are a few simple suggestions that you may find helpful.

Packaging

First of all, there's the matter of packaging. Skin prophylactics are now packaged premoistened in sealed aluminum foil pouches to keep them fresh, dependable and ready for use. Latex rubber prophylactics are usually packaged in sealed plasticized paper pouches or

aluminum foil. All of these prophylactics, at least those marketed by reputable firms, are tested electronically and by other methods to make sure they are free of defects. Prophylactics are handled very carefully during the packaging operation to make sure they are not damaged in any way.

Storage and Handling

It is equally important that you store and handle them carefully after you buy them, if you expect best results and dependability. For example, don't carry them around in your wallet in your back pocket and sit on them from time to time. This can damage them and make them worthless. Next is the matter of opening the package. It's best to tear the paper or foil along one edge so that the simple act of tearing doesn't cause a pinhole. And of course, one should be particularly careful of sharp fingernails whenever handling the prophylactic.

Putting Them On

The condom, or prophylactic, should be put on before there is any contact between the penis and the vaginal area. This is important, as it is possible for small amounts of semen to escape from the penis even before orgasm.

Unroll the prophylactic gently onto the erect penis, leaving about a half of an inch projecting beyond the tip of the penis to receive the male fluid (semen). This is more easily judged with those prophylactics that have a reservoir end. The space left at the end or the reservoir, should be squeezed while unrolling, so that air is not trapped in the closed end.

As mentioned earlier, you may wish to apply a suitable lubricant either to the vaginal entrance or to the outside surface of the prophylactic, or both, to make entry easier and to lessen any risk of the prophylactic tearing.

Taking Them Off

When sexual relations are completed, withdraw the penis while the erection is still present, holding the rim of the prophylactic until withdrawal is complete, so as to stop any escape of semen from the prophylactic as well as to stop it from slipping off. Remove the pro-

phylactic and, as an added precaution, use soap and water to wash the hands, penis and surrounding area and also the vaginal area to help destroy any traces of sperm or germs.
