ASSASSINATION

(ZNS-CUP) -- The final report drafted by the House Assassinations Committee concludes that President Kennedy's murder in Dallas more than 15 years ago was the result of a conspiracy, and that the plot may have involved high members of organized crime.

The draft report, which is not scheduled for public release until May 1, says that the Warren Commission investigation into the Kennedy murder was -- in the report's words -- "seriously flawed".

The Committee concludes the Warren Commission "was in fact wrong" about the people with whom Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby associated prior to the assassination.

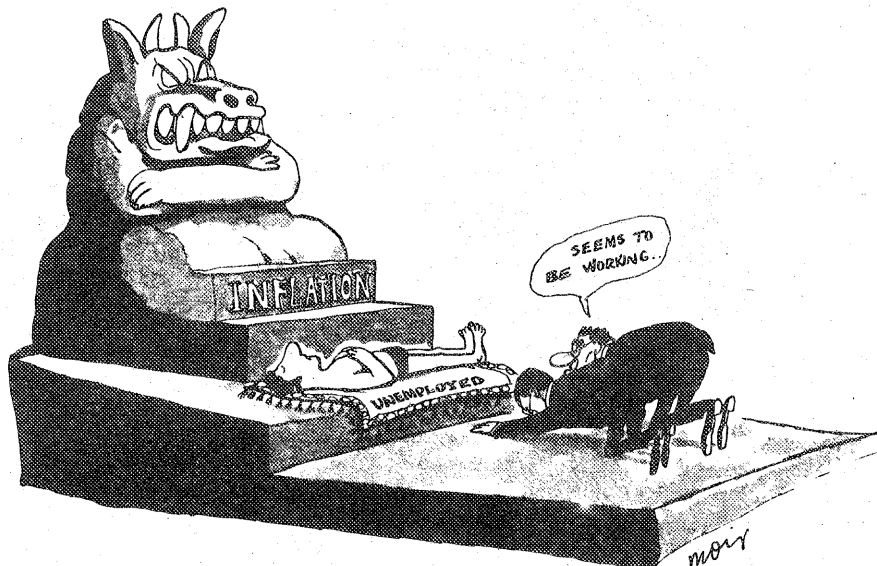
The Congressional report also alleges that "a second gunman in fact fired at the President".

The report stresses that despite its conclusion of a probable conspiracy, the actual identities of the alleged conspirators remain unclear.

It suggests, however, that members of organized crime including reputed mob bos-

ses Carlos Marcello and Santos Trafficante and former teamster boss Jimmy Hoffa, possessed the "motive, opportunity and means" to carry out a presidential assassination.

The report alleges that both Oswald and Ruby had extensive ties to organized crime figures. It reveals that a top lieutenant to a reputed mobster named Nofio Percora bailed Oswald out of jail when Oswald was arrested several months prior to the JFK slaying.



JOBS NOT ALL THAT IMPORTANT says Trudeau

OTTAWA (CUP) - Jobs are not all that important, according to Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau.

Trudeau told an audience in Sydney, Nova Scotia, April 4 that, while the problems of the economy are significant, "dollars and jobs are not all that important for human beings".

He preferred to emphasize national unity and developing "feelings of self-worth" in Canadians, he said.

But representatives of students and the unemployed denounced Trudeau's statement as a cynical election gesture.

"Trudeau is creating false issues in the election because he realizes he and his government haven't dealt with the problem of unemployment," said Bev Crossman of the National Union of Students.

Doug Coupar, speaking for the Ottawa Coalition for Full Employment, said the statement exemplified the "whole Liberal strategy -- a rather cynical masking of a real tragedy they got us into."

And both said it was completely untrue.

"Unemployment is the number one issue, not national unity," said Coupar. "For any unemployed person, jobs and dollars come above any other consideration."

"Dollars and jobs are the essence of being able to develop as a human being rather than just as pieces of flesh," Crossman said.

She said Trudeau's statement clearly reflected his government's previous "irresponsibility" in dealing with unemployment.

"They've clearly abdicated all responsibility for that. This is only putting into words what his practice has been for years."

She said Trudeau's statement was clearly linked to one he made at the University of Toronto in March, 1977, where he told students, "If it's just a job you want my heart does not bleed for you", and "If they don't like it here, let them find another country."

"In moments of stress, when he's put on the spot about jobs or unemployment, he clearly cannot deal with it in a rational sense," she said. "The real sentiments that he and his party hold come through."

"The Liberals consistently make 'blunders' which are blunders to them but which are seen to us who have been unemployed for a long time to be statements of policy."

Coupar said Trudeau would not get away with trying to minimize unemployment because workers, students and the unemployed are all determined to make it an issue. With the groups all organized, he said, the Liberal strategy won't work.

"Working people will be raising the issue of unemployment despite Trudeau's attempt to ignore it. They won't let the Liberals get away with this."

Interestingly enough, Coupar said, when the coalition tried to learn the Liberal positions on unemployment and jobs, the National Liberal Press Office said they could not provide statements on either topic. But they said they could provide a statement of national unity.

Nuclear Waste

TORONTO (CUP) -- A Seneca College student walked into the information centre of the Pickering Power station March 31, and walked out with a container of nuclear waste.

The student, who wishes to remain anonymous, was at the plant to obtain information for an essay. He wandered into an empty auditorium and saw a red and yellow box sitting unattended on a desk.

He simply put the box in his pocket, walked outside, got into his car, and drove away.

The student brought the container home for the rest of the weekend, where he kept it in a lead lined box. On Apr. 2, he brought the container to the radiobiology lab at the Finch Campus of the college where it was tested by two teachers. There it was confirmed that it was indeed radioactive.

"It's hot radioactive material" said one teacher. Without the 1/8 inch lead lined case, he said, the waste gives off 11 REMs per hour. A REM is a measure of the amount of damage radioactivity does to animal tissues. A dangerous dose is 120 REMs; a fatal dose is 250 REMs.

Once inside the case, the material only gives off five

milliREMs per hour.

The average dose a worker at Pickering takes in per year is 100 REMs. In order to equal that, a person would only have to be in unshielded constant contact with the waste for 10 hours.

The nuclear waste, the remains of the station's nuclear fuel, is in the form of two round pellets. Currently, it cannot be reused, and the usual procedure at Pickering for getting rid of it is to dump it in a pool in the complex for approximately 18 months.

After this, it is taken out and buried.

When asked why he took it, the student couldn't really give a clear answer. He and the two friends with him knew something must be in it, he said, so they took it.

"What really surprised us was the lack of security there," he said. There was only one person inside the information centre, at the front, he said, and the only guards he saw were at the entrance to the plant itself.

On a bus tour of the outside of the plant, he noticed no guards in that area either.

When asked what he intended to do with the waste, the student said he would probably bring it back. April 7th.

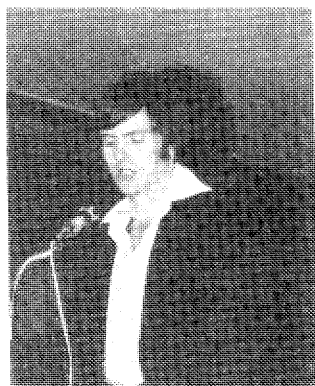

all cabarets, beerfest, and pubtimes and NO. EXCEPTIONS will be made.

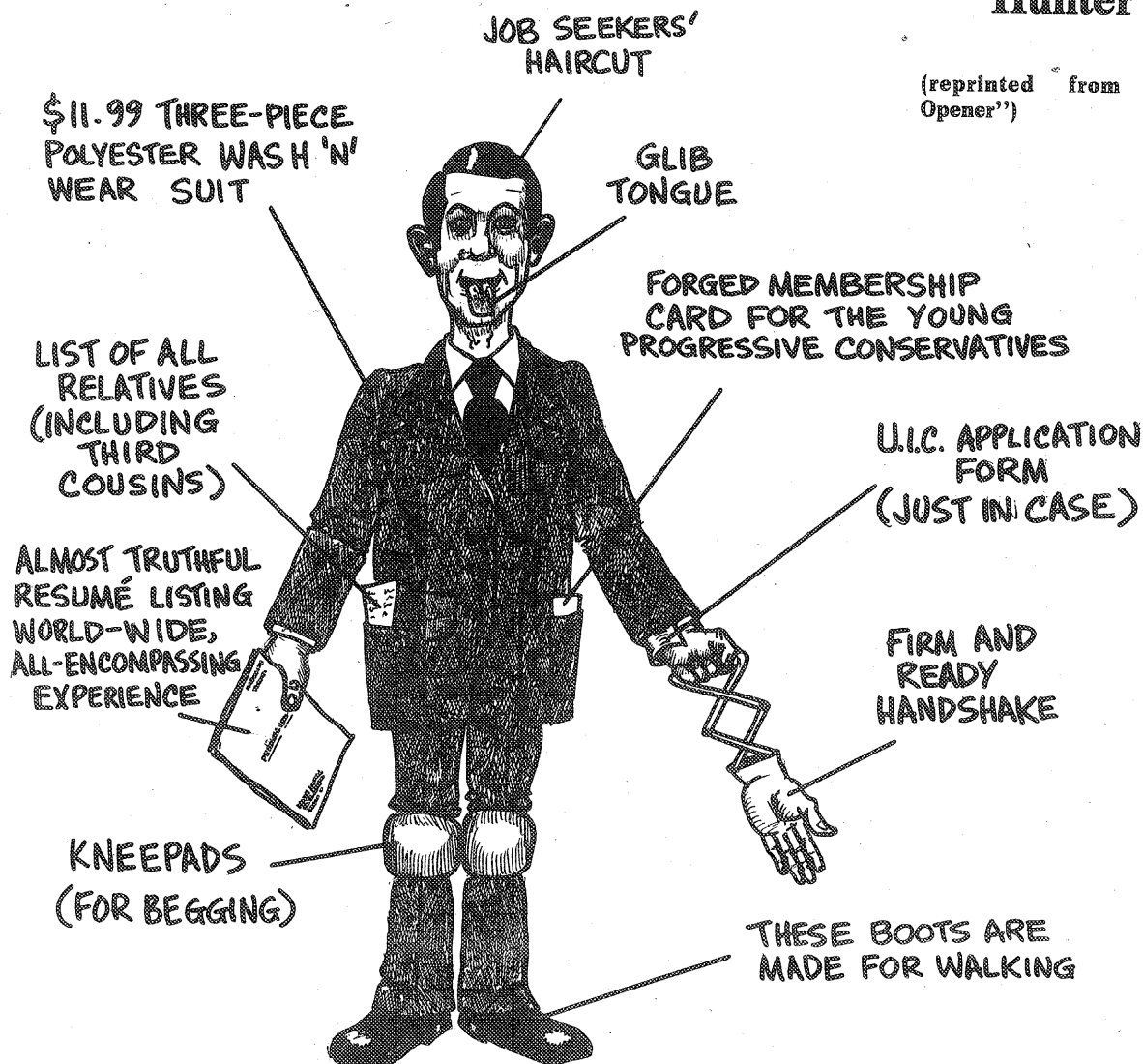

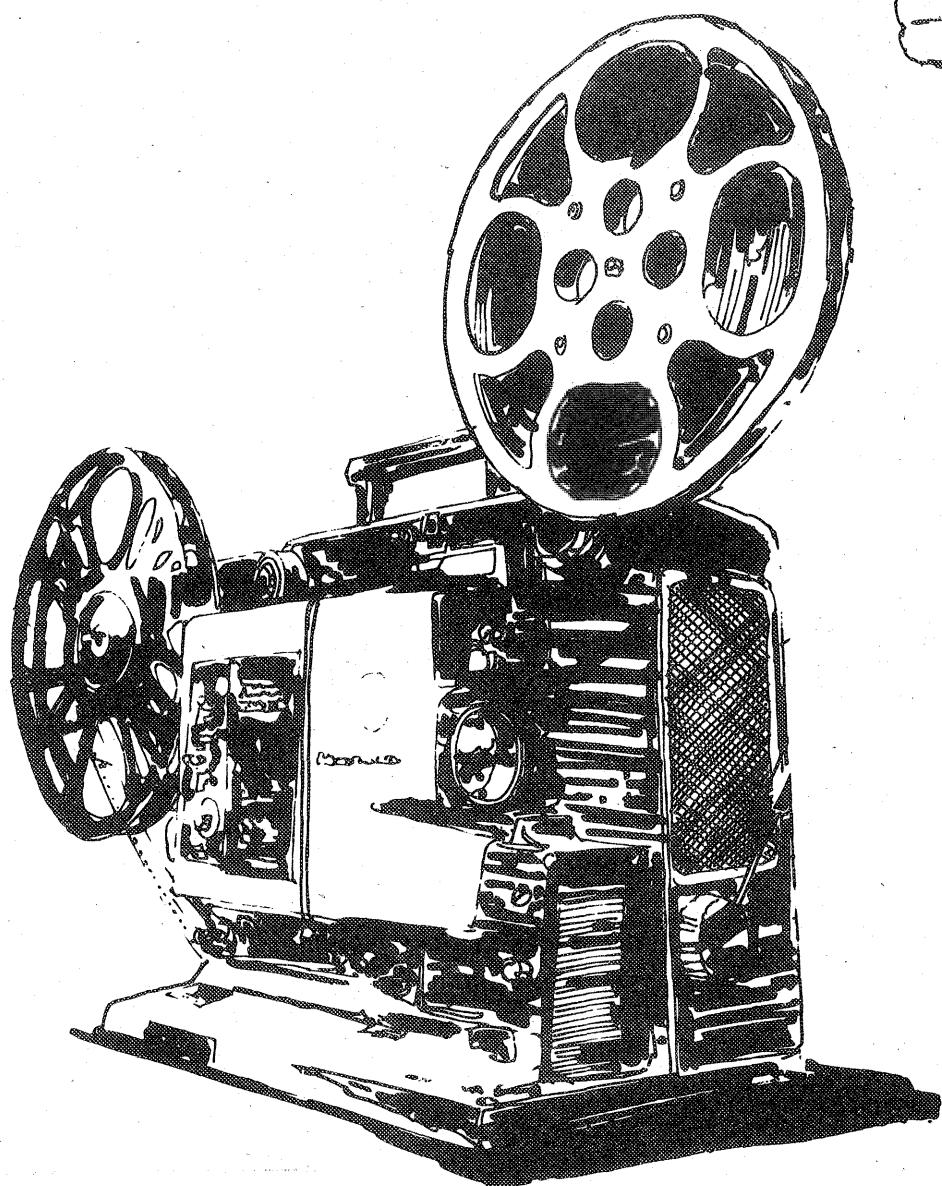

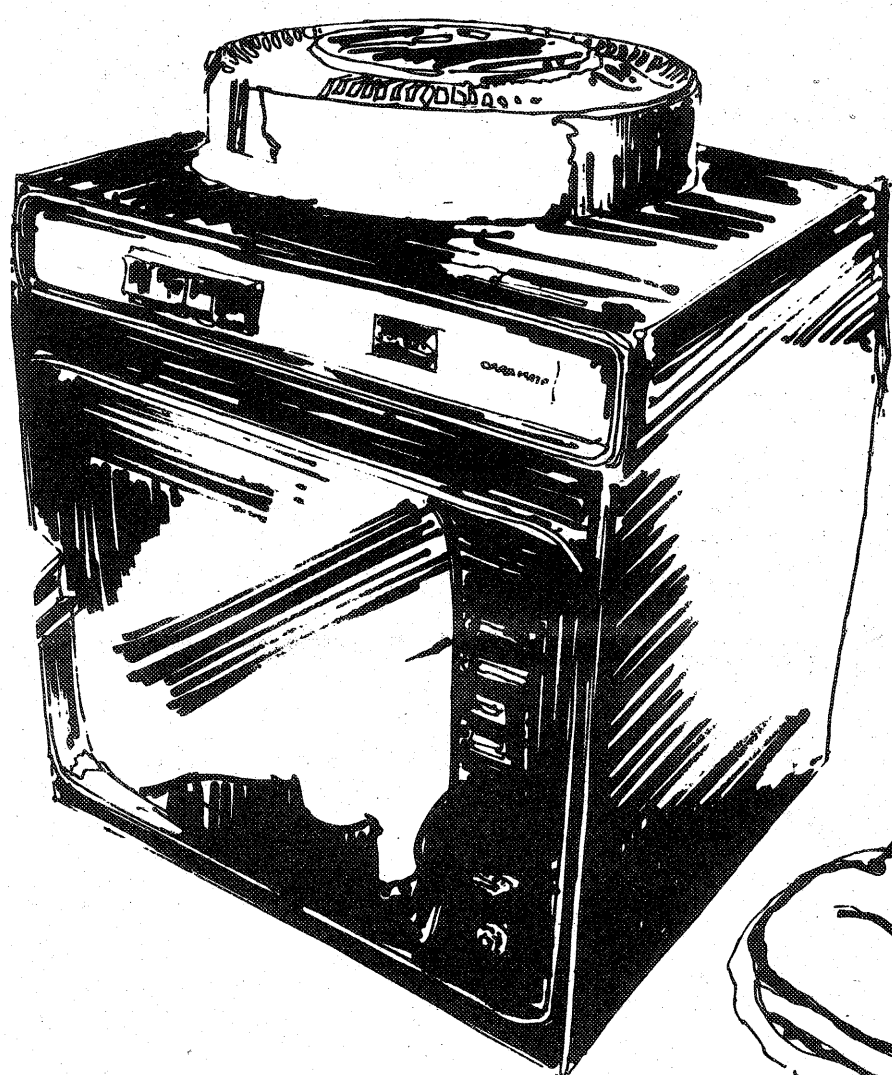
slide sets, transparencies, audio tapes, records, filmstrips and filmloops. All of these materials are available for the use of students.



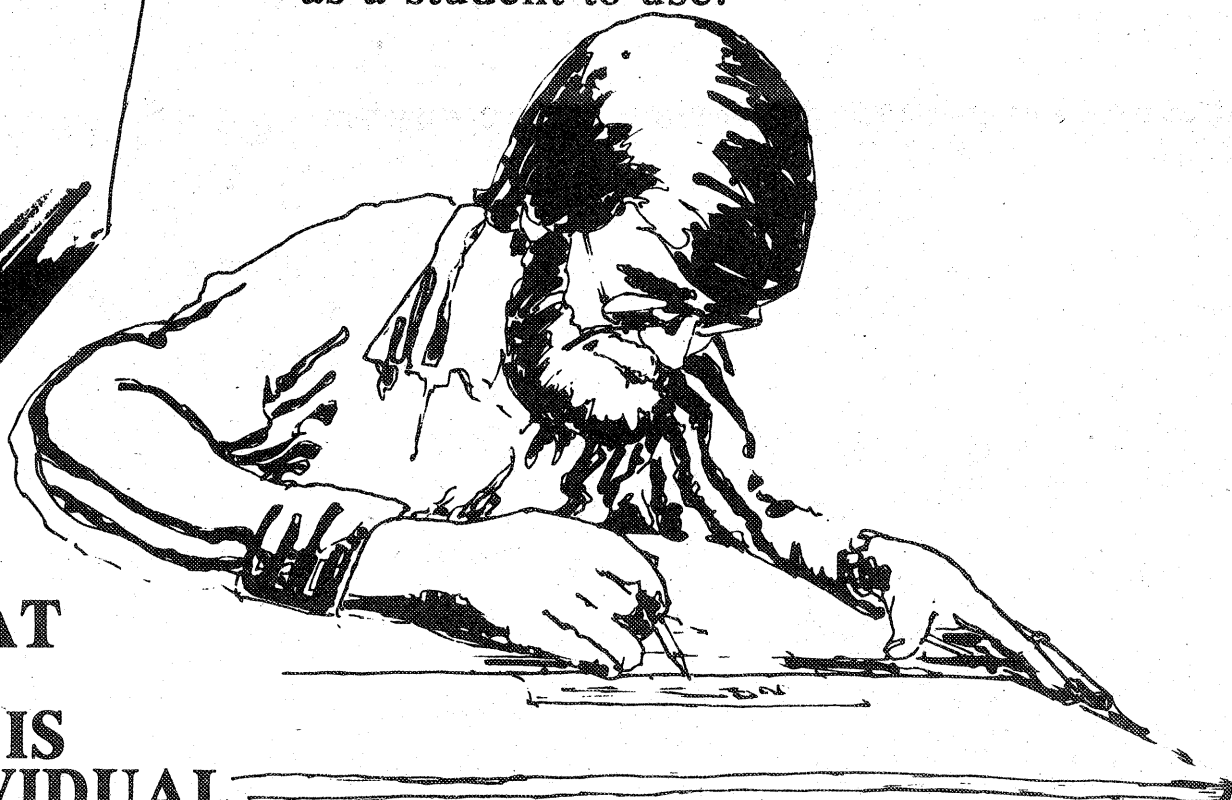

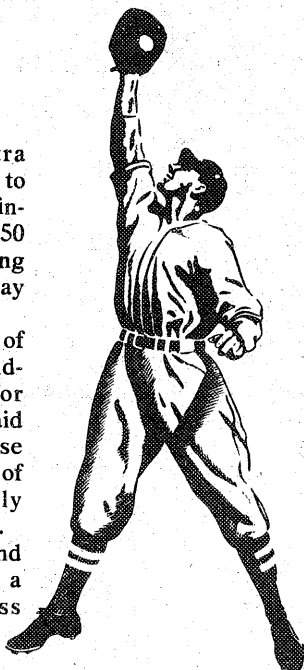
SPORT PEARSON CUP

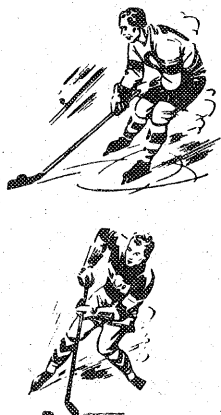
Charlie Hustle himself thinks the song is already a hit.
