JOB CREATION MEASURES ARE NOT WORKING

Ottawa's job creation efforts are sadly lacking despite cutbacks in unemployment insurance that were supposed to provide 'employment' not 'benefits' to the unemployed. New eligibility requirements will virtually keep students off the U. I. rolls, but the cutback hasn't resulted in an effective job creation strategy.

The major summer employment program, Young Canada Works, has a budget of \$62 million this year. Project applications total 13,197 and represent a funding demand of \$161,249,502. Almost two - thirds of the applications cannot be funded due to an insufficient budget.

The major year - round employment program for youth, Job Experience Training, provides for a maximum 26 weeks employment. The federal government subsidizes private employers to a maximum of \$1.50 for each hour worked, paying 50% of the employee's wage. The result, JET provides short - term employment at minimum wage with no guarantee that the employer won't lay off a full-time staffer to obtain the six month wage subsidy.

JET is no answer to the graduate employment problem. According to the co - ordinator of the program, only those who can prove they are unemployable may apply.

JET is restricted to those who have been unemployed from three to thirty - six months, and the majority of young people who have used the program have been under the age of 20 and high school drop outs.

The federal government also places several million dollars in job programs that are "indirect." These projects (such as youth and student employment centres) don't create a single job. Rather, they help students find work despite statistics showing the jobs simply aren't there for the numbers of unemployed students that now exist.

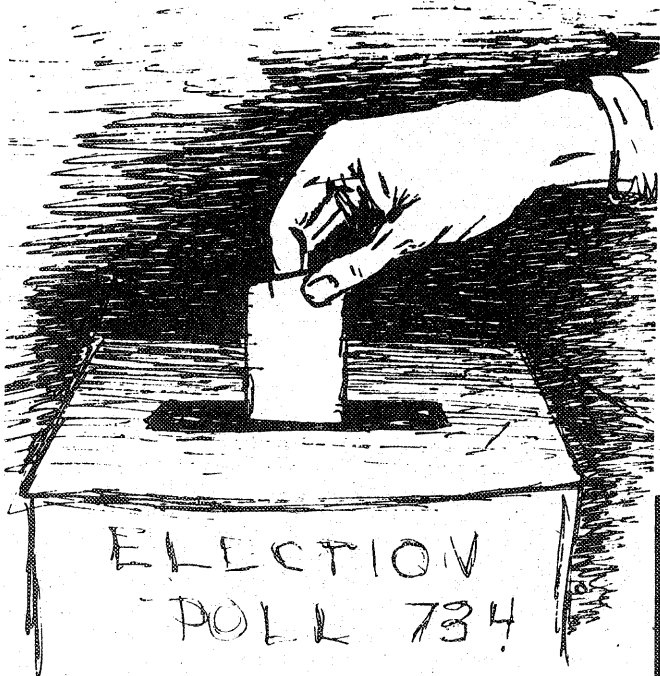

Students & the vote

The long awaited race for government office has finally started. However, **IF YOU ARE NOT ENUMERATED, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO VOTE.**

WHAT IS ENUMERATION?

Enumeration is a process which occurs from Monday, April 2 to Saturday, April 7. It involves more than 100 thousand people, who are paid by the government to go through electoral ridings to the various homes.

They register the eligible voters and compile a list of names which are then displayed in a prominent, public location within each riding.

IN ORDER FOR YOU TO VOTE, YOUR NAME MUST APPEAR ON THE VOTERS LIST.

IF I AM NOT ON THE LIST....

/(Call the Returning Officer, whose name and phone number, plus the location of the office, will be advertised in newspapers from Tuesday, April 17 to Friday, April 27. Ask the Returning Officer to send a "revising agent" to your home, to add your name to the voters list.

2) The other option is to go to the "Sittings for Revision", May 2, 3, and 4. You can get the location and times by calling the Returning Officer. This is your last chance to have your name put on the voters list. **IF YOU MISS THE MAY 4 deadline, you cannot vote on May 22.**

ELECTION TIMETABLE

enumeration: April 2 to April 7
Court of Revision: May 2, 3, and 4

Deadline for Enumeration: May 4
Advance Polls: May 12, 14, and 15

IF YOU ARE IN SCHOOL... Even your school residence is "home" as long as you declare it as such to the enumerator.

If you are enumerated in the same city in which you are attending school, that is where you must vote. Check the list to be sure.

IF YOU HAVE A JOB OUT OF TOWN...

You can still vote, as long as you have lived there prior to May 2.

However, you must remember to have your name put on the voters list in that riding before May 4.

IF YOU WANT TO VOTE AT HOME...

You must ensure that someone in your family or your housemates see to it that you are enumerated. Again, you will otherwise have to add your name to the list by May 4th in order to vote.

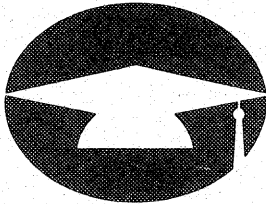
Tribute to the Dolphin

Dental Assisting

Educational researchers are constantly searching for new ways to improve the quality of education by experimenting with new ideas and theories. One of these theories is that people should learn what they choose to learn, so that educators make this information available to those who will use it.

The Dental Assisting Program at N.A.I.T. operates on this method, which is commonly referred to as self-directed learning. The students are supplied with objectives outlining exactly what is expected of them. Written resource material corresponding to the specific objectives is supplied along with other informational resources such as video tapes, film loops, cassettes, and slides specially prepared for the Dental Assisting students. And of course, the instructors offer their knowledge, practical experience, and assistance to the students. The entire program consists of the following subjects: Clinic, Clinic Prep, Oral Anatomy, Histology and Pathology, Nutrition and Diet Analysis, Practice Management, Psychology, Radiography, and Dental Assisting Arts. Clinic involves working in a simulated dental environment in the laboratory. The students follow the objectives and as they feel they have mastered each skill, are evaluated on a one-to-one basis with an instructor. Effective communication among students and instructors is necessary for this type of system to operate. This aspect helps prepare the Dental Assistant to work and communicate in the dental office with patients and other staff members.

To help improve communication between staff and students, a weekly staff advisor meeting is held either in a small group or on an individual basis and problems that may have occurred during the week are discussed with a staff advisor and hopefully resolved. At this time, the staff advisor also checks on the progress of the student in all courses.

As the name implies, self-directed learning allows the student to progress at her own rate, within certain guidelines suggested by the instructors. Oral Anatomy, as an example, consists of six units. Tentative dates were suggested for completion of each unit. The individual student writes the examination for each unit when she feels she knows and understands the information. This is basically the way the other courses progress.

There is one course that is optional, Prophylaxis and Fluoride, which involves three weeks in the last quarter. Practical experience is gained by each student doing a prophylaxis and topical fluoride application on twenty patients. The Dental Assistant is a valuable asset to the dentist if she has the ability to perform this service, and the students are encouraged to participate in this course.

During the year, the students extern at the University of Alberta where they work with Dental Hygienist and fourth year Dental Students. They also are given the opportunity to work in a dental office directly with patients, the dentist, and other dental staff members. This is a valuable experience which brings the entire program into perspective. The student becomes aware of the importance of her role on the dental team and also provides the opportunity to gain practical on the job experience.

The Dental Assisting self-directed learning program requires motivation, initiative, and responsibility on the part of the individual in order to succeed. The information has been made available, and it is the student's choice to accept the challenge to learn.

PLAQUE CONTROL

Does your toothbrush look like you stood on it - bristles curved and bent down? research shows that fibrous foods, although good for you, do not remove plaque. Dental research is going on all the time and as the dental profession learns we try to let you, the public, know about the latest ways to save yourself.

Did you know that today, with contemporary dental knowledge and preventive and restorative techniques, you can expect to keep your teeth as long as you keep your nose? Teeth should be forever. The dental profession has many new aids including pit and fissure sealants to prevent decay on certain teeth, new materials to try to replace lost permanent teeth, and better medications for control of dental disease. But the best part is the things you do at home, to prevent dental problems, can do the most good.

Bring your old toothbrush in, exchange for a new one, and help keep your teeth healthy for a lifetime.

'Meatloaf' served royally

Meat Loaf's colossal sales achievement in Canada of better than one million units was recently cause for celebration for the 'cause celebre' of rock.

Last week, CBS Records of Canada hosted an amazing 'Arabian Nights' party that saw close to 400 attendees joining in the festivities for Meat Loaf, at Toronto's Sheraton Centre Hotel. The night of the party was Monday, March 19th, the same night that Canada's CTV national network ran their half-hour *Meat Loaf* special; party-goers started the evening by viewing the TV special on giant screens provided for the occasion, and all agreed that it was a smash success.

The Arabian Nights theme for Meat's party was carried throughout the evening. All guests wore Arabian caftans emblazoned with MEAT LOAF 1 OVER ONE MILLION SERVED, across the back, while belly-dancers and harem girls mixed in

with the crowd. Mysterious eastern potables were served up in coconut shells, and hors d'oeuvre of Arabian delicacies were later followed by huge roasts of beef and roast suckling pig. The Sheraton Centre's Dominion Ballroom had been transformed into an Arabian bazaar, an illusion perfected by the presence of a llama, a baby leopard, a cougar, a lion, and other exotic live animals. The over-all effect was incredible, thanks to the invaluable efforts of Mr. Jim Clare of Ardel Ltd., whose company specializes in theme parties and in just this type of celebratory madness.

For the evening, CBS worked in conjunction with the Variety Club (Tent 28 of Ontario), and a number of carnival games were staged at the party with all proceeds going to the world-wide charitable work done by the Variety Club. Favourite game of the evening was unquestionably the dart board, for which our Chairman, Arnold Gosewich, thoughtfully provided his own photograph as the target. And to show strong CBS support for the good

works done by the Variety Club, Chairman Gosewich also ensured that CBS would match any sum obtained for the Variety Club, at the party.

At about 10:00p.m., that mighty mountain of melodious magnificence, Mr. Loaf himself, rode into the midst of this Arabian fantasy on a dark stallion of mammoth proportions. Platoons of press and radio reps in attendance, plus the five TV crews there to film the event, went mad. Meat's entrance created an appealing sort of pandemonium and constituted an event not likely to be ever matched -- until, perhaps, we celebrate the million sales of his 2nd album.

Meat Loaf took the stage, seated on a king's throne and with a live lion at his side, and the presentations for the evening began. Ian Sunter, Ken Clarke and Mark Bragagnolo, all players in the Canadian Pro Football Club the Toronto Argonauts, awarded Meat and official Argonaut jersey with his name on the back, and advised him to report to rookie camp in May. Portrait

recording artist *Burton Cummings* next took the stage, and presented Meat Loaf with a special Canadian Maple Leaf hockey sweater with his own personal number, '1 M', for one million. At this point, with festivities at a fever pitch, CBS Canada's Chairman of the Board, Arnold Gosewich, was ushered up to the stage by palm-waving girls. Gosewich then made the special presentations that were the focus of the evening. Praising Meat Loaf and lauding the hard work and effort put in by all to achieve the success of one million sales, Chairman Gosewich presented Meat Loaf with the coveted CRIA Diamond Award, the award which testifies to sales of one million units and which is the highest recognition possible in the Canadian Recording Industry. Not only was Meat's award one of the four ever given in this country, his was the first ever for a debut recording.

Gosewich then presented CRIA Diamond Awards to Jim Steinman (accepted by Karla De Vito and Rory Dodd of Meat's band); to Don

Dempsey, the Sr. V.P. and General Manager of the E/P/A label group in the U.S.; to Steve Popovitch, President of Cleveland International; and to David Sonenberg, Meat's manager.

The Meat Loaf extravaganza carried on until the early hours of the next day, and all in attendance agreed that the party was the perfect way to honour Meat

and to commemorate the sale of one million units for CBS Records Canada, Ltd. Meat Loaf appeared on the front page of the Toronto Star the next day, his second time in a week, and that was an extra and welcome finale to his celebrations.

Will Meat's second LP release, *Renegade Angel*, set for this summer -- go to sales of a million!\$\$\$

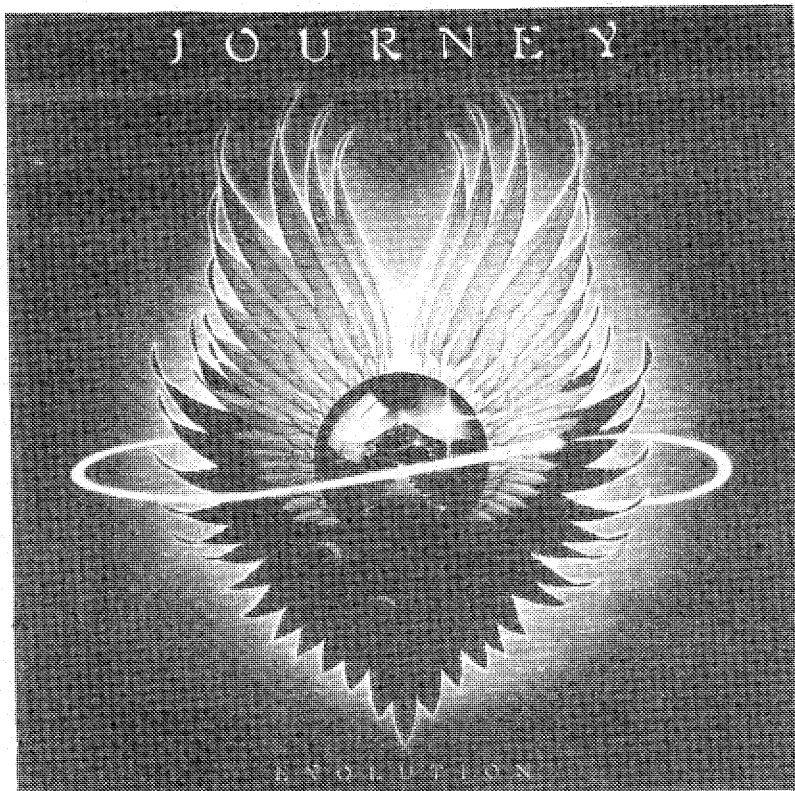

The best parallel I can find for this album is the recent music by "Boston". The same kind of very electric sound with male vocals is evident.

The kind of music varies from slow and easy "Do You Recall" for example to "Lovin You is Easy", some rock n roll boogie music.

Steve Perry has a voice which saunters through the high end of the musical scale quite effective. His style of singing ranges from smooth to some occasional Meat Loaf type scream singing.

Meal Schon really knows how to let loose on his lead guitar with stretches of wild ad lib which sounds good.

The overall sound is composed of steady rhythm

on percussion and base with the fancy variation emitting from key boards, lead guitar and vocals.

I was not at all impressed with the way the sequence of songs on the album cover was quite different from those on the album -- small problem though.

The cast of musicians is Steve Perry on lead vocals, Ross Valory on Base guitar, Neal Schon on lead guitar, Gregg Rolie on keyboards and Steve Smith on drums.

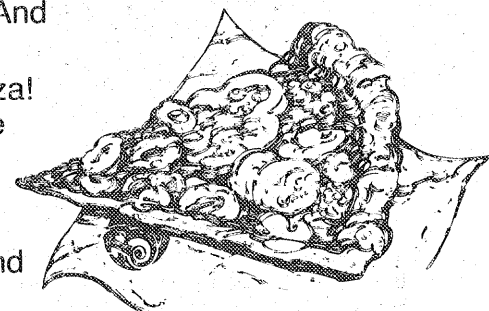

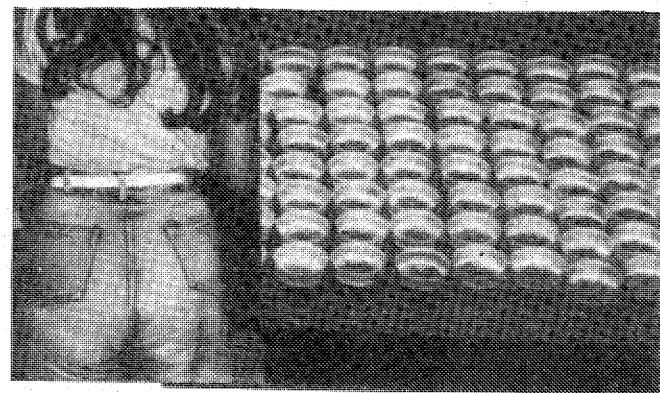

NEW YORK -- "The best role I've ever had in a film" is how actor Ron Leibman describes his portrayal of a textile union organizer in the widely acclaimed new movie, "Norma Rae".

"When I read the script," Leibman said in a recent interview, "I felt very close to it, although I had never been a union organizer. I had been involved in a similar experience when I worked in the civil rights movement in the 1960's. The similarity was being a stranger in an area where you're not wanted and trying to sell something that most people are afraid of."

"Norma Rae" accurately depicts working conditions in a nonunion textile mill as well as the anti-union tactics of a hostile management. However, because interior mill footage was shot inside a mill under union contract in which working conditions are relatively good, Twentieth Century Fox had to request mill management to leave cotton residue on the floors, blow cotton dust in the carding room air, and not clean up for a week before certain scenes were filmed. Many of the extras in the weave room and elsewhere in the mill were ACTWU members doing

their regular jobs.

At first, Leibman said, the extras were a little suspicious. "But then they saw that we weren't ripping them off. They understood that we were trying to represent them realistically and they kind of fell in love with the film."

Leibman -- like the character he plays -- has nothing but admiration for the workers. "Mill workers work so hard. How can they do it year after year? I learned about Brown Lung. I saw people coughing and choking. Making 'Norma Rae' gave me a close-up view of things I had known about but never seen before."

The crowd did not engage in excessive rowdiness but they were far from quiet. Shouts and yee ha's were heard all evening. They were a good party crowd.



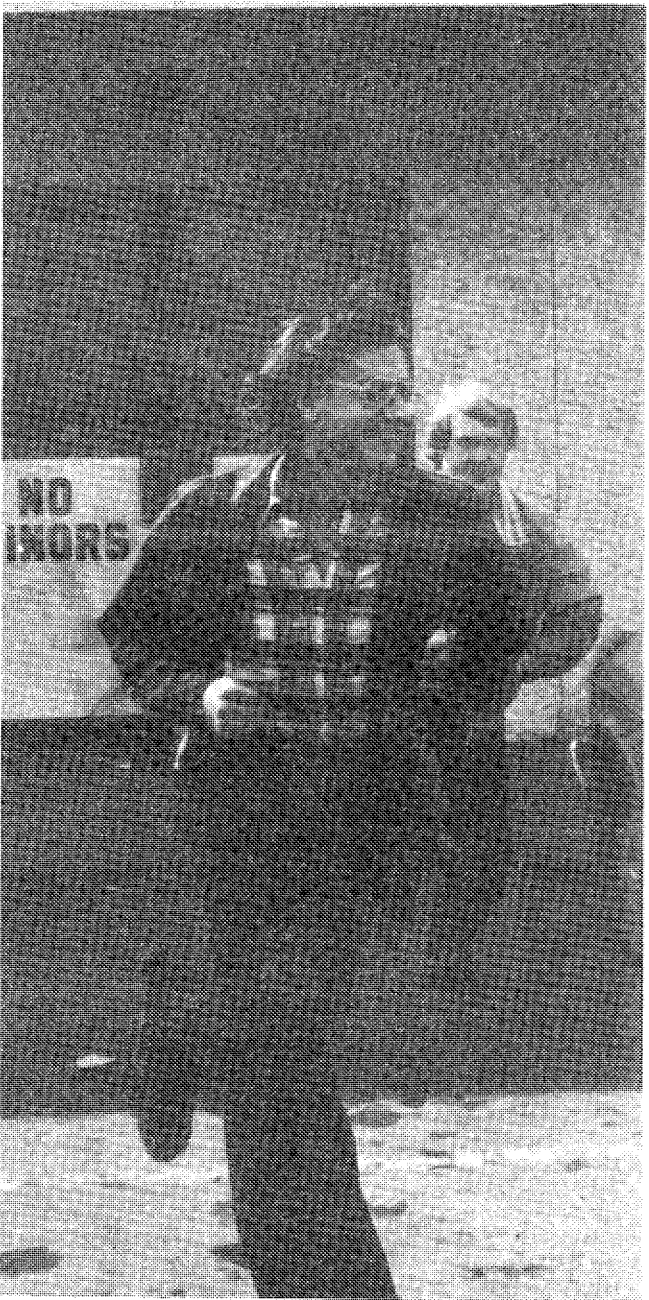
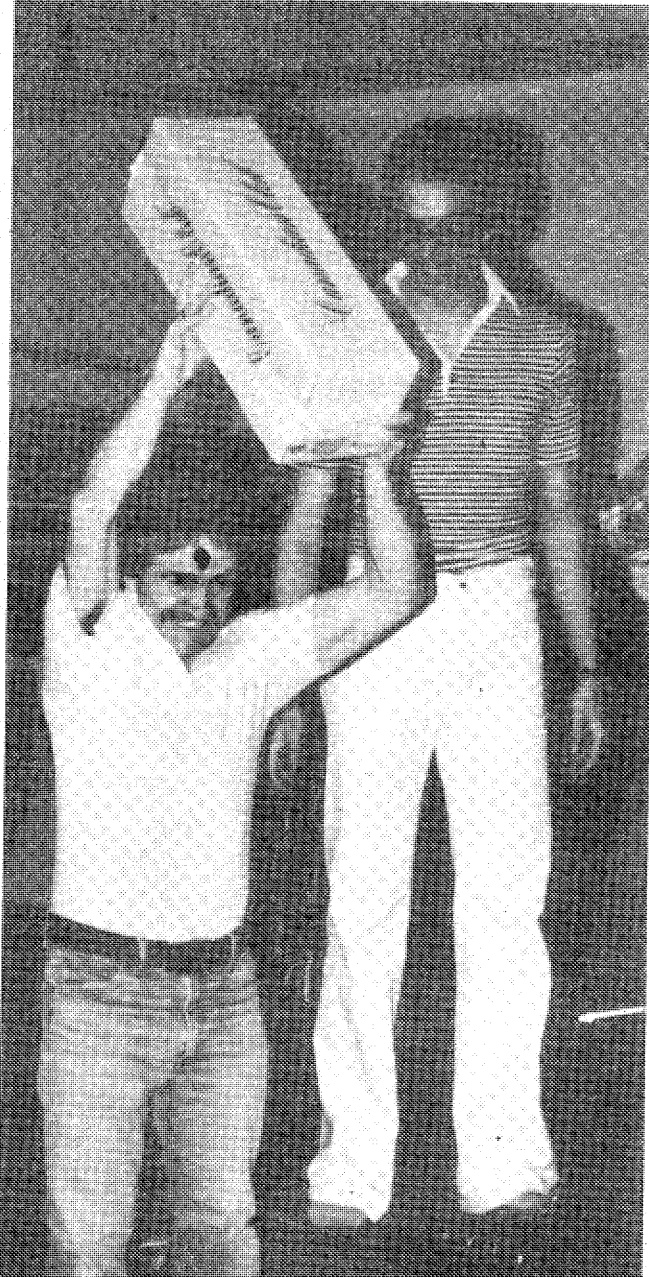
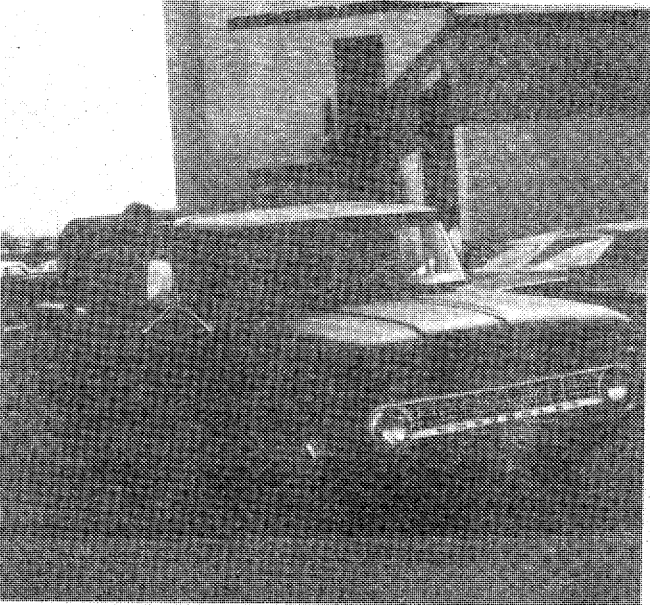
