My main concern is to get people into the Nugget and keep a student paper in the institution. If a staff can't be found the paper will fold. It's that simple.

Since the staff change I feel the paper has better sports coverage and with the old entertainment editor coming back, that section will improve also.

For a new twist we came up with the idea of putting news in the NEWSpaper. Something the Nugget has been sadly lacking all year. It takes people to follow the stories through and they're at a premium around the Nugget.

Come out to the NUGGET office any Tuesday noon-hour after 12:15, even if it's just to give ideas. It is the only way to find out how rewarding the finished paper can be. EDITOR

There has been a lot of information lately going around campus which has been confusing many students as to what the situation is, and getting others very upset.

What's the issue? The firing of our last editor, Dale Henderson. The reason for firing are as follows:

1) Dale doubled the wage of one of the Nugget staff members without the acknowledgement of the executive or even Saundra (Publications Chairman).

2) Articles written by non-Nugget staff were either not put in on time or only half printed.

3) There was a total lack of communication between Saundra Anderton and Dale Henderson. Several meetings were set up to get these two people together and to agree on a few issues. But the only issue both parties could concentrate on was how to get rid of (or fire) the other.

Both people involved (editor and Publications Chairman) are equally to blame for the commun-

ication gap and their conduct, but when it comes down to the last draw, who gets fired? Would it be the editor or the Publications Chairman (who is responsible for all student publications).

Through the edition of the "Tower Power" and "Fried Cake", some statements have been made which are incorrect. They are as follows:

1) It was stated that there are 7,000 students attending NAIT where, in fact, there are 4,009 full-time students at NAIT (includes all campuses).

2) It was stated that students missed a month and a half of newspapers and therefore being uninformed.

There was a total of 2 issues missed:

i) one was destroyed by the Nugget staff after the firing of Dale (this issue included all the announcements of the technology's Christmas dances);

ii) the other issue was missed because there are only two stu-

dents who know how to use the type-set machine: one worked for the Nugget and the other (Saundra) was away ill and missed almost one month of school.

NOTE: This is the third issue of the Nugget this year, '79 and if you feel any information has been missed tell Jim Cooper, the new Nugget editor.

What becomes difficult to understand is if the last Nugget staff was so concerned about NAIT students being informed, why did they destroy that issue of the Nugget?

3) Baked Alaska stated that NAITSA by-laws, dated Dec. 21, 1978, changed full-time fees from \$30-\$35 per student. This change occurred six years ago; the last time the constitution was revised.

4) There was also a misquotation taken from the NAITSA President which actually stated "If we made a mistake, we'll live by it". This statement was not about whether Dale should have

been fired or not, but in reference to the fact that we didn't have an editor to immediately take Dale's place.

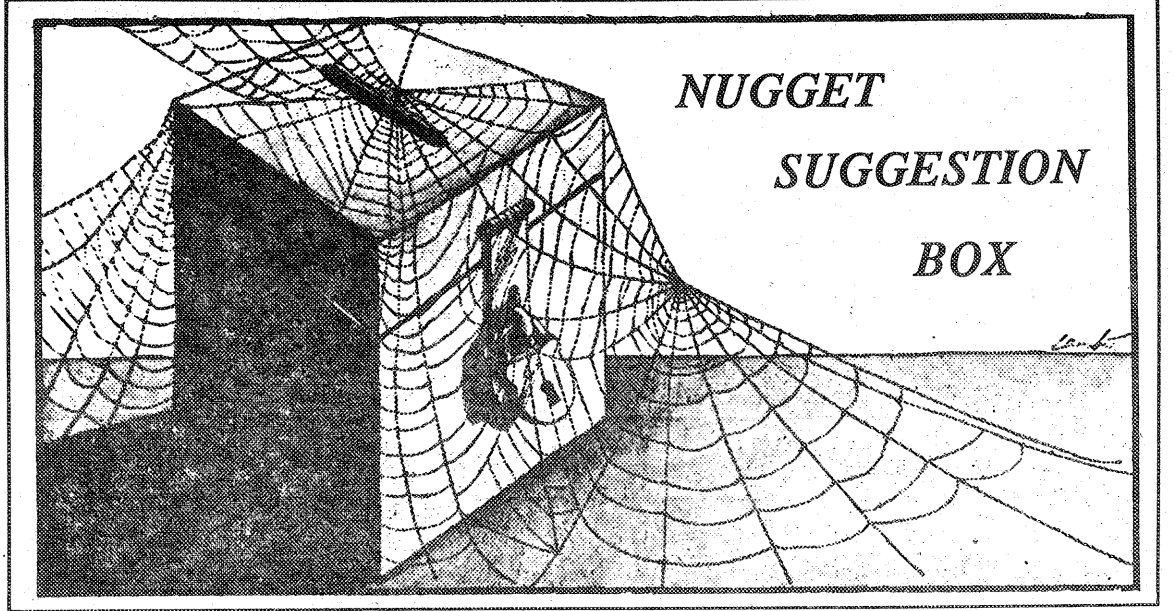
5) M. Cummings stated that we, NAITSA, goof off and don't care. We provide all activities, functions and publications for the big wage of \$85.00 a month.

Dale's wage was \$225.00 plus he received an additional 20% on all ads that went into the paper for the one responsibility of putting out the paper once a week.

Well, we put out a paper until we got a new editor and still assist on the Nugget besides the other duties our offices call for. Do we really goof off or is that a biased opinion.

I would just like to make a comment to Mr. M. Cummings. If you really want to work on the paper as stated in the "Tower Power", no one is stopping you, no one fired you, or asked you to leave. As a business student it

To me, as a person, I have absolutely no feelings or time for two-faced individuals.

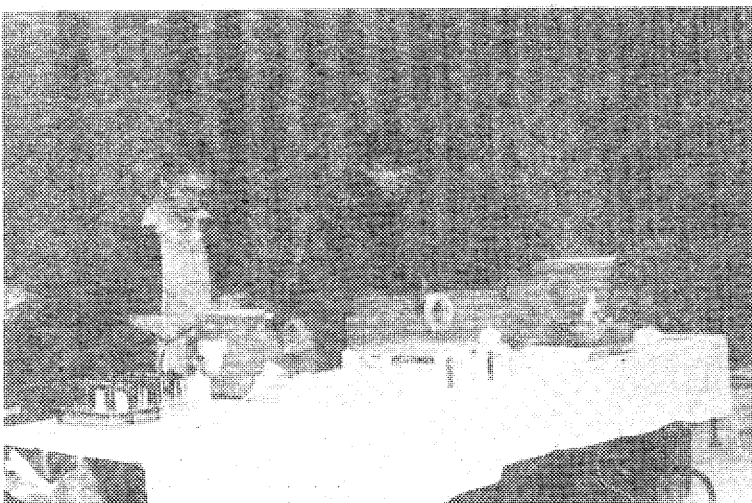

During the past few weeks, the Red Cross blood bank has been dangerously low in their supply of precious blood. In hopes of replenishing it, the Red Cross held a week long blood donor clinic in the NAIT auditorium last week and were pleased with the results.

A total of 643 thoughtful people bared their veins but unfortunately 127 of these generous people were turned away because they had either a cold or the flu. The final tabulation of actual donations was 516. The Red Cross extends to all those who came out a hearty felt thanks for this precious gift.

In talking to a few of the Red Cross staff they stated that the turn out at NAIT has gone down over the past few years but felt that this year was a bit better and would have been even greater if the flu and colds were not so

prevalent. In comparison to the other campuses, NAIT ranks a close second to the U of A even though they have five times as many students. So a tip of the proverbial hat to all the 643 people of NAIT.

For all you who did not donate and now have your conscience feeling a bit guilty, there is still hope. There are regular clinics at Red Cross House at 9931 - 106 St. everyday!!!

Canada is the only place in the world where you can get blood for free in the hospitals and where the blood is collected on the generosity of its people. ## INCREASES

Inflation Strikes! or so the story goes.

Yes -- the prices of food in the NAIT cafeteria did go up on January 1 of this year and you probably want to know what's going on. You should! It's your money!!

In finding information about the Cafeteria I received no response from Peter O'Neil, except to hear that Doug Grey, the man that "calls the shots" for the cafeteria wasn't available for an interview until at least the end of January.

Pat Lukay, your student union vice president had answers to a few questions about the recent price increases.

The cafeteria operates on a zero budget, meaning it is a no loss -- no profit organization. It's supposed to be strictly a break even affair.

The increase in prices was put into effect in order to alleviate an expected 20% increase in costs between Jan. 1, and Sept.

The cooking is done by students from food services technology but other services such as cashiers and those who serve are paid staff.

If you're not satisfied with the recent price increases you should start to say so. NAITSA hasn't heard any noise from the student body and nobody came to the Nugget to express any opinions.

NAITSA does realize what the situation is, but so far they haven't gotten together and made any decisions about some possible action. They know that the NAIT Cafeteria does have a monopoly her and the students have to pay up or suffer.

After asking a few questions to some patrons of the cafeteria, I received a few general opinions.

Some patrons feel the food could be prepared better and if there was a reasonable choice many would eat elsewhere.

Some feel that in spite of price increases the NAIT Cafeteria is still their best bet for a decent meal.

What do you say? Let's get some suggestions and opinions in the Nugget suggestion box.

## STUDENTS CHANGE THE CONSTITUTION

On Wednesday, January 24, 209 students attended the Annual General Meeting of the NAIT Student Association held during the Common Hour. It looked for a moment that the quorum of 200 students wasn't going to be filled, but a few people were stopped in the halls and asked to participate.

The first item on the agenda were the amendments to the constitution which was the main event to the majority of the students present. All the amendments were presented and passed. They were as follows:

1) the fiscal year for NAITSA was changed from September 1 - August 31 to read from April 1 - March 31. Unanimous.

2) a Publications Committee was set up to over see any NAITSA publication. This committee will not sit down and discuss what goes into every NUGGET but will hopefully help

in any way they can to overcome problems and stimulate new ideas. It will consist of Publications Chairman, Nugget editor, Yearbook editor, a staff advisor, and two members of the NAITSA General Council. Passed with 12 against, and 191 for.

3) the setting up of an Appeal Board to handle all complaints of those paid NAITSA employees in all areas except publications (see #4). It will be a three man board consisting of NAITSA President, a member of the NAITSA General Council, and a staff advisor. Passed 4 against, 11 abstain, 194 for.

4) the setting up of a procedure to handle any dismissal of a paid NAITSA employee in the area of Publications. All sides involved will present their views and reasons at a meeting of the NAITSA Council (15 tech quorum). A simple 75% majority vote of the Council will settle the issue. Passed 5 against, 2 abstain and 202 for.

5) a member of the NAITSA EXECUTIVE may be removed from office provided that a simple

Just about enough has been said on the subject of the firing of the last Nugget editor, Dale Henderson, but since the Student's Executive is continuously being criticised about the fact, I feel it is time to justify the decision. At the least to let you know my position as to this unholy mess.

Dale Henderson was fired for what I consider good reasons and contrary to all the opinions of those persons who are continually mouthing off, the fact of whether I like or dislike Dale Henderson had very little impact on my decision.

It is quite true that Dale and myself had a personality conflict and that the situation was becoming unbearable for both of us. Nevertheless, I defy anyone to tell me that personality is not a basis for hiring and firing in the business world.

One of the first questions you are asked in an interview is 'how well you get along with fellow workers', and people have been

majority of 75% of the NAITSA Council and the rest of the executive members approve in writing. The action can be initiated by either the EXECUTIVE or by a member of the NAITSA Council. Passed 5 against, 1 abstain and 203 for.

How do these amendments benefit the students? The setting up of the Publications Committee combined with the amendment to regarding the dismissal of a paid NAITSA employee in the publications area will help to make sure that the students will have a newspaper or any other important publication without the loss that was experienced this year with the NUGGET.

If you felt that a member of the executive was not doing their job, you could do nothing about it.

Now you can. Removal from office is now an added factor in spurning on your executive to try and do the job you elected them to do.

You will probably be able to find out where all your money is going a lot easier now that the fiscal year has been changed. Previously, one could expect the work of up to three treasurers. It was difficult and frustrating to try and decipher the accounting systems each treasurer has set up.

The general mood of the meeting was one of "God. Let's get it over with". As soon as the amendments were read and passed a great many people left to go their way. I wonder if some of them know what they have contributed to. I guess if the students had really wanted to arise en masse and do something they felt was worth doing then perhaps

fired for causing disturbances among staff and being uncooperative. This was definitely the case with Dale but there were other reasons and they are as follows:

1) Refusing to obey the Nugget policy regarding slanderous and libelous letters.

2) Complaints from the Nugget staff. Don Stosky (entertainment editor) complained to me for almost an hour one night as to how Dale Henderson was not living up to his responsibilities as editor by not editing columns, never being in the office, leaving the responsibility of layout to his staff and not directing his staff as to covering of events, etc.

He ended with a statement that I should do something about it as the situation was becoming worse.

Gary Couet (Nugget typesetter) complained several times that Dale was never in the office anymore, that the staff was becoming upset by his absence. Layout was being left to the staff; he didn't seem to be concerned about the quality of the paper and even the staff was having a hard time getting in touch with him on newspaper business.

Even the day before Dale was fired, when I talked to his staff, they informed me that things were still pretty bad and that one member had quit that day and two more were threatening to quit.

The fact that they walked out in support of their editor is hypocritical in light of the complaints they were making.

3) Students were coming to me and asking how much they would have to pay for their cabaret ad as Dale was telling techs it would cost them up to \$5.00 to place an ad.

The policy of the Nugget has always been that techs can place ads free of charge and I don't consider the deliberate confusion of the students a joke.

4) The NAIT NUGGET was reported by Canadian University Press to be the worst student newspaper in Canada. Their

there would have been more interested people there.

I hope that in the future more people will take note of what is going on around them and become involved. To those who were there, I thank you for the interest you showed not only for yourselves now, but those students who will be at NAIT in the future. C'est la vie.

VOLTAIRE

Alberta representative was in the process of writing a report recommending that NAIT be thrown out of CUP. Whether or not we want to belong to CUP is not the issue here. The point is that I have never heard of a student newspaper being thrown out of CUP.

Dropping out by their own decision - yes, but I don't think it would really contribute to the reputation of NAIT to be kicked out of an organization like CUP and have it broadcasted to the rest of Canada. After all, no matter what anyone thinks of CUP personally, they do know how a paper should be run and what quality it can be.

5) On occasion deliberately withholding ads and articles that had been submitted, or printing them later or only in part.

6) Dale raised the salary of a Nugget staff member without any authorization.

No one on NAITSA is allowed control of student funds, why should the Nugget editor? Do you really want any one person to do with your money as they see fit?

NAITSA justifies their expenses to Committees and all NAITSA members and to the Student Council. Dale justified his to no one.

7) The NAIT advisory board (and they throw a lot of weight around here) told me at our last meeting with them that they were extremely dissatisfied with how the NUGGET was being run and that action should be taken to straighten things out.

8) Dale and I seemed unable to communicate on anything regarding the Nugget. This was not only true for myself but he was also unable to get along with anyone else in NAITSA; continually telling us to stuff it. Considering that we were not directing him as to content of what he described as "his" paper and that we are also students at NAIT with a right to an opinion we were all finding his attitude intolerable.

His continual ignorance of us and our jobs was causing friction among ourselves and wasting time that we could have put to better use.

In summation I would like to say that in my talks with the Edmonton Journal and CUP they both agreed that I had just cause to fire Dale and the only other question the Edmonton Journal had after hearing my side of the story was, and I quote "How old is Dale Henderson?". I told them he had just turned 20 and they replied "Oh, I see. Well he'll grow up".

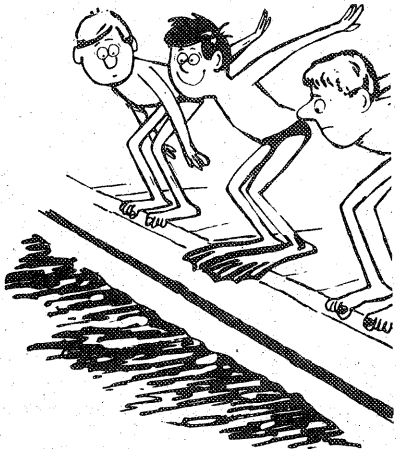

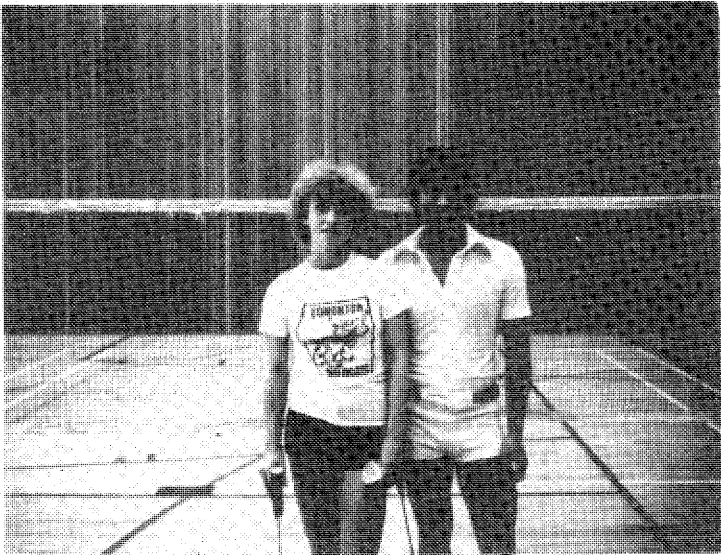
The second half saw A & F tie the game early into the half but EDDT quickly took it back again and managed to stay at least two points ahead until midway point

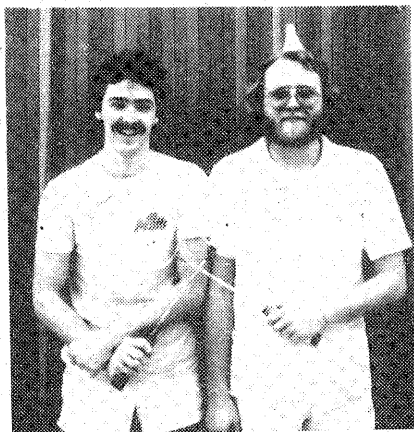
However, it was not a complete loss for Mr. Herbrada as he teamed up with Chris Brower from Court Reporting to secure the right to the Mixed Doubles laurels.

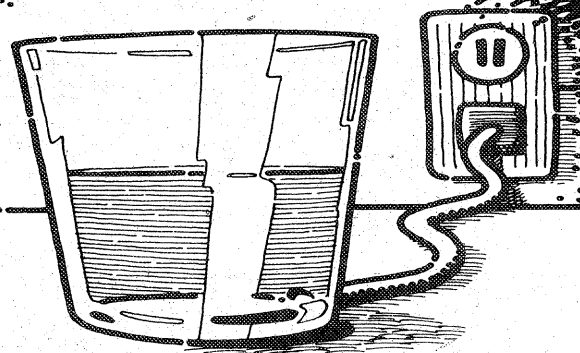

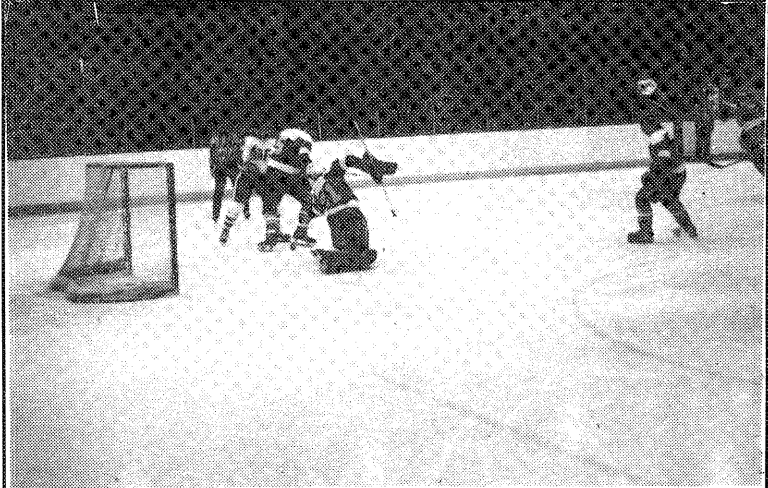

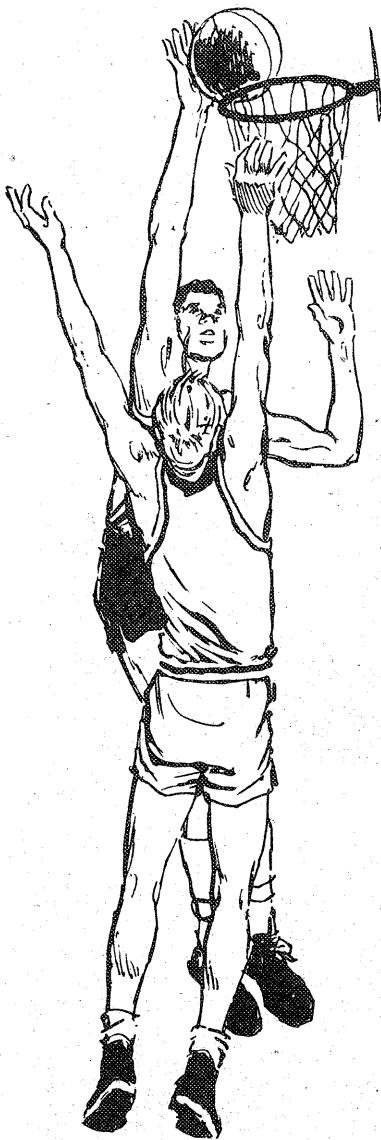

Last Friday I had the option of going to see One Horse Blue or the MIET and Court Reporting disco. I chose the disco, I should bet the horses the way I pick them.

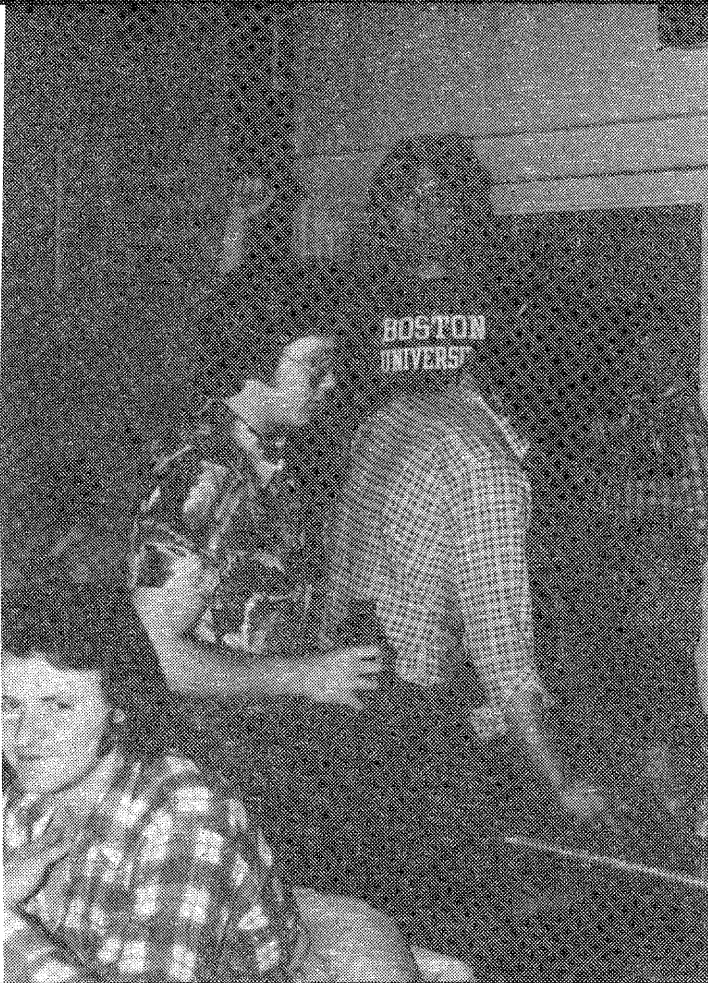
