



So get out to the Plaza, Grads; you've worked hard and long to get where you are. It's time you got the recognition you deserve.

The sport of racquetball is really catching on here at NAIT. If you want to book a court, you have to be here at 7:00 in the morning. Students are always getting upset because there aren't enough racquetball courts.

Well it looks like the students of NAIT may get their wish; because during the summer the plans are being drawn up to install new courts.

According to the Administration though, the cost is really going to hurt the budget. Two alternatives were brought up to solve this problem. The first one was to raise tuition fees to \$500

per person. This idea was ruled out though, because of a survey that was taken. If tuition was raised to \$500, approximately 2,401 students would drop out of NAIT. As a result, NAIT would lose \$4,000,032.10.

The second alternative is the best one, and it will become effective June 4, 1979. This alternative consists of ripping the library down and installing the courts there.

By doing this, no extra building would have to be built; and therefore, this is a cheap alternative. In fact, NAIT will make a \$30,420.08 profit.

One of the librarians said, "By removing all the library books and shelves, at least 8 more racquetball courts could be installed." Another librarian said, "If they tear down the library, I'll be out of a job. That's great, now I can watch the soap operas on T.V.!!!"

Since everybody is happy about the new racquetball courts, the project has been okay'd. Starting in September, NAIT will have 11 courts, and hopefully this will cut down on line-ups for reservations on courts.

1. A 10 dollar increase in student association fees, to take effect on September 1, 1980. \$5.00 will go towards the athletic board, to help out and improve our intramural and our intercollegiate teams, equipment, and teams. The other \$5.00 will go towards NAITSA in order that we may start up a building fund, improve the

Nugget and yearbook, and to counter inflation and higher operating expenses.

2. The other issue you will be asked to vote on is a salary increase for most of the NAITSA executive. The wages have not increased since the early 70's, yet the cost of living has pretty well doubled in those last 8 years or so. As well, the amount of time that the executive does spend on NAITSA business makes for a measly hourly wage, even with the proposed increase.

Remember this all takes place on Wednesday, May 16 at 12:15 in the auditorium.

Come on out and voice your opinion, ask any questions you may have and vote the way you feel about these issues. After it's over, at 1:00 o'clock or so, we are having a political forum for the Edmonton North constituency, this will take place in the auditorium as well. Come out and meet the candidates of your area if you live around here, and ask them any questions you may have.

Last but not least, the interest has been shown in the possibility of starting up a NAIT alumni club, where for a certain amount you will have access to the facilities, as well as having a certain number of tickets for cabarets, beerfests, etc. set aside for you. If interested, leave your name with me, and we'll set up an organizational meeting in the near future. See you later.




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BUILDING CONSTRUCTION



After writing this little quiz, we decided that Civil, Marketing or Drafting could not even handle multiple choice so we answered it correctly for them.





Fomerly with the Jeff Beck Group and The Faces, Rolling Stone guitarist Ron Wood appears on his solo debut Columbia album, *Gimme Some Neck*, with some very well known friends. Yes, you guessed it, courtesy of Rolling Stones records Mick Jagger, Keith Richard and Charlie Watts all play on this sizzler.. Check the credits on this LP for the star studded lineup (including Warner Brothers Mick Fleetwood and Columbia's Dave Mason).

Brilliant production is provided by Roy Thomas (well known for his work with Queen and The Cars) and *Gimme Some Neck* features Bob Dylan's *Seven Days*. The rest of the album is self-penned (except for *Buried Alive*) and is true to Woody's hard rocking tradition. An exciting new release for CBS Records Canda on the Epic label is guitar wizard David Bendeth's LP entitled *Adrenalin*. It's a rare debut album that can boast such misicians as Billy Cobham and Lenny White on drums, Marcus Miller on Bass, John Cleveland Hughes on keyboards, and vocals from the Boyer Brothers. David's expertise as a session player has given an exciting spark, a shot in the arm to many recording artists, most recently including Toulouse and Bob Segarini (fomerly of the Wackers). His style and work invite no comparisons except that of a guitar expert, with a highly accessible contemporary sound. It was with great sadness that CBS Records Canda learned about the death of one the greatest jazz bassists the world has ever known. Carles Mingus' music is immortal though, and it is with great pride that we are releasing *Nostalgia in Times Square*, a collection of hits recorded in 1959, when Mingus was at the pinnacle of his power. Originally edited, these tunes are at their entirety on this recording. Mingus loved to transform standards that attracted his attention, into dazzling, new masterpieces.



PRAIRIE FIRE BURNS

INTERVIEW WITH A FENCER

"Fencing is a very disciplined and demanding sport which requires a great deal of concentration, technical knowledge, and controlled reflexes." Somehow this does not match my idea of the dashing swashbuckler swinging into the castle on a chandlier, rescuing the fair maiden after running the villain through with his trusty sword.

Mr. Les Klar is the coach of the NAIT Fencing Club and he helped straighten out my popular misconception. "Unfortunately, you are not alone in your thinking. A great many people come out to the meetings and approach fencing with a pirate-like attitude and perhaps they were thinking that they would be given the costumes in which to act out their dream. Fencing involves a great deal of hard work and dedication, and many do not think that it is worth it but there are those who do.

At present there are about twenty plus members of the NAIT Fencing Club and not all are men either. In fact the most promising fencer is a young lady from business named Dawn Marie Messier. NAIT has earned a great deal of respect from the various other clubs in the province.

As mentioned in the opening paragraph, it takes a great deal of concentration, technical knowledge and controlled reflexes. By controlled reflexes I mean that one has to react exactly and not over or under react as you may leave yourself open to a thrust from your opponent.

The tactics are similar to boxing. You probe for each others strengths and reflexes and try to lull the opponent into a smooth and monotonous routine and then move in for the hit.

What does one hit with or should I say thrust with? There are three different categories, foil, sabre and epee.

The most demanding is the foil where you try to maim or kill the opponent by stabbing him in the torso area. Points are scored by hitting the opponents target area, the trunk of his body, with the tip of the foil.

The epee is the modern version of the dueling sword. It is heavier than the foil and the target area is anywhere on the body from the toes to the head.

The sabre, a cut and thrust weapon, is the modern version of the slashing cavalry sword. The valid target area includes all the portions of the body above the waist. Unfortunately, just as a great

many are ready to show themselves as a good fencer, they graduate from NAIT. Thus it is hard for the club to produce a steady medal winning team.

However, there is a major upset in almost every tournament when a NAIT fencer defeats an opponent who they were suppose to lose to. The club works very hard and takes the sport seriously enough to make sure that their opponents are not going to think them easy pickings.

If anyone is interested in this fast moving sport, just walk up to F206 and talk to Mr. Klar who will be happy to inform you of the sport and answer any of your questions.
