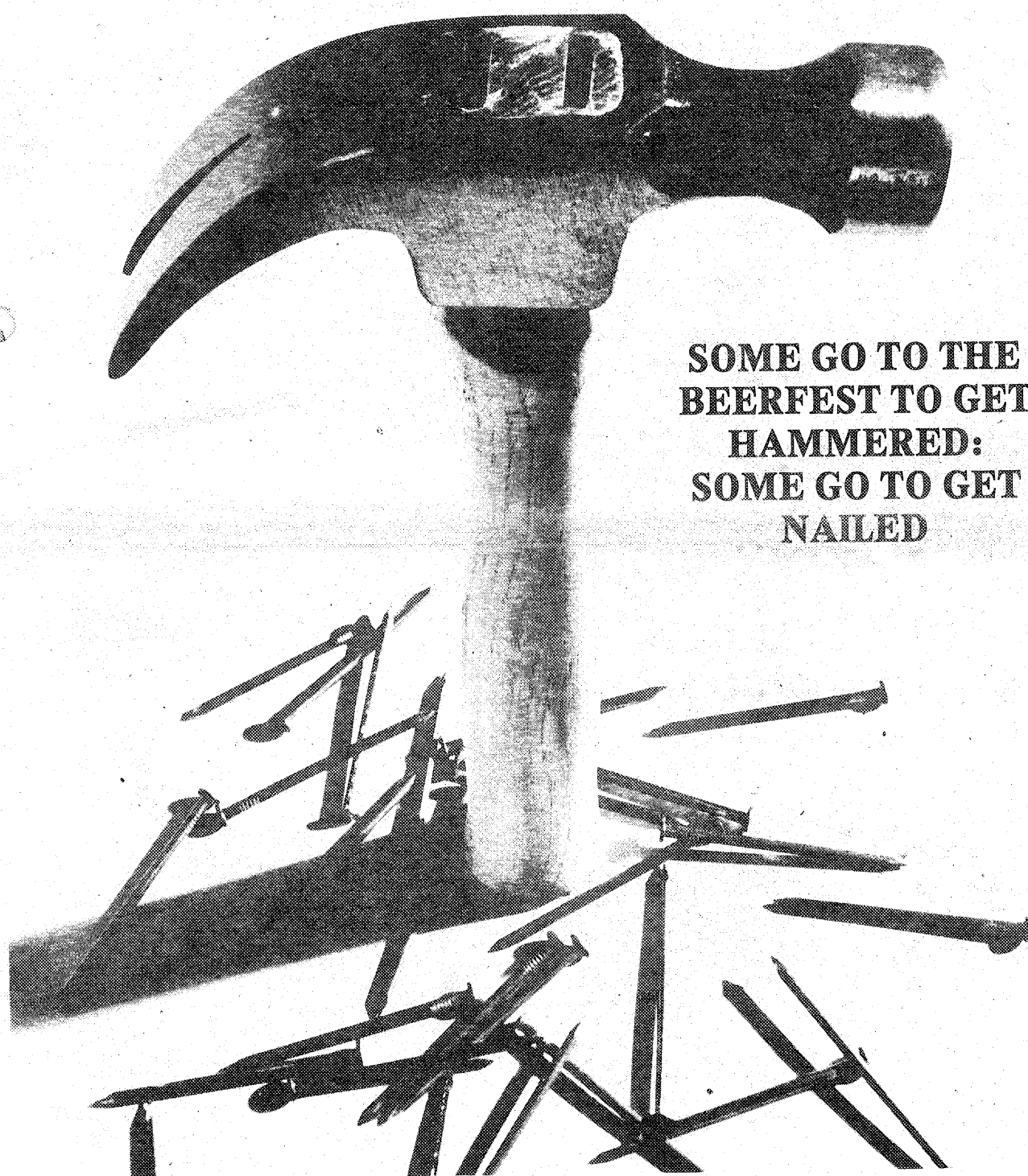

Let's get the facts straight! The Business Society has been feeding us a lot of bull about where the \$15 we are paying for our Grad is going! Check it out yourself:

BAS says - We are getting an individually served, roast beef dinner for \$12.75 plus 15% gratuity (total \$14.67).

- We will dance to the Band of Sound (\$800).

- There will be no wine served with the meal and drinks will be extra (you know the price of drinks at the Plaza).

- There will be approximately 700 tickets sold. (700 X \$15 = \$10,000)

I phoned the Plaza Hotel and they said - There is no \$12.75 roast dinner and the gratuity is 12½% not 15% (so who gets the 2½%).

The BAS is not showing any profit for this year's activities. They say they are contributing about \$600 towards the Grad, bringing the price down from \$16 to \$15. Big Deal! They sold 120 memberships this year at \$5 each. (\$600 clear profit) Therefore they are not contributing anything.

As I see it, the issues here are:

- The largest technology at NAIT (300 graduates) should have the cheapest grad since they can potentially make the most profit from membership fees, and should get greater participation in cabarets.

- Business students should know better than anyone else how to make a profit. I put on two cabarets myself and showed a profit on both!

- Members are not getting a discount on the grad and even if they went to all the cabarets, they would have only got \$1.50 back on their membership price.

- The largest graduation (700 people) has the cheapest fixed costs (Band) per student and therefore should cost significantly less than the grads of other technologies. There is only one grad more expensive than ours -- B.C.E.T. which costs its members \$17.

- The BAS has made a lot of false statements regarding the grad and become defensive, evasive and occasionally hysterical when asked about it. They say that if you don't like it, you don't have to go...

HERE ARE THE FACTS ABOUT B.A.S. GRAD '79

The article written about the BAS Grad by Ms. Clair Bremner appears to have many false statements and it is our opinion that everyone has a right to hear the facts.

It is very uncertain as to the purpose of Ms. Bremner's article. If it is to call the BAS *cheats* or upset all the second year Business students and ruin our grad; you haven't succeeded.

Firstly, BAS is a non profit organization and secondly, we are all still looking forward to our memorable event "BAS Grad '79".

But to help clear the situation and to re - inform Ms. Bremner; here are the facts as they truly are:

Jim Horsman, Minister of Alberta Advanced Education and Manpower, has announced a revised further education policy, designed to provide communities with more money and autonomy to respond to the local program needs of adult Albertans.

"The revised policy represents a continued commitment by Advanced Education and Manpower to the coordination and provision of further education programs at the local level. Increased grants for leadership, administration, travel and advertising will encourage greater community involvement," Mr. Horsman said.

The revised policy will improve community further education services by providing greater local autonomy. Advanced education institutions will continue to provide courses, and may now act as local hosting authorities at the request of local councils. Grants of \$7,000/year-an increase of \$2,000 over the current \$5,000 grant- will be

paid to designated school boards or advanced education institutions for the administration of adult further education courses and for services rendered to local further education councils.

"Under the leadership of local further education councils in the province, educational opportunities for adults continue to grow. During 1978-79 close to 200,000 adults were enrolled in more than 12,500 courses. The government is committed to providing high quality further education services. Advanced Education and Manpower wants to help Albertans as they seek to understand and cope with changing social and economic conditions. The best way to do that is through local involvement and public participation. The revised policy is designed to encourage Albertans as they plan and develop their individual capabilities," Mr. Horsman said.

Nugget's First Bike Test

On May 25th, 1979 the Department of Transportation announced that the Dodge Challenger met all 1979 motorcycle safety and emissions standards.

The Challenger is a strong runner in long range touring bikes. It's 2555.5 cc. in line 4 cylinder liquid cooled engine (similar to Suzuki) can pro-

vide smooth and quiet power, thanks to the Harley-style dry plate and clutch.

Although Challengers acceleration isn't worth beans off the line it is steady and sure with virtually no engine vibration even at high speeds (82.5 mph top end). Unlike most shaftdriven bikes there is no discernible

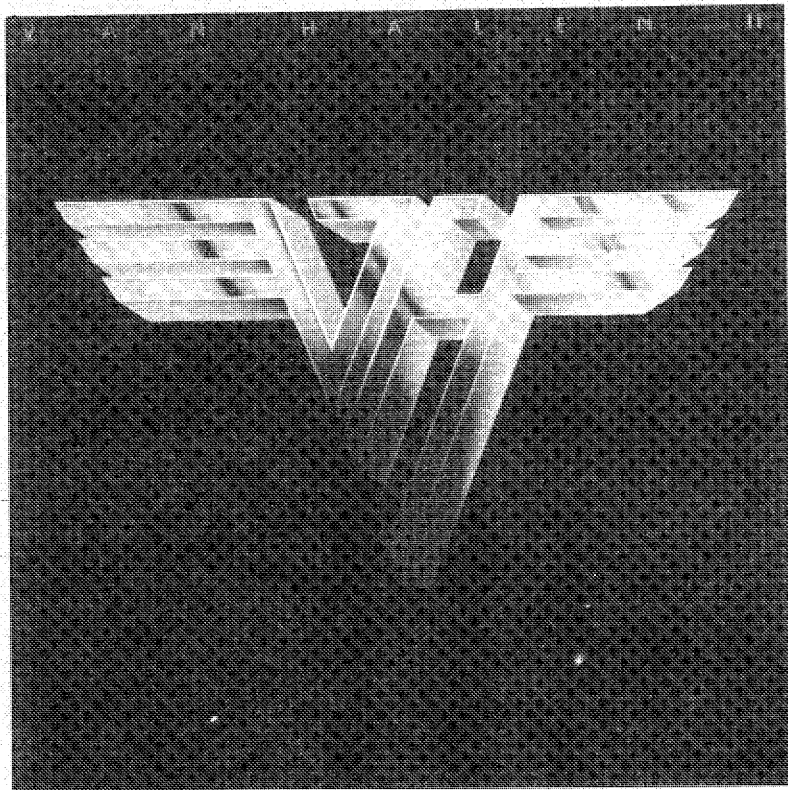
torque pitch.

Handling is fair but is marred by its manual shift long throw linkages, but that is understandable. This is a touring bike you know. Low speed control is excellent. You won't fall over taking a slow turn with this baby.

A disc front, drum rear

combination gives adequate braking power. Engine access is good and the seat is incredibly comfortable even with a passenger on board. Full faring is standard equipment. I'd say the Dodge Challenger rivals any BMW for that cross-town jaunt.

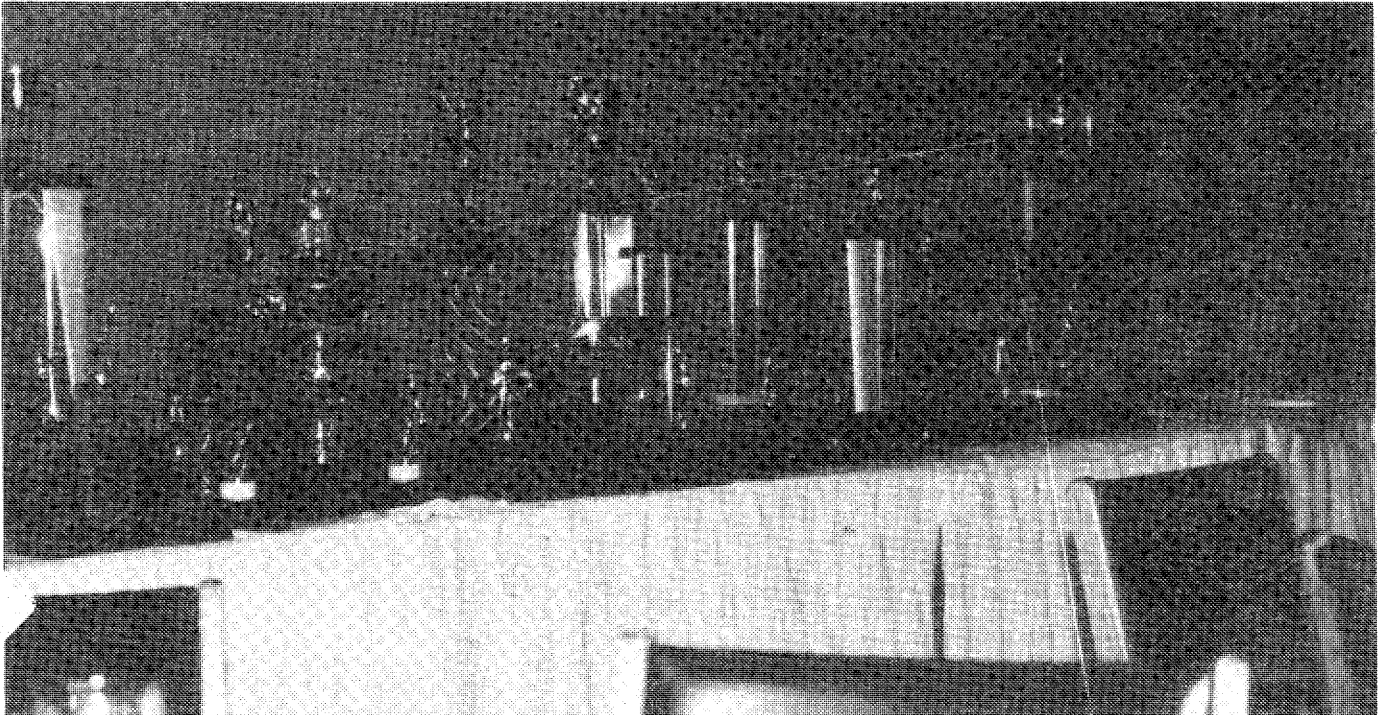
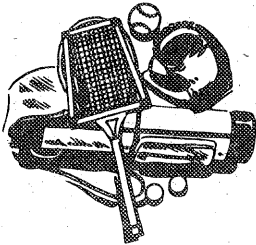
A worthy point to note: Building Construction Engineering Technology broke the all time record high point of 2371 points set last year by Telecommunications by 231 points.
