ARE YOU SAVING OR INVESTING?

At This point, the majority of our bankrolls which have been created throughout the summer are now on the decrease, a depressing fact indeed.

An average savings account will actually lose you money considering the average savings account is paying 101/2% and the rate of inflation hits over 8.4% yearly when the interest is taxable income. Are you living on a credit card? Today, nearly \$35,765 is owed on outstanding cunsumer credit in Canada. Apart from consumer credit there is the problem of the various levels of government having created debt on our behalf. Currently the national debt, per capita, is approximately \$1850.00 and within the next four years that figure is projected to increase to \$4250.00 for every man, woman and child in Canada. A family of five will have borrowed on its behalf \$21,250.00 in 1980. At current bank borrowing rates of nearly 15% the servicing of this debt is \$3,137.50 per year. That is, the amount of money each household has to pay just to cover the interest incurred by our federal government on our behalf.

In addition to the debt dilemma, most tax payers overpay their income taxes to our federal and provincial governments because they do not consult with a variety of tax specialists to take advantage of the myriad of tax laws available to them as incentives for investment. As an example, income earned from interest of money placed on deposit is taxable at the same rates as your regular income while interest (Dividends) earned from investing the money in the stock (Shares) of Canadian companies is taxed at only a fraction of the tax rate you pay on your regular income. How many people know this?

Looks like a losing battle eh? Well it's not. By knowing what is available, you may get almost double your worth out of our decreasing dollar.

Instead of letting inflation beat you as you are trying to make your money last till next summer, invest. Please don't be scared off by the word. It may be simpler than you thought. If you are ultra conservative and are only concerned with staying even with inflation apply your excess savings or windfall money into something that doesn't leave you at the mercy of inflation. Simple savings certificates may be bought at most banks, trust companies, or credit unions, available from 340 days to 20 years with interest rates increasing the longer you tie up your money. (Some certificates are redeemable prior to maturity at a percentage of the interest rate) Interest rates vary from





controlling your money is to see, in black and white, yur financial status. You'll be appaulled at the actual figures. (i.e. How much you spend on entertainment alone). In order to beat inflation by investing, you must know how to save.

Treat yourself, not the government. Do you know that you may claim certain medical expenses, costs of clothes on the job, automobile expenses, Charitable contributions, and income averaging? I could go on and on, however, most vital to our purpose is the fact that you can deduct education expenses if your employer requires you to maintain or improve your skills at your present job. Not only are tuition costs deductable, but transportation to and from school as well as room and board if it is necessary to spend the night away from home. It is important to realize that these and other tax benefits exist, however, careful consideration of the pamphlet mailed to you along with income tax forms is a must to see if in fact you qualify. Tax laws do not exist for big businesses nor for the wheeler-dealers, but for you and me. Check them out.

One of mans greatest weaknesses is that of travel through life, he travels more by hope and expectation of luck than by logic and hard reality. For example, how many people stop to calculate the number of hours that they will spend working during their life? Some quick arithmetic shows that if a person begins work at age 25 and ends at age 65 he will have worked for 40 years which represents approximately 2000 hours per year or 80,000 hours in a life time.

On the assumption that every person is thrifty enough to save say 20% of all wages earned, being approximately \$1.00 out of every \$5.00, then it's clear that if such a savings conscious frugal person did that all his life, never took holidays, the best he could do is save enough money (ignoring inflation) to have a personal net value, at the end of his life's work, of \$80,000.00 to \$100,000.00. That by today's values, is only enough to pay for a modest house upon retirement. The fundamental question, therefore, we should ask ourselves when starting out in our careers or vocations, is whether this state of affairs is acceptable to us. Obviously, for most of us, this is not acceptable. Working one's entire life to have only a humble little home to retire in is not sufficient. When one thinks through this whole process it becomes clear that those beginning on life's earning trail must address their minds to more than savings for retirement purposes. They must quickly learn about participating in the countries productivity through investments. This will enable individuals to not only benefit from dividends, which are taxed at lower rates than interest earned from savings, but take advantage of capital gains of the stocks purchased as they rise with increased productivity with automatic offsets for inflation.

The blunt truth is that under high inflationary conditions a person who relies entirely on savings is substantially worse off than a person who relies on investment.

In today's times, your best bet appears to be, saving to invest - not savings to keep on saving! Kelly Polanski

MOONIES RECRUITING AT U of C


I have received four calls in the past week telling me that Moonies are recruiting on the University of Calgary campus.




DOES IT


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

CHARLIE -- "Fight Dirty"

The cover of this band's debut album depicts a clever, eye-catching photo of a scantily-clad woman in the midst of seduction, dropping what is presumed to be a tranquilizer or poison pellet into her lover's drink. The picture on the back shows the man huddled over the bedside telephone, oblivious to his fate.

If this little scenario intrigues you ehough to want to check out the album inside, you won't be disappointed. This is a pleasant record to listen to, with lots of vocal harmonies and some very good instrumental backup. The driving force behind Charlie is a man named Terry Thomas, who handles the majority of the writing chores. as well as lead vocals and rhythm guitar.

The band sings several songs about searching for one's identity ("Fight Dirty", "Don't Count Me Out"). a couple of numbers about women who have met with misfortune ("Runaway", "Too Late") and the obligatory ode to California (called - what else - "California"). "Just One More Smiling Face" is an interesting tale of a rock star who meets a woman and takes her home, only to find he is just one in a long line of conquests. She takes his picture and he joins the gallery of photographs that cover her

The best cut on this album, the one I keep returning to, is "Killer Cut", a tongue-in-cheek guide to fame for the aspiring rock star. The song advises that the secret to success is to listen closely to Top 40 radio play-lists, steal a bit from each song, and then write a "Killer cut to turn on the world". 

1 tsp. or more chili powder 4 tsp. black pepper.




To Think, Gene almost didn't play.

Last year, after two weeks of basketball practice every night, Gene decided he couldn't handle it, so he quit. But he forgot to tell the coach. Naturally, Dave Hoy (men's basketball coach) wondered what had happened to his potential basketball star. Dave finally saw Gene and asked why he wasn't attending practice. Feeling, a little guilty and none-too pleased with himself, Gene told the coach he didn't think he could handle school and basketball.

Well as the story goes, Gene did return to the team and went on to win two basketball awards at the end of the season: Best Defensive Player and Silver Torch which is awarded to the player with the best combining ability, leadership and most gentleman-like conduct.

Today, The twenty-two year old, Saskatchewan native says he's not sorry he played. "I have never regretted it." Basketball provides an outlet for Gene as well as an opportunity to meet people and attend social functions.

Heading into his second year in Building Construction, Gene states ther's plenty of time for studies and extra-curricular activities if you use your time right. When game time rolls around, Gene assumes the position of team leader. He places a certain amount of pressure on himself. "...if you're not scoring or playing decent it bothers you because he (Hoy) puts you out there cause you're supposed to be able to do something..." Gene adds that he hates to lose so he always wants to give 100% every game.

Gene stands 6'1%" and admits to being one of the shorter players on the team last year. But as coach Hoy states, "he made up for it because he was the best defensive player. He showed a pretty good example for the other players. He worked hard."

I've never seen Gene play, but if past-performance is any indication of what to expect, we could all be in for a treat!




opportunity to have fun, meet other people outside your technology and represent NAIT. Individual medls are awarded in each event to the first three teams and for the overall team winner.

COMPUTERS TRIUMPH AS BIO LADIES BITE THE DUST




