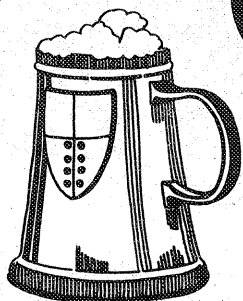

It consists of a lot of drinking, dancing, rocking & talking.

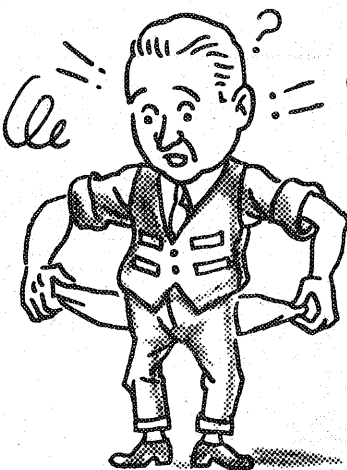
The cost of tickets depends on the source of music, bands costing more than DJ's, and the drinks are cheaper than in city bars.

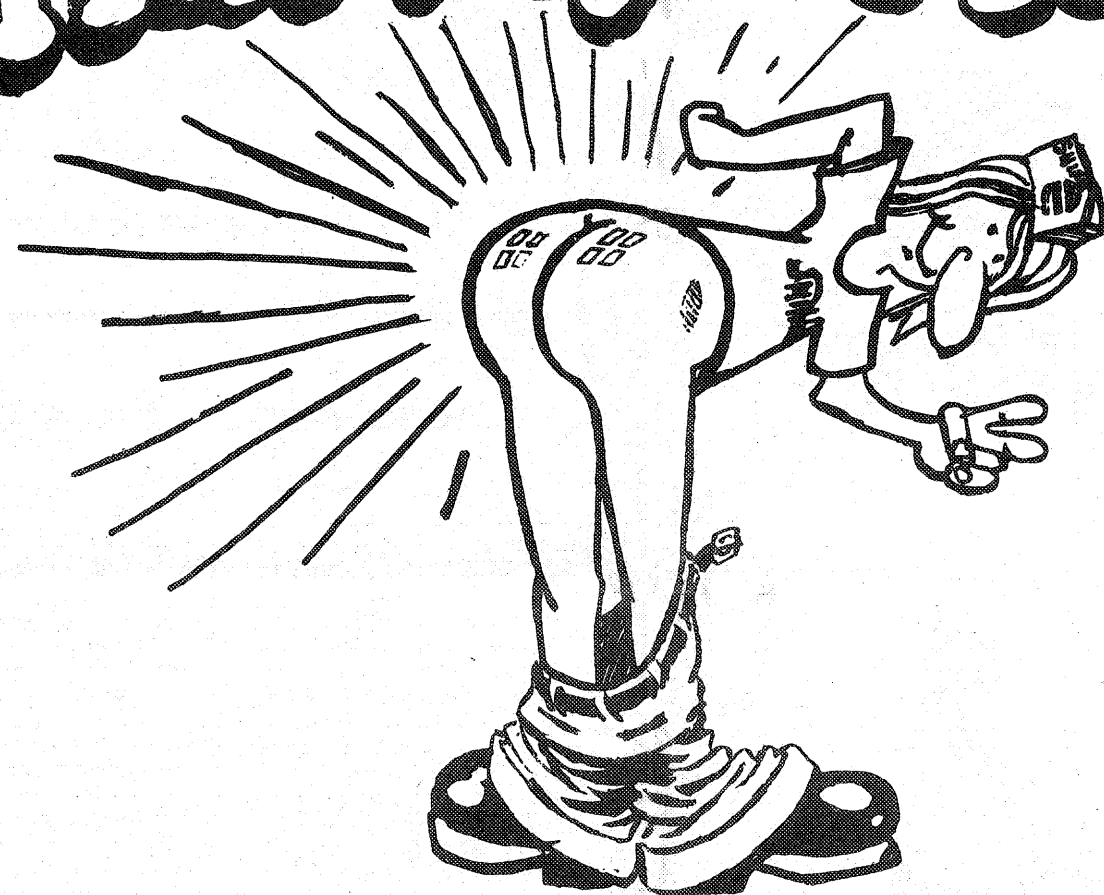


# SHINERAMA '82 GOAL IS \$10,000
