






THE NUGGET LAWS OF EXAMS...





The Canadian Army Welfare Fund has established an Educational Bursary Programme to encourage and assist dependents of former members of the Canadian Army (Regular) or Canadian Army Special Forces (Korea) who served between October 1, 1946 and January 31, 1968. Selection of recipients is based on financial need, scholastic ability, and length of service in the Canadian Army.

Bursaries are granted for full-time tuition at a Canadian university, college or at a community college or technical institute requiring not less than two years, leading to a certificate, diploma or baccalaureat degree. Applicants must not be older than 25 years of age, single, and able to provide details of their parents' Army service, i.e. rank, service number and length of service.



Chemical Tech and Medical Lab. Cabaret


