

Bass heavy mixing was eventually straightened out and short breaks were appreciated. The band has about ten original songs that were also well liked.


Secret Society mixed up the show with popular new wave numbers by the Clash, Generation X and the Romantics. The songs that got everyone going were the

Chicks Bask etball




Without question this is the best team ever to play in ACAC ladies competition.

Brent is a second year student in Materials Technology and has been with the NAIT Cross-Country Ski Team for two years.






