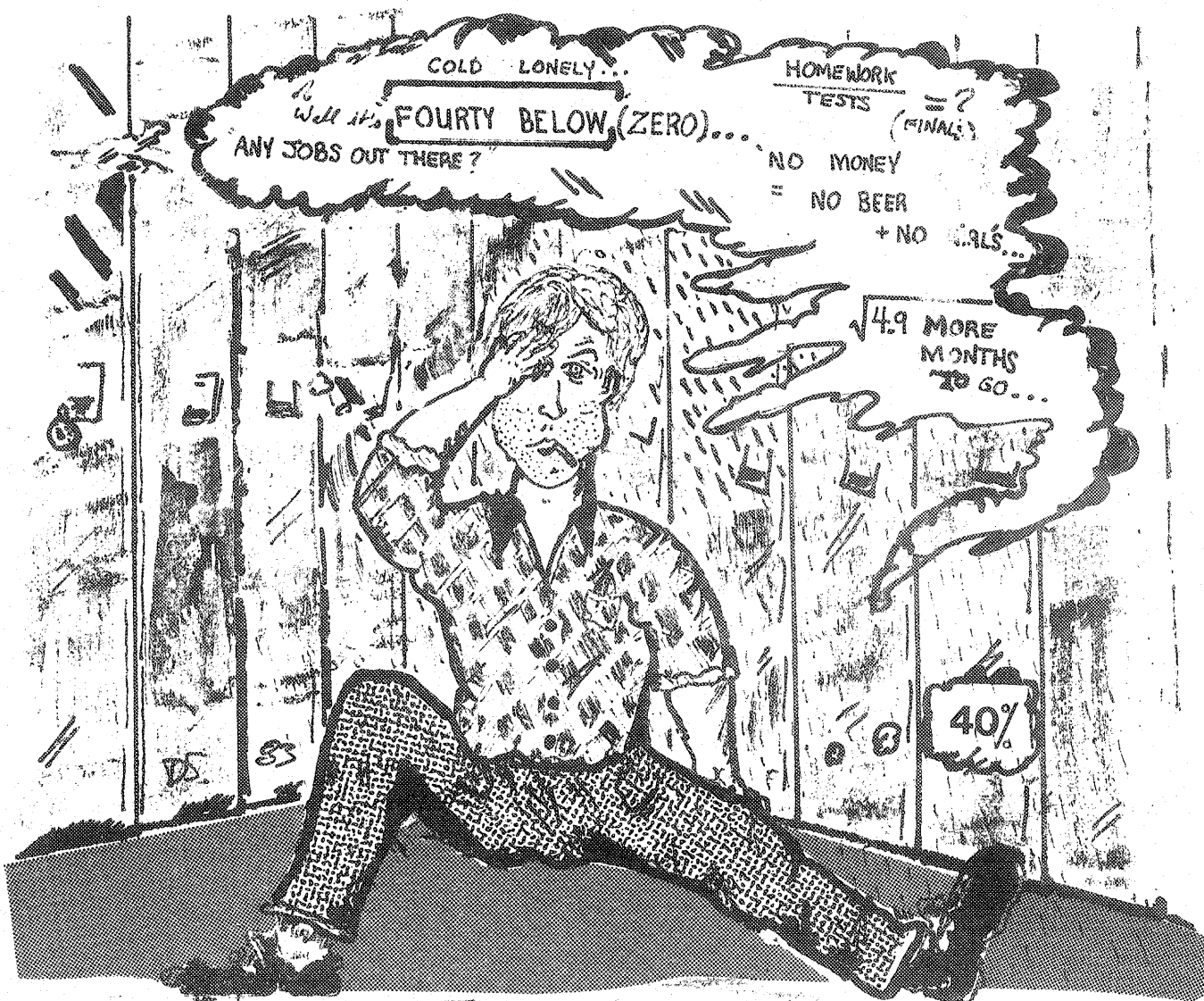

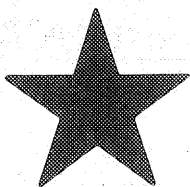
Dear Paper Pervert:

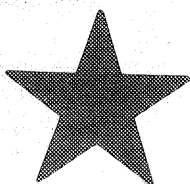

## BAS CABARET -JAN. 22, ALBERTA AVE. HALL

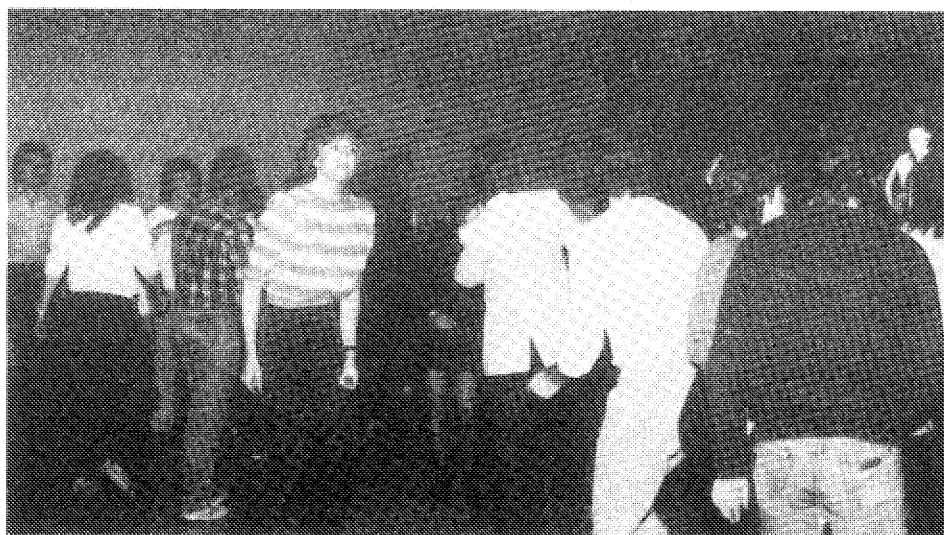
Even though ticket sales started out slowly for the third BAS cabaret, they eventually managed to fill the hall to capacity, for the farewell performance of "Sneakers".

The band put on a good show (except for the extra long breaks that they took) and kept the dance floor packed the entire evening.

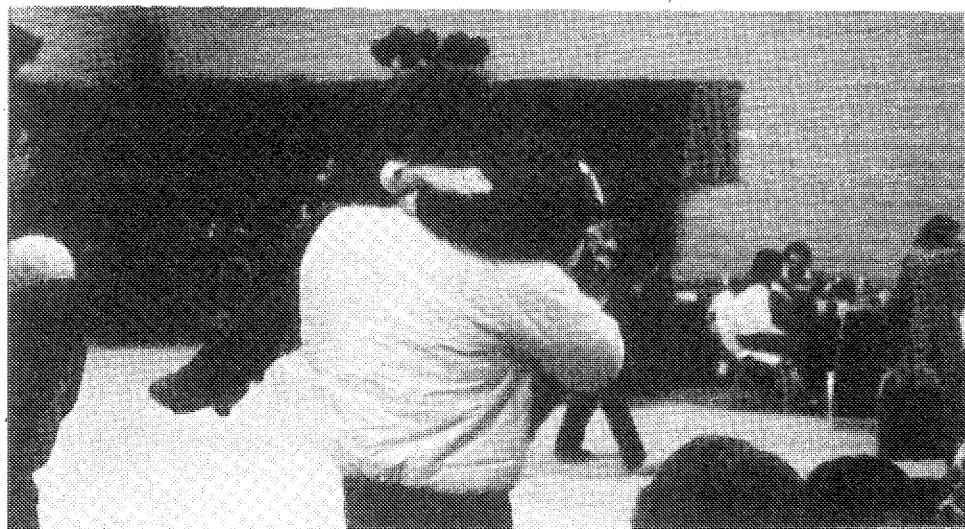
Everyone was more than

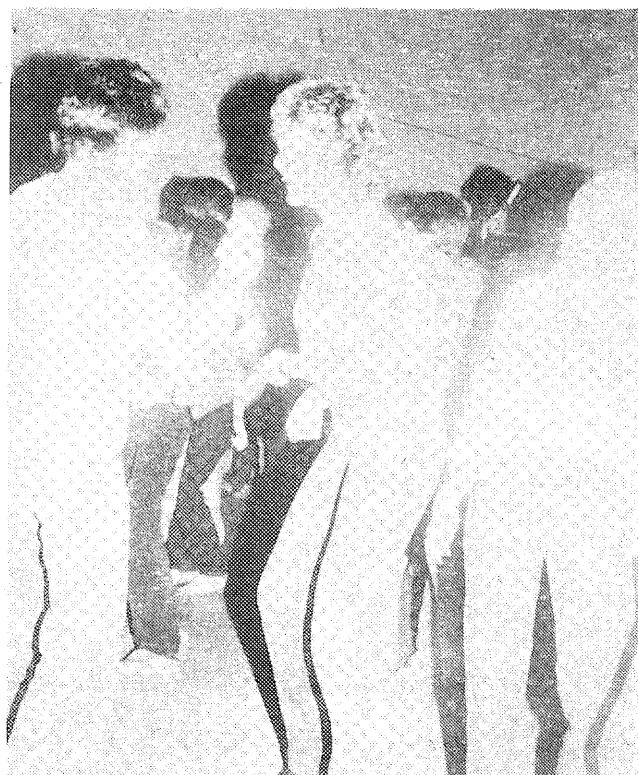
## ELECTRONICS ENGINEERING CABARET

The music was loud, but who cares. All the Beach Bums and ladies were dancing anyhow. That dance floor was crowded from start to finish.

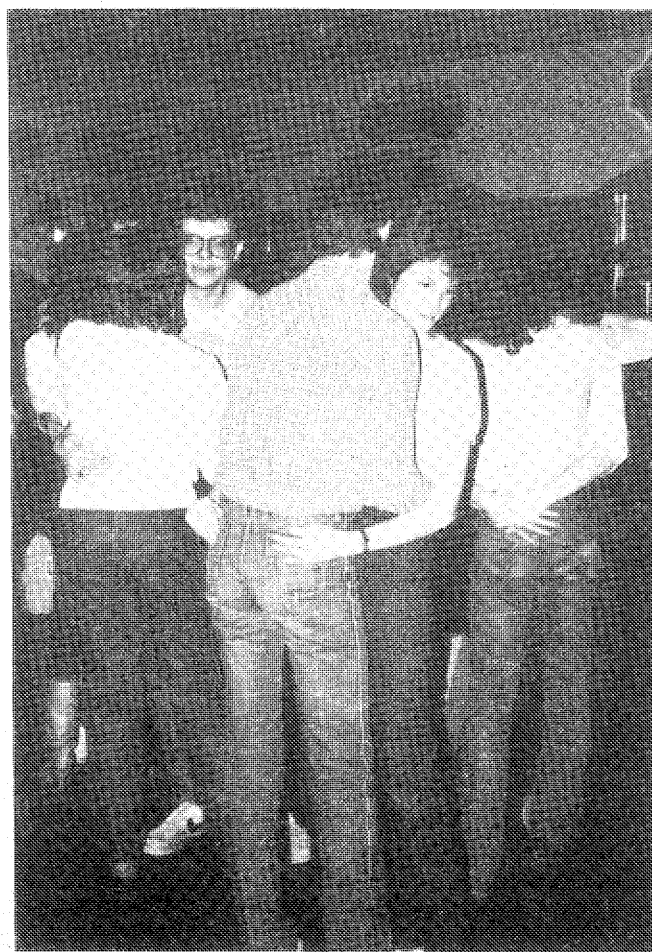
Unlike some cabarets' I've been to where people sit and talk to their neighbor, these cats were wondering around talking to anyone who would talk back.

## Business Administration Department Conference

On Wednesday, February 2, 1983, the second year students in NAIT's business administration programs -- Accounting, Finance, Administrative Management, Marketing, and Computer Systems -- will depart from their normal classroom routine to interact with resource people from the business community. Taking place at the MacDonald Hotel, the 9th Annual Business Conference will bring more than 500 students and staff of NAIT in contact with 45 successful business people in a series of seminars dealing with a broad spectrum of business topics.

The one-day conference is intended to help students bridge the gap between the business and academic worlds. In addition to gaining insight into business issues, students establish useful contacts and clarify career alternatives available to them. For management people from business, the conference provides opportunities to assess student interests, capabilities and aspirations.

The format of the conference places a premium on small group sessions. However, there will be a keynote speaker during the noon luncheon. This year's speaker is Donald Cormie, whose very successful career has won him the honored title of Queen's Counsel. Mr. Cormie is best known as a Senior Partner in the law firm of Cormie and Kennedy and as the President of the Principal Group, a local financial and investment corporation.

The conference planning committee is comprised of instructional staff from the Business Administration Department including Chairperson Armin Gebauer, as well as Ralph Jones, Wayne Larson, Donna Richardson, Vis Viswanathan and Brian Yahn. If there is any relationship between organizational effort and success, this conference is bound to be a winner.

"Shogun" was written by James Clavell, and is a fictionalized account of the first Englishman in Japan. William Adams (Blackthorne in the book and television series) really did exist in the 16th and 17th centuries; he became court translator for Tokugawa Ieyasu, founder of the last shogunate of Japan. (Clavell's reason for not referring to Adams and Tokugawa, whom he called Toranaga, by their true names is that, necessarily, he had to fictionalize their lives and therefore had to use different names from the ones they are known by in factual history.)

The book and the series are both magnificent. For the series, they have added more narration by Orson Welles for this broadcast, and may or may not have included subtitles for the Japanese dialogue. (However, having seen the series without subtitles on CBXFT, one could say that those who complained in 1980 about the lack of English subtitles were most assuredly jingoist WASPs.)

So, for an insight into Japanese culture that can be matched only by watching Kurosawa films, ensure that you watch all episodes of "Shogun" next week. (Manic depressives should pay particular attention to the seppuku scenes.) Da kara sa, terebi mimasho!

At 6:08 of the first period, NAIT's Kevin Imrie increased the lead to 5-0 on a pair of goals by Darrell Hughes and singles by Gary Hoekstra and Kevin Hayes. MRC came back to cut the lead to 5-2 before the end of the period on tallies from Rob Richichi and Kevin Johnson.

The first two minutes of the third saw NAIT widen the margin to 7-2 when Brian Hermanutz and Rick Karst both found the net. Dennis Friessen of the Cougars rounded out the scoring with two tallies making the final 7-4.

Outshooting Mount Royal 42-36, NAIT experienced a letdown after gaining five advantages. In the letdown Mount Royal notched all four of their goals.

In a fast paced first half, the Ooks played well and contained the usually high scoring SAIT team to 39 points and also accumulated an equal amount with some good plays coming from guard Murray Proctor and centre Scott McLaren. The second half continued on the same way that the first half finished, with a good offensive and defensive performance from the Ooks. There was a big controversy at the end of the game. With 7 seconds remaining on the clock and the score 83-82 in SAIT's favour we had an opportunity to win the game with two free throws. Star guard Harry Blacker was shooting and missed them both. On the rebound after the second shot Harry came out of a pile up on the floor with the ball and made the basket. If the basket was counted we would have won the game. Because of a mixup at the timing desk the clock had been delayed in starting by 3 seconds which the SAIT coaching staff noticed. The refs decided that the 7 seconds should be put back on the clock, the basket disallowed, and the last free throw retaken. This time Harry did not miss and the game was tied. The final 7 seconds ticked down with neither team being able to score, so the game was sent into overtime. In the extra period SAIT came on to play some good ball and managed to come away with a 99-92 victory. There were only 5 players on the score sheet for the SAIT team while almost all the players were on it for the Ooks. High scorers for the Ooks were Scott McLaren 20, Phil Bartlett 19, Murray Proctor 16 and Harry Blacker 14 pts.

On Friday, Jan. 21, the Ooks played an exhibition game against the U of Lethbridge team who were in town to play the U of A Bears on Saturday night. The Ooks faired well and finished 17 points behind a team with more experience and a definite height advantage. Good performances came from a couple of first year players Luc Naccarato and Jim Barnett. The next action for the Ooks is this weekend against Camrose and Red Deer.
