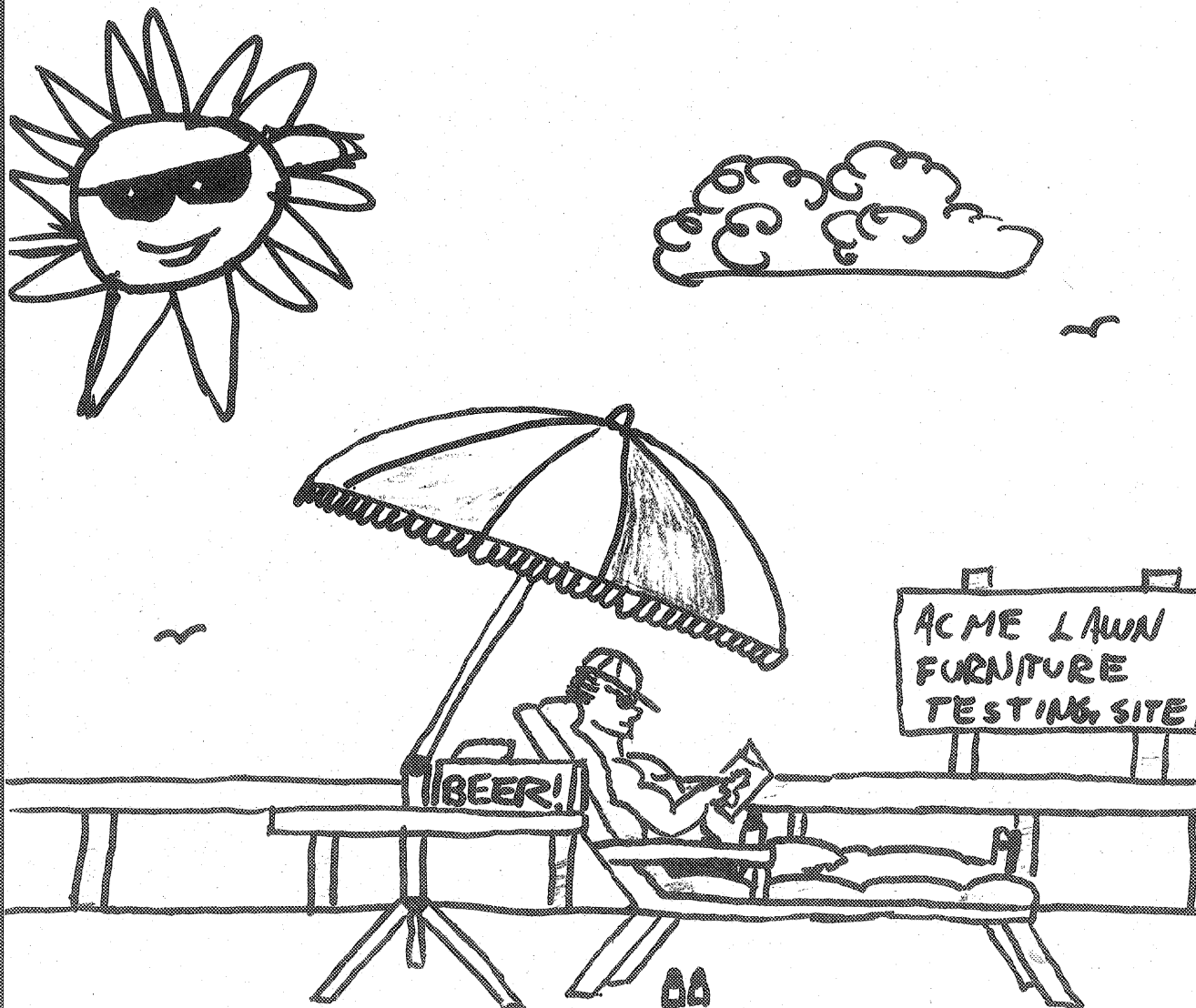

My only complaint is that this sort of good entertainment hasn't been going on all year. Also, I understand that some people couldn't handle having a little fun poked at them.

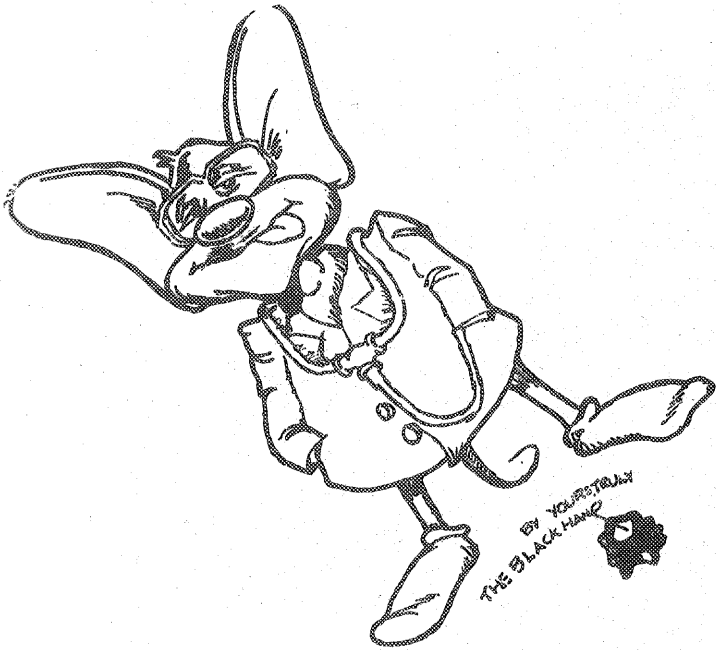

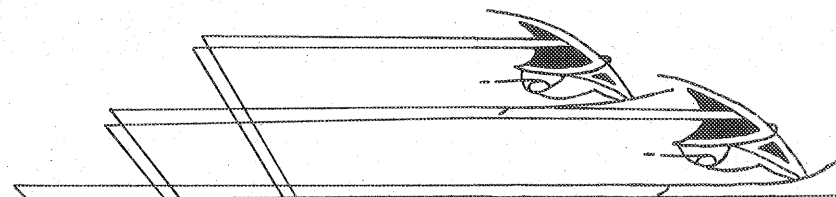
THE INSIDE EDGE

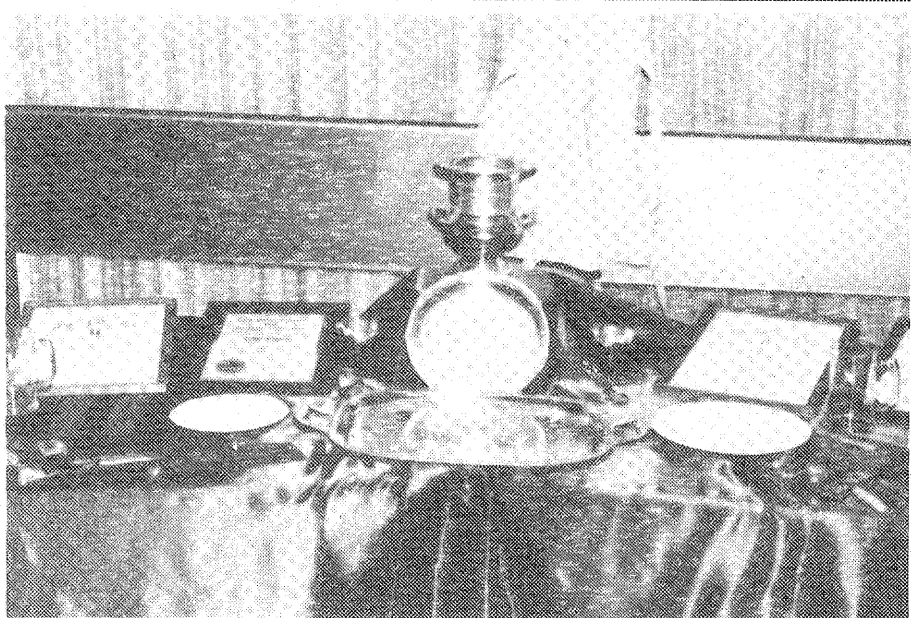

COMMERCIAL COOKING WINS IN TORONTO



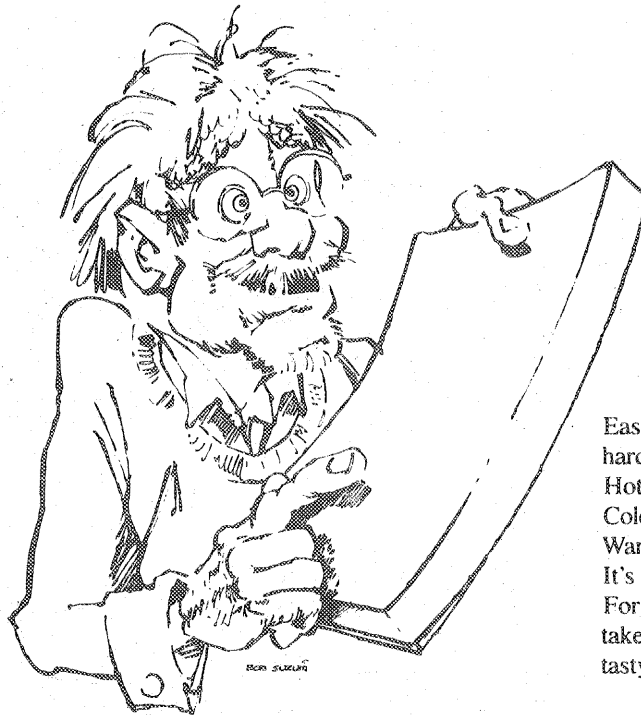
The NAIT Commercial Cooking students came home with some very impressive awards from the first Canadian National Students Culinary Competition held, April 27, 1983. The

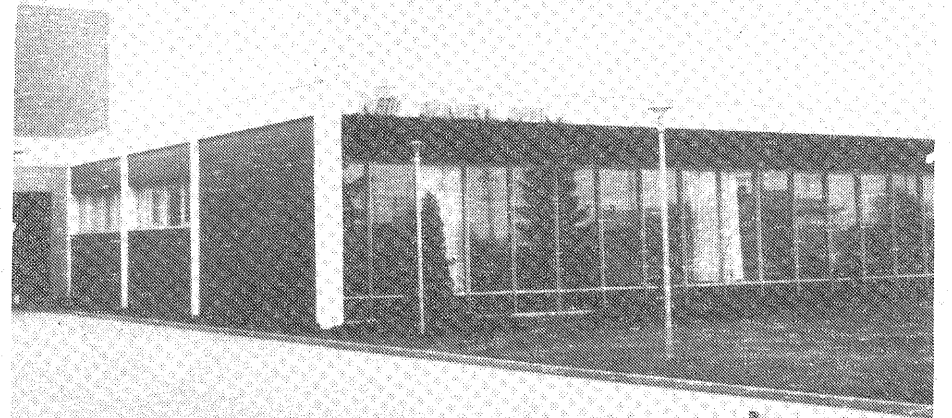
