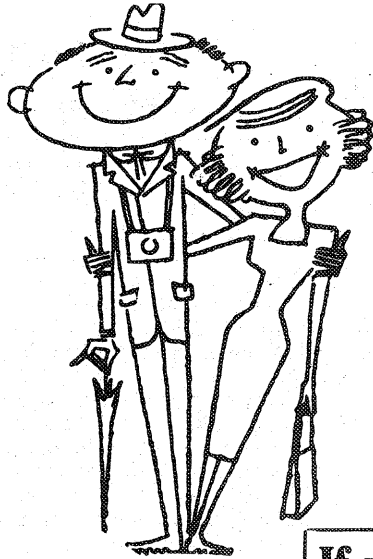

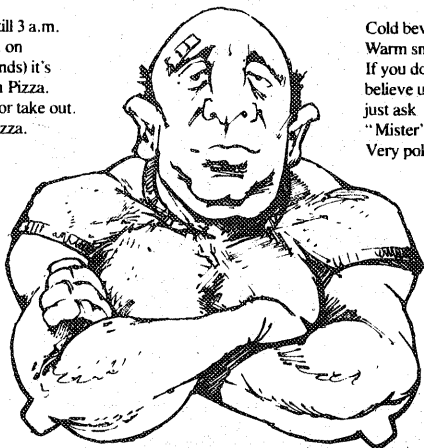

That Winning Feeling

What is one of the more important factors in a winning team? One would definitely be the winning feeling or lack thereof. Take the Edmonton Eskimos for example.

When the rest of the CFL was busy switching coaches and players like a game of musical chairs, the Eks were there to be the Rock of Gibraltar; steady, unchanging, unyielding, and winning 4 Grey Cups in a row. Until last year.

Last year was the beginning of change. First Wilkie retired, then the Eskimos had a losing team for the first half of the season. Hugh Campbell announces that he will leave the Eskimos for the new USFL. The Eks then go on a winning streak en route to a fifth Grey Cup. Up again, down again.

Then there was the uncertainty of who would be head coach. When Pete Kettela was finally named head coach, he came on rather strict, a new experience for most Eskimos who played for easy-going Hugh. Later it appeared that Kettela wasn't so bad. There was a new offence. The Eks were losing again. The coach would be kept, no, he would be fired.

Now we have the following situation: the Eks now have a definitely easy-going coach in Jackie Parker, they appear to be back on track, they are playing CFL style football, and Wilkie is back as an advisor.

Maybe the rock has stopped crumbling, maybe an air of continuance, permanence, and stability has returned to the Eskimos. Maybe the winning spirit has returned. If their last game is any indication, it has.

So, what is one of the factors in a good team? By the Eks, it would appear to be the winning spirit. But Edmonton is not the only team. Toronto went through it's fair share of change until Bob O'Billovich arrived. Under Obie, the Argos have been very stable and winning.

So, although it is not the only factor, the winning spirit is a definite factor in the truly winning teams.

Physically Fit at 85 Years Old

Will you be physically fit and active at 85 years old? Dr. Chitose is, and he attributes his good health to a life-long participation in karate training. One of the most respected karate masters of his generation, Dr. Chitose still teaches karate in Japan, and last summer, at the age of 84, he toured Canada and the United States attending numerous training camps and clinics. During this tour Dr. Chitose demonstrated karate and its applications.

Using his knowledge of medicine, Dr. Chitose has modified his practice and teaching so that his style known as Chito-Ryu better promotes good health. The local group that follows Dr. Chitose's teachings is the Edmonton Yoseikan Karate Club, which holds classes in North, East, and West Edmonton and in Millwoods.

Promoting good health is not the only requirement of a sport, however, it must also be interesting. The Chito-Ryu style of karate maintains interest through its varied curriculum which includes methods for escaping and avoiding attack as well as throwing and the better known striking and holding techniques. Advanced students also study the use of the traditional weapons of the Okinawan peasant. These are simple weapons derived from farm implements by the Okinawan people because they were forbidden from bearing arms for hundreds of years. Participating in sparring tournaments, either non-contact or controlled contact with body armour, provides excitement for some. Entering sporting contests is challenging, however the greater challenge is accepted by those who are truly determined to master the karate techniques. This requires many years of diligent training and one develops physical and mental discipline through the continuous effort required.

Most of the training is done without a partner and rate of improvement is directly related to the level of the practitioner's effort. No equipment is required for basic karate training thus it can be practiced almost anywhere. However, there are certain aspects of karate training such as sparring and self-defence applications which require partners and usually a group of beginners starts at the same time to facilitate teaching them karate and getting them in good shape. This group is later integrated with the more advanced students for continued instruction.

The members of the club participate in many other activities besides regular workouts, these include clinics, seminars, summer camps, and tournaments as well as baseball games, ski trips, socials or any other activity in which there is interest. There is strong friendship among the club members due to their associations within and outside the gym.

Socialization, recreation, self-defence, physical fitness, sport and discipline, these are all aspects of karate. If you want to be fit when you are 85 years old you should consider taking up a sport which is practiced by those of all ages, karate.

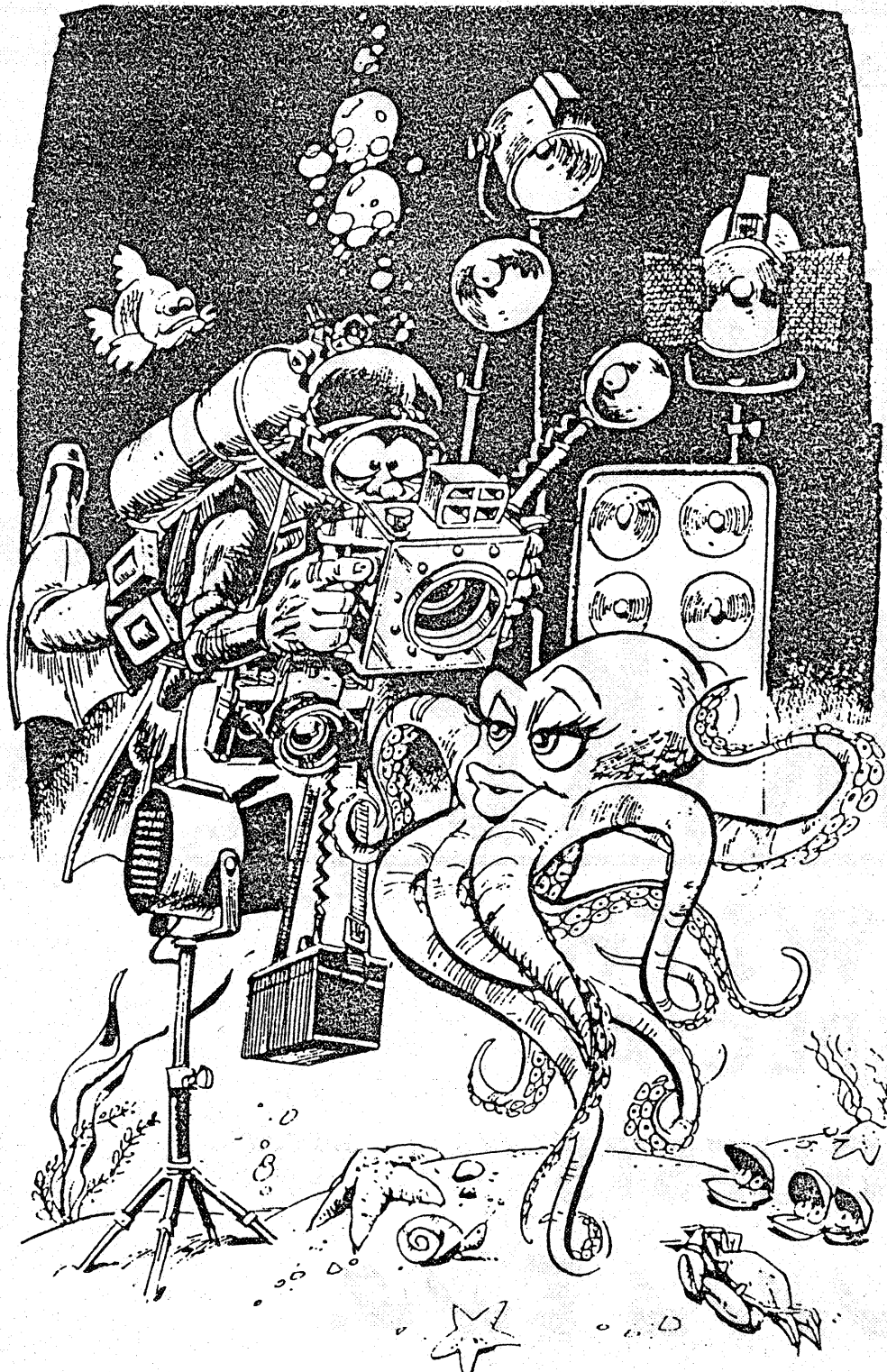

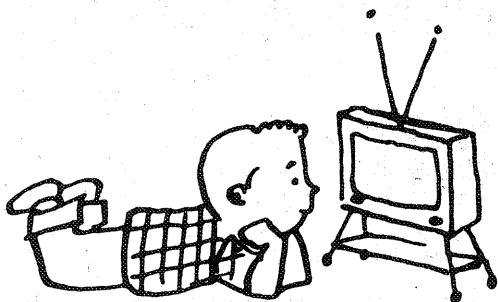

Thicke of the Night

What might Alan Thicke have in common with Merv Griffin, Dick Cavett, David Frost, David Susskind, and Mike Douglas? Thicke is the latest person to try to take on Johnny Carson and "The Tonight Show". If "Thicke of the Night" fails, it will be in good company--Griffin, Cavett, Frost, Susskind, and Douglas have all tried and lost at the game of the late-night talkshow.

Alan Thicke's show just might make it, though. Although he is Canadian by birth, Thicke has spent much of his life in Hollywood. He has learned about "the Business" so well that he has produced several shows for American television that were well-deserved hits. Anyone who has watched his daytime talkshow on the CTV network realizes that he avoids the staleness that brings about the downfall of any television show. And, perhaps more importantly, he's relatively unknown in the States--no one is expecting anything big quite yet.



Right off the start, Thicke declared that Carson was unbeatable, and that it would be useless to try to beat the Great Karnak at his game. And, aside from some similarities to the format, I think most viewers will find the format of "Thicke of the Night" to be quick, fast-paced, and refreshing. It is obvious the writers have spent a lot of time on the various skits that are performed, and Thicke's own unique style of interviewing guests [whether on the show's set or in the celebrity's home] gives a new insight into the familiar faces of Hollywood. And there are enough subtleties to keep one's interest [when was the last time you saw someone interviewed on the hosts left-hand side?].

"Thicke of the Night" [which is produced, ironically, by Fred Silverman--the man who, in 1980, got Carson to stay on NBC] is almost two weeks old, and it is hard to predict whether it will be successful in its syndicated market. If it can avoid both the burnout and the flatness that most talkshows seem heir to, "Thicke of the Night" may soon become a hit in its own right. A couple years from now, it may be that Alan Thicke will be the Great, being the standard for some new blow-dried-yet-talented Canadian who wants to really make it big in the late-night arena. Tune in to cable 7 weeknights at 1:30 if you want to keep track of how a Canuck succeeds, or fails, in his bid to become a part of our bedtime viewing.

The NAITSA Executive are your representatives. Come and have a coffee with us in room E133.

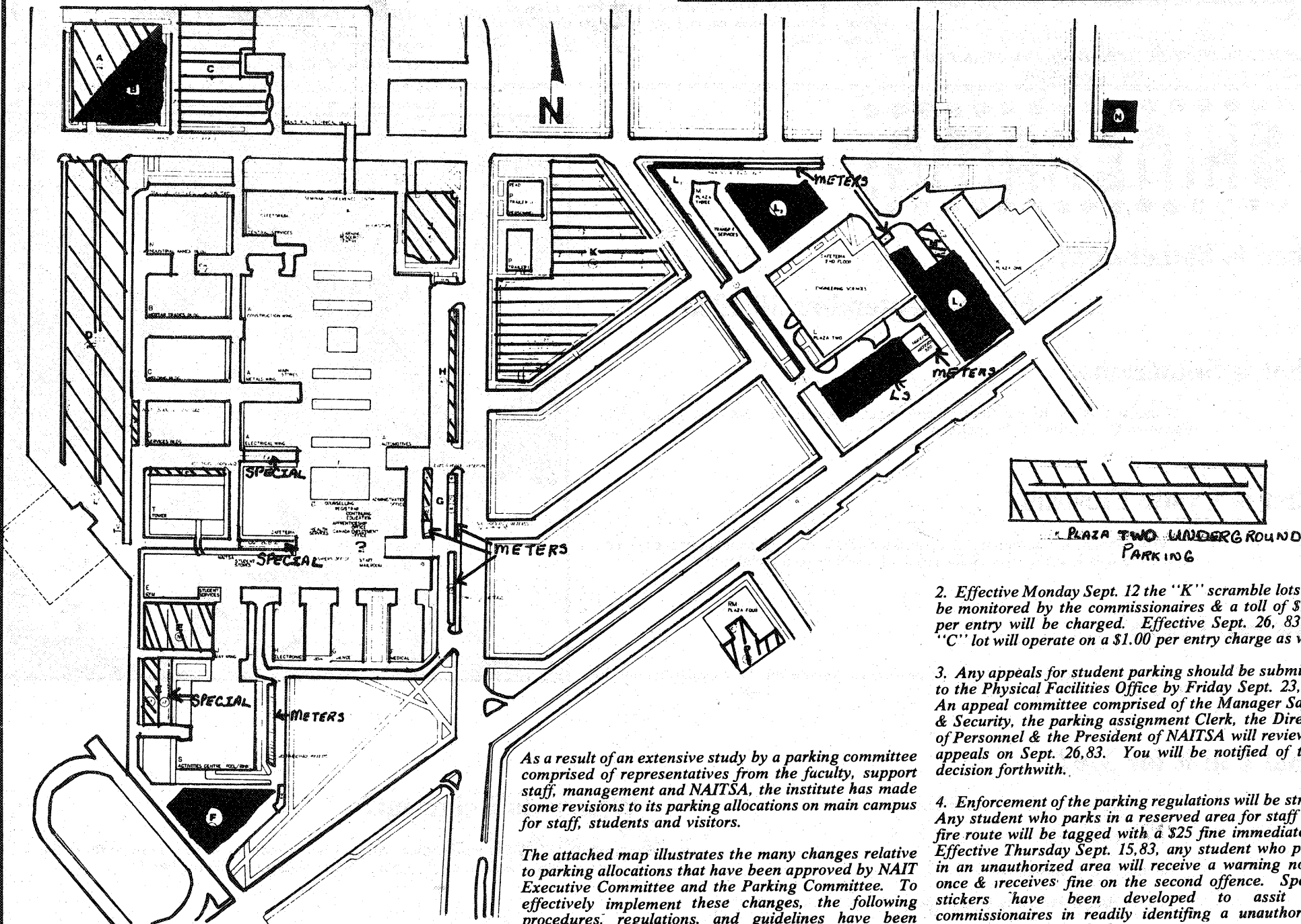

The attached map illustrates the many changes relative to parking allocations that have been approved by NAIT Executive Committee and the Parking Committee. To effectively implement these changes, the following procedures, regulations, and guidelines have been established in consultation with your NAITSA president, Debra Nykilchuk:

1. Criteria for allocation of specific student parking stalls was on the basis of a) handicap, b) distance to travel and access to public transit; and c) carpooling

2. Effective Monday Sept. 12 the "K" scramble lots will be monitored by the commissionaires & a toll of \$1.00 per entry will be charged. Effective Sept. 26, 83 the "C" lot will operate on a \$1.00 per entry charge as well.

3. Any appeals for student parking should be submitted to the Physical Facilities Office by Friday Sept. 23, 83. An appeal committee comprised of the Manager Safety & Security, the parking assignment Clerk, the Director of Personnel & the President of NAITSA will review all appeals on Sept. 26, 83. You will be notified of their decision forthwith.

4. Enforcement of the parking regulations will be strict. Any student who parks in a reserved area for staff or a fire route will be tagged with a \$25 fine immediately. Effective Thursday Sept. 15, 83, any student who parks in an unauthorized area will receive a warning notice once & receives fine on the second offence. Special stickers have been developed to assist the commissionaires in readily identifying a unauthorized vehicle which is parked.

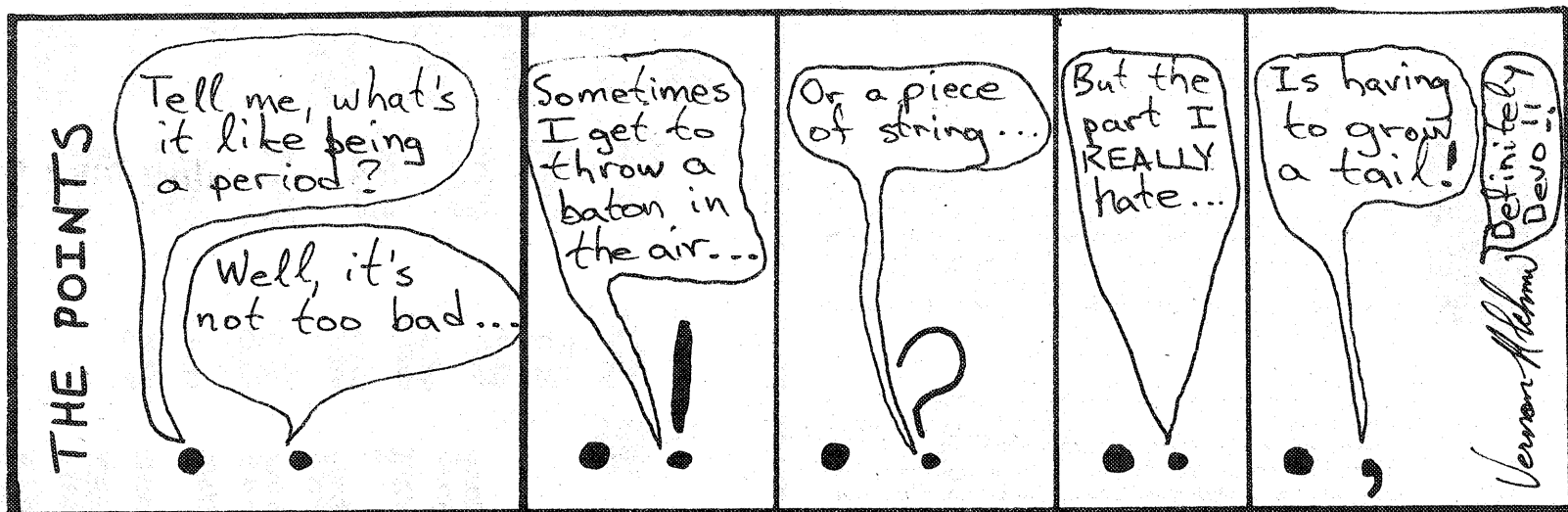
Through the parking study we have been able to increase available student parking by 68 spaces. We appreciate your continued co-operation in observing NAIT's parking regulations.

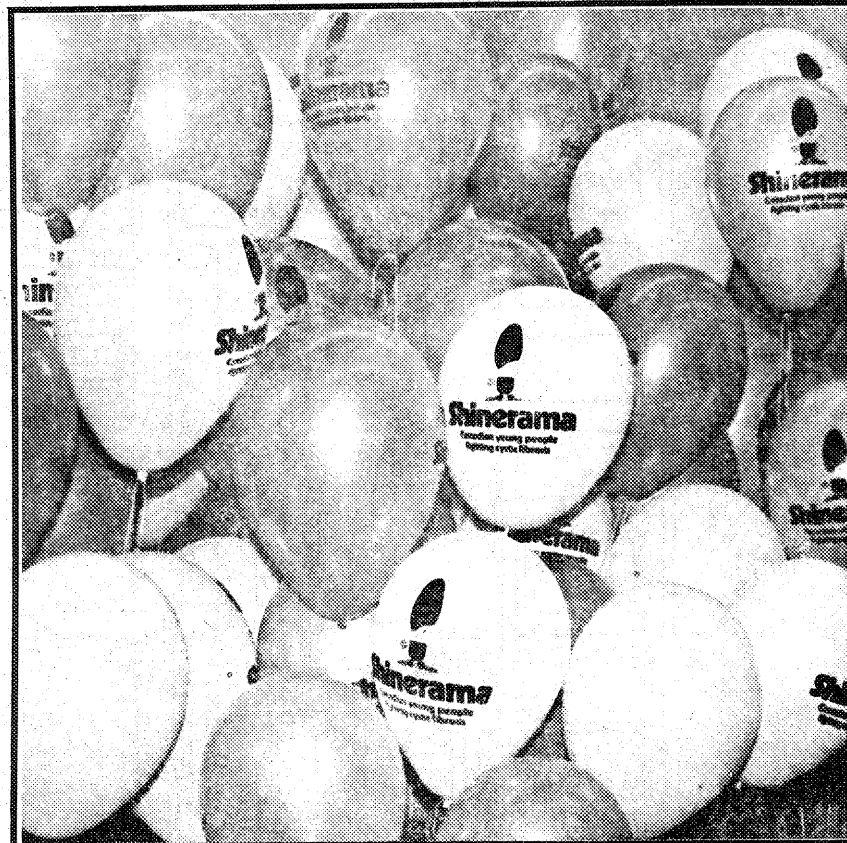
