Adieu, C-Channel

During the past summer, Canada's pay tv battle lost its first competitor. Before completing even one half-year of broadcasting, C-Channel was forced to "go gently into that good night". Translation: the folks at C-Channel crapped out.

Pay tv has been around a risky business for some time now, even though it has been around since the 1950's [yes, folks, the fifties]. What most of the stations have tried to do is to become better than the commercial networks without becoming like the commercial networks. Some have tried to survive on a strictly-movie format, others on specialty programming [I am still waiting for a show called "Basketweaving at the Basilica'], while others wind up looking like very expensive imitations of community stations. [like cable 10 here in Edmonton] The station's main hope is that people are wanting something different.




