### PLAY REVIEW

#### Laundry and Bourbon

Laundry and Bourbon, a play by James McLure, captured the mediocrity of reality and the human tendancy towards reminiscence. Darlene Bradley, as Elizabeth, gave a very fine interpretation of one who has held on to the past in hopes of finding her idealistic future. As the play opens, Elizabeth is seen gazing down the road, searching for, as we will find out later, her husband's pink Thunderbird convertible. Her friend Hattie, Lorraine Behnan, interrupts this reverie. Hattie is a very lovable character, sporting a pronounced southern personality. She enters the scene with incessant chatter, and immediately captures the limelight. Her exuberance greatly overpowers

Elizabeth's wistfulness. The two women sit down to some serious bourbon, and some not-so-serious chatter of children, husbands, and laundry. They set the comic mood befitting such a mundane, stereotypical small town life. The highlight of the afternoon seems to be outguessing the contestant on "Let's Make a Deal". The show itself is a rerun, which seems to illustrate the repetitious pattern of their lives. While sorting through the laundry, Elizabeth finds one of her husband's old shirts, which brings back highschool memories.

As the women continue to drink, strong emotions begin to emerge, via the alcohol escapism route. Elizabeth confides that her husband Roy, a vietman veteran, has been gone for two days. She tells of his recurring nightmares, and inability to find work. His disappearance is not uncommon, however, as he had run

off before, and spent his time gambling and chasing women. Elizabeth accepts this fact, by suggesting that his carousing in someway is beneficial to purging his happiness. In his high school days, Roy was the town rebel. His car gave him a feeling of power. It appears that he never outgrew this adolescent image of himself, but chose to cling to its security through adulthood. Elizabeth believed that she and Hattie were special, and herself different from Roy's other highschool lovers. The practical aspect of Hattie's personality begins to truly emerge at this point. She challenges Elizabeth's idea of their supremacy. She acknowledges the fact that she was jilted by her boyfriend after graduation, and as a result she entered a practical, though a unromantic marriage. Elizabeth, however, refuses to let the romantic days of youth escape her, and continues to view her relationship with Roy as a highly exciting affair, with all the thrill of young love. Her despondency, on this day, is due to the dissonance caused by her newly discovered pregnancy. The reality of this event breaks through her delusion, into the core of her understanding. She is shocked into facing the fact that she is pregnant, and the father of her baby is unemployed, unfaithful, and unable to face up to life. Hattie, once again brings the audience close into their lives, by introducing reality as an identifiable element in the play. This is accomplished by a simple telephone conversation with her children, highlighting the day-to-day domestic trivialities. The mediocrity of Hattie's world serves as a shocking contrast to Elizabeth's sentimental existence, which remains suspended in reality.

Societal politics come into play, as we learn of the "Bridge Club Feud" between the Country Club and the uneligible bridge players in the town. The character of Amy Lee, played by Marie Gynane is introduced as the town busybody. She is a member of the Country Club, Baptist Church, and appears to be involved in every other imaginable event as well. Hattie dislikes Amy Lee, which may be partly due to jealousy. Amy Lee, like Hattie, married for practical purposes. But unlike Hattie, Amy Lee married into money. Amy Lee enters Elizabeth's house with the excuse of bringing over an air conditioner filter. Resentment hangs thick between Hattie and Amy Lee, leaving Elizabeth to drift in and out


of her own world. Conversation moves along simple lines, with Amy Lee issuing a charity sales pitch, and managing to convince the two women to attend a church supper.

Although Amy Lee feigns reluctance to drink, soon the three women are becoming quite drunk and foolishly giddy. Amy Lee begins to discuss town gossip concerning a pregnant woman whose husband has run off. Elizabeth jumps to the defense, as she surely sympathizes with the young woman's situation. The other woman's plight may bring the truth of her situation into a more fightening prospective.


When Hattie leaves the scene for a moment, Amy Lee

when Hattie leaves the scene for a moment, Amy Lee takes the opportunity to explain the real reason for her visist. She had seen Roy, in the city, with another woman. Elizabeth rises to the situation, however, and offers a perfectly viable excuse for this occurrence. Hattie returns, and Amy Lee continues to blabber about the divorce rate and rampant infidelity in their town of Maynard. Amy Lee announces that bridge, which took Hattie a year to learn, is going out of style, to be replaced by a more complex Chinese game. At this point, Hattie is faced with, what she considers, a monumental crisis in her life. Hattie's reaction to this trivial matter, again exemplifies her simplicity, and her unquestioned acceptance of this state. A physical fight ensues between Hattie and Amy Lee. Amy Lee becomes sick from the alcohol she has consumed, and leaves in embarrassment. Hattie also leaves, and Elizabeth sits down, alone, to admire the beautiful sunset. The scene ends as it had begun, awith Elizabeth staring dreamily, reminiscing of the past, and seeking excuses for the present.

Reaction to the play, from the audience, was highly favorable. In my opinion, in Laundry and Bourbon, Amy Lee provided the basic stereotyped character to add comedy. Hattie served as a comic, but still identifiable portrayal of an average person, leading an average life, in an average way. Elizabeth personified that part of all of us, which hungers for our ideal self, but is trapped by the oblivion caused by a reluctant acceptance of life as it is.






