GENERAL COUNCIL MEETING

MEETING CHANGE

Council meeting for the date of Dec. 16/86 has been moved to the first week we come back to classes for the second semester. This decision came with unanimous support because of final exams being held that week.

SEMESTER PROGRAM CHANGES

Recently, many complaints have been received by the Naitsa executive regarding the semester change and the resulting work loads as a result. Many petitions have been circulating to the tech's respective department heads expressing discourse about the change from a tri-semester to a semestered system. If your tech has a petition, Chris would ask that he can see that the right people get the information. As for as the department head level goes, there is no talk of any problems related to the change.

NAITSA SKI TRIP

Techs are again asked to return shirts ASAP after a Cabaret. If not, you will be charged the cost of the shirts which is \$20 a piece.



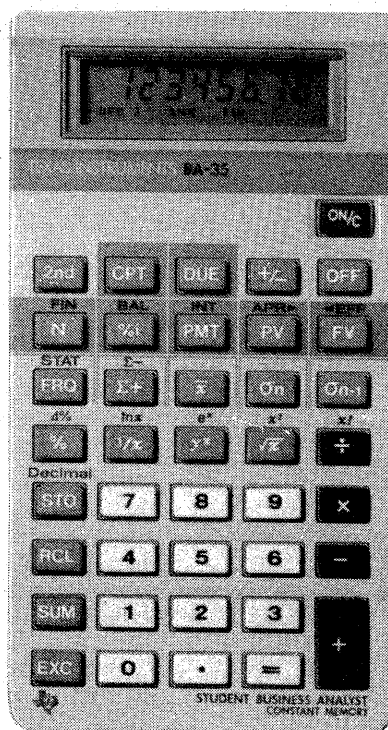

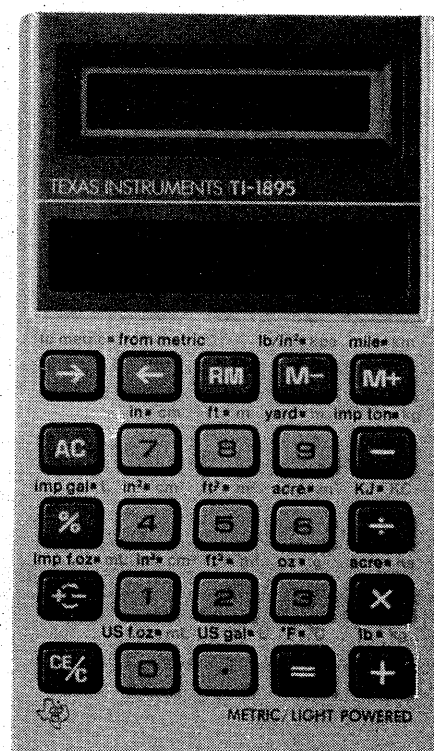

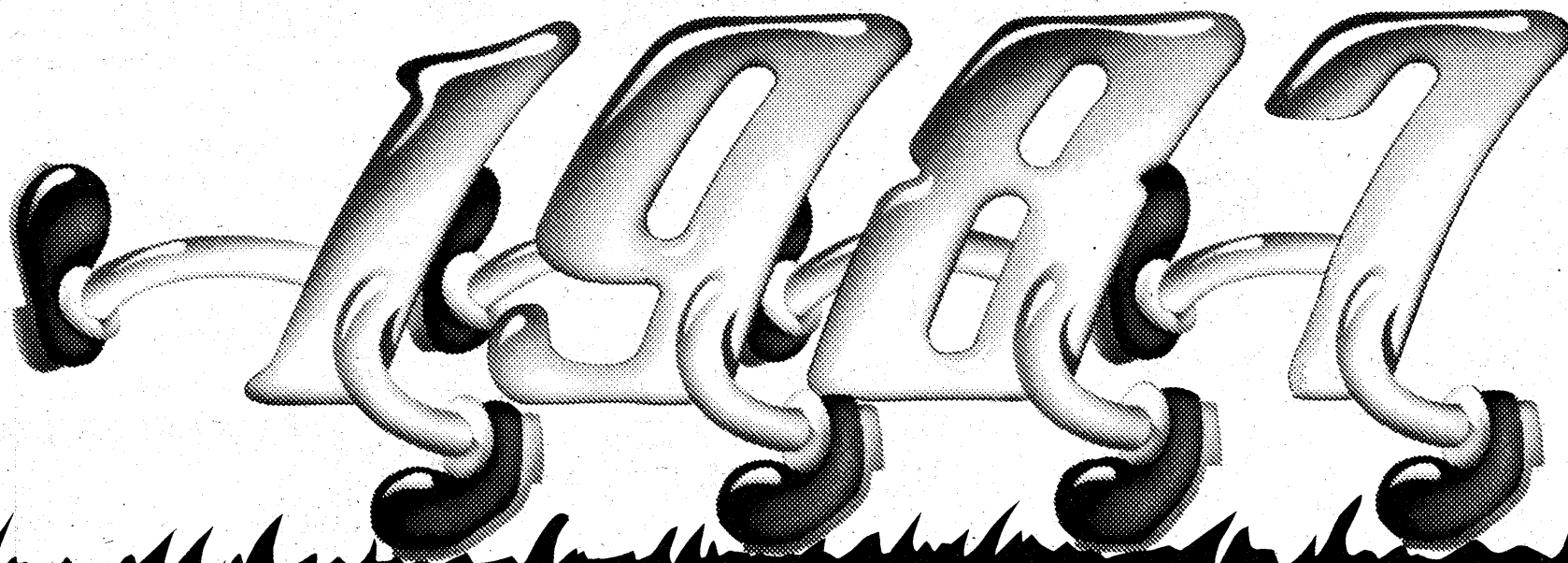

STUDENT LOAN REMISSION PROPOSAL

The following are excerpts from a 12 page report proposal submitted to the Advanced Education Minister Dave Russel. This proposal was formulated by The University of Alberta's Students Union and is being supported by NAITSA.

The foremost objective of any student aid system must be to allow *all* academically qualified citizens wishing to better themselves through advanced education to do so. A student citizen with significant personal resources must, as a matter of natural justice, be lower down the list of priorities than a student citizen of very modest means. This philosophy is, of course, recognized and codified by the Students' Finance Board via the "need" criteria involved in the student loan/grant/remission program.

DEBT LOAD REDUCTION:

Beyond simply providing loans adequate to allow a return to school, the U of A Students' Union, and, happily, the Government of Alberta, recognize that the need to repay debt upon graduation serves as a deterrent to embarking upon the path of advanced education. It thus follows that programs to reduce indebtedness upon graduation will serve as a significant incentive prompting more persons to choose the advanced educational option. The Government of Alberta, by providing significant debt relief through remission, is thus in recognition of social good accrued by all when individual citizens increase their value to society via education. The same criteria and philosophical objectives pertaining to the granting of loans must therefore also be applied to the granting of remission: remission dollars must be directed so as to induce the maximum number of persons possible to upgrade themselves via advanced education. Only in this way can the greatest return on investment (i.e. the number of educated persons) be maximized. The current granting of remission in proportion to total indebtedness is a significant step towards the fulfillment of this objective. The U of A does, however, believe that improvements in the targeting of remission can further allow the doors of education to be opened to all. This presentation contains proposals to further accomplish this objective.

A third, and crucial, element of any aid for student citizens must be a respect and appreciation for the taxpayers. Given unlimited funds, the achievement of the first two objectives outlined above would be simple: throw money at the problem. The economic reality, however, precludes this "solution". The U of A Students' Union is acutely aware that often the alleged representatives of students come across as whining children, demanding the un-

reasonable, thinking little but asking a lot. Regrettably, this impression has often been justified. For this reason, our proposal presented today is rigorously mindful of the taxpayers. Our proposal involves **no additional costs** to the taxpayers of Alberta. A large element of our proposals is the addressing of abuses of the system. The misuses of the student aid system perpetrated by some students are threefold shameful. Firstly, they fraudulently cause tax dollars to be spent, with no return to the taxpayer. Secondly, they undermine the faith of the People and the Government in our vitally needed student aid system. Thirdly, and most despicably, the dollars spent on those abusing the system could have been redirected to bring those on the edge of advanced education attendance into the system.

BENEFITS AND DRAWBACKS

As all university students' unions acknowledge, no system of student aid will leave all groups satisfied.

The greatest benefit of the exemption/flat rate proposal is that it frees up much needed dollars to address the problem areas within the student population. Based upon the 48 916 students who had taken out loans in fiscal 1985/86 (as of March 3, 1986) an exemption of \$1 000 per student would exempt approximately \$47 594 206 in loans from remission. At the system wide average remission rate of 40.373 percent, this would liberate some \$19 388 452 to be directed by the S.F.B. towards areas known as being under assisted. This \$19 388 452 is an absolute minimum amount that will be available for redistribution. Four factors will function to increase the amount of money liberated.

1) The quoted \$19 million assumes that all loans were subject to only an average \$1 000 per year exemption. First loans which were taken by students in the second and subsequent years would be subject to an average exemption of greater than \$1 000. Thus the \$19 million is an underestimation in that the exempted amount will be greater than estimated.

2) The initial exemption of \$1 000 per year may act as an incentive to some students to reduce the loan amount taken.

3) Should it be possible to reduce the loan/grant threshold with the exemption savings, then a portion of the loans replaced by grants will be Alberta Student Loans, thus an interest cost savings will be accrued to the Alberta Government.

4) The deterrence value of the increased enforcement efforts should reduce the loans taken out, thus providing the Alberta Government with savings both from remissions not paid, and

loans/grants not taken.

The University of Alberta Students' Union insist that all additional dollars generated within the Students' Finance Board system **remain** within the SFB system.

WINNERS AND LOSERS

Some students lose under this proposal. Those students with a modest debt load face significantly reduced remissions. For example a student who only requires a loan of \$1 500 per year to cover his or her tuition and books for four years would be affected. In this example rather than being able to expect a remission of up to \$2 100, the student would be able to apply for only about \$800. The U of A Students' Union does not view this reality as being a negative one. Our philosophical belief is that if a student only needs a relatively modest amount of assistance, it is acceptable to redirect the remission aid towards those students whose economic conditions are such as to require larger loans. Such a sacrifice is especially justifiable if the additional aid available goes towards enabling more citizens to exercise the advanced educational option.

POSSIBLE DRAWBACKS

The provision of a 40 percent flat rate remission, after an initial debt of \$1 000 per year of program is assumed, may prompt some students to attempt to maximize their loan amounts after the threshold is passed so as to get as many 60 cent dollars as possible.

A second concern raised with this proposal is that it appears to penalize the thrifty and industrious student who manages to keep his loan amount modest in size. Our response to this concern is a simple one: virtue is its own reward!! A student who leaves university with a degree and a modest debt load has, in a very real sense, already received his or her reward.

A final concern raised with our program is that it would require a significant recalculation and re-configuration within the SFB in terms of living guidelines, loan limits, remission rates possible and number of students. The U of A Students' Union

would therefore request, urgently, that should the Minister see it wise to adopt, in whole or in part, our proposal, that a representative of all the Alberta university students be given "status" within the process of calculation and redistribution of the available SFB funds.

SPECIFICS OF PROPOSAL

The University of Alberta Students' Union proposal builds upon the consensus existing between all university students' unions in Alberta by being based upon a single flat rate of remission, independent of institution, or year of study. Where the U of A Students' Union differs from our friends at other institutions is on the matter of the inclusion of an initial amount of loan which is exempt from being eligible for remission. The U of A Students' Union's proposal is as follows:

1) A flat rate remission of at least 40 percent (a greater percentage if available) be granted on all student loans issued by the Alberta Students' Finance Board.

2) An amount equal to \$1 000.00 per year of the normal length of study for the program be exempted from being eligible for remission.

3) The monies saved by the exemption be, **in their entirety**, directed towards problem areas **exclusively in the form of additional grants**

4) The following additional enforcement steps be taken:

A) Significantly bolder, more prominent warnings be included in the loan application packages, including warnings as to the severe penalties associated with student loan fraud.

B) Students be required to

provide additional backup documentation with their applications. Such items to be required might include: birth certificates for children, employer statements of earnings and/or payslips, daycare cost receipts, and receipts for extra-ordinary expenses.

C) Audits be targeted towards areas where a greater concentration of abuse is believed to exist.

5) That the monies saved through additional enforcement measures be used **exclusively** to increase the percentage of remission paid under the flat rate system.

6) An education program on debt management be instituted to the personal financial ramifications of student loans. Such a program might include:

A) Information as to the estimated **monthly** payments associated with the student's current debt load.

B) Information on personal financial planning.

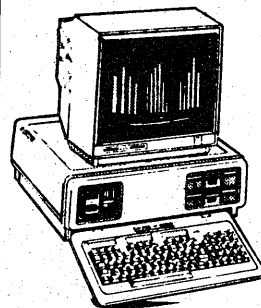
7) Monies saved due to student planning/thrift be recycled into providing increases in the flat rate of remission paid.

8) If the funds available allow, lower the threshold beyond which all monies awarded by the SFB are in the form of a grant.

9) If the threshold between loans/grants can be lowered the savings resultant from interest costs associated with the carrying of Alberta Student Loans being reduced should be directed towards increasing the remission flat rate.

NOTE: The proposed remission system, if approved would be initiated for the next school year of 87/88.

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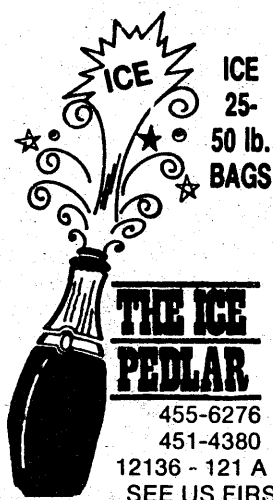
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Lady Hoopsters Split Weekend Series

After three consecutive road games the Chicks returned home to host Medicine Hat College and Lethbridge Community College.

The Chicks were hungry for a victory; going into the weekend with a 0-3 record and home court proved to be just what the doctor ordered. Friday's game featured the Lady Rattlers from Medicine Hat College, a team with lots of talent but a little short of experience. The game saw the Chicks jump out to a 10-2 lead only to trail 29-31 at the half, due to missing a number of easy shots inside. The second half saw the Rattlers increase their lead to ten points with five minutes remaining before NAIT guard, Kathy Prochnau hit two three point plays, Sherry Lee scored a layup, and Kathy hit on two free throws to give the Chicks the lead for good. The final ended up 55-52 for NAIT as the Chicks got their initial ACAC league win.

The score wasn't completely indicative of the play as the Chicks had control of the boards yet while having twenty offensive rebounds, could not convert these into points. Once again Sherry Lee turned in a strong performance with 20 points and nine steals, Tracy Guhle led the forwards with ten rebounds.

NAIT had little time to savour the victory as Saturday afternoon they squared off against the unbeaten (7-0) Lethbridge Kodiaks, a team that is loaded with talent and experience. The squad features two players in their fourth season of competition and three players who have played for three years in the ACAC. One has to wonder about whether the ACAC is developing into a league where three and four year players are the norm rather than the exception.

The game was never really in doubt as Lethbridge

pulled steadily away from the Chicks taking a 42-22 lead at the half. The first ten minutes of the second half saw the Kodiaks extend their lead 65-26 before the Chicks got going offensively and outscored LCC 24-14 down the stretch to lose 81-52. Lana Simpson led LCC with 26 points while Sherry Lee (14 pts), Kim Ferris (13 pts) and Kathy Prochnau (11 pts) replied for the Chicks. **FOR THE RECORD:** The Chicks will break from ACAC play until January 16 and 17 when they host the tough Calgary teams SAIT and Mount Royal. The schedule has not been kind to the Chicks who will play six of their first eight games against teams in the league. While the squad will take a short break for exams they will be back on the court December 20 and 21 when they host the ladies from Saskatchewan Technical Institute (Moose Jaw) in a two game exhibition series.

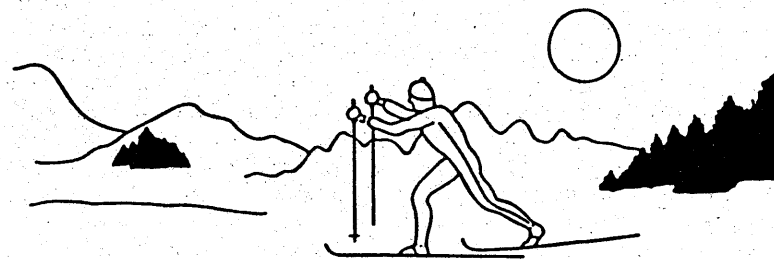

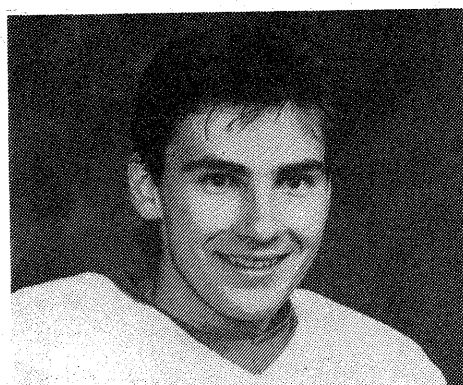
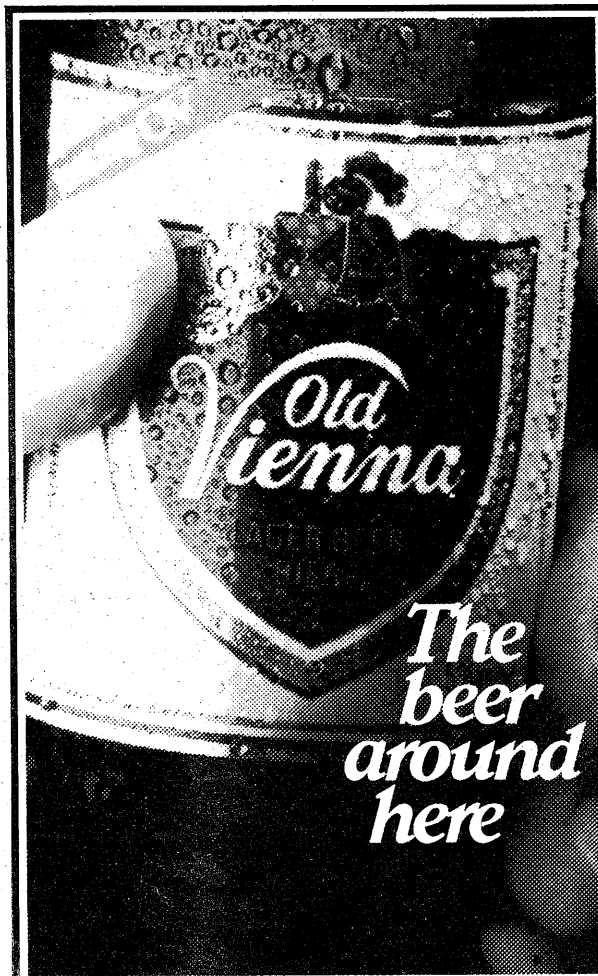

Over the years, many individuals have been appalled at the apathy for college sports in Canada as compared to the United States. While college sport flourishes south of the border, college sport north of the border is struggling to survive.

For example, in the NCAA, the University of Michigan Wolverines draw upwards of 100,000 for a football game, and the NCAA-2 Hockey

Championships in Detroit almost fill Joe Louis Arena, the home of the Detroit Red Wings. In contrast, the U of A Golden Bears football team rarely draws more than 1,000 fans, and attendance at university and college hockey games in Edmonton usually is less than 500 people.

To account for these differences, the spectator must be aware of the situation that exists both north and south of the border. Although the differences seem minor, they are determining factors.

Firstly, tradition is on the side of U.S. universities and colleges. Athletics in U.S. educational institutions go back to the turn of the century. As a result, schools have had a longer period of time to develop a reputation for sports and to receive support from alumni. On the other hand, the Canadian Colleges Athletic Associa-

tion National Championships have only been around since the early 1970's and many of the members of the ACAC have only been in touch with their alumni recently.

Secondly, culture plays an important role in the development of college sport. South of the border, many individuals regard these activities as the "in thing to do". In Canada, most people avoid college sport like the plague.

Thirdly, college sports south of the border is big business. Television contracts for NCAA basketball and NCAA swimming bring millions to a number of learning institutions. In addition, other media realize the importance of college sports and cover the scene quite well. Here, the CIAU has only in the past few years acquired a contract for the broadcast of the hockey national champion-

ships and no such agreement exists between the CCAA and a television network. In Edmonton, NAIT has to work hard to receive recognition on the sportspages and on the airwaves.

Unfortunately, the big loser in the scene is the potential fan of college sports. A number of quality athletics toil in both the ACAC and CCAA in virtual anonymity. The level of play in ACAC and CIAU hockey is comparable to the NCAA. Many players in these leagues have just as much talent as those in the NHL, but the college hockey player did not receive the breaks.

While ticket prices for the Edmonton Oilers remain high and inaccessible to a number of Albertans, college hockey is an affordable, entertaining alternative. Other sports are also very rewarding. Don't take my word for it, experience college sports yourself.
