This mud-slinging benefits no-one, and only amplifies the hostilities of men to women and women to men.

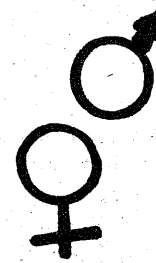
What initially started as humorous columns has steadily deteriorated to name calling and put downs. I know that is not the intention of students submitting the columns.

NAIT Hockey OOKs Sweep Series

Friday, November 28 - NAIT OOKs 13, MHC Rattlers 3 at the NAIT arena.

The NAIT OOKs scored five goals in the first period and five more in the second en route to a 13-3 triumph over the Rattlers at the NAIT arena on Friday night.

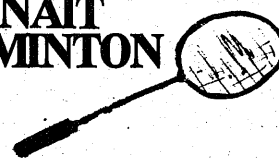
The NAIT OOKs opened the scoring quickly as John Walker tallied at 1:32 of the first from Ron Amyotte and Mike Tookey. Walker then assisted on Mike Nottingham's marker a short 26 seconds later. With only 2:32 gone in the first, Lou Rimstad increased NAIT's advantage to 3-0 on a play with Rick Chauvette and Nigel Cripps. With the third OOKs goal, Rocco Meraglia was pulled from the Rattler nets in favor of Scott Fischer. The OOKs were held off the scoresheet until 13:33 when John Walker connected on a Mike Nottingham-Pat Mohrmann set-up. Mario Sicoló rounded out the first frame scoring at 14:17. Kurt Roebuck and Darren Schmidt assisted.

In the second, Murray Melnyk tallied for NAIT at 3:20 to make the score 6-0. Ron Amyotte turned on the red light at 5:37 from Mike Nottingham to increase NAIT's advantage to seven. Lorne Oystriek of MHC broke the NAIT shutout bid at 10:23. Thirty-one seconds followed before Todd Penner scored the second Rattler goal. Brenn Leach of the OOKs then netted his first of the contest at the 11:25 mark. Mike Nottingham reinstated NAIT's seven goal lead at 11:58. Brian Varga of the Rattlers then cut the NAIT advantage to 9-3 at the 17:15 mark. The OOKs ended the second period scoring at 18:35 as Mario Sicoló dented the mesh.

The OOKs then closed out the scoring parade with three goals in the third. Kurt Roebuck tallied with 15 seconds gone in the stanza, Marty Volcan connected at the 6:46 mark, and Mike Tookey scored at 7:17.
