## Students Go For Savings

The international student-youth movement is alive and thriving in our own backyard! A quiet revolution of discounts in travel, student advocacy, and student discounts at over 6,000 retailers across Canada, is building worldwide with our Canadian student travel organization in the forefront.

Travel CUTS (Canadian Universities Travel Service Ltd.) was started by students and incorporated non-profit over 14 years ago. From their humble beginnings aspirations to keep air-grown to the longest running Canadian Christmas charters, they have grown to the longest running charter organization in the country.

You will see the name Travel CUTS on nearly all campuses across Canada. The recent expansion in Edmonton to two offices and nationwide to 17 is in response to the overwhelming demand by students, youth and budget-minded travellers for greater access to "Travel CUTS programs".

As more students are becoming aware that they are entitled to discounts that range from airfares to meals in restaurants, the demand for the Interna-

tional Student Identity Card (ISIC) grows. All full-time secondary and post-secondary students are eligible for the card which is necessary in order to take advantage of the discounts. The ISIC is available at Travel CUTS. It costs \$7.50 and requires a passport-size photo. Booklets detailing discounts available both regionally and around the world is given with each ISIC.

For non-students under 26 years, one can qualify for the FIYTO card which offers a large percentage of the same discounts holders of the ISIC enjoy. The FIYTO card is available at Travel CUTS or the Canadian Hostelling Association.

One of Canada's most popular student programs is the Student Work Abroad Program (SWAP). This program offers the opportunity to work and holiday in a foreign land. In addition to Britain, Belgium, Ireland and New Zealand, 1986 welcomes Australia to the program.

Information on SWAP and many more of Travel CUTS programs is published quarterly in the "Canadian Student Traveller". The Spring edition has just arrived in our office. Watch for it at your school or drop by

Travel CUTS to pick up your FREE copy.

If you are thinking about travelling to Europe, you should ensure that you have a copy of "Let's Go Europe". This is an excellent guide for the budget-minded traveller and is given free with every Eurail pass issued at any Travel CUTS. Another must is the "Sleep Cheap Guide to Europe" which lists budget hotels, pensiones and private houses.

For anyone interested in learning a language, the EUROCENTRES program is ideal. It is set up so you learn the language in the country from which it originates and offers you a chance to live with a family. Courses range from beginner to advanced and last from 3 weeks to 3 months. Travel CUTS is active in the International Student Travel Conference, the worldwide organization which regulates the sale of the ISIC and other student travel opportunities. Membership in this organization gives Travel CUTS access to student travel discounts and flights worldwide such as tours into China, Russia, European charter flights etc.

### Who may apply?

Any person, institution, corporation, or society may request research funds. The Trust will give preference to private sector applicants, including individuals, for environmental research which might otherwise not get done.

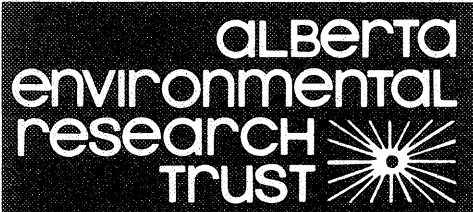
Environmental research covers a broad range of issues. Anyone contemplating an A.E.R.T. application should review the list of similar projects which can be done by consulting the A.E.R.T. annual report, or the Library of Alberta Environment. Applications should involve specific objectives with tangible potential benefits for the Environment. The proposed research should reflect an innovative concept or approach. The need for Research must be demonstrated.

Deadline for submission of application for grants is March 31, 1986. Early submission is advised. All applications are reviewed upon receipt by the Grants Advisory Committee. Applicants will be notified as to the Board of Trustees' decision by June 1, 1986. Research projects should be planned to start after this date.

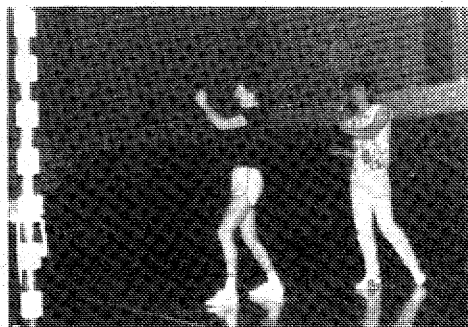

The game was fast-paced and without incident except for a third period wrestling match which saw 6 players go to the box.

On Saturday, Feb. 22, the Oaks eliminated the Kings with a tight, 2-1 victory. The Oaks came out flat, allowing the Kings to out-shoot them and take a 1-0 lead. In the second period, the Oaks played much stronger,
