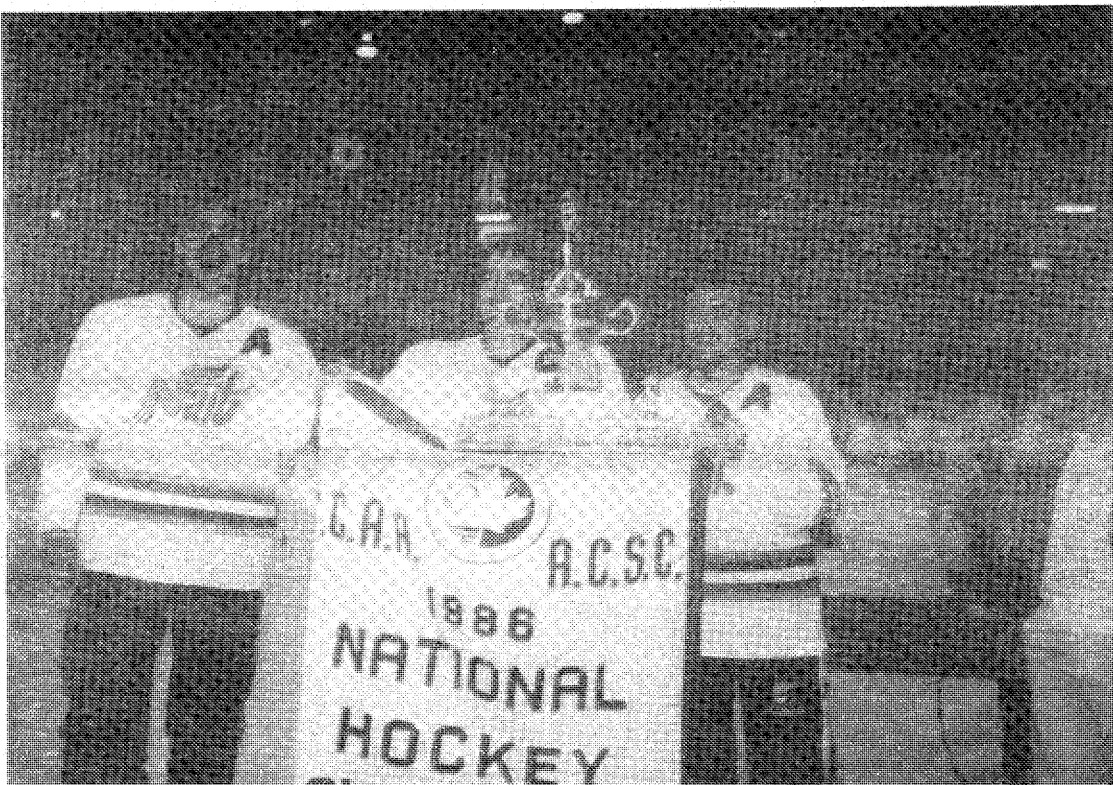

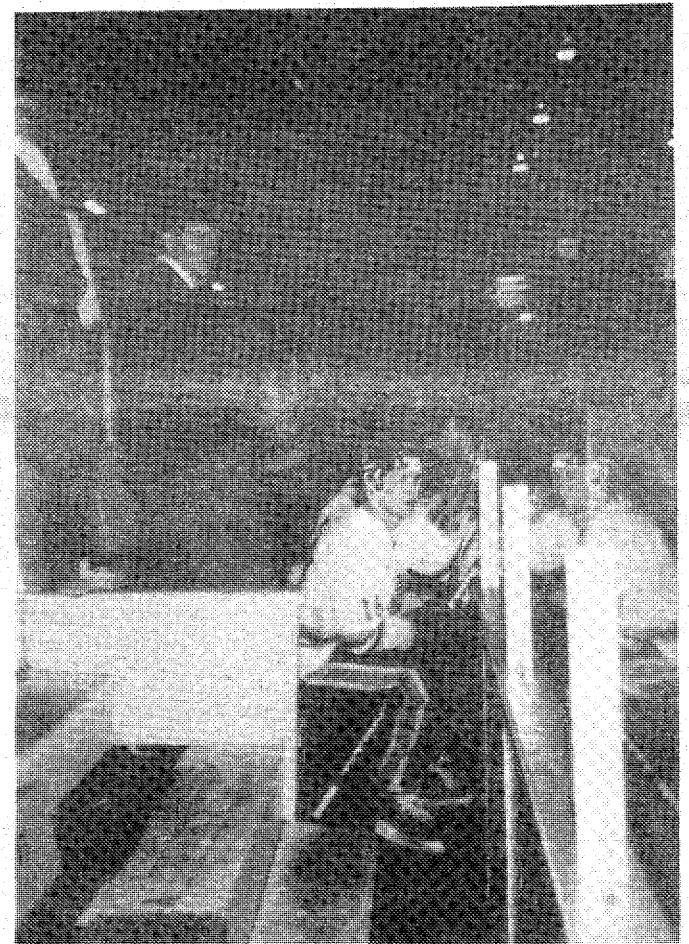

Dental Health - Let's Keep it Good for Life

Dental disease is the most common but preventable disease in Canada. Gum disease and tooth decay occur mainly from neglect, and if left untreated, it may cause pain and possible tooth loss.

Tooth decay is the major cause of tooth loss in children, and gum disease is the major cause of tooth loss in adults. Early signs of gum disease are red, shiny, puffy gums that bleed when touched. The gums become loose and begin to recede, and the bone that supports your teeth eventually starts to resorb and shrink away. Without this boney support, there is nothing to hold your teeth in place, resulting in tooth loss.

The loss of teeth can be very serious. It may result in a change of speaking abilities, chewing, and even eating habits, as your choice of foods may also become limited. Also, tooth loss causes an unpleasant

appearance and can bring about changes in the jaw-bone.

To keep your teeth healthy for the rest of your life, the answer is simple: Control plaque. Plaque is a thin film made up of saliva, food bits, and bacteria always present in the mouth. These bacteria react with sugar to form an acid that attacks your teeth and gums.

To remove plaque, it is essential to do a daily thorough brushing and flossing. As well, limit your sugar intake and eat firm, fibrous foods, such as raw fruits and vegetables, which are not harmful to your teeth. Finally, you should go for regular check-ups and cleanings at your dentist's office. If you maintain good dental health, you are on your way to keeping your teeth "good for life."

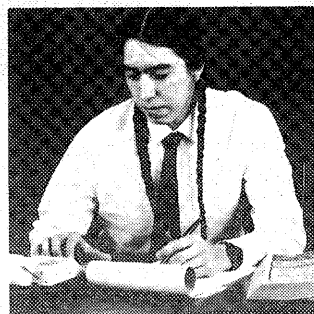

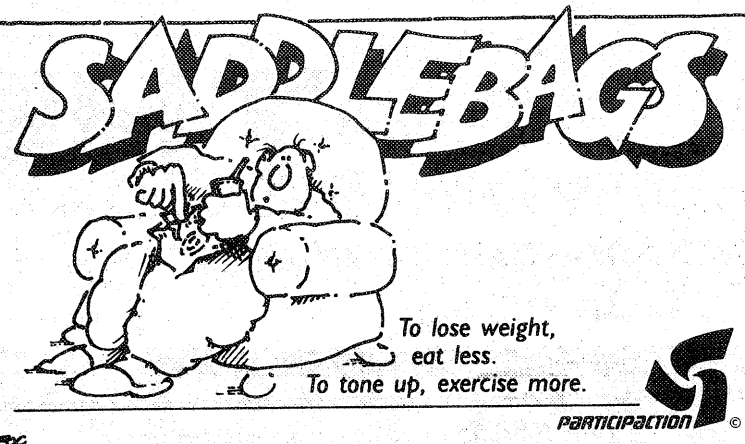

NAITSA Overbudget

On Tuesday March 25, 1986 General Council was told of a \$10,000 deficit incurred primarily by the Northern Torch. Unbudgeted expenditures such as mug shots were unaccounted for and have resulted in such a deficit. Publications Chairman Brian McDonald, who is directly responsible for the Torch, plans to reduce this deficit by digging into the funds of the Nugget and other publications and may possibly use the building fund.

Although there is a problem with over-spending in the Publication department, NAITSA as a whole can be blamed for unnecessary spending. Such items as monthly luncheons to 'keep in touch' and annual retreats at the Westin (you know, to talk things over), are not uncommon.

Has anyone ever asked to see a complete run down of expenditures incurred by NAITSA? Not likely. Cheryl Anslow, Treasurer of NAITSA is doing an excellent job keeping the books in order. But wouldn't it be interesting to see exactly what our student funds are being spent on.

One of the biggest expenses incurred was the remodeling of the NAITSA offices. \$50000 plus, was extracted out of the building fund to give NAITSA a 'professional look'. On top of the initial cost, each executive received \$100 to spend on prints and or pictures for each of their offices. NAITSA keeps arguing that the money came out of the building fund and not student Association fees. But in fact do not we as students contribute a portion of our fees to the building fund.

So where does the problem lie? Is it with NAITSA or is it with General Council who continually gives approval to this type of needless spending? It is time that General Council further scrutinizes the spending habits of NAITSA, after all they are responsible for the money that students contribute.

No Contest for NAITSA President

Once again, NAITSA elections are upon us. With 20 candidates for 13 positions, students will have a difficult task in choosing the best candidate. There is, however, one position for which there will be no contest: NAITSA President. Why? Simply because only one student in this institution made the decision that he might be the best candidate for the job. One student!

Out of all the first year students in an institution with 6,000 students in total, all but one felt they would not be the right person for the job. As a result, there will be no contest for President: the

sole candidate will win by acclamation.

What happened?

Perhaps inadequate promotion was the problem? However, this remark can be quickly rejected, as the extent of election promotion that this year's Executive has done has been more than adequate in comparison to past Executive's efforts.

Consequently, the problem must lie with the student body. Students failed to recognize the importance, responsibility, and long term benefits of this position. It is shocking to realize that only one person felt that he had the personal qualities neces-

sary for the job.

It is also obvious that, with only one candidate, the element of competition has been eliminated. This is a serious concern: competition is the vital ingredient in determining who will be the best person for the job. With the President already installed via acclamation, an essential foundation of the democratic process is wiped out.

Students at NAIT for the 1986-87 academic year will be extremely fortunate if their President fulfills his Executive responsibilities. But if he fails, it will be a sad tribute to the apathy of the 1985-86 first year students.

DOES EDMONTON KNOW THE OOKS ARE CHAMPS?

For the second consecutive year, the NAIT Oaks hockey team has conquered the C.C.A.A. Championship. A victory of this magnitude has instilled a high level of pride in NAIT students and Edmontonians in general. In one day (March 23), Edmonton became the City of Champions in two hockey contests: the CIAU playoffs where the U of A Golden Bears took top spot, and the CCAA tournament which saw our Oaks come out the victors. However, given the extent of coverage in the city's two daily newspapers, you would never realize the Oaks were champions.

The U of A Bears received national television exposure, front page coverage in the

Edmonton Journal, and a two-page spread in the Edmonton Sun, all complete with action photos and game analyses.

On the other hand, the Oaks, who had a superior record in comparison to the Bears, who easily defeated the Bears in the February 2, 1986 Ronald McDonald Cup, received dismal coverage.

The Oaks were ranked number one going into the nationals, the Bears were ranked tenth in their league (Many sports critics questioned the injustices in the CIAU system for placing the Bears in the nationals to begin with), and yet the Bears receive all the glitter and adulation of the media,

while coverage of the Oaks' victory was limited to a mere one-fifth of a page in both dailies.

Questions need to be asked about this inequity. Was it due to an inferior athletic promotion/P.R. department at NAIT, or was the media to blame? Realistically, both sides should admit their shortcomings.

Steps must be taken, and further complaints should be issued (i.e. letters to the Journal and Sun) to ensure that this disgusting lack of coverage never happens again. Then, and only then, will the Oaks get the media coverage they rightfully deserve. It is long overdue.

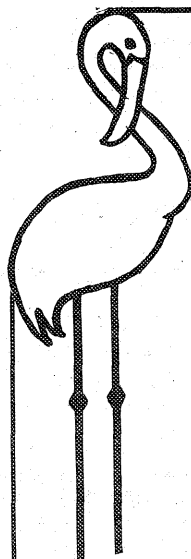

Overall, looking back at the past season, the team had its ups and downs just like any

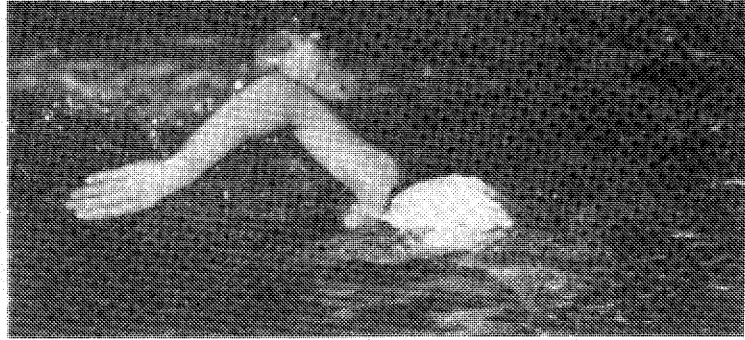

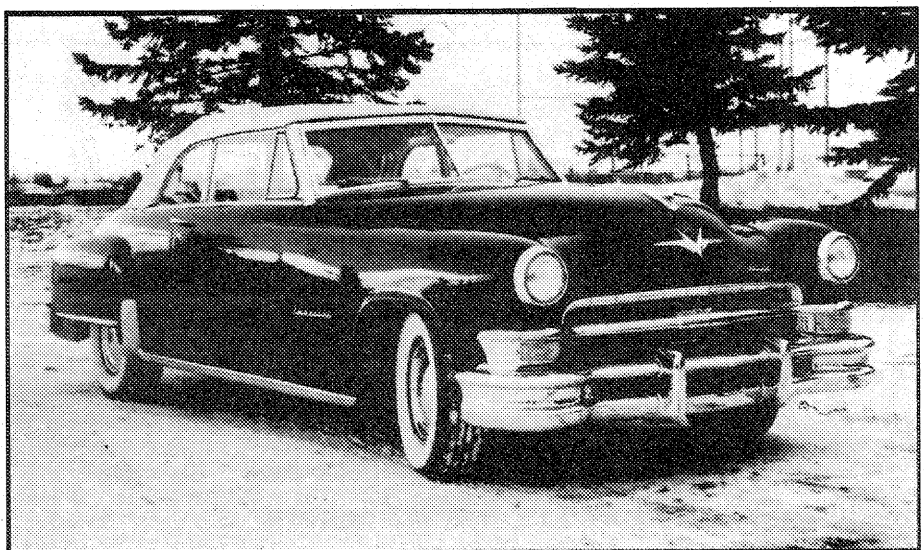

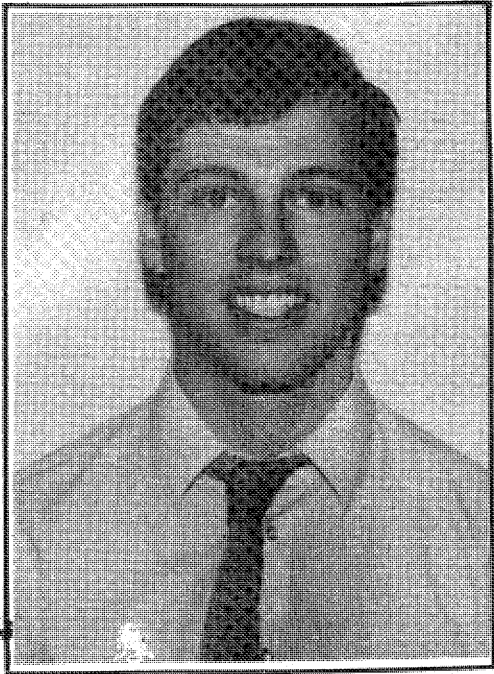

Chris Reinert - President



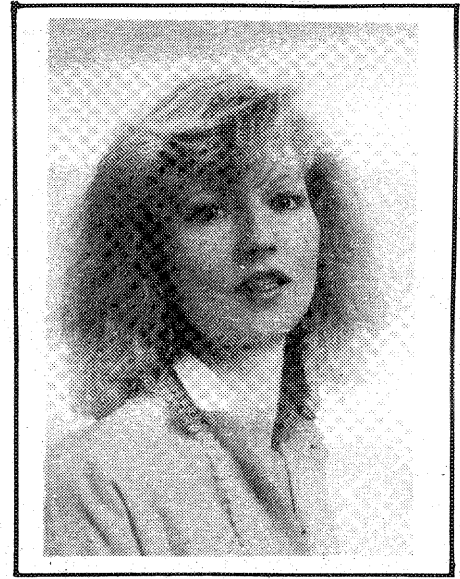
Hi. My name is Chris Reinert. I am running for the office of President. I am a first year business student taking first and second year courses. I am planning to take either accounting or finance in my second year.

Most students don't even realize that the Board of Governors is the principal governing body of this Institute. The decision that the Board makes affects you!

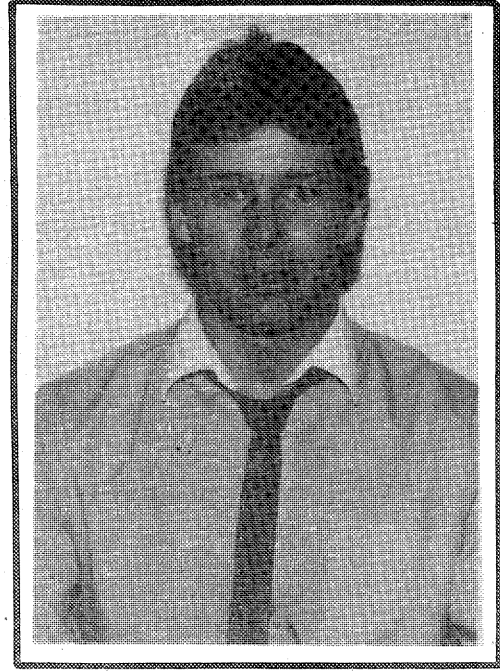

Bob Ashauer—Board of Governors



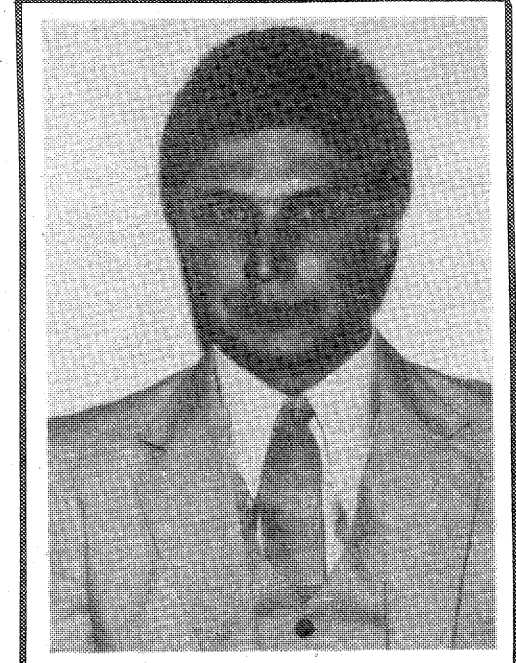

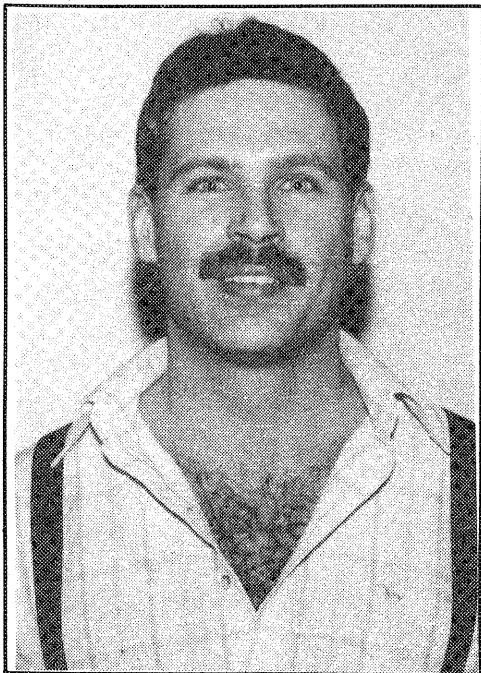
In my personal life I have worked several years in management. In the past I have been involved in several student organizations.

The duties of Activities Chairman are not new to me; in fact they are right up my alley.

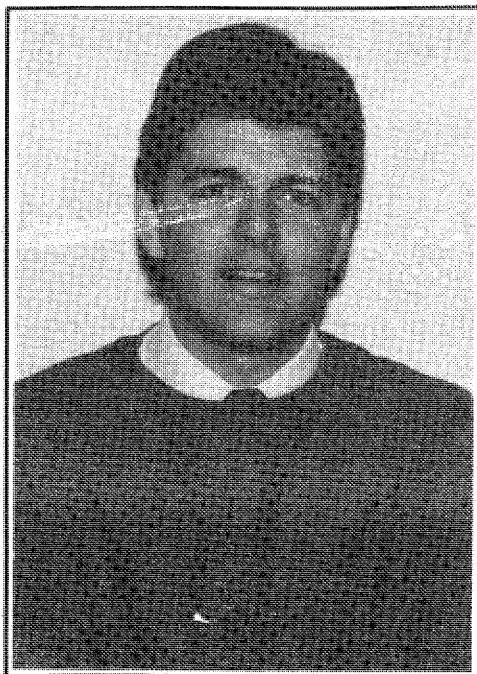
In Conclusion

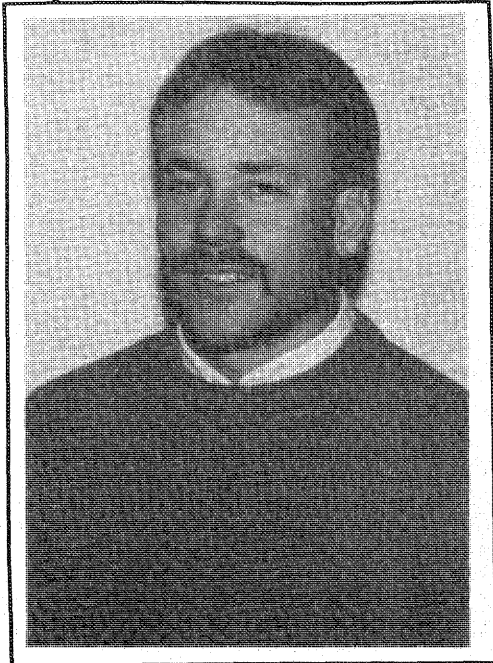

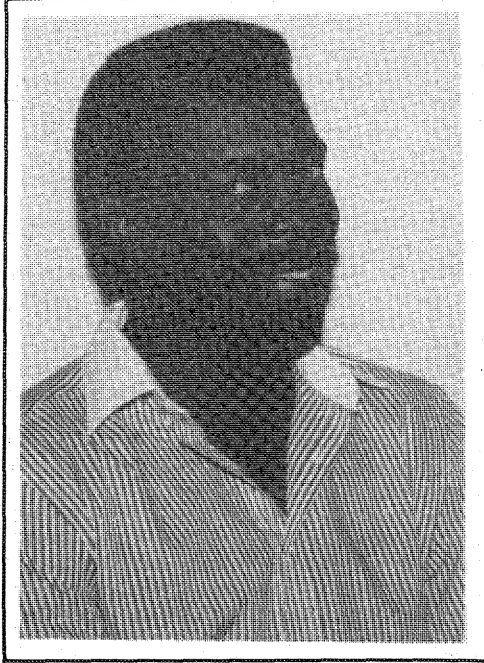
Warren Sutherland

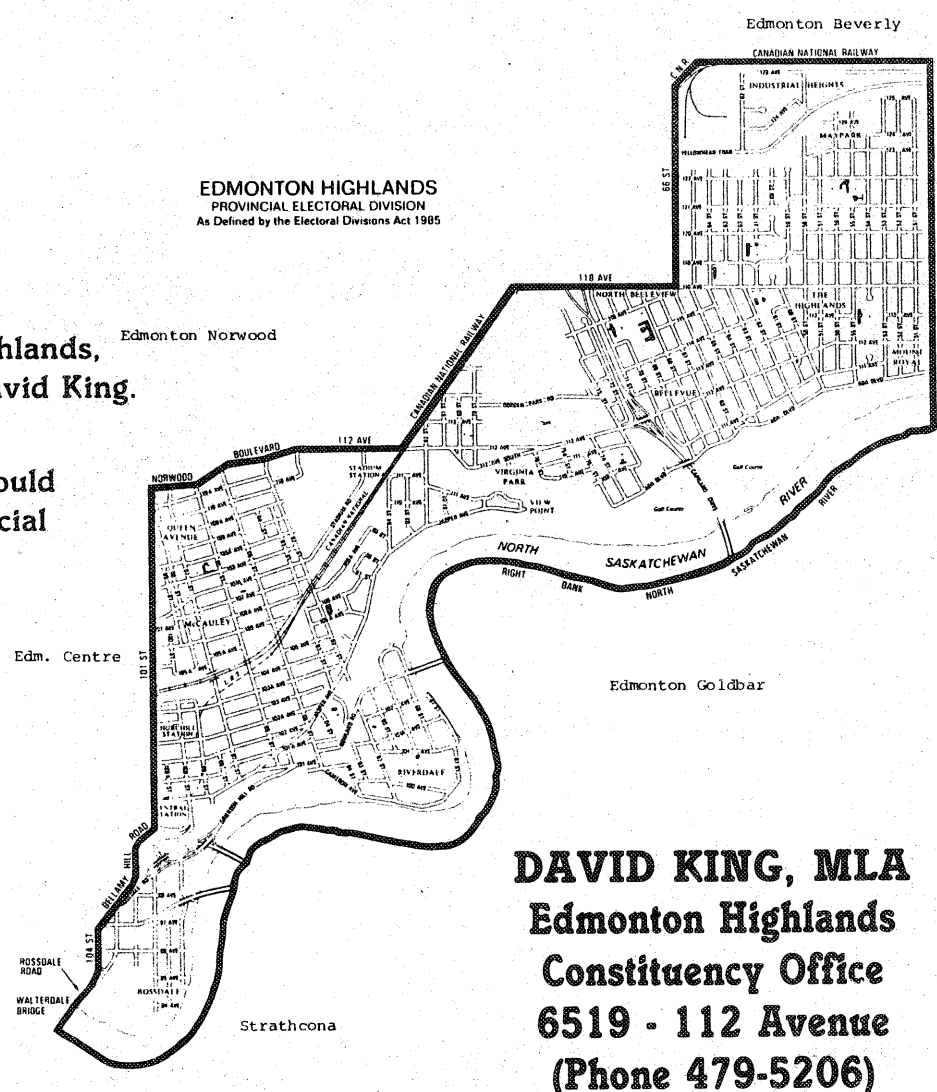
