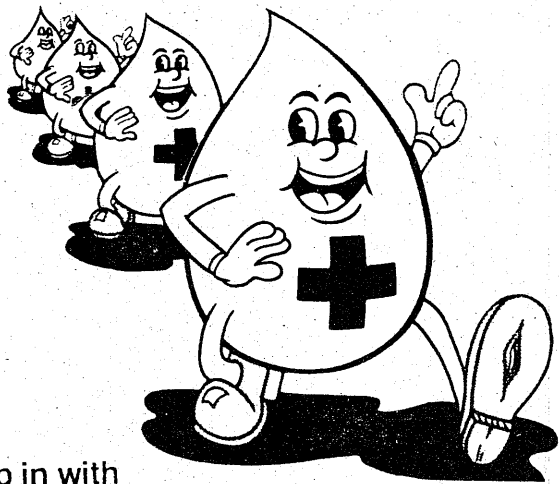

Being a professional athlete can either allow you to get away with much more than a normal citizen, or it can mean you will be severely punished for your mistakes because you are setting an example for today's youth.

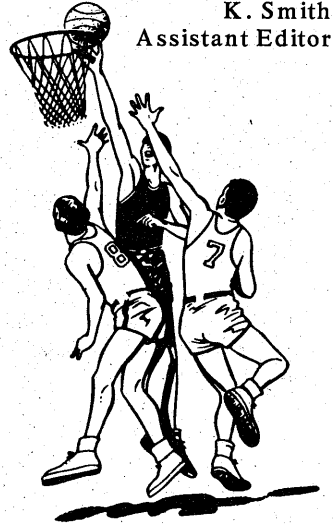

Student government is intended to allow you the chance to plan events that you feel are important and the ability to raise funds to finance your objectives. Along with this goes a responsibility to be accountable for your actions.

Regarding the motion brought up at the Council meeting on Nov. 4/86 which asked "should NAITSA reinstate all the technology's privileges when a creditor absolves the tech of its debt?" Legal action against the individual who signed the contract would fail as the courts recognize that person was acting on behalf of the NAIT technology and accountability falls to the technology. If the creditor, out of frustration, decides not to pursue this matter, should NAITSA reinstate the tech?

Do you think this person will ever again deal with NAIT? When we talk about Community League hall rental, they have a Federation where they all could decide to not rent halls to any NAIT tech until all debts are paid.

With that implication, NAITSA and all technologies must accept the responsibility to ensure all debts are

paid to promote an image of a credible institution.

## Tips on Sipping

Alcohol beverages have been a source of both pleasure and problems since the beginning of mankind. They have been recognized throughout the ages as a source of relaxation, pleasure and conviviality, as well as nourishing the body, restoring and preserving health. Yet history shows that irresponsible use of alcohol can be destructive to individuals, families, and societies.

Contrary to popular belief, the majority of problem drinkers are not "skid row bums." This population comprises only 3 to 5 percent of alcoholics in America. In fact, the proportion of heavy drinkers increases fairly steadily from 6 percent of those with grammar school education to 15 percent of those who are college graduates.

Problem drinkers are defined as persons experiencing negative behavioral consequences resulting from alcohol use. Using this definition, 10 to 15 percent of the students surveyed at various universities around the country were considered to be problem drinkers, and 30 to 45 percent said they had driven after several drinks during the previous year.

The answer to the problem is not prohibition, but rather prudence. The question is not so much whether to drink or not to drink, but rather, if you choose to drink, how to be a responsible drinker.

## Tips on Responsible Drinking

If you use alcohol in a responsible manner, chances are that you will never experience a drinking problem. Thus, alcohol will be something to enhance your social relationships rather than impairing or destroying them. For the person who has made the decision to drink, here are some ways to avoid over-indulgence:

Keep in mind that drinking should not be the primary focus of any activity.

Recognize another's right to drink or not to drink.

Remember that the right to drink is limited by society through laws governing drinking and driving, the minimum drinking age, etc., and respect these laws

Set a limit on how many drinks you are going to have when you drink, and stick to it.

Drink slowly-don't gulp your drinks.

Measure the beverage alcohol when you are mixing a drink.

Use alcohol carefully in connection with other drugs.

Discourage a driver who is under the influence of alcohol from driving; provide transportation at social gatherings where drinking is involved.

Seek help if you think you have a drinking problem, and if you think someone else may have a problem, encourage him/her to seek help.

## First Aid for the Intoxicated

There is no way to sober up quickly. It takes time for the person to metabolize the alcohol in the bloodstream. A cold shower, black coffee, oxygen or exercise will have little effect. A general rule of thumb is that it will take as many hours to sober up as the number of drinks ingested. Here are some basic first-aid procedures to use on an intoxicated person.

If a person has had "one too many" and passes out, monitor his/her breathing to make sure it's normal. If the breathing is irregular and the person appears to be in a coma, with purplish skin tone, try to wake him/her by shaking or gently poking. If there is no response, call for medical attention immediately.

If the person responds but is listless and sleepy, make sure the person is on his side so he will not choke in case of vomiting. Keep the person comfortable and let him sleep it off. A ride to the local detox centre might be a sobering experience for your friend.

If the person is not breathing, proceed with mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and get help immediately.

Much care must be executed with the aggressive drunk who wants to fight everyone.

First approach the person carefully and try to calm him/her down by using a rational reasoning.

Attempt to get the person to leave and go home with you or friends.

If the person continues to be assaultive and is hurting others, you should call the police to avoid further damage and for the individual's own protection.

## How to Detect a Drinking Problem

Here are some basic warning signals that indicate a person may have a drinking problem.

1. A person who frequently drinks to a state of intoxication.
2. A person who relies on a drink to start the day.
3. A person who consistently skips classes due to hangovers.
4. A person who has blackouts and loss of memory from drinking.
5. A person who frequently drinks alone to escape from reality, boredom and loneliness.
6. A person who sustains bodily injury as a consequence of drinking.
7. A person who excessively denies he has an alcohol problem when approached about his behaviour concerning alcohol.
8. A person who suffers from chronic hangovers and wants a drink to relieve the hangover.
9. A person who under the influence of alcohol does something he/she would not do otherwise.

If someone close to you seems to have an alcohol problem, don't be afraid to talk with him/her. Show concern and support without preaching or criticizing. Have a positive attitude and be sincere about your feelings. Be prepared to offer alternatives and specific advice as to what kinds of professional help are available, because the problem drinker is usually the last to know he has a problem.

If you follow these tips on sipping, you can minimize the problems of drinking alcohol and maximize the pleasures. Health pamphlets on various subjects, can be obtained free from Health Services Room # 119 Central Core. Please call in any time.

There is a Forth language available for your computer, no matter what it is. Come out and find out how to put it to use.

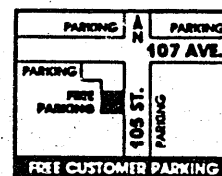


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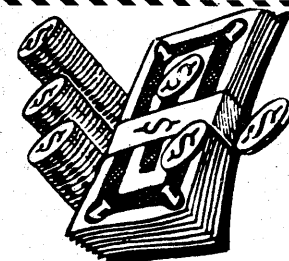

A good, if crowded, time was had by all as the fine tradition of excellent Instrumentation Cabarets continues. Watch for the next one.

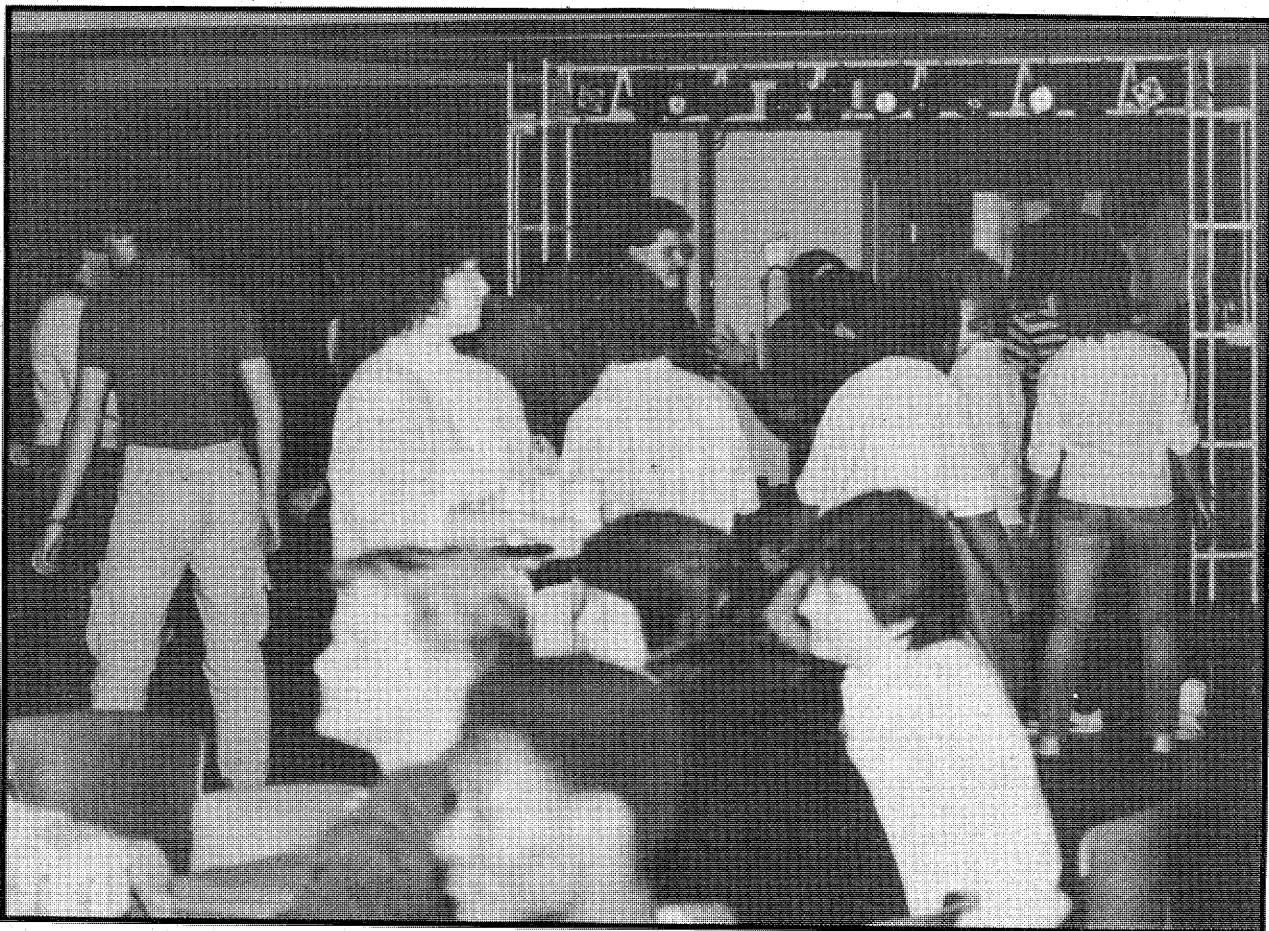
## ROCK AND TALK

I recommend everyone plan to take in the Rock n' Talk it really is a good bash; and you still have time to go and party afterwards. What a way to warm up the evening.



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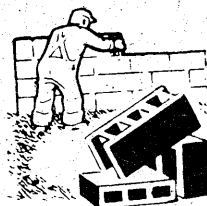

## OOKS STILL UNDEFEATED

The NAIT Hockey Ooks swept a home-and-home series with the Red Deer College Kings over the weekend to improve their regular season record to six wins and no losses.

**FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 14th**  
NAIT OOKS 5, RED DEER KINGS 3 AT THE RED DEER ARENA

The NAIT Ooks special teams proved to be crucial as the Ooks scored a 5-3 victory over the Red Deer College Kings on Friday night in Red Deer.

John Walker of the Ooks opened the scoring with his fourth goal of the season with 2:17 gone in the first frame. Greg Pulliam of the Kings tied the game at 1-1 at the 11:48 mark. Three minutes and 33 seconds followed before NAIT's Mike Tookey connected on the powerplay with help from Darren Schmidt.

In the second, the Kings pulled even 55 seconds into the frame as Rick Howarth capitalized on a powerplay opportunity. Darryl Shudra's second goal of the campaign moved the Ooks into the lead at 4:15. Darren Schmidt was credited with an assist.

NAIT widened their advantage to a pair as Mario Sicolo netted a shorthanded goal from Marty Volcan and Ron Amyotte with 2:12 elapsed in the final period. Lindsay Hall pulled the Kings to within one on the Red Deer powerplay at the 6:48 mark. Mike Nottingham notched his first of the season with six minutes and 37 seconds left in the game to make the final 5-3 in favor of NAIT.

Kevin Stapleton was busy in the NAIT crease facing 43 shots. At the other end, Bruce Cory was tested 31 times in the Red Deer net.

**SATURDAY NOVEMBER 15th--NAIT OOKS 8, RED DEER KINGS 1 AT THE NAIT ARENA**

The NAIT Ooks exploded for six goals in the final period en route to an 8-1 triumph over the Red Deer College Kings at the NAIT Arena on Saturday evening. With the win, the Ooks increased their lead in the ACAC standings to six points.

Following a scoreless first stanza, the teams were involved in a close battle through the second period. With the man advantage, John Walker found the net on a play with Mike Tookey

and Mike Nottingham at the 9:28 mark of the second. Darryl Shudra increased NAIT's advantage to 2-0 on the powerplay at 14:33. Mike Tookey and Mike Nottingham assisted on the marker.

Dan Baker of the Red Deer team broke Jeff Lastiwka's shutout bid with 1:23 passed in the third. Brad Sorochan started the Ooks scoring in the frame with a tally at 7:21 from Rick Chauvette. John Walker added his second of the game from Mike Nottingham and Melnyk. A short 42 seconds later, Mario Sicolo made the score 6-1 NAIT. Brenn Leach, who assisted on Sicolo's goal, entered the scoresheet with a NAIT powerplay goal at 16:40 on a Rick Chauvette set-up. Leach and Chauvette then teamed up to set up Don Simpson's second tally of the season with seven left in the game to give NAIT an 8-1 triumph.

Jeff Lastiwka stopped 24 of 25 red Deer shots in the Ooks net. Bert Brooker blocked 29 of 37 NAIT drives in the King's crease.

**ON THE BENCH:** The NAIT Ooks are in Calgary this weekend for a pair of games with the Mount Royal Col-

lege Cougars (3-3). Game times at Glenmore Arena are 7:30 on Saturday night and 2:00 on Sunday afternoon... The next home action for the NAIT Ooks will be on the weekend of November 28th and 29th when the Medicine Hat College Rattlers are here at the NAIT Arena.

## Chicks Battle in Calgary

Close only counts in Horse-shoes but the Women's Basketball squad can get some measure of satisfaction from the weekend series in Calgary where they lost two weekend games to SAIT and Mount Royal. Teams from Southern Alberta are traditionally strong and this years teams are no exception, but weekend action proved they are not invincible.

## WILDERNESS SKILLS COURSE Nov. 29-30

The Physical and Leisure Education program at NAIT will offer a Wilderness Skills Course on the weekend of Nov. 29th and 30th. The course consists of two after school lectures, Tues, Nov. 25th and Thurs, Nov. 27th from 4:30-6:00 (Room E-117) and the weekend excursion to a selected Wilderness area. The course deals with developing the skills necessary to survive in the outdoors in an emergency situation. Material covered in the course includes shelter, construction, fire lighting, natural edibles, wilderness navigation with map and

compass, and how to psychologically deal with a survival situation. The course is offered free of charge and most of the equipment is provided by the institute with the student being responsible for their personal clothing and food (No Alcohol Allowed!). The bus departs Saturday morning and returns Sunday at about 5:00 pm. While there has already been a registration for this course, there are still plenty of openings for those interested. 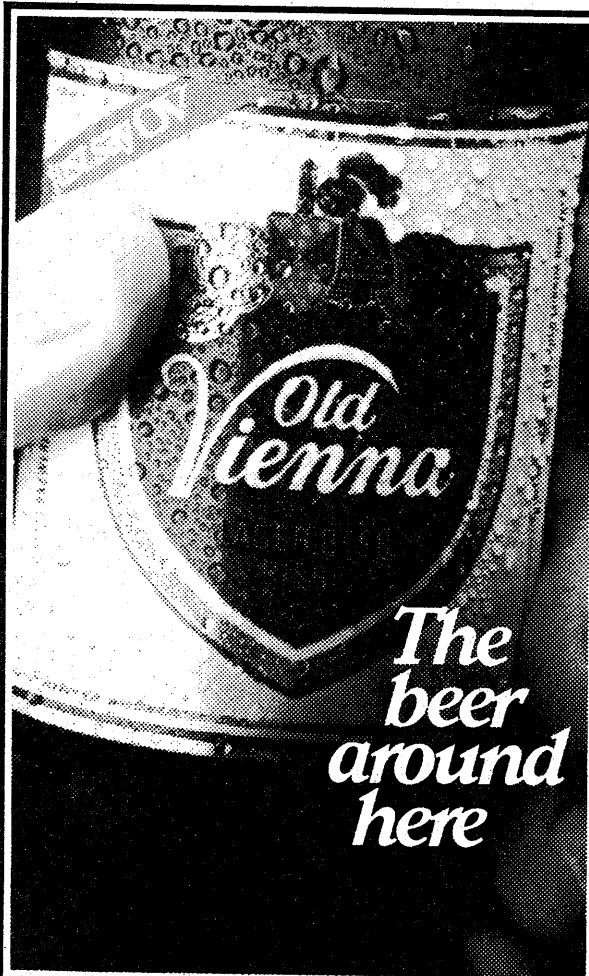
Efosh learnt his early soccer in Nigeria which he left in 1982. He attended St. Joes High School and played for Tony Petrone and Father

Dear Readers:

A letter was brought to the attention of the NUGGET staff. The letter is a personal plea to find a family member. The NUGGET staff invites you to read the letter - you may have some information that may help the family concerned.

Note: The letter was addressed to the president of the Institute.
