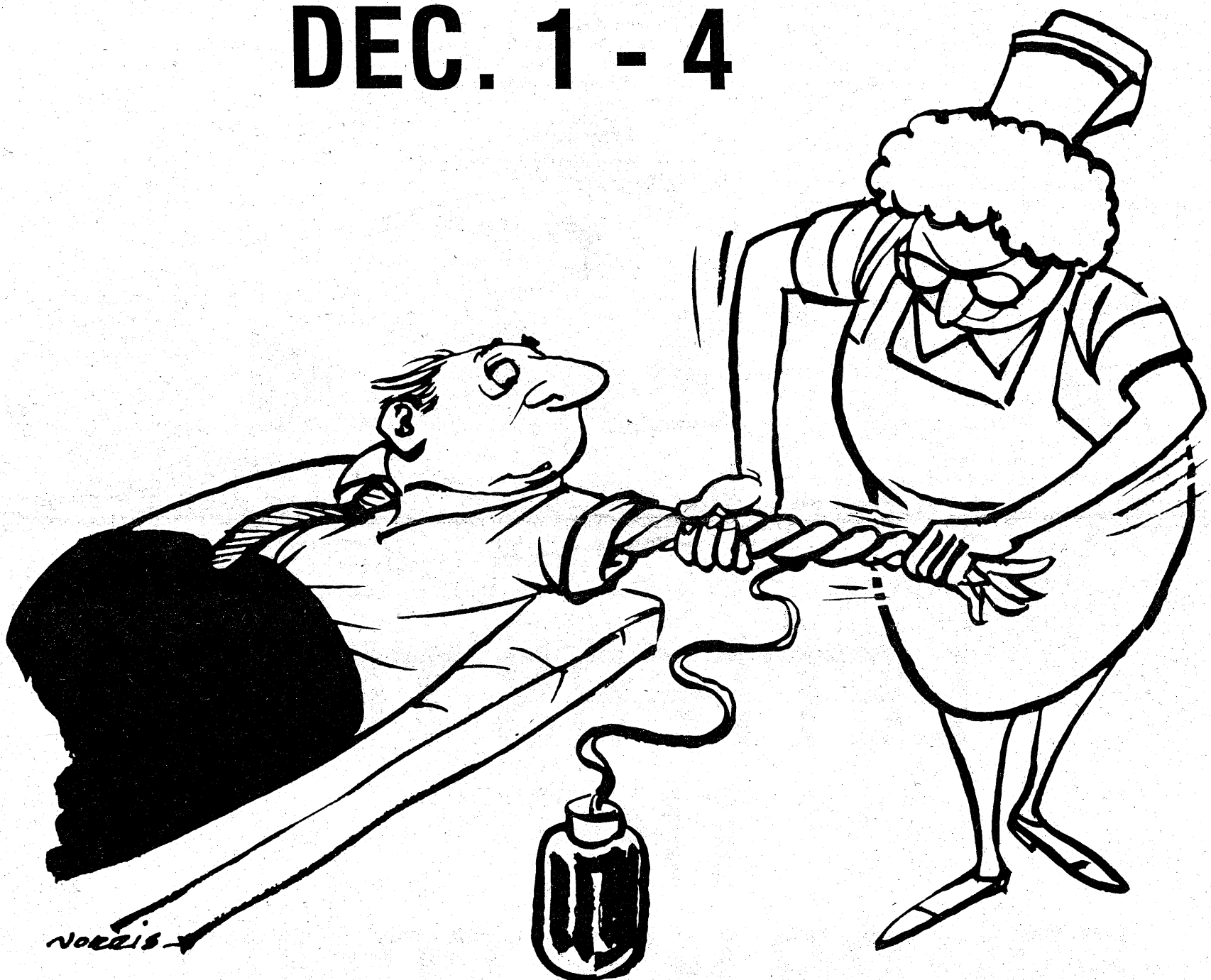

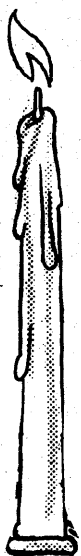

The Varscona is one of the few buildings of its type in Western Canada so it should be architecturally important to Edmonton, or are building from before 1940 the only ones worth saving. With all the work being done to restore the unique buildings on Whyte Ave., the Varscona could add even more interest

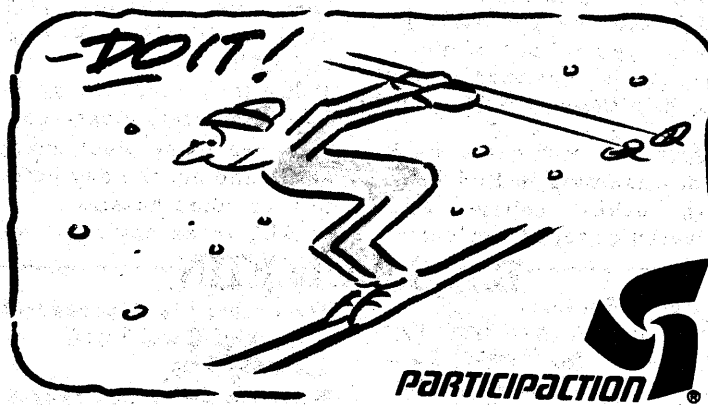
to one of the most interesting areas of the city.

This past weekend saw the return of many familiar faces to the N.A.I.T. gym where the Chicks hosted their Annual Alumni Games. Friday action saw the N.A.I.T. women squaring off against the recent N.A.I.T. Alumni and totally dominating the affair 67-37. Sherry Lee led the Chicks with 24 points while Sue Tomchuk repied with 12 points in a losing cause.

Saturday's game was a more closely contested affair against a team of older Alumni. The lead see-sawed back and forth in the first half with the Chicks clinging to a 36-33 lead going into the break. In the second half conditioning played a large part in leading the N.A.I.T. squad past the Alumni in posting a 71-56 victory. N.A.I.T. was sparked by 23 points from Kathy Prochnau

and supported by evenly balanced scoring from the rest of the team. All-time N.A.I.T. scoring leader Janice New (Rosenberger) returned to turn in a great performance hitting on 10 of 14 field goals and leading the Alumni scoring with 23 points.

Looking back at the weekend series one has to question the value of the actual game to the overall program. While it is nice to see some familiar faces for years gone by and renew old acquaintances the actual basketball played is often very disorganized and simply not that good. Alumni teams often approach the game in a casual manner and on many occasions the N.A.I.T. women have taken a similar attitude into the games. While a need exists to recognize athletes who have

graduated from the program by inviting them back to play perhaps Basketball can follow the lead of the Hockey Program. The past few Hockey Alumni games have featured games between Alumni teams played previous to a scheduled ACAC League contest. The Alumni get the opportunity to get together with old teammates as well as witness the current N.A.I.T. squad in action. The format is one that Basketball could do well to follow.

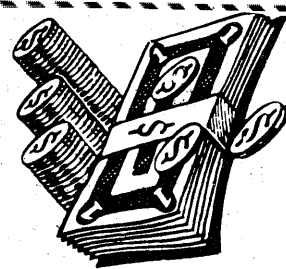

NAIT OOKs six game winning streak ended as the OOKs came away with a weekend split in Calgary as the Mount Royal College Cougars provided the competition. The Saturday night loss means that no ACAC club will finish the regular season with a perfect record. **Saturday, November 22nd--Mount Royal Cougars 7, NAIT OOKs 5 at Calgary Centennial Arena.**

The NAIT OOKs fell from the ranks of the undefeated dropping a 7-5 decision to the Mount Royal College Cougars on Saturday night in Calgary.

Kevin Busch of the OOKs started the scoring with his first goal of the season at the 4:17 mark of the first on a play with Mike Tookey. The Mount Royal College Cougars evened the score at 1-1 on the powerplay at 10:47 as Ken Froese scored. The Cougars moved into the lead on Mike Cormack's

marker with 6:51 left in the period.

Ron Amyotte netted his fifth of the season to tie the contest at 2-2 with 5:55 elapsed in the middle stanza. The Cougars regained the lead at 18:12 on Al Chatlain's marker.

With the man advantage, the MRC squad increased their lead to two as Mike Cormack found the net at 5:24 of the third. The OOKs then attempted a comeback. Ron Amyotte's second of the contest pulled the OOKs to within a goal at 12:40. John Walker and Brenn Leach assisted. Mario Sicolo of the OOKs notched his fourth goal of the season a short 14 seconds later to tie the contest at 4-4. Mike Tookey and Brenn Leach were credited with assists. Nine seconds followed before Mike MacNeil placed the Cougars ahead to stay with a tally at 13:08. Rodger Irvin added an insurance marker for Mount Royal at the 16:10 mark. John Walker

Kevin Stapleton stopped 24 of 30 Mount Royal shots in the NAIT net. Buddy Brazier blocked 32 of 37 NAIT drives in the Mount Royal crease.

The NAIT OOKs scored three powerplay goals en route to a 6-2 win over the Mount Royal College Cougars on Sunday afternoon in Calgary.

Ken Robertson of Mount Royal opened the scoring with a shorthanded goal with 9:12 gone in the initial frame. Mike Nottingham of the OOKs made the score 1-1 at 16:55 from John Walker and Ron Amyotte.

With two men in the sin bin for the Cougars, the NAIT powerplay connected as Ron Amyotte scored on a Brenn Leach set-up at 2:27. The OOKs increased their lead to 3-1 as Darryl Shudra set up Mario Sicolo's tally at the 4:21 mark. John Basco scored the second Cougars' goal at the 7:47 mark as the OOKs were killing off a penalty.

John Walker scored a pair for the OOKs on the same shift in the third period. On the goal scored at 3:37, Mike Tookey and Brenn Leach assisted. On the marker netted at the 4:15 mark, Mike Nottingham and Pat Mohrmann received assists. Rick Chauvette closed out the play scoring for the OOKs with 6:30 left in the contest on a play with Marty Volcan and Lou Rimstad.

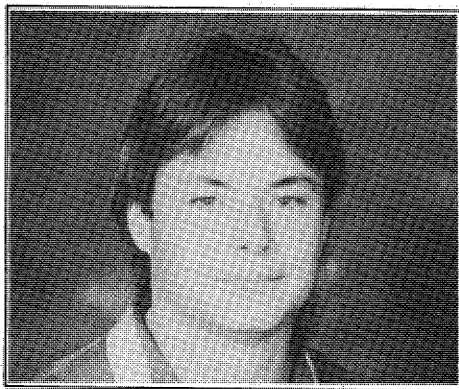
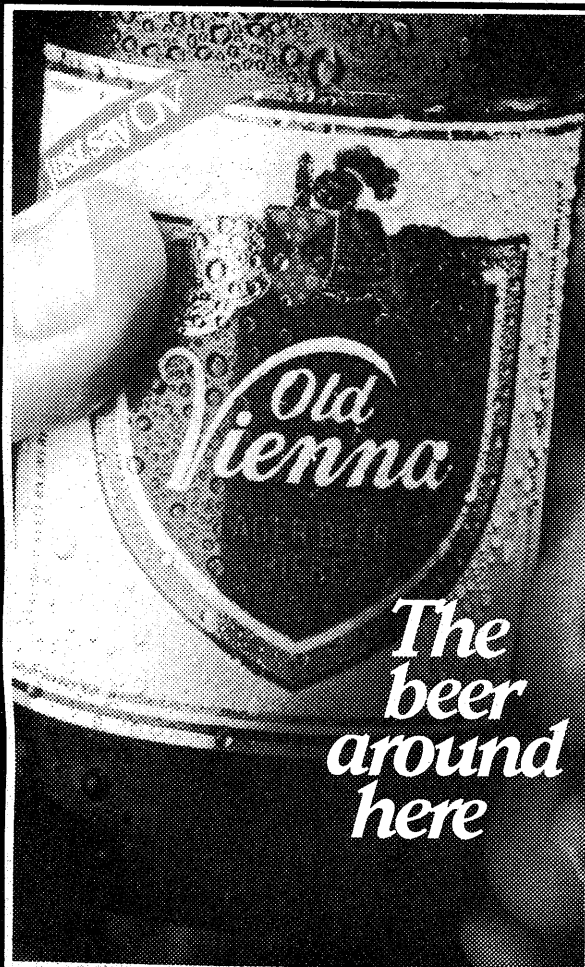
Jeff Lastiwka tended the crease for NAIT and faced 27 Cougar shots. At the other end, Scott Stanley of the Cougars was tested 34 times.

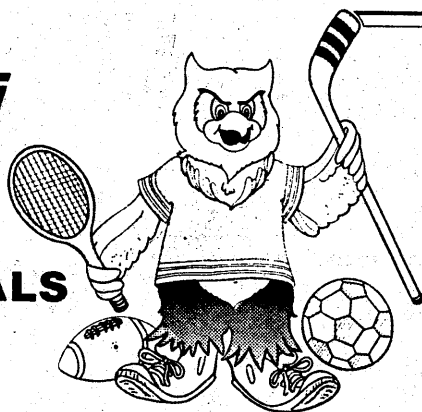

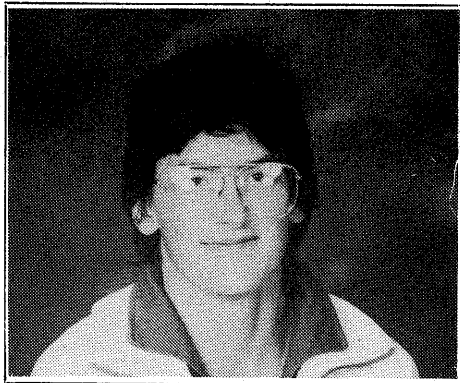

Lynne Stephenson

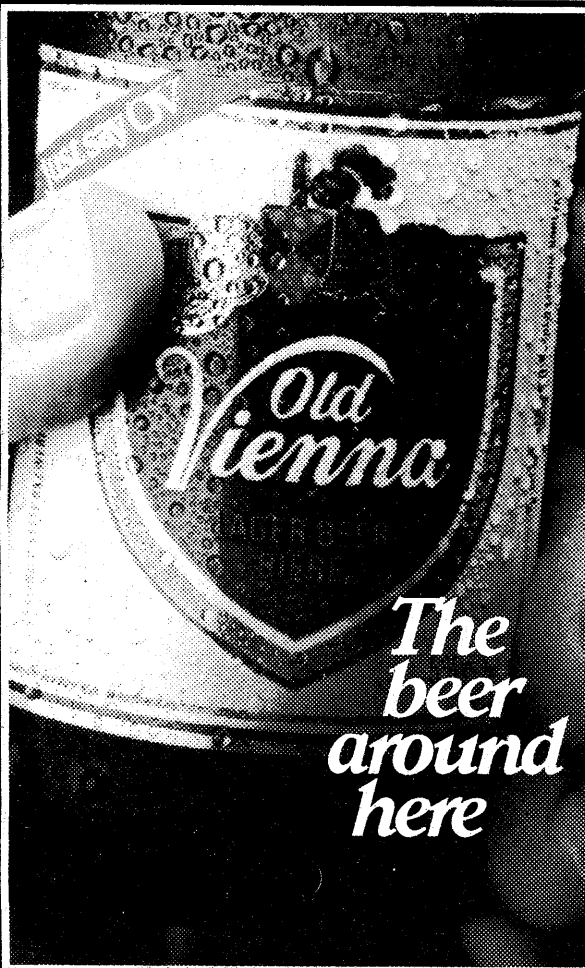
Women's Volleyball

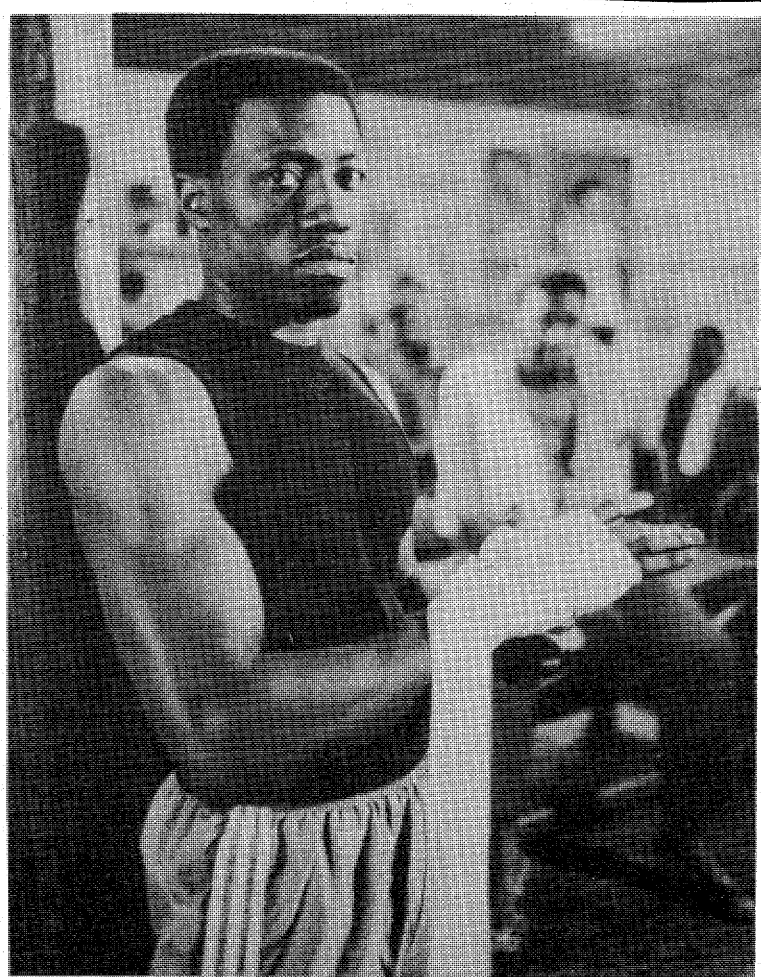


Power: "Cannon"

STREETS OF GOLD

America, it seems, has little to offer Alek Neuman, a Russian Jew and former Soviet boxing champion who left the Soviet Union after being denied the right to fight the Olympics because of his religion. Reduced to living in a run-down boardinghouse in Brighton Beach, Brooklyn, and working in the kitchen of a local Russian restaurant, the once-famed fighter has become a bitter, disillusioned man.

"Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in Heaven."

I am moved by this Bible verse to bear testimony of our brother, John Mason, who has lived among us in Ghana.

It was early last year when John decided to spend time in Ghana with his parents, to see how the Lord was using them and to find out what SIM was doing in Ghana. He descended upon Ghana by land through the vast expanse of an inhospitable desert and a land of unpredictable hazards. The account of his journey impressed Ghanaian Christians who are close to the SIM and the Challenge Enterprises with his courage and his daring faith.

His motor bike was involved in an accident, and he was robbed of his travelling papers and money but by His grace he managed to get through to Ghana into the waiting arms of his parents and friends.

Upon his arrival, he was placed in charge of the relief work, receiving and distributing food, drugs, blankets and other items to hospitals, schools and other institutions. He also helped in the renovations of the Osu Children's Home and at the opening ceremony the authorities of the Home commended him for his dedicated service. He also built four malnutrition wings to the Polyclinics at Kaneshie, Dansoman, Maamobi and to the Princess Marie Louise Hospital. In all these works he maintained an excellent and commendable standard,

His full genius was displayed when he was given, and accepted, responsibility for preparing the Maranatha Campus, recently acquired, for occupation. We here in Ghana love John Mason and want thank all of you who are supporting him during his time in Ghana.

May our Lord reward you richly and bless you in all your enterprise.

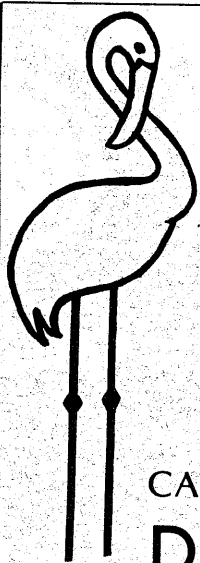

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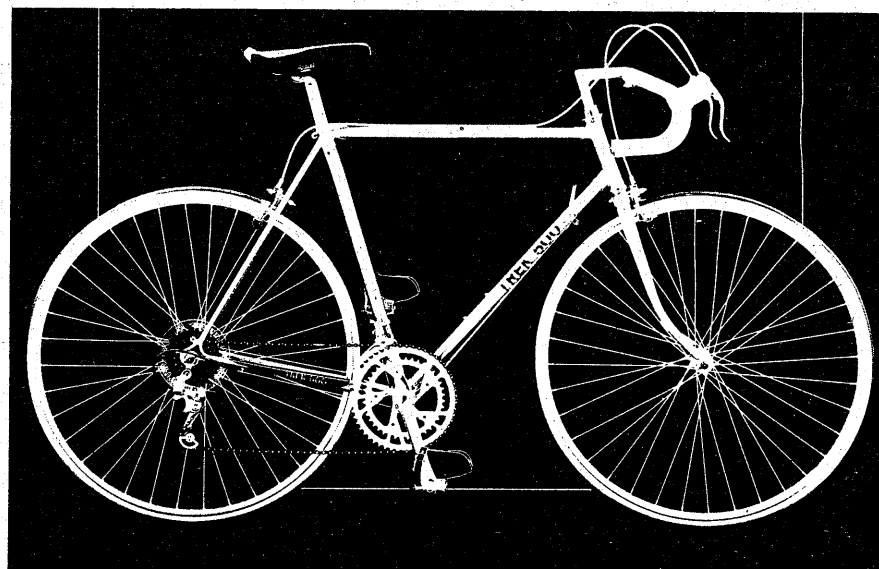
