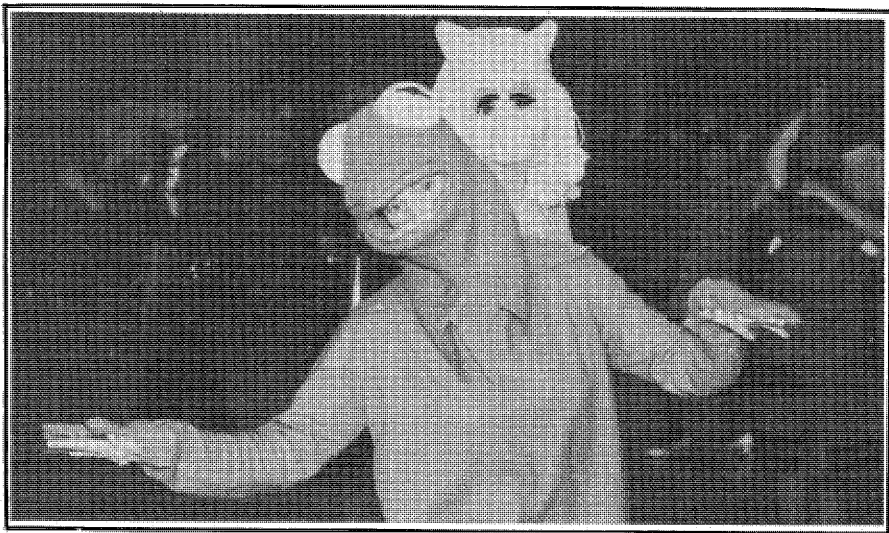

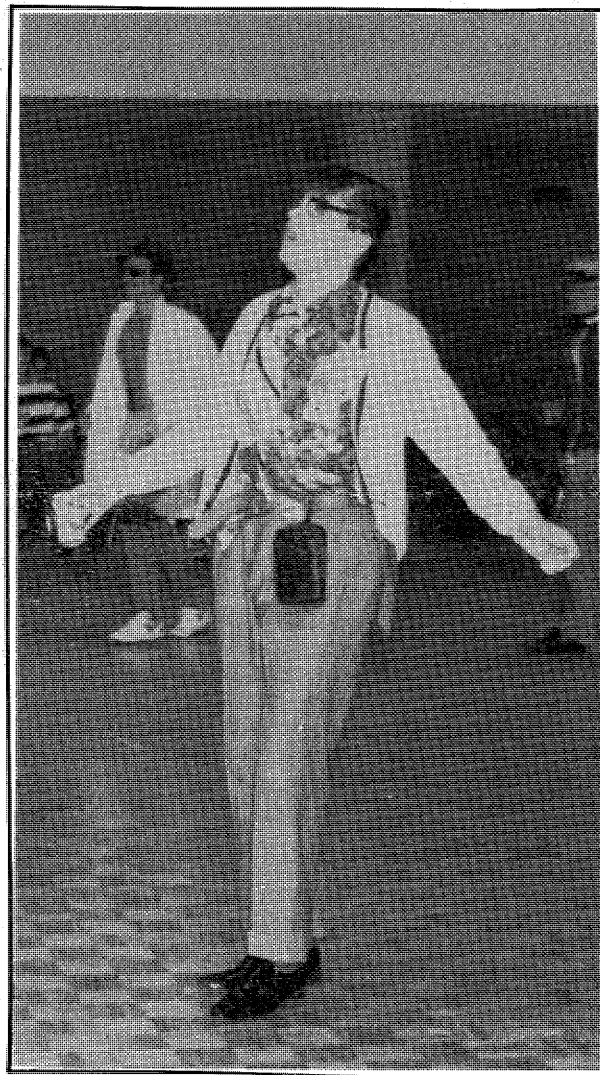

## SAVE YOUR SYMPATHY

## Dear Fellow Graduates of BAS

Have you heard that our Grad is being planned for Thursday night April 30, 1987. Who has ever celebrated their Grad on a weeknight such as Thursday? Perhaps this is the reason our BAS Committee has received such a good deal. What is wrong with Saturday, May 2 after the NAITSA ceremony which is held in the afternoon? Why not go directly to the supper and dance after the ceremony?

Has BAS really considered all the parties involved in this decision? Does BAS care that some of the grads guests have to work Friday, May 1? Will any parents or guests from outside Edmonton be willing to take off 2 days just to attend the graduation? Is BAS going to reimburse our parents and guests for lost wages on Friday? Or perhaps the BAS Committee thinks all of us should leave by 11:00 pm if our date has to work the next day.

Does BAS care that many of the mature students have children who cannot be looked after till late hours on weeknights because babysitters go to school on Friday or because most adults work the following day? Is BAS going to offer a babysitting service for those parents who wish to attend their own graduation and cannot arrange for anyone to stay with their children after 11:00pm on a weeknight?

The BAS Committee has booked the Westin Hotel for our Grad this year. Has BAS considered the price of a ticket and alcohol at such an expensive Hotel? Will there even be enough tickets for all of us to bring our parents, grandparents or whoever is special to us to our own graduation? Does BAS Committee honestly believe that \$71 for a hotel room at the Westin Hotel is a rate that most students can

afford? Especially after paying for clothing to wear, tickets for the meal and drinks.

Do you not feel that this is yet the most unthought event our BAS Committee has planned? After all, they were elected to represent us! Don't we all have a right to have a say in our own Grad? Does the BAS Committee really believe that surveying 70 of 450 students is the majority? How can 5 people honestly believe that they know what is best for us? How can BAS justify grad on Thursday night when over 50 names opposing Thursday were collected by concerned students in one day alone? The BAS Committee has refused to take a vote from ALL BAS students to consider what ALL grads want. We are more than willing to go along with the wants of the majority, but a majority should be more than 15%. Don't we deserve the chance for all of us to decide the date and place for our own grad? Maybe BAS is scared to let us decide on our own (we may agree with them).

In any event, the BAS Committee has made it very clear that they believe they have made the right decision so it is up to us as grads to make them see that their decision may not be in the best interest of the majority. The saddest thing about this situation is that the only people hurt by not going to the grad is ourselves.

So if you care about your grad let your BAS Committee know by asking for a vote; a chance to choose and don't let them tell you it's too late. It's never too late for something as important as your own grad - YOU'VE EARNED IT - YOU'VE PAID FOR IT - AND YOU SHOULD HAVE A SAY IN IT. Let BAS know how you REALLY FEEL.

## GET THE FACTS STRAIGHT

In response to last weeks article "Flirting with Disaster" by Tony Rivard, I would like to make a statement concerning the actual facts of owning a handgun. One of the many facts that were stated wrong is that if you do not have an F.A.C. (Firearms Acquisition Certificate) you have to go to the Police Headquarters downtown and fill out a form. After the form has been filled out, a complete report and background evaluation is done on the person. One to two weeks later you might receive an F.A.C. or not depending on the report. Then you may wish to buy a handgun. You must then have to pass a proficiency course to even apply for a permit to convey. This permit allows a person to take the pistol to the range then back home again once done. This

permit takes between two-three weeks to get from the R.C.M.P. As last weeks article says "they can decide to buy in the morning and have a handgun by the afternoon of the same day", obviously this is impossible unless of course you know the Chief of Police in Edmonton

and the Chief of the R.C.M.P. in Ottawa and they both owe you something. Another misquoted fact is that there has never been mail order handgun shopping in Canada, well not since at least 1946. The only way to get a Handgun through the mail is if you

have a licence to buy and sell handguns, and that's a whole different ball of wax. In the last 5 years there has not been 1 murder, bank robbery, break and enter or any other criminal offence committed with a registered handgun. Of all the Handgun related crimes only a little over 14 percent were committed. Sounds like a real serious problem to me. In the U.S.A. about 5 times (136,000) the amount of people die each year from Drunk Drivers. If anything alcohol should be outlawed and I know how well that would go over. When the Government outlaws guns, only outlaws will have them. I would rather be a free man and own a pistol, than a Communist slave and own none.

## An Open Letter to 2nd Year Business Students:

BAS is pleased to announce the confirmation of BAS Grad. '87!

Business students can look forward to an extra special evening at the Westin Hotel on Thurs. April 30, 1987.

This date was chosen after two months of extensive inquiries and careful analysis of all the possibilities available. Basically, our decision for this time and place was a result of the following pertinent points.

i) Students who are renting accommodations should be better able to plan for graduation since it will be at the end of the month rather than at the beginning of a new month.

ii) Approximately 90% of 2nd year students in the tower building will be finished final exams by Wed. April 29. The 10% who will be writing exams on Thurs. includes Computer systems students. This 10% would have exams in the morning only. No exams on Fri. May 1st.

iii) Due to the change to the semester system (making it unable for us to book an exact date in May of last year) and due to the size of the graduation, we were limited to 3 main choices - the Terrace Inn, the C.I. South, and the Westin. After investigating and comparing each possibility; in terms of prices, food and service quality, availability, space requirements, atmosphere and overall package offered; we then proposed these situations to various Business

students. The majority of students preferred the Westin.

iv) Students and their guests will be able to stay at the Westin, in a reserved section of the Hotel, for a discounted rate on graduation night (last year's graduates were not able to book any rooms at the Terrace Inn for Grad. Night).

v) By announcing this date six months prior to the event we feel we are providing ample opportunity for those wishing to participate to plan ahead. This will be giving those who have children and/or jobs time to schedule accordingly for the night.

vi) With BAS's main concern being fund raising for graduation, we will be providing a substantial portion of funds needed for Grad. '87. Therefore, the ticket price will be within a student's budget regardless of where our graduation is held. So why not go with "The Best" By April I think we'll deserve it!

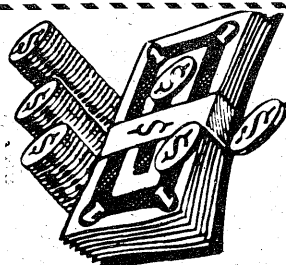

## RECRUITMENT BEGINS NOW FOR THE HIRE A STUDENT PROGRAM

Hire a Student is now recruiting creative and enthusiastic post-secondary students and recent grads for various positions in the Alberta Hire a Student program. Last year Hire a Student employed over 200 students throughout the province. As many are expected to be hired for next summer's program.

Positions with Hire a Student encompass a wide range of duties and responsibilities and provide students with the opportunity to develop a wide variety of skills and gain valuable work experience. In any one of the positions students could find themselves acting as a public relations advisor, community development worker, financial recorder, group supervisor, employment advisor, secretary, statistician, administrator, teacher, or all of these at the same time.

Extensive training is provided for each of the positions and a resource staff and committee are available for support and advise.

Operations Coordinator positions are available in Edmonton and Calgary. Program Administrator positions are available in Medicine Hat, Red Deer, Lethbridge, and Grande Prairie. They provide support services in the recruitment, hiring, training and supervision of Hire a Student staff and are responsible for reports and statistical information. Program Administrator positions are full-time term positions, open to recent post-secondary graduates.

Job Search Information Teams will be employed in seven Alberta regions, beginning in January to give presentations to high school students on effective methods of job search. Job Search Information presenters work part-time until the end of classes, and full-time to the end of June. Team Leaders work full-time from January through June - perfect timing for December graduates.

Student Placement Officers and Centre Managers will be employed throughout the province during the summer months. They work on a one-to-one basis with students to assist them in their job seeking and refer qualified students to appropriate employers.

## EPILEPSY

The staff of Health Services would like to give you some information on Epilepsy.

If you have Epilepsy or suffer from seizures please make sure your instructors and some of your classmates are aware of this. Tell them how it affects you and how often you have seizures. Should you then have a seizure in class they won't panic and think you have a sudden serious condition. If someone has a seizure call the nurse (Main Campus 2400, Plaza II 2400, Patricia Campus 451-6790)

### What is Epilepsy

Epilepsy is a condition in which the brain function is briefly disturbed. It is accompanied by electrical disturbances which can be measured. The condition is usually associated with loss of consciousness, convulsions, and occasionally brief periods of unusual behavior.

### Causes of Epilepsy

The cause of epilepsy is not known in over 50 percent of patients. It can however, be caused by brain injuries, very often birth injuries and imbalance of body chemistry.

### First Aid for Epileptic Seizures

Keep calm. You cannot stop a seizure once it has started. Do not try to revive the patient. Let the seizure run its course.

Try to prevent the patient from striking his head or body against any hard, sharp or hot objects but do not interfere with his movement. Protect the patient from serious injury but do not restrain him otherwise.

**Do Not Force Anything Between The Patients Teeth**  
Loosen tight clothing.

Turn the patient to the side and make sure his breathing is not obstructed.

Place something soft, such as a rolled-up coat, beneath the person's head.

When a patient regains consciousness let him rest, if he wishes to.

If a seizure lasts beyond 5 or 10 minutes, or if seizures occur repeatedly, medical aid is urgently required.

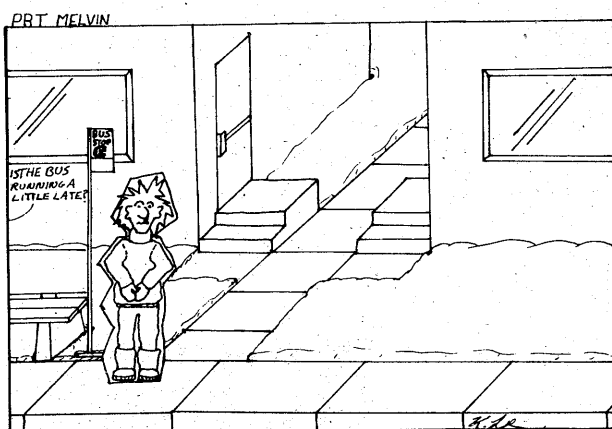
## ROCK & TALK IN REVIEW

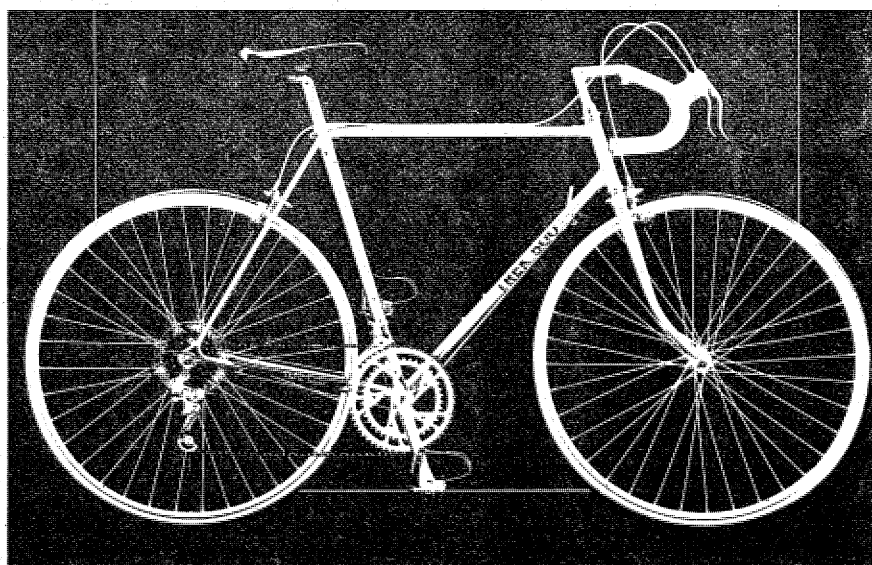

## CHICKS CONSOLATION CHAMPS at ACAC Pre Season Tourney

In weekend action the Women's Basketball squad took part in the annual Pre Season Tournament hosted at GMCC. The eight team affair included all squads from the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference save Mount Royal College. The Chicks got off to a poor start but finished very strong to emerge as Consolation Champions.

NAIT 36 SAIT 64

Mid-term exams prevented the Chicks from fielding a full squad but there were few other excuses available as SAIT stormed out of the starting gates and outscored NAIT 18-2 in the first seven minutes enroute to a 38-14 lead at the half. With Sait substituting liberally in the second half, the Chicks held their own, being outscored 26-22 over the final 20 min. The game was decided under the boards where SAIT totally dominated the game limiting NAIT to a mere seven defensive rebounds. SAIT was led by fourth year veteran Eve Pollet (13 pts) and 6 foot 2 rookie, Cindy Coulter (12 pts); Kathy Prochnau had 16 pts in a losing cause.

NAIT 60 MHC 57

This game featured two evenly matched teams who played wide open basketball, a style which suits the Chicks' guards but is some problem for our forwards who have a tendency to get in foul trouble. NAIT sent the Lady Rattlers to the foul line 29 times overall and should have lost the game with this statistic alone. After leading 27-26 at the half the Chicks committed many unforced turnovers and were behind 57-48 with four minutes left in the game. Some tough defence down the stretch and some clutch shooting by the Chicks resulted in ten straight points highlighted by a clutch shot by Kathy Prochnau who hit a 15 foot shot while being fouled to push the NAIT ladies ahead to stay. Kathy led NAIT with 27 points while Sherry Lee hit for another 15 points.

The Consolation Championship game featured the Chicks against the Vikettes from Camrose; a team that NAIT had narrowly defeated last Monday 59-57 after squandering a fair lead. 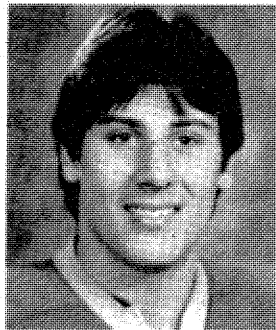

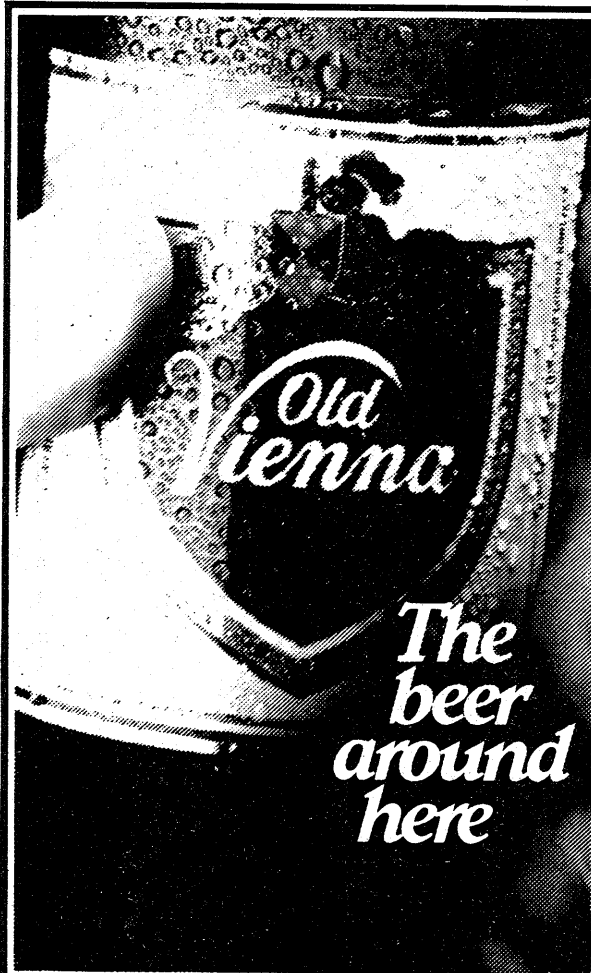
Murray had an outstanding opening weekend to the acac season. He chipped in the winning goal in a 6-2 Friday night triumph over Camrose while adding an assist as well.
