It appears that at least one person did not fully understand my purpose or proposal brought forth in the article “Unfair, Unjust, and Just Not Fair” printed in issue 4, of the Nugget or else, of course, this person simply disagrees with me.

If, Mr. Tymchuk, you missed my point, as others may have, I would like to take some time to clarify the issues I presented. On the other hand if you disagree with me that is your opinion and it is your right to place your opinion in print. However, good sir, I believe that you do bear injustice against me and the libel is yours. Your article, “Where Did You Come From?” was sure based on emotional outburst for it contained little fact. You did however present an issue worth mentioning in a more positive fashion.

The NAIT grievance system, as Mr. Tymchuk inferred is a good one and I encourage all students who are having problems with their instructors to speak to them first and if the problem is not rectified there then go to the program head. They seem very eager to help. The grievance system is the only way I know for a group of students to influence instruction methods while they are still attending the offending class. This is a short run solution requiring a number of persons to actually take the initiative to personally speak out (which for a very large number of people, may be difficult to do at times) and may end up having to be

repeated in the absence of proper controls and feedback.

The solution I proposed (mandatory evaluation forms) would be long run. It could be placed into effect almost immediately and would serve both staff and students for many years to come. Its purpose would be to see that feedback (here's the key: positive and negative, constructive feedback) related to instruction methods would be directed from the students to both the instructors and their supervisors so that the good may get better and the poor improve (or be replaced if improvement is impossible).

I am happy to end this article on a positive note. Since the publication of “Unfair, ...Just not Fair” I have met with both Harold Daum (Program Head) and J.R. Ramer (Chairman of the Business Administration Department) and they have assured me that the subject of day-time instructor evaluation is an issue currently under debate. Now is your chance. If you want the opportunity to commend instructors and/or suggest ways of improvement for the others then do something about it. Let your instructors know. Let your first year co-ordinators know. Speak out! Now is the time. And remember, this is not limited to Business alone. Let's hear from the other people here at NAIT they are your instructors and opinions to.


I am very proud to announce that we have raised over \$20 000 in this years campaign. We set our goal at 20 000 and we can be very proud that we reached it.

Thanks to NAITSA for doing so much to encourage participation, and thanks to the students for actually coming out to help. Let's keep the dream alive.





floating around Saturday night to fill a fair sized swimming pool.






BOWLING TEAM

WEIGHT ROOM WORKOUT



The NAIT Men's team brought back the gold in 1985-86 ACAC competition. The NAIT Women placed third and the mixed team fifth.

Trials will take the form of a mini-league held at the NAIT lanes after school in the second half of the first semester.

Looking for alternatives to Aerobics, Swimming, or Jogging? If these Cardio-Respiratory (Heart, Lungs, Circulation) fitness activities do not interest you take a look at what's happening in the Weight Room at NAIT. Every day during the week at different times you will see NAIT staff and students happily sweating their way through a program called "WEIGHT ROOM WORKOUT".

This dual purpose program is designed to improve Cardio-Respiratory fitness while muscular strength and endurance is also being enhanced. The workout class works this way.

There are 15 different exercises laid out in a circuit fashion around the Weight Room. The Exercises utilize principally Hydra-Gym equipment and some Free Weights in activities which cover the entire body. Each exercise is timed as is the rest period between each exercise station.

The timed intervals are geared to music (example 25 seconds of music followed by 25 seconds of silence). When the music stops, participants change exercise stations moving to the next one in the circuit. Most participants find the use of music motivational, it keeps them working hard. After a number of weeks on the "WEIGHT ROOM WORKOUT" program participants will have worked up to completing three sets of 15 exercises for a total workout time of 45 minutes. A stretch warm up and cool down is included in each class.

Participants will find "WEIGHT ROOM WORKOUT" a safe, interesting and fun alternate to other forms of exercises.


