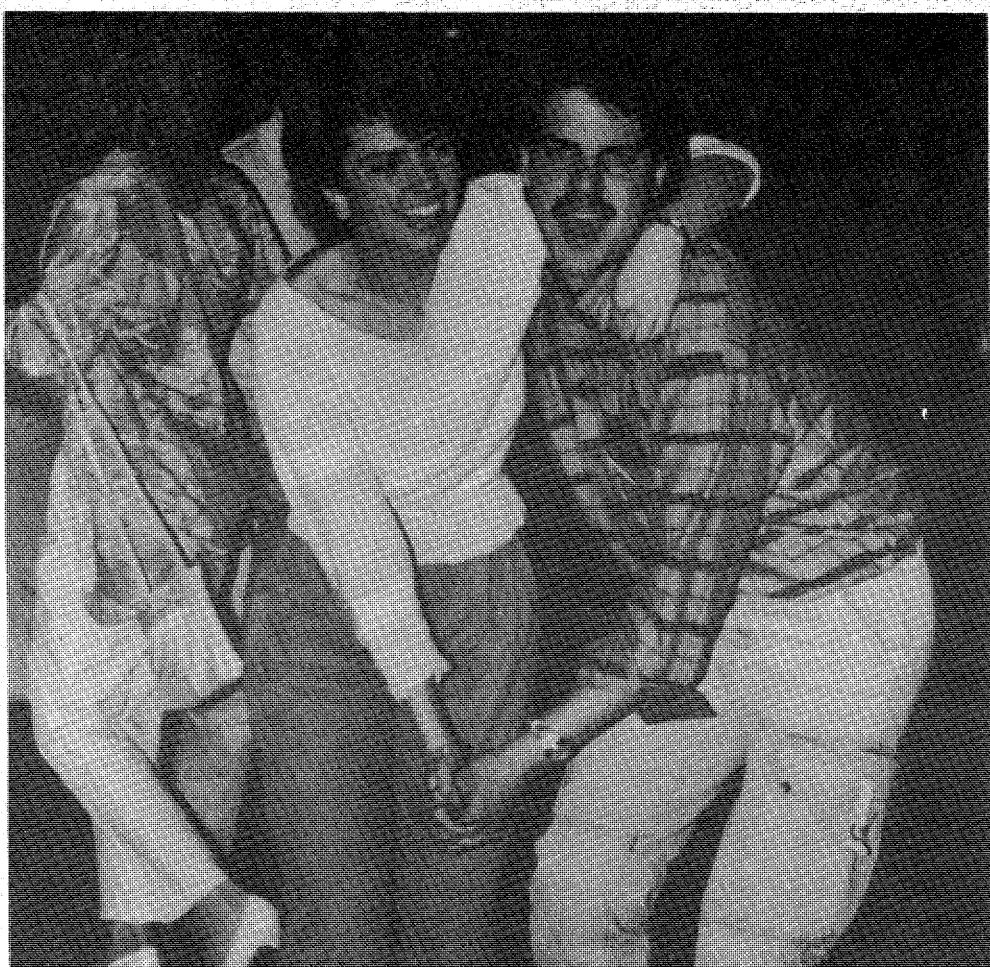

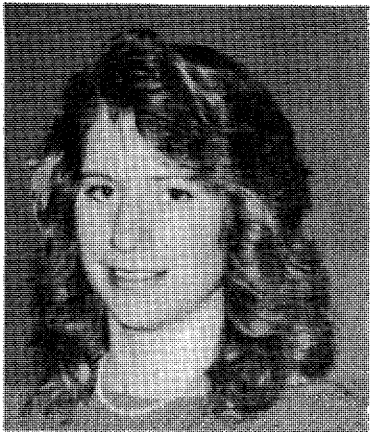

We hope you enjoy the FUGGIT as much as we have.

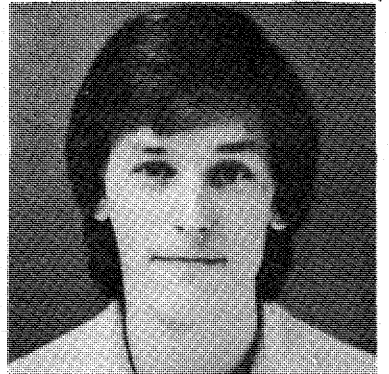

With the cuts coming in student finances; hopefully, extra care will be taken when formulating the list. The thought of spending money on supplies does not bother me in the least. That is, as



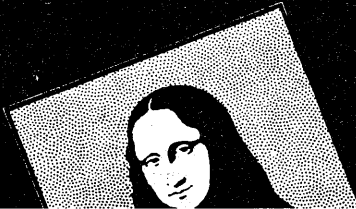

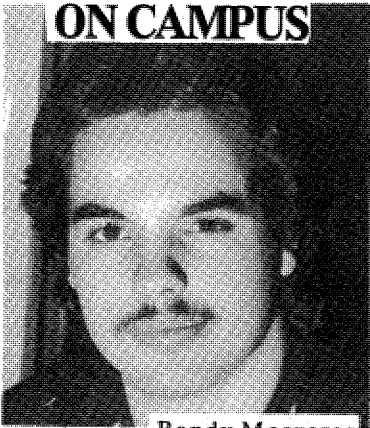

The Business Administration Grad Committee is putting together a fantastic Grad banquet and dance for Saturday, May 2nd. Purchase your tickets in the tower lounge from 11-12 Monday to Friday.

B.A.S. would like to clear up a concern about B.A.S. members not getting a discount on Grad tickets. B.A.S. is already subsidizing the Grad ticket price by \$7 per ticket! B.A.S. members have received discounts all year and were unhappy that this misconception arose. At the start of the year when we offered B.A.S. memberships, we told everyone that the ultimate purpose of B.A.S. is to subsidize Grad ticket prices. We have done that. So look at it this way; for your \$10 membership, if you only are attending Grad and have not attended any of our 7 cabarets (\$2 discount) or the ski trip (\$10 discount), you are at least getting a \$7 discount off your \$27 ticket. Thank you for purchasing a membership, members, as you've helped all business students to a \$20 ticket price.

Business students and B.A.S. owe a thanks to the Grad Committee for their work so far on Grad.

A message to first year business students, we will be coming around to classes today (Thursday) so you can vote to accept or reject the proposed B.A.S. constitution. Congrats to Jay McMartin, who is B.A.S. activities director for 87-88. Jay joins the rest of the new B.A.S. executive, all of whom are in by acclamation.

### GOOD DEAL - RUSSELL

Students of Alberta who are protesting the Provincial Governments 3 percent cuts in funding, and 9.5 percent cuts in the Student Finance Board are still getting a good deal from the Government.

Russell has been quoted as saying, "I never had it as good as the students attending universities and colleges of Alberta do today."

Russell has also stated that, by any measure, "Alberta gives the highest level of support" to the educational facilities throughout the province. "Frankly, I think students are getting a pretty good deal in Alberta as compared to the other Provinces in Canada."

Before students go out and protest, Russell asks that they first wait and see what the Board of Governors at NAIT do with the 3 percent cut in funding.

-At NAIT, the 3 percent cut means \$2 million will be slashed from the \$77 million operating budget.

As to the 9.5 percent cut to the Finance Board, it was the area with the least cuts in Education. Students now have to do a lot more financial planning before attending the colleges and universities of Alberta.

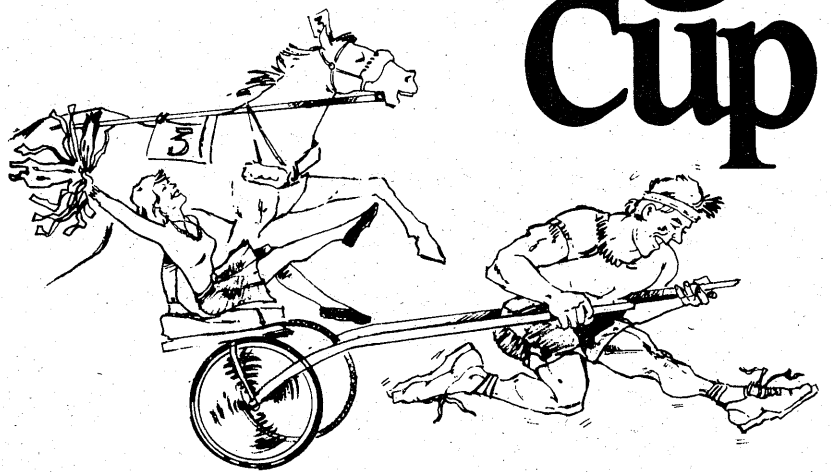

## DILLY DALI

I recently (Thursday, April 2) went to see a lecture, 1 of a 5 part series on Surrealistic Art, on Salvador Dali at the Edmonton Art Gallery. The cost was \$8, but the experience was worth every penny.

Salvador Dali was born in 1904 in Spain and was into his art by age 14. When he was 19, I believe, he went off to his very first art school. At this school in Spain he painted very realistic pictures and displayed a definite talent for his age. Now Savador Dali is known for his eccentricities and at the ripe age of 19 started to exhibit them. At the end of his first year of his schooling he, like all the other students, was



supposed to hand in his paintings for a grade. At this point Salvador wrote a letter to the head of the school and expressed his feelings that the instructors were not competent enough to grade his paintings fairly. With this he dropped out of school

and went on his own.

Continuing in his endeavors he had his first full blown art show and sale in Paris. The year was 1929, Salvador Dali was 25. During the past 5 years he had been having an affair with a woman named Gala and at the time of the display was out with her. When he did finally show up at the gallery everything had been sold. Salvador Dali, now aged 83, has continued selling paintings at this rate. Although he doesn't produce very much any more.

The type of art Salvador Dali produced was that of the surrealistic nature. The dictionary definition of surrealism is that which is "an attempt to portray or interpret the workings of the unconscious mind as manifested in dreams". The Surrealistic Art Movement was first initiated in the early 20's by a poet named Andre Breton. Apparently he wrote an avante garde manifest outlining the basis of sur-

realism. Through this and a very conscious study of Sigmund Freud's subconscious studies of the same period the surrealistic movement began.

Essentially there are 5 very prominent artists who either dabbled or submerged themselves in surrealistic endeavors. These, in chronological order of birth, are Marc Chagall (1887-1985), Giorgio de Chirico (1888-1978), and Salvador Dali (1904-). These 5 people helped change the face of the art world and Salvador Dali is still in there providing his worth. To possibly help you understand what a surrealistic picture may look like try to remember MAD Magazine and their weird bi-folds that took a realistic portrait and, once folded, they distorted the original to produce a second image. That's not how they painted but the product was a masterful distortion of reality or, better yet, a masterful rendering of our subconscious.

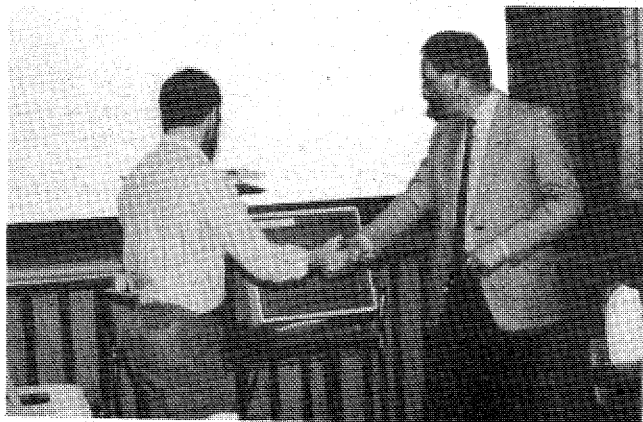

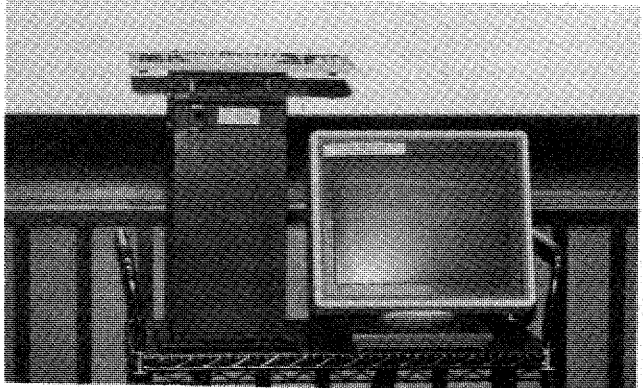
## NEW TYPESETTER

At the General Council meeting on Tuesday, the NAIT Foundation presented to NAITSA and the NUGGET newspaper, a new typesetting machine.

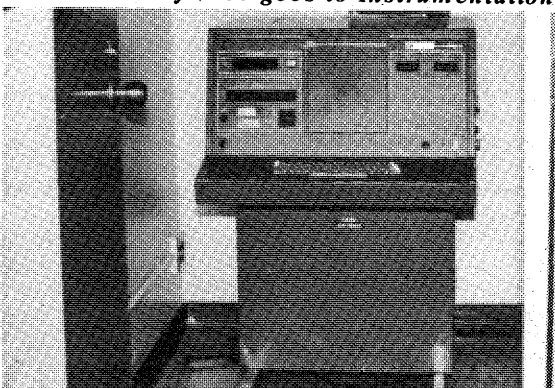

4th Place	Telecom

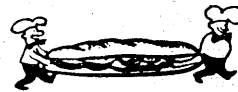
Through their efforts, along with all other students who sold tickets, \$15,000 was raised towards the pur-
