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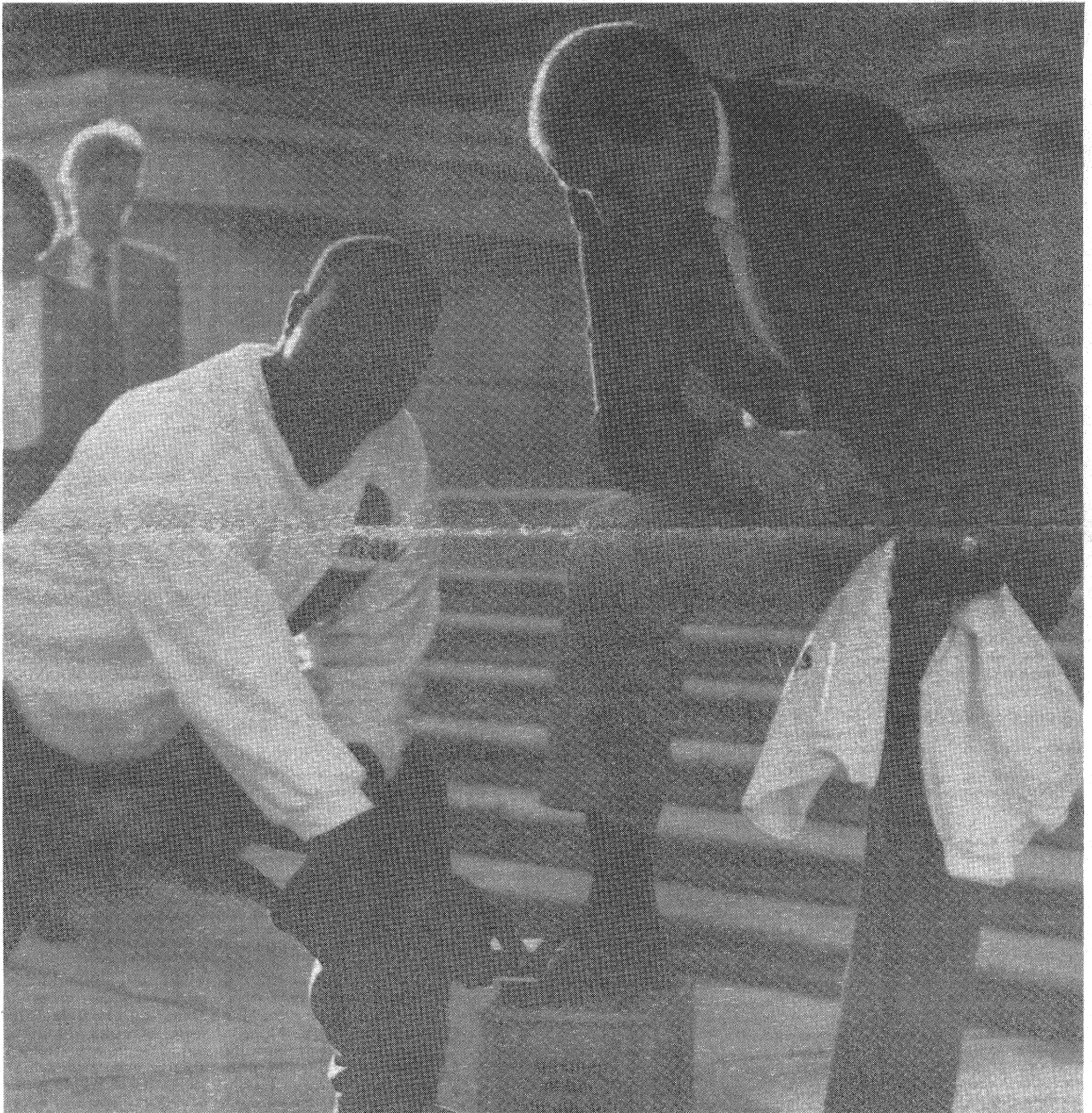

## More on Literacy

are quite consistent throughout. The beauty of this is that once these basic rules of pronunciation are learned one can sound out new words and teach himself to read. One has in effect broken the code of the alphabet.

This may sound very simple and, basically, it is. Phonics was the method used to teach reading in public schools for generations.

If you can remember being taught with the 'Dick and Jane' series in grade one, however, chances are you were never taught phonics. Phonics was phased out of the curriculum several decades ago and 'Dick and Jane' styles of textbooks were introduced.

An elementary school teacher I knew lamented this change in teaching methods and predicted a major problem

with illiteracy in future school generations. She continued to teach phonics quietly, on her own, and regularly had grade one students reading over one hundred books a year. And they loved to read. In a school with large remedial reading classes she had the distinction of being the only teacher without students in need of this help.

The fact that this woman was my mother may have had something to do with my bias on the subject but I like to think that seeing the results of her efforts was a deciding factor as well.

Factually, we are faced with a problem of wide-spread illiteracy and I believe that the source of this problem lies in the failure to provide instruction on a fundamental basis in the art of reading.

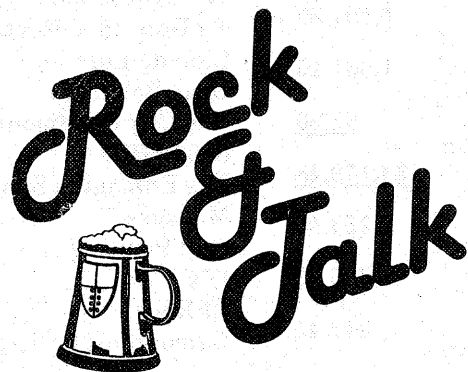
## What's a Card Party?
