NAIT offers its staff and students some unsung specials to stretch that dollar.

Automotive and autobody service and repair, and animal clinics are available by appointment and limited as required for student training. They're a good deal (no labour costs) and go quickly, so ask early.

Hairstyling and materials testing are also available by appointment.

Denture work also becomes available at certain times of the year.

The savings are consi-

derable on many products and services when there are no labour costs. So "shop" NAIT if you can.

Health Services are available on the Main, Patricia and Plaza II Campuses. The nurses provide assessment and care for both illness and injury as well as immunization, vision, color vision and hearing tests. Again no charge.

A Valu-Card, available at the LRC (Learning Resources Centre), reduces photocopy charges from 15¢ to 10¢ per copy.

PARKING (after 5:30 pm)

Parking is available at a rate of \$1.00 per entry or \$7.50 per month in all lots on the Main Campus. In some lots one will pay the attendant while in others one must obtain a ticket from the ticket dispenser.

Listed below are the parking lots, their locations and also an indication whether the lot has a ticket dispenser or an attendant.

- Lot A/B - The Parkade on 118 Avenue (Attendant operated)
- Lot C - East of Parkade on 118 Avenue (Attendant operated)
- Lot D - West of Main Campus opposite Parkade (Attendant operated)
- Lot K - Opposite Automotives between 105 Street and 103 Street (Attendant operated)
- Lot K - Bound by 118 Avenue and Princess Elizabeth Avenue and 103 Street and 101 Street (Ticket dispenser)
- Lot H - Directly in front of Automotives (Ticket dispenser)
- Lot J - In front of Central Services Building (Ticket dispenser)
- Lot E - South of Gym (Ticket dispenser)
- Lot F - South of Activities Centre (Ticket dispenser)

Monthly parking permits can be purchased at the Cashier's Office (opposite the Registrar's Office) during office hours and at the attendant's booth of A, B, C, D and K lots during evening hours. Parking permits are valid in lot operated by an attendant and also lots with ticket dispensers.

NOTE: It is advisable to purchase monthly permits prior to your first class and thereby avoid lengthy line-ups.

In addition to the above pay lots, meter parking is available in numerous locations and is enforced until 10:00 pm.

Cars left in any 24-hour reserved or restricted locations will be given a \$35.00 ticket and/or towed away at the owner's expense.
