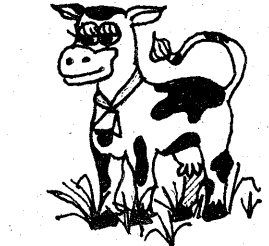

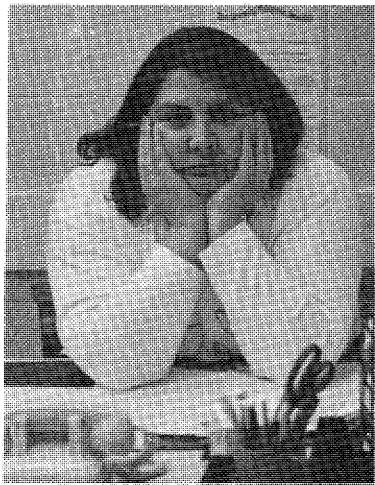


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Editorial

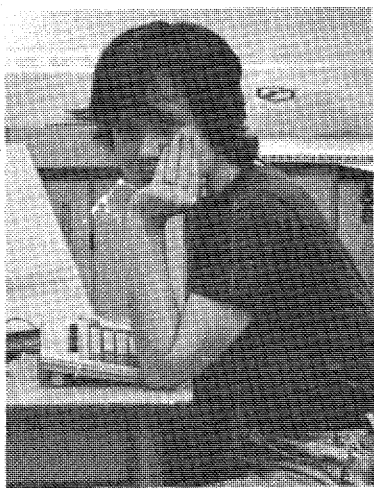
The thing to remember is that it is the *END* of the semester that we're tasting. Weigh it out. We're very nearly one semester closer to the target we have chosen for our futures.

You've come a long way, baby. Or have you?



To those of you who are about to graduate, congratulations. All of your hard work and your ambition to improve yourself through education deserves respect and a chance to prove yourself. Out there in the hard cold world, though, that might not be what it gets.

North American society encourages us to believe that cream rises to the top, regardless of circumstances, and that hard work always

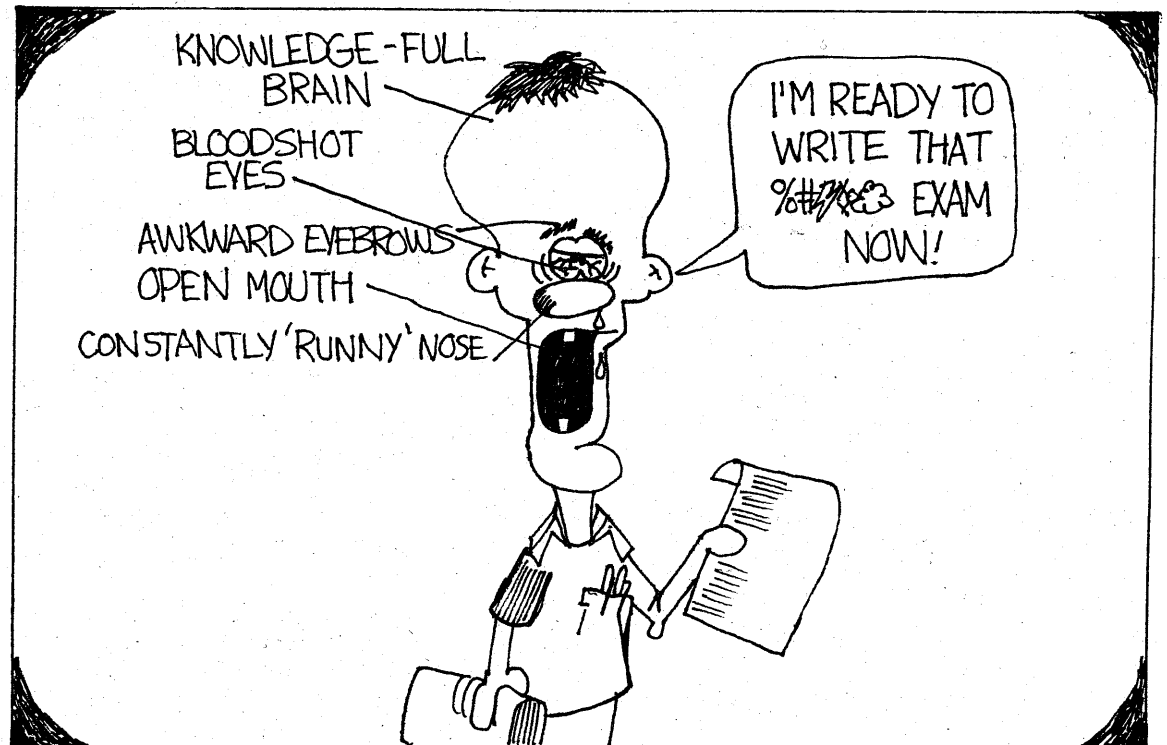
pays off. The reality is different. The reality is that, on average, women earn less money than men. The figures I looked at showed that women earn approximately \$10,000 less per year than men with the same level of education. They also showed that women with a post-secondary diploma earn *less* than men with a *Grade 8* education. What a lack of progress!

Contrasting comments two of my instructors made on this subject last year interested me. One instructor felt that social programs which promote hiring a greater proportion of women managers cost money. (It occurred to me that what he really thought was that they *wasted* money.) Another instructor said that these programs actually *save* money. His view was that people are valuable resources. Ability is rare. When a talented person is denied the opportunity to do a job because of racism or sexism, money is wasted because resources are not put to their most efficient use.

If you think that Canada in 1988 is a "liberated" society, please consider these statistics and think again. The problem will continue to exist unless we do something about it.

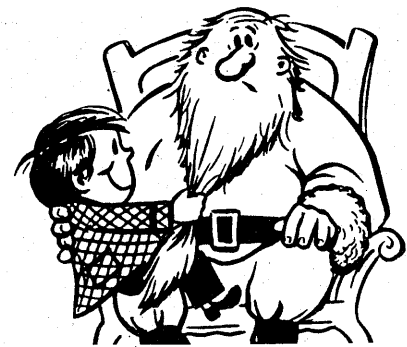

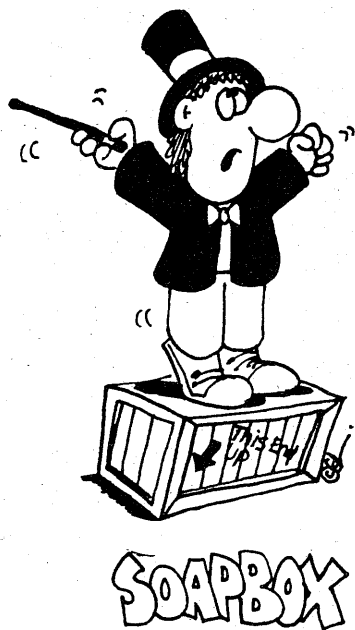

Elaine Rud thought she was doing a good deed for some little girl in Vancouver.

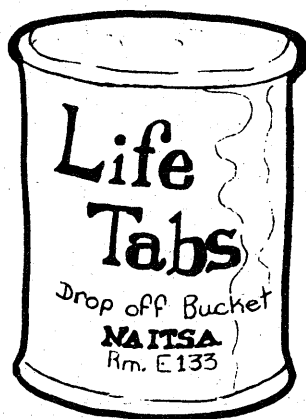
All she had to do was to collect tabs from beer, pop, or juice cans, package them in groups of twenty, and send them through the mail to a family in Vancouver. The family would then submit these tabs to the local hospital which, in turn, would use them for the recycling value to pay for the use of a kidney dialysis machine. It worked out that 3,000 tabs would cover one session's use of the machine. The little girl needed dialysis three times a week.

Elaine Rud, and the many students she got to help her, THE NEST staff and NAISTSA amassed over 7,000 or 8,000 tabs a week.

A great deed and accomplishment had it been true, but it was "all a hoax" claimed a depressed and shocked Elaine, who found further discussion on the subject difficult.

Judy Blair, the executive director for the Kidney Foundation in the northern Alberta chapter, when contacted said that "the many well intentioned Albertans who are collecting pop can pull tabs can stop now. It is all a hoax. The sad truth is

that these pull tabs are worthless to the Kidney Foundation. For one thing dialysis is free in Canada as part of the medi-care program."

NO LIFE IN

"LIFE TABS"

A greedy soulless, heartless, and calous person has suckered in a few caring people with a charity hoax.

Every time I think about a dirty deal or something scandalous, I get upset. Big time examples like Jim Baker, Jimmy Swaggart, Gary Hart, Donna Rice, or Richard Nixon and Watergate everybody is familiar with. Small time cretins you'll never hear about, probably because the media never makes great attempts to expose them, but they are there and they are doing their cretin-like, low-life activities.

Classic Example

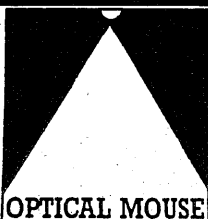

The Phillip Walker Blues Band

"...A tasty, deeply satisfying performance. He sings with a deep, throaty quality - reminding one occasionally of the young Ray Charles - that gives his performances great conviction. His guitar work is strong, inventive and fluent."

BORN IN LOUISIANA in 1937, this "contemporary master of modern electric blues" was a professional blues guitarist by the age of 15. Inspired by blues artists such as Guitar Junior, Lonesome Sundown, Long John Hunter, and others in both Louisiana and Texas, where he moved in 1954, Phillip Walker has been playing the blues for over 30 years.

Walker has performed with a long list of prominent artists like Etta James, Jimmy Reed, Lowell Fulson, Bobby Bland, Junior Parker, Little Richard, Fats Domino, and others. In the mid 1950's he performed with Clifton Chenier for about 5 years.

In 1958, Walker moved to Los Angeles where he formed the Phillip Walker Blues

Band. The Band has toured Europe, Australia, Japan, and North America. Walker's debut album, *Bottom of the Top*, was released in 1973. Since then he has recorded *Someday You'll Have These Blues* (1977), and *From L.A. to L.A.*, with his old friend Lonesome Sundown (1983). Both albums were well reviewed, but it was his fifth album, *Tough As I Want To Be*, released in 1984, that gave Walker the wider recognition he needed. The album was #1 Blues Album in North America for more than four weeks.

Walker's style has been described as "Gulf Coast rawness mixed with an urban urgency", and "effortless guitar". He has been compared to both Ray Charles and B.B. King, but his style is all his own. "His playing evidences a loose, relaxed, rolling style with the notes from his guitar literally tumbling off his fingers in beautifully conceived and executed runs." (Music World Magazine)

Walker's performance November 30 - December 3 at the Yardbird is one not to be missed.

First known as "Chad Allen and the Expressions" this band was formed in 1964 shortly before landing their first recording contract. The first album was titled "Hey, Ho (What You Do For Me)" and released in early 1965. Later they released a single entitled "Shaking All Over". Shortly after, lead vocalist Chad Allen left the band and guitar player Randy Bachman brought in a new member to try out as lead singer and keyboard player; his name was Burton Cummings. In late 1968 they released their second album entitled "Wheatfield Soul" and included the smash hit singles "These Eyes" and "Laughing". In early 1969 another album called "Super Golden Goodies" was released and yet another one late that year called "Canned Wheat" which found its way to the charts with the number one song "No Time". The "American Woman" album was next to be released (February 1970) and contained the hit classics "American Woman", "No Sugar Tonight", and "Hand Me Down World". In 1971 they released yet another album this one called "Share the Land" which made its way to the #2 spot on the Canadian charts with the hit releases "Share the Land", "Hang onto your Life", "Broken" and "Albert Flasher". From 1972 - 1975 the band released the following albums: "Best of the (Vol.1)", "So Long Banatayne", "Rockin'", "Live at the Paramount", "Artificial Paradise", "Best of the (Vol.2)", "Road Food", "Flavours", and "Power in the Music". Some of the singles which emerged from this prolific effort were: "Raindance", "Guns, Guns, Guns", "Running Back to Saskatoon", "Follow Your Daughter Home", "Glamour Boy", "Star Baby", "Clap for the Wolfman", "Dancing Fool", as well as others. The group eventually split up, each going their separate ways in solo efforts.

Close Up On Health:

Fibre Facts

For many years the substance we call fibre was overlooked as an essential part of a healthy diet. Man thought he was improving on nature by taking out the fibre which he believed to be useless.

Today's diet in general, consists of highly processed, low fibre foods with a high fat and sugar content. It is now known that this is the cause of the high incidence of cancer of the colon, heart disease, obesity, diabetes and high cholesterol levels in the western world.

Doctors and dietitians now tell us it is vitally important for everyone to eat a variety of foods containing "roughage" or dietary fibre every day. Fibre is the indigestible part of plants and excellent sources of this are:

- Whole fruits - particularly those with edible skins
- Leafy vegetables and raw carrots
- Breads, cereals and any baked goods containing whole wheat, multigrains or bran
- Dried peas, beans lentils and seeds
- Natural bran which can be added to various dishes and foods.

Don't add fibre to a poor diet but have a well balanced intake based on the Canada Food Guide. Reduce the amount of refined, sweet and fatty foods eaten, add a variety of fibre foods and drink lots of fluids, especially 6 - 8 glasses of water daily. Try this over Christmas and avoid the "after holiday" feeling.

Health Services has leaflets and recipes using bran and our nurses will be most happy to give you further information and help.

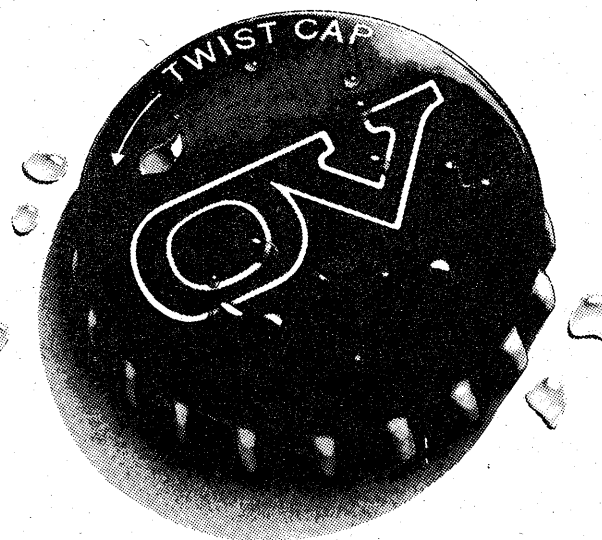

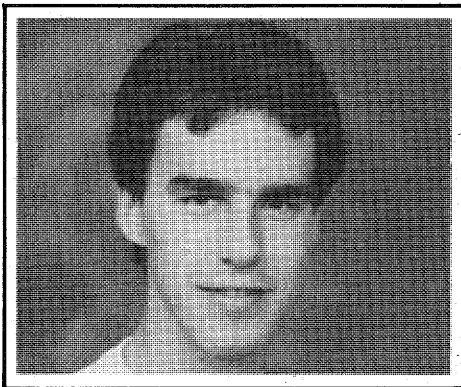

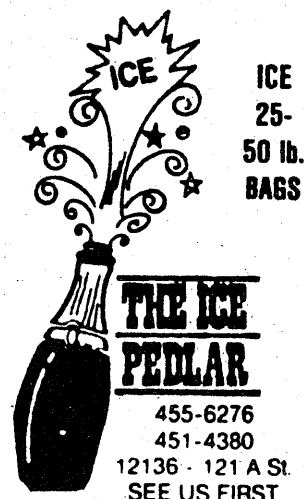
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
