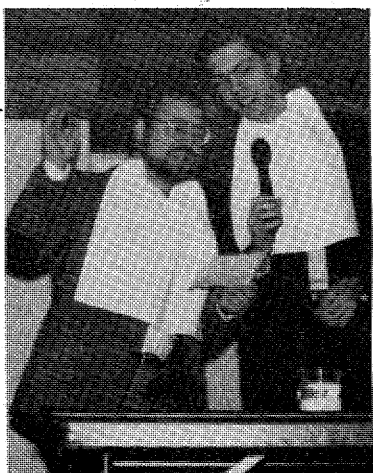

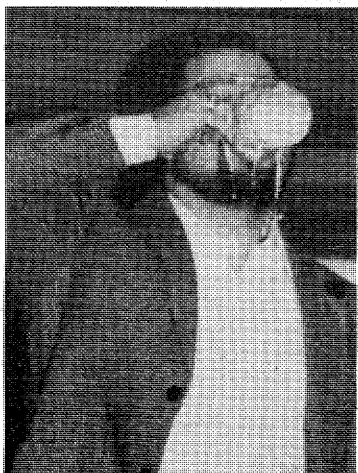

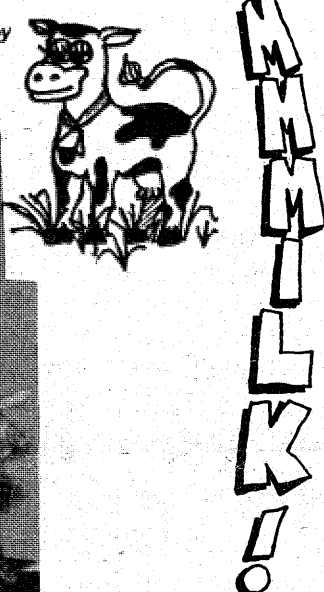

Penalties Galore as Hockey Ooks Trounce Trojans

Since the completion of the 1981-82 season, ACAC hockey observers have been asking themselves one question, "Will the SAIT-NAIT rivalry ever be as fierce as it was in 1981-82?"

Well, the question was

answered on Saturday, December 3rd at the NAIT Arena when referee Brent Smith dished out a total of 231 penalty minutes including nine misconducts and seven majors in a hard-fought battle as NAIT downed SAIT 10-3.

The Sunday contest was tamer with only 58 penalty minutes handed out in the Ooks's 7-3 victory over the Trojans.

In Saturday's contest, the Ooks led 1-0 after the first and 7-0 following two periods

before settling for a 10-3 win over the Trojans.

Ted Bradshaw, Brad Fenton and J.C. McEwan each tallied twice for the Ooks. Vince Ashton, Robin Dube, Blaine Peerless, and Craig

Sterzer rounded out the NAIT scoring. Kevin Karius, Wally Fizer and Kurt Woolf replied with Trojan markers.

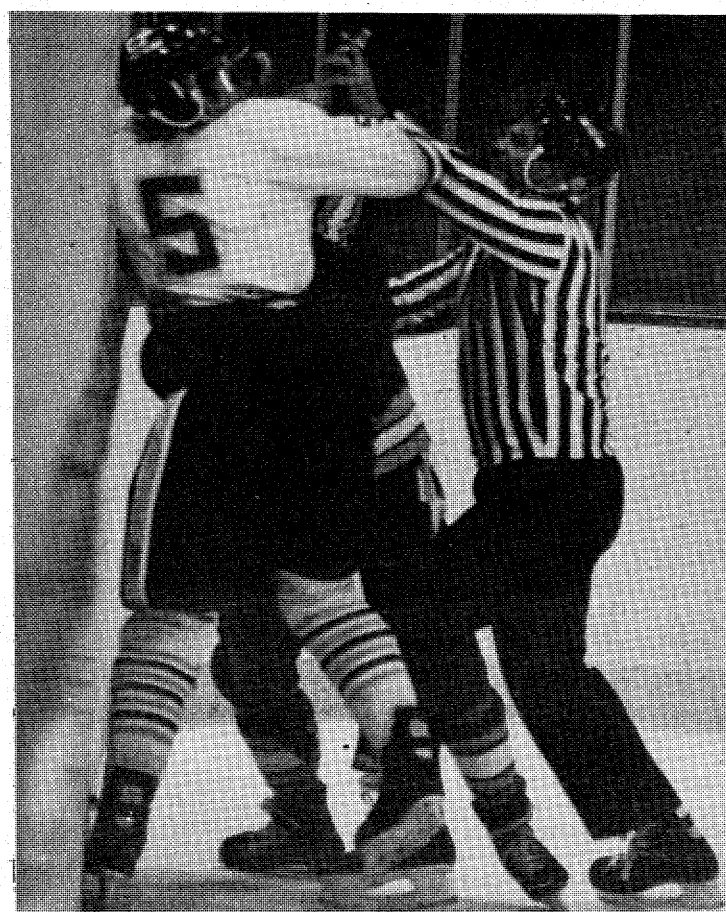
NAIT netminder Rob McKinley turned away 33 of 36 SAIT shots. At the other end, SAIT's Jeff Stayko and Horatio Schlinger blocked 31 of 41 NAIT drives.

In Sunday's match, NAIT held period leads of 2-1 and 6-1 en route to a 7-3 win over SAIT.

Robin Dube sparked NAIT with a pair of goals while Scott Melnyk, Myron Feser, Brad Fenton, Vince Ashton and Marty Volcan added singles. Wally Fizer, Jeff Turner and Kurt Woolf answered with Trojan goals.

Rob McKinley of NAIT stopped 25 of 28 SAIT shots. At the other end, Rich Plester of SAIT redirected 36 of 43 drives.

ON THE BENCH: The Ooks play in Camrose on Friday night and then start preparing for their trip to Czechoslovakia. The Ooks' next action at the NAIT Arena is on January 14th when they host the MRC Cougars... 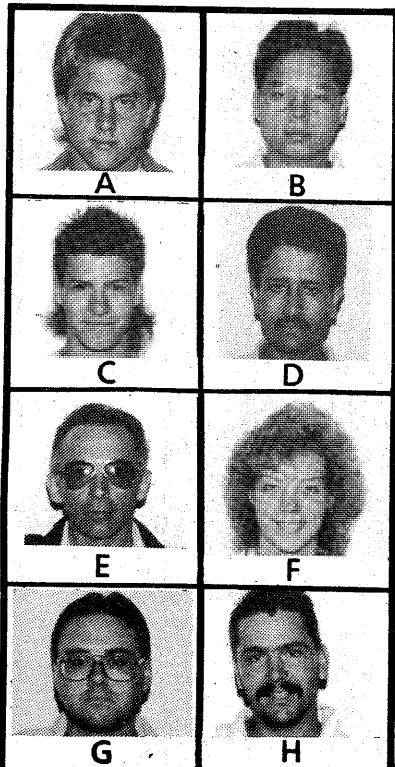

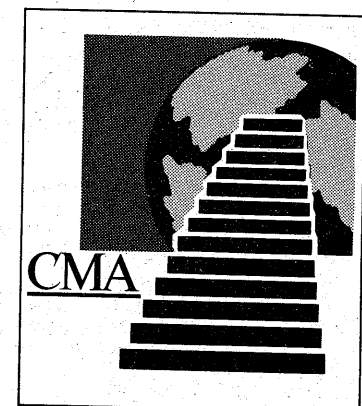

THREE MEN ON A HORSE

This classic comedy (circa 1935) of horses and horseplay, written by George Abbott and John Cecil Holm, is a comedy you can bet on...and it's off and running from December 6 to January 1, 1989 on the Citadel's Shoctor Mainstage.

THREE MEN ON A HORSE includes the perfect mix for a dirty thirties comedy: there's the "worm" (something like today's nerd) Erwin (or Oy-win) - he and his very average and saccharine wife Audrey make a match just like Blondie & Dagwood! Erwin, a versifier for a greeting card company, is devoted to his tyrannical boss because he can't imagine anything more glorious than \$40.00 a week, 52 weeks a year. Meanwhile in New York...there's action at the track - but our 3 Stooges: Patsy, Frankie & Charlie haven't seen any of it, they're down on their luck!

As it turns out, Erwin has a hobby - he "dopes" horses. He picks winners with almost inhuman accuracy. He will not, however, bet on them! His talents yields no tangible profits - until he falls into the clutches of this gang of small time gamblers who try to turn him into their own gold mine. Greed eventually reaps its just rewards, but not before a great many wildly entertaining events occur in this swift high-powered comedy.

His wife Audrey is played by SANDY TUCKER, the annoying brother-in-law by GORDON MASTEN, his boss J. G. The group began in 1985 in Newmarket, Ontario. Their first album entitled "The Tin Red Line" was released in February, 1986 and did spectacular things for the group both in Canada and abroad. The album sold over one million copies worldwide and over 500,000 copies in the U.S. alone. Two of the singles released in the U.S. went "Top Ten" and the band received a "Grammy" nomination as "Best New Artist" in the U.S. In Canada, five singles were released from the first album. The first single "Don't Forget Me" went platinum (over 100,000 copies), and another entitled "Someday" went gold (over 50,000 copies). The band also received four Juno nominations in Canada for their first album effort.

Recorded in the fall of 1987, the group's second album "Diamond Sun" was released in May, 1988. From this album the first single "I'm Still Searching" went gold in Canada and the second single, the title track, was very close to gold as well. The third release from this album was called "My Song" as traditional sounding song recorded in Dublin, Ireland complete with tin pipes backup provided by the Irish folk group "The Chieftans". This single is also doing very well so far.

The band anticipates the release of yet more singles from this second effort and is currently on a world tour which includes such exotic places as the U.S., Europe, Japan, and Australia.

The NAIT Volleyball Teams were in Grande Prairie over the weekend to face the Nordic Wolves. The trip was not a complete success.

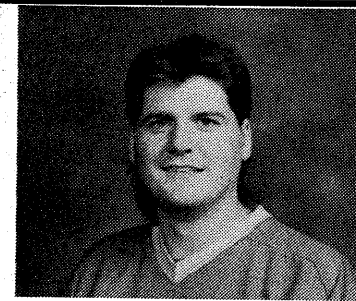

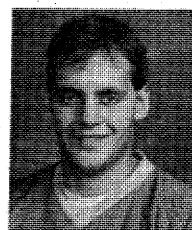
In women's action, NAIT dropped a pair of matches to GPRC. On Friday night, the Nordic Wolves swept the match three games to none (15-

J.C.'s hockey history is a long and interesting one. J.C. started his junior career in Saint Albert where he played two years with the Saints. At the age of 18, J.C. went to Lethbridge to play for hard-nosed Broncos of the WHL. "C" spent three years in the Western Hockey League and, in his second year (1983-84), played on the WHL Championship team.

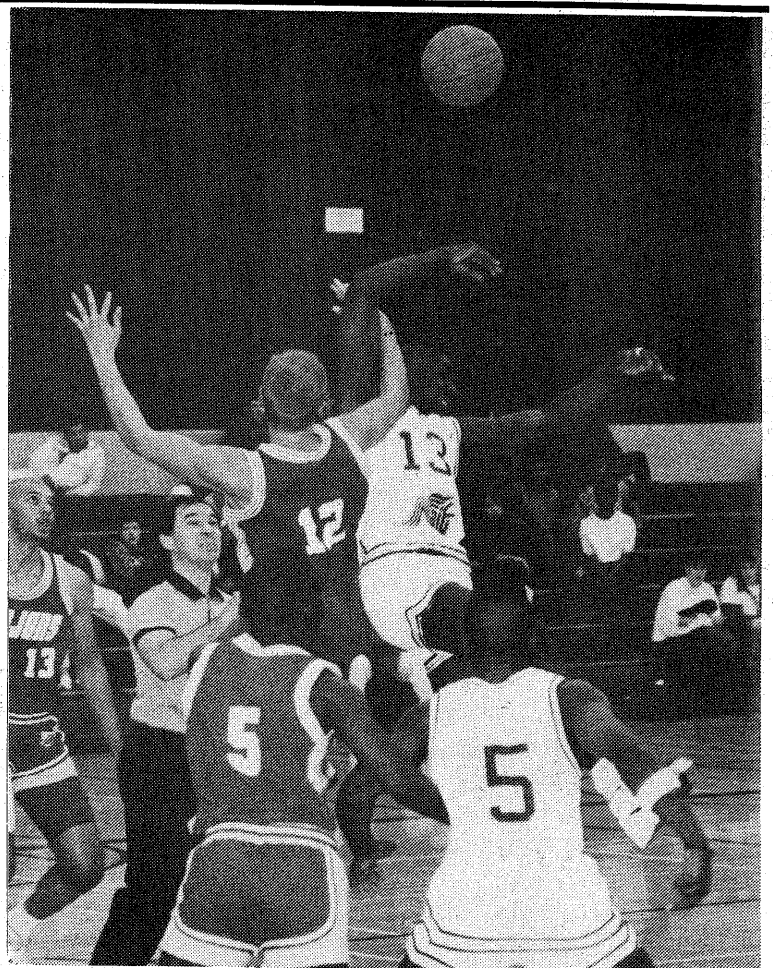
