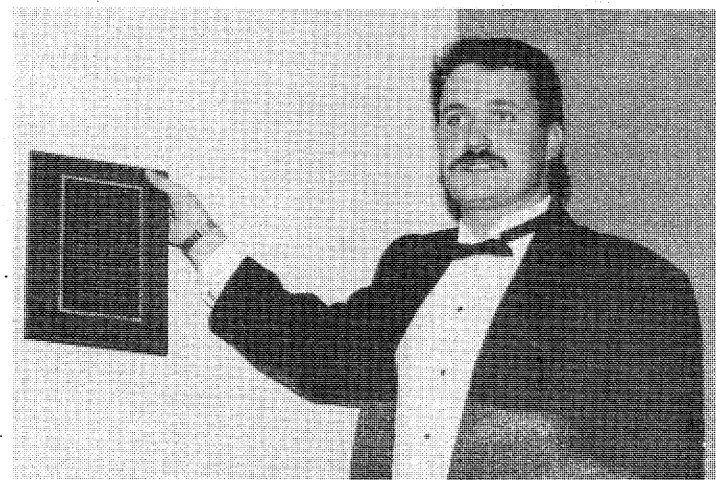

War. Why have so many died? They died to protect their loved ones, to protect the future for those to come and to protect a way of life they believed in.

War is a last resort. It is the desperate act to maintain or improve life at its most outrageous cost, life. No one should have to resort to killing and maiming others to ensure survival in a civilized world. No one should have to, but, sometimes there is no other alternative.

November 11th is the one day of the year that we are reminded to think of those who died and to appreciate what we have because they gave their lives. It is difficult for those too young to remember war to understand its impact on people. NAIT has veterans on campus who remember only too vividly what war is like.

The commissionaires on campus are all veterans. Some are war veterans. Those men and women who took part in war are not eager to talk about their experiences to those who were not there. Veterans often get a painful and far-away look in their eyes when war is discussed.

Commissionaire Bill Davignon says, "We don't need to talk about it. Hell, we lived it." To be in Bill's presence as he recites *In Flanders Field* is a chilling reminder that we Canadians live in peace because so many young men gave their lives.

Editorial:

In 1988, what is Remembrance Day?

What does Remembrance Day mean to you? Poppies? A day off from school? A celebration of war? Old men gathered around a cenotaph?

Probably a large majority of NAIT students and staff do not have first hand experience with war. The last war Canada fought ended over 40 years ago. The meaning behind the pomp and circumstance may be a little cloudy for many of us. So what exactly is Remembrance Day?

It is a day to remember the war dead.

How each of us does this may differ, but that is the reason November 11th was set apart from other days.

I have sometimes felt a little uncomfortable watching Remembrance Day ceremonies. Does a person have to like war to remember the fallen? This is the last stanza of John McRae's classic poem, *In Flanders Fields*:

Take up our quarrel with the foe:

To you from failing hands we throw

The torch; be yours to hold it high

If ye break faith with us who die

We shall not sleep, though poppies grow

In Flanders Fields.

Would a lack of willingness to "take up" the "quarrel with the foe" be disrespectful? I do not think so. I do not like war. I believe that for the most part wars are started for reasons of economic self-interest by politicians and businessmen who do not have to fight in them.

The common people, who truly believe in words like patriotism and freedom, are the ones who make the sacrifice.

To the people who knew the deceased, the worth of a person's life is not measured by the cause of his death, but by his life. It is also measured by the effect the person's death had. The value of peace is measured in lives; those already gone, and those yet to be saved if peace is kept.

On this Remembrance Day, take time to remember and respect those who have given their lives in war. Take time also to remember that, unless we are careful, they will not be the last to die.

Where Have All the Female Athletes Gone?

The required number of female athletes to field full teams in canoeing, curling, bowling, golf, cross-country running, cross-country skiing, squash, racquetball, basketball, and volleyball is about 70. Generally, 50 to 55 are the average numbers that fill the teams, but that is the 50 to 55 that actually come out. It is not the 50 to 55 that make the teams out of the 100 to 150 that should be trying out.

Considering that approximately 2500 female students attend full day courses 70 athletes making the teams, translates into 2.8 per cent. If five to six per cent would tryout, it would not raise many questions regarding female participation. The fact that only two to three per cent try out is cause for concern.

Why??? Are the athletic facilities that bad? Is the athletic program run that poorly? Is the average student workload that restrictive? Is the campus too spread out? Is the Alberta College Athletic Conference so Mickey Mouse? Is the NAIT spirit or pride non-existent? Is the average female in poor physical condition or that non-committal?

My experience with the racquetball and squash teams proves year after year that double or triple the required number of male athletes compete for the team positions. Why then, are less than required numbers, coming out for the female teams?

Your feedback to help the coaching and athletic staff improve this dilemma would be welcome.

And as for a waitress telling me that she remembers people who don't tip and that she is out to get them the next time they come in, I would just like to say that I am a paying customer and I only tip for service that I receive.

So in closing I hope that the management of the Nest reads this letter and takes prompt action to rectify this problem immediately or the reputation of service in the Nest will not be a good one.

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Free Trade Affects Lifestyle

The Alberta Association of Social Workers is concerned about the significant and serious implications for social programs due to the proposed Free Trade Agreement. There is no written guarantee that our health care, unemployment insurance, pensions, family allowance and welfare programs have been adequately protected. These are unique programs developed to give security to our citizens and they have received very strong and consistent support from Canadians.

As professionals working in the social services and health field, Alberta Association of Social Workers members have first-hand knowledge of the necessity of ensuring that these basic programs continue to offer support to people when they are disadvantaged or at vulnerable points in their lives.

We point to Chapter 14 of the Free Trade Agreement, which identifies that American companies must be accorded non-discriminatory access in any tendering process associated with the management of a whole range of health, institutional and social services. This includes hospitals, homes for children, the handicapped and private practice social workers.

Because of the current

different accessibility and quality of Social Programs in the United States and Canada, the concerns of Canadian professionals are well-founded. The risk is that these benefits could be challenged at some time in the future by the United States as being "unfair subsidies", as identified by Marjorie Bowker in her analysis of July, 1988.

The possibilities exist that either the United States industry could put pressure on the Canadian Government to eliminate these programs due to unfair trade practices or that Canadian industry could try to eliminate them as they add to labour costs and make competition more difficult in the export market.

Since there are documented fundamental differences between the social service programs of the two countries, we believe that careful examination of the Free Trade Act must be quickly undertaken to ensure that Canadians not be asked to diminish any benefits now in place in our existing health and social services programs, and that future development of such programs not be hampered.

At present, we enjoy a unique Canadian approach to social needs and a society that supports the "safety net" for those in need. The few advantages of Free Trade

must not be allowed to outweigh the disadvantages inherent in this particular Free Trade Agreement.

The Alberta Association of Social Workers recommends that social programs be specifically identified and protected in the Free Trade Agreement, as the Agreement deals not only with economics but effects the life styles of all Canadians.

CANADIAN ROCK HISTORY CHALLENGE

The group formed in December 1969 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Together, they travelled to Quebec in 1970, settling eventually in Montreal where they landed a recording contract.

In February 1971, their self-titled debut album was released which included a song called "Fast Train" which soon became a local hit in the Maritimes. A second album was released in July 1972 entitled "On Record" and boasted the following list of hit singles: "You Could Have Been A Lady" (which became their first major Canadian hit), "Bad Sign of the Moon", "Drop Your Guns", "Lady Run, Lady Hide" and "Weeping Willow". "Electric Jewels", their third album, emerged in March 1974 and contained two further hits, the title track and a little song called "I'm On Fire For You Baby". They followed with a live album in September of 1974.

The LP "Stand Back" was released in July 1975 and climbed to the top with such hit releases as: "I Wouldn't Want To Lose Your Love", "Come Hear the Band", and "Tonight is a Wonderful Time To Fall in Love". The band continued to release album after album, some of which became extremely successful, including: "The Whole World's Going Crazy", "Harder, Faster", "The Nature of the Beat", and "Power Play". The group eventually split up in 1986 and has not since rejoined.

The team simply could not compete in the conference with only six players and repeated attempts to attract more people out for the team proved futile. The team will have the opportunity to rejoin the ACAC next season by posting a performance bond and being voted in by the remainder of the conference.

Since assuming the head coaching position with the women's basketball team ten years ago, it has been increasingly evident that for the team to survive and improve, players had to be recruited each year. Towards this end, I spend a great deal of time identifying high school talent and trying to sell NAIT and our basketball program.
