'INSTRUCTOR EVALUATION' MODIFIED

On Sept. 26 Academic Council accepted a report by its subcommittee which modifies instructor evaluation as it was introduced in 1988, with NASA and January of 1988. Academic Council will recommend to Board of Governors that the report be implemented this year as soon as possible and reviewed in March next year.

In a major clarification, Instructor Evaluation has been renamed Student Feedback. Its purpose as stated in the September 1 report is to improve the quality of teaching, not to judge the worth of individual instructors.

"Established in April NAITSA representation, the Review Committee solicited staff and student input on the system of student evaluation of instruction instituted in follows: January 1988.

"While student feedback was seen as important to improve the quality of instruction, feedback to the Review Committee and line officers indicated the current system, the way it was communicatied and implemented, the instrument

> "In order to overcome the negativity and to positively influence instructional effectiveness, the Review Committee recommends as

- The objectives of student feedback should be 5. formative.
- The feedback instrument should be titled 'Student Feedback on Instruction' instead of 'Instructor Evaluation'
- The statements on the feedback instrument should be limited to those elements of instructional activity on which the students can competently provide feedback.
- The instrument should contain a set of instruction-centred core statements, a set of 6. program-specific statements, and a set of

instructor-designed statements. The response scale should range from 'strongly agree' to 'strongly disagree' with a separate 'not applicable' category. A catalogue of statements, as well as sample instruments to different suit instructional settings should also be made available.

- The instructor, in consultation with his/her supervisor should determine the class(es) and times for administering the instrument. The instructor should administer the instrument, the collection of responses being entrusted to a third party or a student. The Computer and Systems Services Division should summarize responses and provide these to the instructor.
- The process should be mandatory, with a minimum of two surveys a

year for each instructor.

- 7. Students should be given the choice of signing or not signing the document.
- 8. Instructors should be encouraged to share the summary of feedback with their supervisors and even discuss the key indicators with the classes.
- The raw data and all electronic records should be destroyed after 30 days.
- 10. Developmental activities should be provided to staff, to the extent possible.
- 11. Extensive education on the system should be provided to staff. administration, and students.
- 12. The current grievance/appeal mechanisms should be made more visible. Staff should pay greater attention to the needs and expectations of students. Additional avenues should be created for students to express their views.
- 13. The Review Committee should be continued to monitor educate, implementation, and conduct on-going reviews."

PLACEBO: A HARD PILL TO SWALLOW

Academic Council has accepted a report outlining the new Student Feedback to replace the Instructor Evaluation system of student opinions of campus.

The only problem is that the whole intent of Instructor Evaluation has been altered and lost. It is now solely a method for students to vent their frustrations without doing any damage to instructor morale. Effectively it is nothing more than a placebo.

This is an insult of student's intelligence. How can all students possibly be viewed as merely part of a lynch mob? Do students not have the ability to be fair and well thought out? Are all students considered to be vindictive and on the prowl to destroy an instructor's career? Reverse discrimination! Students are stereotyped as instructor-hating monsters that must be quieted..

Let's be a little more realistic. Yes, some students will judge solely on emotion, yes some students will channel anger at what is the apparent source. Was it that difficult to assess the compiled evaluations?


Students are human but then so are the instructors. Can we agree that there are some instructors that NAIT would be very hard pressed to replace? Why not take advantage of the information that students can make available on instructor effectiveness. Instructor Evaluation was a recognition, stated Dr. S. Souch in the Nugget, Letter to the Editor, April 7, 1988, "that students have a valid contribution to make to performance appraisal".

Problem: Student Feedback Solution: Get Militant

The report on Instructor Evaluation which Academic Council approved on Sept. 26 could be viewed as a compromise. Some poeple have told me that they think it is comparable to a declawed and neutered tiger, but I disagree. I think it is probably the best document we could hope for in the negative climate created by last year's version.

This report will help improve the quality of education here at NAIT. It gives instructors a pat on the back by telling them when they teach well. It also points out developmental areas in a non-threatening way. It will not do anyone any good to coerce those good instructors who are in the majority. Generally speaking, the carrot is more effective than the stick, and this report uses the carrot. Maintaining the goodwill of instructors is important. Certainly the reputation of NAIT is earned by its graduates, but where do the graduates get their knowledge?

Don't get the idea that I think this is the ideal solution. I do not. But it's a start. From the discussion I heard at the Academic Council meeting, what Academic Council expects this version to do is begin to regain the trust of instructors and hopefully encourage acceptance of student feedback through the use of peer pressure instead of the threat of a negative performance appraisal. Once instructors have accepted student feedback and trust is regained, I hope they eventually accept student feedback as one element in their performance appraisals.

This report offers a solution to half the problem of last year's controversy. It does not, however, provide a really solid solution to the problem which some students unfortunately face. What do you do when you have an instructor who is either unwilling or unable to teach? (Let me stress that I believe the majority of instructors do their jobs. I am talking about the few instructors who have a serious problem.) Student feedback certainly isn't a vehicle which communicates the problem to those in power.

Complain. Unite with your fellow students. First talk to the instructor and suggest reasonable and specific ways to improve. If you do not get results, go to the Program Head. If you still do not get results, go to the Dean, then the Vice President of Student and Staff Services, the President and the Minister of Advanced Education, in that order. But do complain. AND DON'T QUIT UNTIL YOU GET RESULTS.

The shame of this arrangement is that only a small minority of students are likely to have the guts and stamina to run this gauntlet.

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TAKING STOCK

The first investment anyone should make is to ensure that you have sufficient emergency capital in an ultra-secure, liquid investment.

"Sufficient" means the equivalent of 6 months necessary living expenses. For example, if your basic require-ments total \$800 per month, your emergency capital should be \$4,800.00.

Obviously, these funds should not be used for any purpose other than meeting emergency expenditures, whether because your source of income has disappeared, or because of unforeseen bills.

DEFINITION: Money Market Instruments:

These investments consist primarily of Government of Canada Treasury Bills, (T-Bills), Bankers' Acceptances (BAs), GMACs (General Motors Acceptance Corporation papers), Term Deposits, and Canada Savings Bonds (CSBs).

In this issue, we will discuss only the first three: T-Bills, BAs, and GMACS.

These investments are bought at a discount and

mature at par. Translated, it means that if you buy a \$5,000, 3 month T-Bill, at 98.035, you pay 98.035% of the face value (value at maturity). Thus, your cost would be \$4,901.75. When the T-Bill matures, you receive \$5,000.00. The difference (\$98.25) is the interest you earned.

T-Bills, BAs and GMACs have terms ranging from 1 to 365 days. They never have a maturity date longer than one year.

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

T-Bills always come due on Fridays, unless that Friday is a statutory holiday. Then, they usually mature on the preceeding Thursday.

Different terms, (30, 60, 90 days) will offer different yields. The longer you put your money away for, the higher your rate of return will be. (There are some exceptions, depending on economic conditions. Ask your broker).

Shop around for the best rates. In most cases, a brokerage firm offers the highest rates for the same instrument for the same period. It makes no difference to the security of the investment where you buy it.. Go for the best rate.

When you call for rates, you should receive 5 pieces of information. They are: 1) The minimum amount required by the institution to be invested; 2) Price; 3) Interest rate or yield; 4) Number of days to maturity, including the actual date; 5) Settlement date.

A typical quote may be stated as follows:

30 day T-Bills, due October XX, 19XX, cost is 99.40, yielding 7.24%; 60 days, due November XX, 19XX, cost is 98.75, yielding 7.59%...etc.

Note that the yield is annualized. In the example above, the return was \$98.25. This is an actual rate of return of 2% (\$98.25 divided by \$4,901.75 multiplied by . 100). However, this is your return for only three months. If you repeated the investment three more times, in one year you would receive \$393.00, or 8%. The term used to repeat this type of investment is a roll-over.

Settlement date is the date you actually have to pay for the T-Bills (or BA or

GMAC) you ordered. Usually this is the same business day. Known as same day settlement.

ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES

These investments are secure. T-Bills are fully guaranteed to any amount of principal and interest (p&i) by the Government of Canada. BAs are guaranteed by the issuing bank (you might want to stick to the "Big 5"), and are also guaranteed by CDIC (Canada Deposit Insurance Corporation). CDIC, however, guarantees only to a per investor (not per investment!). GMACs are guaranteed by the issuer. The last I heard, their credit rating was higher than any bank in Canada.

You can see that these investments meet the "security" requirements I mentioned in the opening. They are also liquid. Any of them can be sold by you without penalty on any business day. Be aware, however, that the selling price is determined by the interest rates at the time of the sale. You may (rarely) lose money, but you may also receive a higher rate of return. Ask

your broker what the price is before actually instructing him or her to sell, and ask how long the price is good for. It may only apply for an hour or two. At any rate, ou may decide to wait.

RULE OF THUMB:

Always keep 20 - 25% of your emergency capital in a high interest rate savings account which you can access through a banking machine. (For weekend emergencies.) The balance (75 - 80%) should be invested in one of the above instruments.





Extended Library Hours

New hours at the main library effective October 15th are as follows:

Sat. 11a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Sun. noon to 9:00

p.m. Mon. 7:15a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Tues. 7:15a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

This change extends present hours by one hour on Mondays, Tuesdays and Saturdays, and four hours Sundays.

The schedule will be in effect on a trial basis until December. Then the hours policy will be evaluated and a permanent decision will be made.

The hours extension was made in response to request by Pat McEwen, President of NAITSA, at the Sept. 26 Academic Council meeting. "I'm very happy with the additional hours. I hope students will make good use of them," saidMcEwen

Plaza II library's hours were not included in the extension because, according McEwen's figures, circulation at that library is much lower.

McEwen also had three other recommendations which Academic Council will review and report on in December or January:

- Purchase approximately 1,000 books at a cost of \$50,000 to upgrade book selection to a very good level;
- 2. Make a computer lab available in the library;
- 3. Increase available study space.





'BURN THIS'

by Pauline Crawford The news release for this play says, "To Wilson (Pulitzer Prize winning Lanford Wilson, who wrote this play), 'burn this' was the phrase a writer attaches to a painfully private letter, a letter so honest it makes its author shudder."

That statement, combined with the phrases, "urban danger zone" and "collision of the characters' wildly disparate definitions of love and sexuality" which were in the news release, bothered me. They gave me the horrible feeling that I had made a mistake when I said I would review this play. I thought I had let myself in for a few hours of agonizingly painful and boring "arty' screaming about how awful

I'm happy to say that my fears were unfounded. This play isn't about razor blade inspired confessionals; it's about nothing more awful than falling in love.

Anna (an uptown modern dancer) and Pale (a downtown macho man) find the experience of falling in love with each other to be frighteningly powerful and unpredictable. They struggle against it, but ultimately succumb to it.

The entire play takes place in an apartment in lower Manhattan and has only four characters, so if you are attracted to epic scope and exotic scenery, go see Dracula. However, most of us probably find the subject of 'BURN THIS' a more common experience than being bitten on the neck by a vampire. To paraphrase Larry, a advertising art director who is Anna's gay roommate in the play, 'Why does it always have to be about that? It just always is. God, don't ask me why. Ask a priest. I didn't make people.'

If you think you might like to see a smaller scale play and you don't mind a lot of blue language, give "BURN THIS" a try. It plays from September 27 through October 23 in the Rice Theatre at the Citadel. Ticket prices range from \$9 to \$16.50.


In the mixed sprint, Shawn Stephani and Korin Edler placed for th. Gary McCagg and Elaine Erler finished sixth.

I recently received a letter from the girls parents, in Vancouver, and the family is very excited about what we are doing here at Nait. They are very touched by the drive here.


Once again I would just like to say thank you, and the work we are doing here is very appreciated. Every "life" tab is worth something - to that little girl. Thank you NAIT!!!
