Isn't that cute!

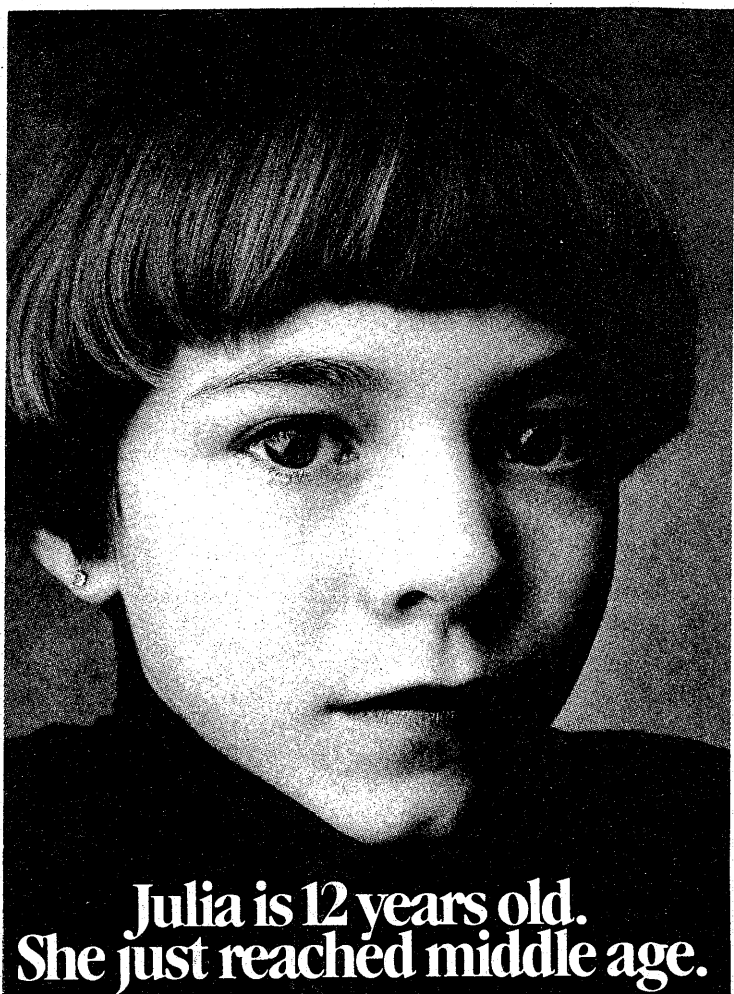

30% LIVE TO SEE EIGHTEEN

Approximately one of every 1,800 children born in Canada has the incurable, hereditary disease called Cystic Fibrosis (CF). Only 30% of children diagnosed with CF live to celebrate their 18th birthday.

First recognized in 1938, CF was usually diagnosed during an autopsy. Infants and young children died of malnutrition, dehydration, pneumonia, or combinations of these.

CF affects the exocrine glands. These glands secrete tears, sweat, saliva and mucus, and thus can create one or more of the following conditions:

-- Abnormally thick mucus in the lungs forms a breeding ground for infections and makes breathing very difficult. Progressively, the lungs become more and more

damaged.

--Thickened mucus in the digestive system blocks normal digestion and limits nutritional assimilation, resulting in malnutrition.

Two genes are the cause of CF. A child who inherits one gene from each parent has a 25% risk of having CF, a 50% risk of being a CF carrier, and a 25% chance of being unaffected. A

child can also be a carrier with only one parent's CF gene.

An estimated 5% of the Canadian population carries the gene for CF. There are no reliable tests available for identifying either CF carriers or for detecting CF in unborn children.

CF is diagnosed with a 'sweat test'. A high salt

content in sweat in conjunction with other symptoms confirms a CF diagnosis.

The symptoms of CF as listed by the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation are:

1. Constant cough, producing thick mucus;
2. Excessive appetite with loss of weight;
3. Frequent large foul-smelling bowel movements;
4. Excessively salty taste to skin;
5. Repeated and prolonged bouts of pneumonia.

Do what you can to help CF children celebrate not just their 18th birthdays, but many more. Shine shoes, or have your shoes shined on October 1st, 1988. All proceeds go to CF research.

LIBRARY HOURS

The decision by NAITSA to try and get the library hours extended is long overdue (pardon the pun).

The present hours are not always convenient: 7:15 a.m. - 10:00 p.m. Mon. thru Thurs., 7:15 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Fri. and 1:00 - 5:00 p.m. week-ends.

Many students are morning people. If they go to the library first thing in the morning they barely have time to unpack, get the books they need and get started before it's time to pack up for the first class of the day at 8:15.

The night hawks aren't any luckier. They don't really get into a good work mode until 10:00 p.m.

The week-end hours are decidedly the most inconvenient. Students who would like to get an early start on a project have to be sure to take out all the books they may need and lug them home. Those wanting to work late check out all the books they need. Some students simply go to the University of Alberta (U. of A.) libraries.

The U. of A. hours vary with each library. The Cameron and Rutherford Libraries, for example, open 30 minutes later than NAIT's on week days but remain open until 12:00 p.m. Mon. thru Thurs. and until 10:00 p.m. on Friday. Their weekend hours are excellent from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Saturday and from 10:00 a.m. to midnight on Sunday.

Extending the week-end hours may not aid those who work all week-end but for those who work one day in the week end it doubles the usable library time.

To students who don't have jobs it adds an additional 8 hours on Saturday and 10 hours on Sunday. You can get alot done in 18 hours.

From a student's perspective extended library hours means greater flexibility to study, research projects or complete assignments. Of course the final decision does not belong to NAITSA or to the students. Hopefully, those in positions of power will agree with our point of view.

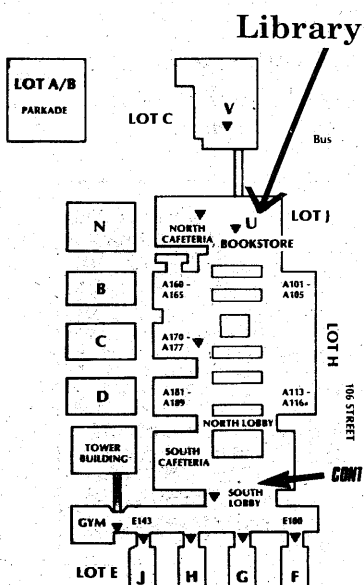

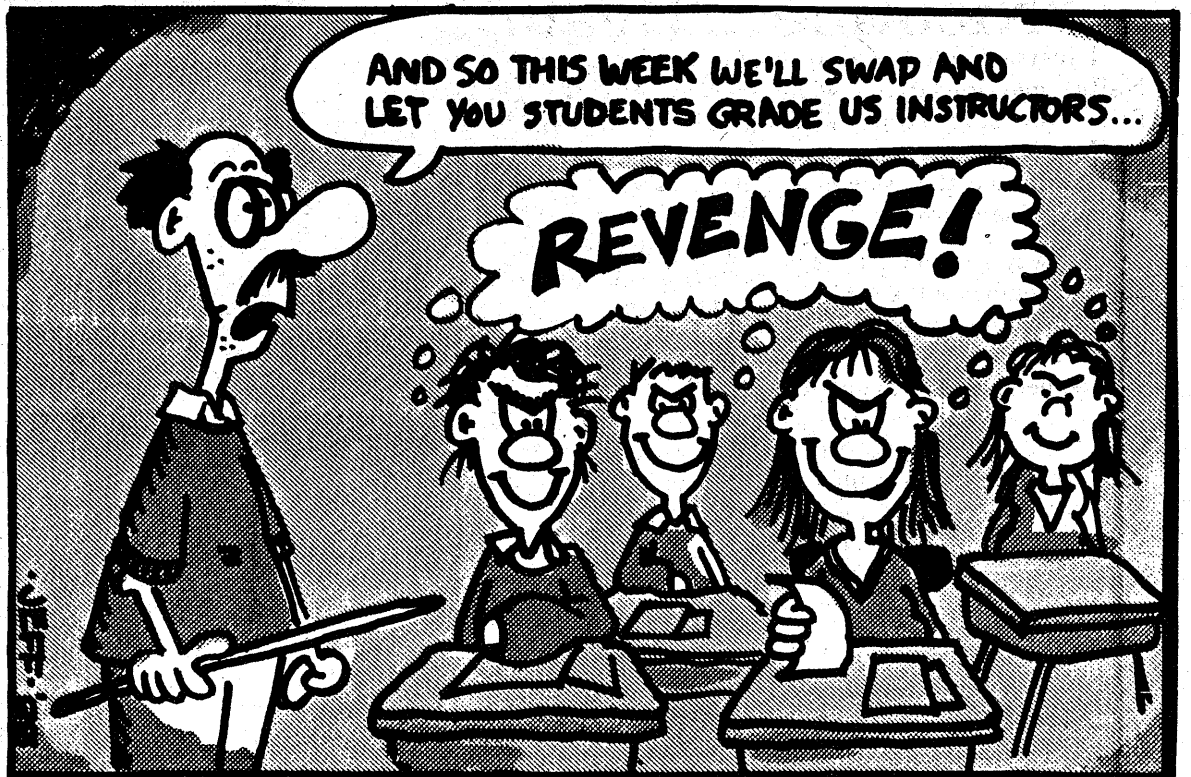

WAR: INSTRUCTORS vs. STUDENTS vs. ADMINISTRATION

What does a student do about an inadequate instructor?

Past years, after frustrating and useless discussions with first the instructor, and then the program head, he or she fought for instructor evaluation.

Mandatory instructor evaluation was introduced at NAIT last year with mixed results.

I have heard rumours that instructors are not happy with it at all. I am not just talking about the few inadequate instructors students are frustrated with. I am also talking about the majority, the good to excellent instructors who always seem to somehow get those exams back to us the day after the exam, and who gladly take the extra time and effort to patiently explain that difficult-to-us but easy-to-them concept yet again.

Why are instructors unhappy? For a moment I will imagine how I might react to instructor evaluation if I was an instructor.

I have been working hard as an instructor and, I think, doing a pretty good job. I welcome feedback from students. But it seems administration does not notice or care because suddenly these instructor evaluations are arbitrarily forced on me. Before I was treated like a professional. Now decisions about my salary and "tenure" have been placed in the hands of a group of people, some of whom are not particularly mature or responsible, and none of whom have a full understanding of all aspects of my job. I am insulted.

It is not my intention to irritate or insult people I respect, but as a student I am strongly in favour of some form of instructor evaluation for the following reasons:

1. It provides positive feedback for good teaching.

2. It provides useful information to instructors about how they might improve. I do not mean that there is necessarily a deficiency. Everyone needs to improve.

3. It indicates to administration when there might be a problem with a particular instructor.

If there is a problem, corrective action can be taken. Whether the person just needs help learning to teach or the difficulty is caused by personal problems, something might be done to help the instructor.

If all else fails, unfavourable feedback from students is one factor administration should consider when they are deciding whether or not an instructor will continue to be employed at NAIT. Students spend more time watching an instructor teach than his or her supervisor does, and it seems foolish to me to disregard our observations. Some instructors are better at internal politics and putting on a good face for the boss than they are at teaching. I am not saying that students should be given carte blanche to fire instructors because our observations are to some extent affected by what mark we expect and other

prejudicing factors. But don't tell me they are worthless. That IS insulting.

Unless administration really listens to student complaints when there is a legitimate problem with quality of instruction and acts, the frustration will continue to build. Unless instructors feel they are treated with respect, their morale will continue to be low and we will all suffer.

A sub-committee of Academic Council will present a report on instructor evaluation to Academic Council early this fall.

I hope it has a solution.

Remember: when an incorrigibly incompetent instructor is allowed to continue, all our reputations are tarnished: the Institute's, its graduates, and its instructors, because equally incompetent former students are out there letting employers know where they went to school.

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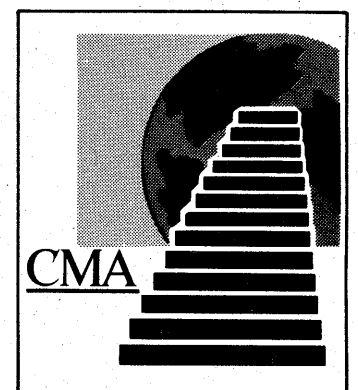
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Know Your Institute: Academic Council

This is the first of a series of articles introducing prominent people on campus and important organizational structures.

What is Academic Council?

Academic Council is a 17 member committee whose main purpose is to advise NAIT's Board of Governors on academic matters such as programs of instruction, academic awards, and policies and practices regarding the selection and admission of students.

The Council has the authority to strike committees to investigate issues referred to it by the Board of Governors and to recommend policy to the Board of Governors. It does not have the authority to implement policy.

A current high profile project is the development of a model for student evaluation of instructors. A subcommittee will present a report on this subject to the Council early this fall.

Some of the Council's past contributions have been a Declaration of Student Rights and Responsibilities, procedures for student appeal, recommendation on the conversion of the academic year from a quarter to a semester system and studies of program and instructional quality.

Who is Academic Council?

Academic Council is the most broadly based committee in the Institute. Its membership is comprised of students elected to the council, faculty members, support staff, NAIT administration, and members of the public.

When Does Academic Council Meet?


Academic Council meets once a month. The first meeting this year is on September 29th. After that date the Council meets on the third Monday each month until April. There is no meeting in December.

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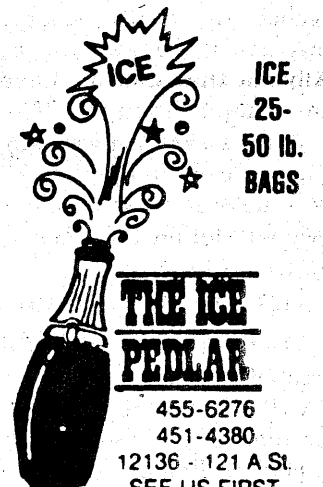
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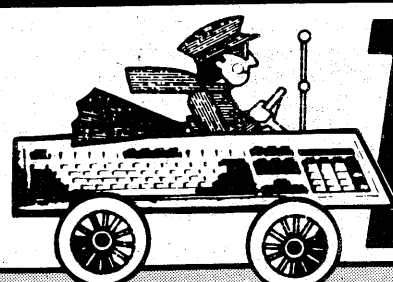


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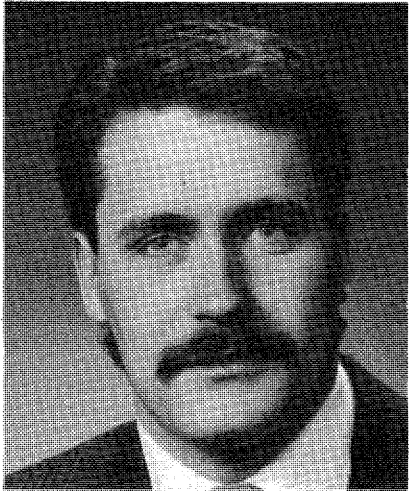
A chat with NAITSA President

Last week I finally managed to get an interview with Pat McEwen. Not only is he one very busy fella but, if you don't know by now and you should, he is president of NAITSA.

I was interested in his opinion and NAITSA's on the opening of our new lounge (which has been delayed, but find out why in the interview with the lounge assistant manager Gord Matthew).

I was also concerned about just what a man like Pat McEwen would say about the lounge, his famous saying is "Nait is not all work, let's have fun too."

T: First off I would like to hear an opening statement regarding the new lounge.

P: The lounge is something the school has really needed. We are one of the few colleges in Alberta that doesn't have an on campus lounge. The first year is going to be the toughest year of operation. We will have strict guide lines and we will follow them to the T the first year to make sure that there no problems at all.

T: Well, Pat what I'm interested in knowing is how this will affect the Rock n' Talks (hereafter RN). They are a popular Friday event.

P: Yes, the RN are an event that happen every second Friday. We don't anticipate any great problems, it might

be a little harder ...take more effort on our part to promoting the RN, but it's two different types of a set up. We've got a big dance floor and we can hold 250 people there, the lounge at present will only hold 145-150 people... there will be some people that just prefer to going out and having a beer and making lots of noise, that's Rn's. The lounge will be alot more ... civilized as well you will have alot more variety... I think that we will not see any problems at present with the RN's. It is something we will have to look at throughout the year to see id the RN's are still feasible and we might have to make a few changes in the RN's to make them more appealing with our lounge.

T: Okay, so you still see that the RN's will live, but the potential for them losing their popularity might exist.

P: Ah, yes, the potential is always there for the popularity to go down, but I don't anticipate us dropping the RN's. It's still a...

T: Tradition.

P: Yes, it is a tradition here. Everybody knows about Nait's RN's and I still think that it is two separate identities. There are always people that have been going to other places like Runway, Shades and this has not hurt our RNs. I'm presuming that having an on campus lounge will take some of the population of RNs away, but we just gotta create more, we've got 6500 students here and 150 in a bar and 250 in the RNs so I don't anticipate any problems.

T: That's good. You were mentioning before about strict guide lines that you were going to establish, what would they be? Alcohol service will start at 4:00 P.M. and we still have classes beyond 4. I'm just wondering what will be done if we have drunks wandering the halls or every second Friday there might be the odd socially overactive person(s) who come from the lounge to the RN and perhaps create any disturbance along the way. What do you plan to do about that?

P: Well first of all the lounge will be opening at 4:10, which most classes are over by that time, but yes there are still classes that go after that, and we have some pretty good management coming in. Bob Short is manager and former president of NAITSA Gord Matthew is the asst. manager. They have been trained in the Who's Responsible program and hopefully we will not see the point where a person will be intoxicated enough to cause problems. The entrance to the bar, there are two entrances, one is on the outside the other inside the school. The school door will be closed fairly early, we have not set a definite time on that yet though. There won't be problems (such as the one described by me -Teo) Drunk people won't be allowed period in our lounge. The lounge is a place to go to get some drinks and have a good time. It is not a place to go to get hammered. We won't allow it.

T: Alright. So if I understood this correctly, NAITSA is relying upon the lounge management and Nait security to prevent any social mishaps.

P: Yes

T: Now if the lounge goes over well and I do anticipate it to do so. This being our first, the University having several, is there a potential for expansion(bars, lounges, et al)

P: At present we have one and that is what we are concerned about the one we have and that it goes over well. The students have invested a lot of money into it and until the money is paid back and at that

point there might be some additions to the school, example expansion across the street, I can't rule out not having another lounge, but you also have got to look at the population. The U has got over 20,000 students, if I'm not mistaken, whereas at Nait students and staff are under 10,000. So we don't have as big a market to target as the U does. So we are mainly concerned about our one lounge now, but I would not rule out any possibilities of a possible second lounge in our expansion, but that would be 5 - 10 years down the road.

T: Right, well that's good. Any closing remarks you would like to add?

P: Yes, basically this lounge is gonna be a trial for the students association and the Nait Board of Governors. They have put a lot of trust in us that we can handle this lounge in a respectable way. One of our very very high priorities at NAITSA is that of the prevention of drinking and driving, this too is shared by the lounge management.

LOAN SHARPIES

The Student Finance Board is clamping down on cheaters.

The increase in auditing in the 1987-88 academic year has amassed approximately \$7 million in savings this year.

Reason: The Student Finance Board was prompted by student leaders and the public to do so because of abuse in the system.

Abuses range from: not declaring stocks and bonds, not claiming assistance from another government agency, claiming non-existent children or marriages, and even lying about living expenses when living at home.

Consequences vary from restitution to criminal proceedings. One individual declared she was single when she was not and was imprisoned for three days and ordered to make full restitution of \$14,510 as a civil debt.

Additional auditing procedures include waivers that once signed allow the board to seek information from Revenue Canada to verify statements. Also access to student bank accounts for status and balance information. This last move was suggested by bank representatives.

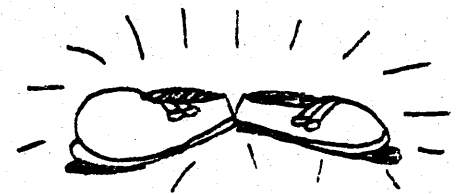
Who am I talking about, you may ask. Well, if you would stop thinking these questions and start reading, I could tell you!

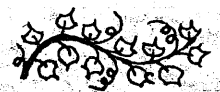
