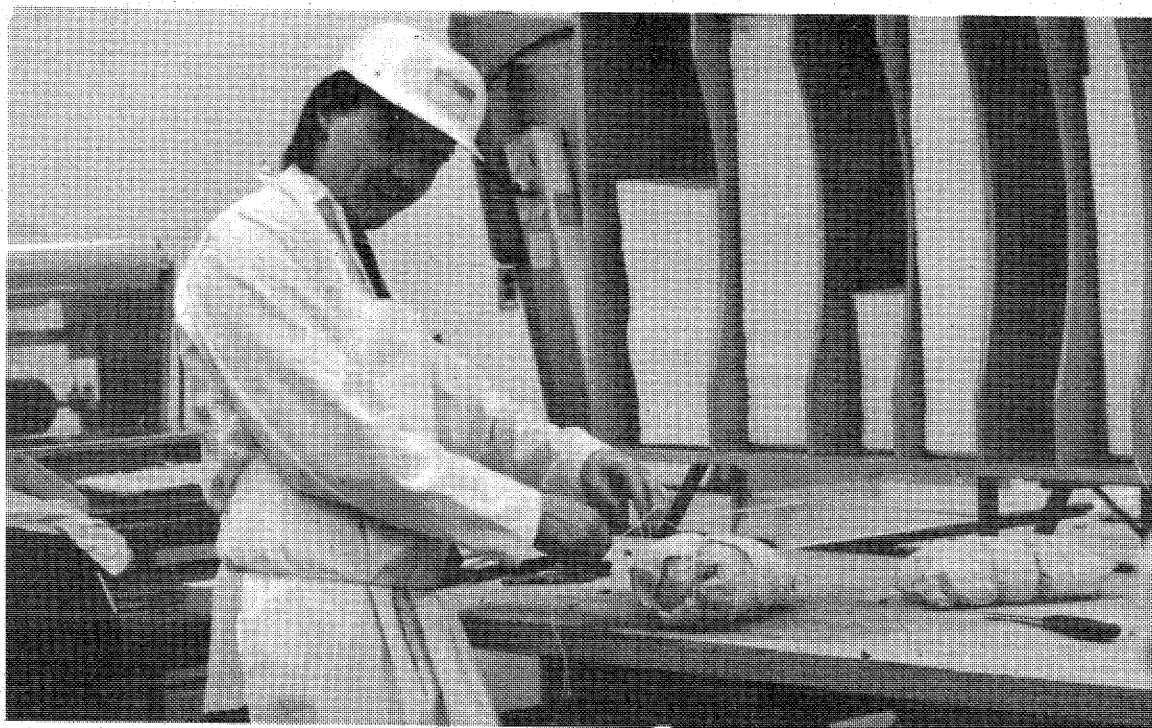

MEATCUTTING OPENS STORE ON CAMPUS

On Tuesday and Wednesday Sept. 20 and 21, Retail Meatcutting began meat sales at its new customer service facility at the back of the Main Cafeteria.

"As students progress in the course of their studies, so will the variety of the cuts of meat available," said Dave Kulak, Program Head of Retail Meatcutting.

As well as providing a good place for students and staff to buy reasonably-priced meat, the facility benefits the Retail Meatcutting Program. The program teaches not only how to cut meat, but also how to merchandise it, manage a meat counter, and serve customers.

The new store is a permanent training facility and is an improvement for retail meatcutting students over the sales held in the

cafeteria last year.

Hours this week and next week are 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., Tuesday and Wednesday. There are plans to also open on Thursdays starting the first week of October.

The store will be open until early December. It will reopen toward the end of January and close again at the beginning of April.

"This is the first large initiative since the Retail Meatcutting Program began in 1968," said Dave Kulak. The renovations made this summer consist of the construction of a door and set-up of the customer service centre on the existing site of the Retail Meatcutting Program.

NAIT is paying for all the costs except for a large meat counter which was donated by Canada Safeway through the NAIT Foundation.

Parking: Permits or Tickets

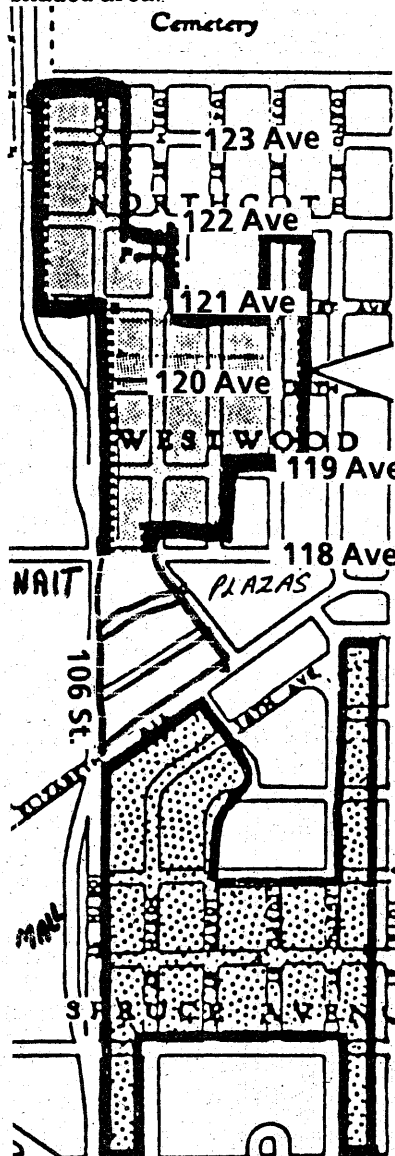

The Foundation receives operating grants from NAIT. Funds raised by the Foundation are used for scholarships bursaries and for projects and activities that normally are not budgeted expenditures. Specialized facilities, enrichment activities, innovative developments are part of the Foundation's goal of advancing educational excellence at Nait.

"The Foundation was commissioned by the (Nait) Board of Governors in 1983," said Bill McCallum, "but became active in

January 1986." McCallum went on to say, "In the last fiscal year, which is July 1987 to June 1988, the Foundation through the various programs has raised \$1.5 million."

Fundraisers used by the Foundation include a car raffle, Drive for the Green (golf tournament), Draft for Dollars, and corporate and private donors. The money is held by Nait in the General NAIT Endowment fund. The interest from the endowment is spent annually.

The Board of Governors and the Foundation Board receive and review applications for Foundation funding. The priority of the applications is determined and the funds raised to meet the needs of the accepted projects.

A few of the projects realized and underway by the Foundation are:

- The Nugget typesetter
- Supplementary funding for the Business Administration Students' Conference
- Automation for the library (a three year project started last year.)
- Offset the cost of the yearbook by \$1000
- New micro-computer lab for Forestry Technology

Student support of the Nait Foundation is beneficial in helping the Foundation to meet all its' goals. Involvement in car raffle ticket sales or even the selection of the Foundation as the Tech charity ensures that the efforts of the students is redirected back into the improvement of the Institute.

RED CROSS APPEAL

The Canadian Red Cross Society launched a National Appeal for funds to be channeled to the areas demolished by Hurricane Gilbert.

The full extent of damage caused by the Hurricane is not yet known. Gilbert ripped through Jamaica, several other Caribbean Islands, Mexico and the Southern part of the United States.

737-13 Ave, SW Calgary, T2R 1J1. Cash donations may also be made at any Branch of the Toronto-Dominion Bank. Contributions should be marked "HURRICANE GILBERT". Income tax receipts will be issued.

Name implies a double standard

The NAITSA General Council voted last Tuesday, September 13, 1988 to call the new lounge "THE NEST".

There seems to be some contradiction of policy. NAITSA is very involved in the promotion of responsible drinking.

NAITSA requires all Tech Cabaret posters have the "If you're drinking who's driving" stamp clearly visible. NAITSA promotes the designated driver program and in general encourages students to be more responsible around alcohol.

It is therefore out of keeping to promote a name for NAITSA's drinking establishment that connotes - home, a safe haven, a place to retreat for solace, comfort, support, and affection. The name suggests it's o.k. to drop your guard. Your safe in "The Nest" so drinking is O.K. here, that's the subliminal message.

It's like the beer commercials showing all those macho outdoorsmen chopping wood and stopping after a hard day's work for a cold one. They never show the poor soul who sleeps off that last bottle of vanilla on a park bench, or the "successful" businessman who only drinks for social reasons but never spends a sober night with his family anymore.

Those "good times" drinking commercials promote drinking by playing on other human emotions. "The Nest" name does the same thing.

This doesn't mean people who drink at the lounge will become alcoholics. The point is simply that another name would be more appropriate in light of NAITSA's stand on drinking.

The name is 'cute'. But...for an organization that is so involved in promoting responsible behaviors in students its seems an irresponsible choice.

So the third goal is to be a forum for your opinions. On any subject, a person is entitled to his or her own opinion, but it must have a student or staff I.D. number on it.

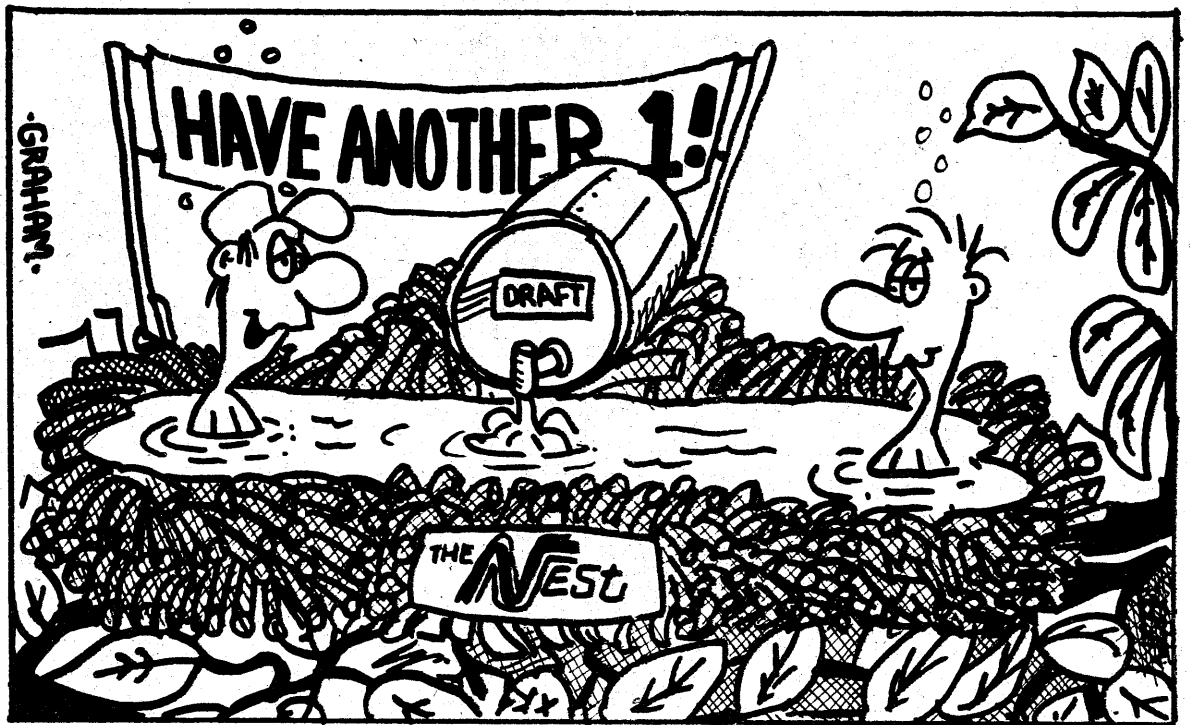

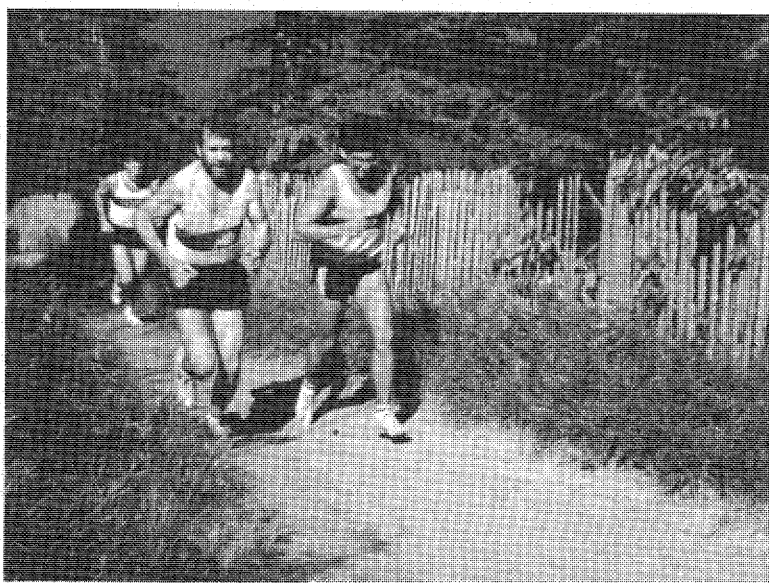
Other runners who

In the sportsworld, the 1980's will be remembered as the decade of drugs. There are the tragic stories of Len Bias, the Boston Celtic draft pick, Mercury Morris, the running back of the Dolphins, and Don Murdoch, the NHL rising star of years gone by.

There is no doubt that drugs are a problem throughout society. However, the methods of combating the drug problems in North America appear to be cosmetic.

In the NFL, 19 players have received suspensions so far this season for illegal drug use. The fact these players have chosen to use certain substances is their own choice. However, drug testing is not the solution to the problem.

For too long, North America has been concentrating on drug rehabilitation. In reality, the problem stems from a lack of intestinal fortitude from the justice system and a lack of proper information from the educational system.

Parents, schools, and governments have not done enough to inform this generation about the physical, psychological, and societal damage of drugs. For years, many felt that the problem would go away, but it never did. The campaign against crack featuring individuals like Merc are a step in the right direction.

The United States has taken an approach with Operation Zero to stop the influx of drugs into their nation. While the intentions of the policy are commendable, there have been instances where custom officials may have gone overboard.

On the other hand, the sentences given to those individuals who sell illegal substances to minors have not been harsh enough. The damage that has been caused by this situation is irreversible. A life sentence with no chance of parole and a seizure of all personal assets for those who sell substances to minors would be fair.

It's time we dealt with the causes instead of the effects.

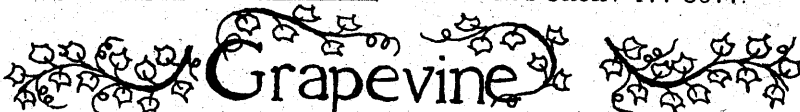

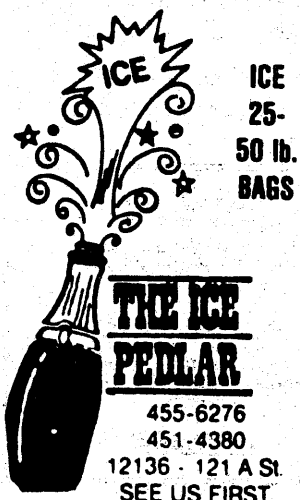

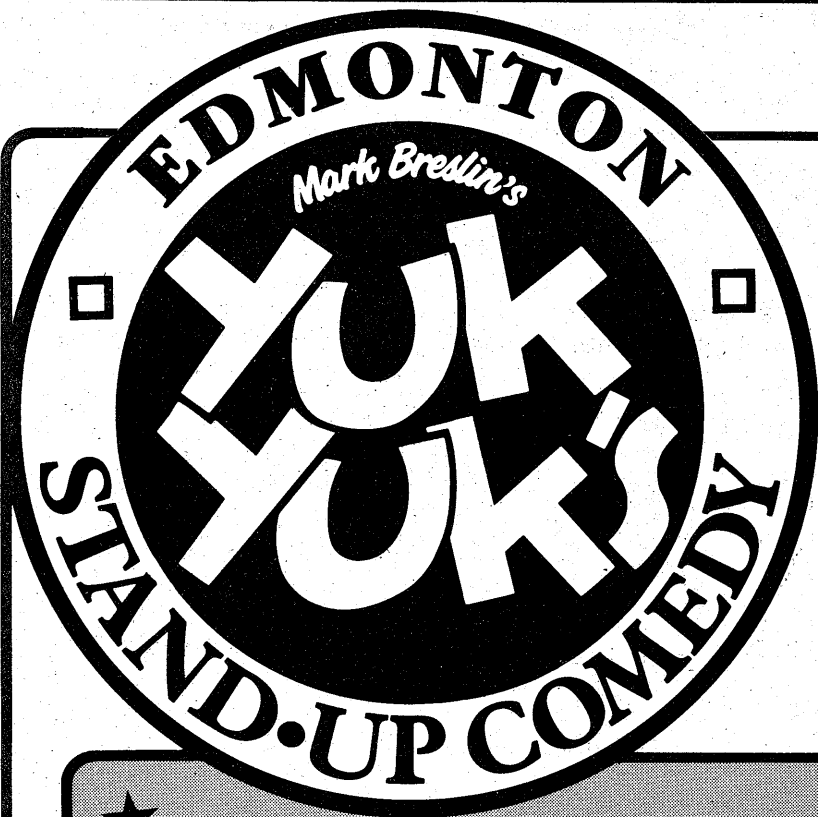
